

BOARD MEETING, BOISE

January 3, 4, 5, 1968

Members present: Al Tice, Chairman
Martin Capps
Arlie Johnson
James Baughman

Mr. Renshaw called and said that due to car trouble he wouldn't be able to get to the meeting. Mr. Tice said he would send his plane for him.

The meeting was called to order at 10 a.m. for the purpose of taking care of business that had accumulated during the hunting season and to review the taped record of the formal hearing of York vs Nitz Bros.

Minutes of the previous meetings were read and approved.

Mr. Baughman told the Board that he had reviewed all available records for Mr. Ralph Dawson and could find no precedent for his claim to the Salmon River breaks area and had written him to that effect. However, he did find that there appears to be a narrow strip from Blowout Creek to the Gaines Trail that is not presently licensed to anyone, and this would give Mr. Dawson access to the river if he wants it. The rest of the Board reviewed the files and concurred with this determination, and a letter was written to Mr. Dawson advising him to make application if ^{he} desires this area.

A review was made of the request of Mr. Floyd Harvey for an area on each side of the Salmon River up to the mouth of the Middle Fork. Almost the entire area was previously licensed to other outfitters. This was stated in a letter to Mr. Harvey. It was also explained that if he employs boatmen to operate on the "hazardous rivers", they are required to have an outfitter or guide license.

The meeting recessed for lunch and reconvened at 1 p.m.

The matter of a license for Mr. Vern Hamilton was brought up. We had received his guide bond and \$15 fee but no application. A letter and an application form had been sent to him, but he had not complied with our request that he fill out the form and return it to this office. Mr. Johnson moved that a refund of \$15 be made to Mr. Hamilton for the reason that an application was never received, but a request ^{by letter} for a big game hunting area under a guide license was denied. Second by Mr. Capps, unanimously approved.

Mr. Renshaw arrived for the meeting.

The Board next reviewed the books and bank account in preparation for the annual payment to the General Fund. Mr. Johnson moved that a check be drawn to the General Fund of the State of Idaho in an amount equal to 10% of all funds collected by the Board for 1967-68 outfitter and guide licenses, less 2 refunds made in the amount of \$30.00, in conformance with subsection (a) of Idaho Code 35-5416. Second, Mr. Renshaw, Unanimous.

A letter was read from Mr. Leslie Smolinski, complaining of trespass by Mr. Robert Shawley. A letter is to be written to each.

The meeting recessed for dinner and reconvened at 8 p.m. to listen to tapes of the formal hearing of York vs Nitz Bros. Recessed at 10:30.

The meeting reconvened at 9:30 a.m., January 4, with all members present except Mr. Tice who had been called to Mackay Bar but would return as soon as possible.

There was discussion on the tapes heard and on the recommendation of the hearing officer. Mr. Johnson moved that no action should be taken against Nitz Bros. as the evidence of trespass was inconclusive. Second Mr. Capps. Unanimously approved. A letter to the attorneys involved was drafted.

Correspondence was reviewed. Letters from the attorneys of Lyle Phelps and George Matteson cannot be answered until we get a response from the attorney general to whom the matters have been referred. A letter inviting a member of his staff to attend our meeting had not been answered.

The meeting recessed for lunch and afterward to proceed to the Fish & Game Department to listen to taped complaints made by dissatisfied clients of outfitter Jim Taylor.

The meeting reconvened at the office of the Board at 3:30 p.m. with all members present.

Letters of complaint against Mr. Taylor were read and discussed along with the tapes just heard. A letter is to be written to Dr. Mastell to determine if he is still desirous of returning to Idaho to testify.

Meeting recessed until 9:30 a.m. Friday morning. All members present.

Chairman Tice called the office of the attorney general to request Mr. Slavin to come to the meeting. He agreed to come in a short time.

It was determined that further action by the Board is unwarranted in regard to complaints of clients of Mr. Cliff Cummings and Mr. Leo Crane.

At this time Mr. Slavin arrived and matters which needed his opinion were presented to him. It developed that he had not had time to review the matters presented to him by letter but expected to be able to give us time in a week or ten days.

The meeting recessed for lunch and reconvened at 1:30 p.m.

There was further discussion of the Taylor matter, and a letter was drafted to Mr. Slavin asking him to expedite proceedings as quickly as possible if he finds that action is warranted.

Next was a discussion on renewing the contract with Mike Wilkins. It was moved by Mr. Johnson and seconded by Mr. Baughman that the contract for field services by and between the Idaho Outfitters & Guides Board and Mr. Mike Wilkins, an individual, be renewed and kept in force for the calendar year of 1968 under the same terms and conditions as originally set out in the service contract. Also, we should ask Mr. Wilkins to observe the condition of the outfitter's equipment and the number and condition of riding and pack animals used to serve the customers of the licensee. The Board further asks that Mr. Wilkins report to the Board any cases where he considers the equipment and animals inadequate to properly perform the outfitting services of the licensee. Discussion and unanimously approved.

Further, the secretary was authorized to notify Mr. Wilkins of complaints and pending investigations as quickly as possible in order that he may group these inspections and hold expenses of investigations to a minimum.

Mr. Johnson moved that the secretary be authorized to purchase 2 filing cabinets, 1 letter size and 1 legal size, a stand for the 3M copier, and a table or desk for the outer office. Second by Mr. Baughman and unanimously approved.


