The meeting was called to order by Taylor. A printing bill was approved by the Board for payment.

The Don Lee situation was further explained and discussed with Mr. Southcombe. It was determined that the Board would take no further action on the situation until Don Lee submitted his application, which was not anticipated in the near future because of the question of Lee being able to obtain the camps he desired from the Forest Service.

The possibility of printing the amended law for distribution was presented for discussion. It was decided to print twice the amount used with the original law, to be distributed to all license holders, applicants and those requesting same. Mr. Southcombe advised the secretary of the proper way to indicate an amendment when preparing the law for printing.

The anticipated hard feelings to develop with the Forest Service regarding area control was explained to Mr. Southcombe. He said he would study the legality of the amendment regarding areas and report his findings to the Board.

David Osterhout's letter of June 26 regarding his request for a sheep area was presented to the Board. The Secretary was directed to write Osterhout requesting an agreement with Bill Guth and a more definite area boundary.

Frank Santos and Larry Garner met personally with the Board. They announced their plans to operate together this year. The area is to be increased to include the Barth Hot Springs Camp Site. Earl Dodds will be notified.




Wayne Anderson's request for part of Avon Hill's area was discussed. It was decided not to permit same, since Hill is an established operator.


