**Note to employing outfitter: Before you submit an application for a new ski guide, the following check list of requirements must be complete. All applicable documentation, cards and certificates showing proof of completion must be enclosed. Incomplete applications or amendments will not be processed and will be returned to the employing outfitter.**

**Qualifications for Licensure:**

**Level I Ski Guide (non-hazardous terrain)**

- One year training as a ski guide’s assistant in a non-hazardous backcountry setting (Statement must be in writing from the employing outfitter)
- Standard First Aid Training (Proof is required and must be submitted with all ski guide applications)
- Level I Field Based Avalanche Training Certificate (24 hours) (Curriculum submitted/instructor roster)
- Letter of reference from employing outfitter that explains the applicant’s knowledge of operator’s scope of operation, logistics, services and terrain. **This must be attached to applicant’s resume of experience.**
- Ski Guide Application Coversheet (OG-19) must be attached to the application. If this is an amendment to an existing guide license, a letter of intent of employment must be enclosed.
- Application or Amendment Fees

**NOTE:** Level I Ski Guide may work in hazardous terrain under the supervision of a Level II SG

**Level II Ski Guide (hazardous terrain)**

- Two winter seasons training with a licensed level II ski outfitter; or, equivalent work experience with another level II ski operation that conducts services principally in hazardous avalanche terrain. (Statement must be in writing from the employing outfitter)
- Advanced First Aid, WFR, OEC or EMT (minimum 48 hours) If a card or certificate is not available, the name of the instructor who taught the course, the date the course was taken and contact information must be provided.
- Level 1 Field Based Avalanche Training Certificate (Curriculum submitted/instructor roster)
- Level 2 Field Based Avalanche Training Certificate (48 hrs) (Curriculum submitted/instructor roster)
- Letter of reference from employing outfitter that explains the applicant’s knowledge of the operator’s scope of operation; logistics, services and terrain. **This must be attached to applicant’s resume of experience.**
- Ski Guide Application Coversheet (OG-19) must be attached to the application. If this is an amendment to an existing guide license, a letter of intent of employment must be enclosed.

**Field Supervisor**

- Statement on one year training as a ski guide assistant to include verification statement of experience coming from the field supervisor
- Field Supervisor is at a minimum a level I licensed guide, with 5 years experience at level I ski guiding. Documentation of personal resume and professional resume
