

MEETING AUGUST 26, 1965, BOISE

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Tice.

A motion was made by Martin Capps, seconded by Arlie Johnson, and passed unanimously, to hire, on a temporary contract basis, a qualified fieldman, subject to the direction of the Outfitters & Guides Board, to ascertain that all outfitters and guides operating within the State of Idaho are complying with the Outfitters & Guides Law, Chapter 54, Title 36, Idaho Code. Compensation is not to exceed \$25.00 per day per man and \$30.00 per hour for plane rental with per diem allowances the same as for Board members.


A motion was made by Martin Capps, seconded by Arlie Johnson, and passed unanimously, that when an unlicensed outfitter or guide is found to be operating, he be informed that he will have 15 days in which to apply for the proper license; otherwise, the Board will bring a criminal complaint against him for acting as an outfitter or guide without a license. Also, where a licensed outfitter is found to be conducting his big game activities in the licensed area of another outfitter, he will be informed that he must remove his activity to his own licensed area, unless the outfitter licensed for the area involved has given permission for him to so conduct his big game activity in that area.



Other decisions were:

Mr. Stan Tappan, Stanley, should be sent an application blank by mail and the new fieldman should contact him to secure the completed application, bond, area map, and Forest Service approval of camp-sites, if not received by this office within a short time.
