A letter from Floyd Harvey was read, objecting to joint use of the hunting area along the Snake River. He asked to meet with the Board.



Dear Mr. Dorris:

This letter constitutes your authority to act as field investigator for the Outfitters and Guides Board.

You will do all things necessary in making field investigations, under the direction of the Chairman of the Board, or any one of its members. Your duties shall include:

1. Travel within the state of Idaho, by the most convenient means available;
2. Investigation of unlicensed outfitters or guides;
3. Investigation of charges which may lead to revocation or suspension of licenses;
4. Investigation of applicants and licensees, their qualifications and their gear and equipment;
5. Investigation of disputes between licensees in regard to their operations;
6. Cooperation with the Idaho Fish and Game Department and the United States Forest Service in regard to the business of outfitting and guiding in Idaho.

In performing these duties, you may utilize your peace officer powers to make arrests when, in the course of your investigation, you find a person or persons in violation of any portion of Title 36, Chapter 54, Idaho Code.
