

BOARD MEETING MAY 19, 1967
SALMON

The meeting convened at the City Hall at 9:30 a.m. This was a pre-announced meeting held the day prior to the Spring Meeting of the Idaho Outfitters & Guides Association, Inc. All licensed outfitters and guides had been notified by letter that the Board would be available for consultation on this date and the following day, if necessary.

Cliff Cummings, Northfork, and Newton Kilpatrick, Salmon, had been asked to meet with the Board in regard to hunter complaints forwarded to the Board by the Fish & Game Dept.

Mr. Cummings met with the Board to discuss a complaint made by 4 sheep hunters from Pennsylvania. He also wrote a letter which we have on file. He stated that a snow storm on the third day of the hunt scared the hunters out and they decided to go to Wyoming to hunt antelope and then return for the opening of the elk season. He said he held the dates for them but they didn't return.

Mr. Kilpatrick explained an accusation that he had allowed an elk to spoil due to lack of equipment for transporting it. He said he had plenty of equipment, but the hunters gave their guide too much liquor in spite of his warning that they shouldn't give him any. Also, they decided to cut the hunt short 2 days without advance warning so there was not time to get the elk and pack them out when they desired. He was warned that he was using an unlicensed and unbonded packer for a guide and that he should not entrust his guests to someone known to be unreliable.

Clyde Chaffin inquired about getting a boat guide license to guide for a number of different boatmen. He was told to send in his application.

Bob Cole and Ivan Sack appeared as representatives of Middle Fork Lodge. They wish to purchase the outfit of Dave Osterhout if they could be licensed for the area for which he has been licensed the past several years. Bill Guth objected to the transfer as he said he had given Dave permission to use the area and Dave had said he would turn it back to the Guth boys when he finished with it. Statements by Mr. Guth, Mr. Osterhout, Mr. Cole, and Mr. Sack were taped for later study.

Mr. Guth later withdrew his objections.

John O'Connor and J. Spencer Parker appeared to inquire about the procedure for turning the O'Connor operation over to Mr. Parker who has purchased the O'Connor property at Cobalt.

Wayland Heaton came in to discuss the possible sale of his operation.
