

MINUTES OF THE MEETING  
STATE OF IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES  
LICENSE BOARD  
Landmark, Idaho  
August 27, 1963

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Taylor at 9:30 a.m.

The problem arising from one outfitter crossing another's area to get to the first outfitters big game hunting area (with hunting parties) was discussed. The following was decided:

Be it resolved: That the occupation of outfitting and guiding requires a license from the Outfitters and Guides Board, that such license limits the area in which such outfitter and guide shall operate as a guide or an outfitter for big game hunting. The area so designated on the license is the limit of operation for such guide or outfitter; therefore, any guide or outfitter following such occupation with out the limits of his prescribed area shall first obtain the permission of the guide or outfitter in whose area he wishes to guide or outfit or through whose area he wishes to travel. Such agreements will indicate the approximate time of arrival and departure in the foreign area and the type and number of game to be taken out. When such agreements are reached, a copy of the written communication indicating the scope of the agreement will be forwarded to the Outfitter and Guide Board. This resolution shall be adopted in the substantially same form as a Rule and Regulation of the Outfitter and Guide Board.



Licenses were issued, or directions given.




