

Neither Lloyd Gilman nor young Buker were present.

It was explained to those present that the Board would be very happy to have them handle their differences themselves, which they could not do.



(At the October 14 Board Meeting Mr. McCurdy discovered that the application was for John Buker, Jr. -- an initial applicant -- which upset the situation.)


Further correspondence with Mr. Buker, on a personal basis by Mr. McCurdy and to and from the Board, is on file with the Board.
