Mr. R. J. Holmes represented the Fish and Game Commission in an ex-officio capacity as his appointment to the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Board was not yet confirmed. Mr. Arlie Johnson's term on the Fish and Game Commission expired in April which automatically removed him from the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Board. Rex Lanham was present, having been appointed by Gov. Samuelson to replace Al Tice.

This meeting was a special meeting called for the convenience of outfitters and guides attending the meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Associations, Inc.

The first order of business was election of a Chairman. Bill Guth nominated Rex Lanham, motion seconded and unanimously approved. Thereafter the Board met informally with anyone who wished to consult them during the 2 day meeting of the Association.

Mr. and Mrs. Wally York appeared to discuss a formal complaint regarding services provided to Henry W. Clark, Jr., Clyde Shook, Ralph Holbrook, and Eugene A. Robson, all from Arizona. Mr. York had had a heart attack and was not able to personally guide as set forth in his brochure and letters. They submitted a letter from Mr. Frank Sandborgh who had guided the party making the complaint.


Mr. Don French and Mr. William Sullivan appeared, accompanied by their attorney, Mr. James Herndon. They asked the approval of the Board for arrangements being made with Mr. Albert Lamper for the Ramshorn Ranch to use a part of his big game hunting area. They also inquired about available area in the Pahsimeroi Vally in the vicinity of Goldburg. They were advised to make application.


Mr. James Muscutt appeared to answer to a complaint against his services, submitted by a group of hunters. He was asked to send names and addresses of other hunters he had serviced during the past season.

Mr. & Mrs. Floyd Weddle and Mr. & Mrs. Leo Crane complained about outfitter Raymond Tarbox operating in their licensed areas which is approximately 30 miles from his own area. He not only hunted their areas but left camps they were required to clean up.

A large group of outfitters and guides from eastern Idaho came in to request a redistribution of big game hunting areas in the Targhee and Caribou National Forests. They also asked for enforcement to control any unlicensed operators in their area. They were told there would be a meeting held in eastern Idaho. Among those present Mr. & Mrs. Vaughn Haderlie, Mr. & Mrs. Glen Park, Rhett Bradford, Merle Robinson, Larry and Paul Wolfley.

Mike Wilkins discussed problems he encounters in his investigations. He asked for written instructions defining procedures he should follow.
