Also present were Rex Lanham, George Dovel, Earl Dodds, Ranger in Big Creek District, Payette N.F., and Steve Boller.




The views of each were heard and recorded on tape. Mr. Dodds was consulted in regard to campsites etc.

An agreement was reached and a 'TEMPORARY MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING' was drawn and signed by George Dovel and Rex Lanham, the original of which is attached.

An order was drawn and the secretary instructed to issue the licenses as shown. The original of the order is attached hereto.

Mr. Johnson moved that the secretary to the Board, Lois Merritt, by reason of the extra heavy work load, be granted a raise of \$15.00 per month, retroactive to June 1, 1965, making her total salary \$265.00 per month. Motion seconded by Mr. Tice.

This is a temporary memorandum of understanding by and between Mr. George Dovel and Mr. Rex Lanham in regard to the respective campsites and hunting areas which they have agreed to occupy and use during the 1965-66 license year.

Mr. Dovel will use Rush Cr. Point, West Fork Rush Cr., Telephone Cr., and Shake Basin campsites.

Mr. Lanham will relinquish West Fork Rush Cr. but will keep Bear Trap Saddle, and will apply for campsites at Coxey Cr., Cold Meadow, Ginger Cr., and Head of Cave Cr., the last four campsites having been formerly issued to Dewey Moore.

Each party agrees that they shall respect the campsites of the other party and the respective areas thereto.

It is understood that this arrangement is entered into by mutual consent of the parties hereto, and is dependent upon full agreement by the Forest Service and the Outfitters & Guides Board.
