

MINUTES OF MEETING
STATE OF IDAHO
OUTFITTER AND GUIDE LICENSE BOARD
Friday, September 8, 1961
Capitol Building
Boise, Idaho

PRESENT: All Board Members

The meeting was opened by the reading of the minutes of the August 7, 1961 meeting, which were approved as read.

Tice was "brought up to date" on visitations before the Board at Lewiston 28 August.

The Mail was opened, the correspondence gone over and instructions were given to Taylor on handling the various problems.

The next meeting was a topic of discussion because of the operations of all board members during the hunting season. It was decided unanimously that to and until the hunting season was closed or nearly so, there would be no regular meeting of the Board; that Taylor, whenever possible, would get the mail and do what was necessary under the regular course of business. If any questions arose, he would contact another Board member by telephone, if possible.

It having been a matter of research and question to this Board from the time of inception relative to "packers" and "boatmen" having a need for a guide license, the persons so designated coming under that portion of the Law which states, "a guide is a person who furnished personal service in guiding or assisting".

POLICY #1:

It is the policy of this Board that such individuals come within the definition of a Guide and are required to have a Guide License.

POLICY #2:

It is the policy of this Board that any outfitter having in his employ any person acting as a guide, as defined in 36-5402 (3) Idaho Code, without being properly licensed, shall be deemed by the Board to be in violation of the provisions of the Outfitters and Guides Law (Title 36, Chapter 54, Idaho Code) and such outfitter's license shall be subject to suspension or revocation by the Board and the Board may deny such Outfitter's application for renewal of his Outfitter's License, so long as such violation continues.

POLICY #3:

It is the policy of this Board that in the case of partnerships or other business associations involving more than one person, which holds an outfitter's license, not more than one member of such partnership or association shall be entitled to act as a guide without a guide's license, and the other members of such partnership or association are required to have guide's licenses in order to perform the function of a guide.

The numbers preceding the above policies are for reference to the minutes of this meeting, only. These said policies were unanimously adopted and are a result of extensive research by and at the advice of competent legal authority. This was also suggested by the Governor.

Bills incurred where statements had been rendered were paid. The meeting was adjourned, with the next meeting being of indefinite date to be arrived at by correspondence or communications at or near the close of hunting season.
