

IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD

April 23-24, 1970, Boise, Idaho

Members present: Rex Lanham, Chairman, James F. Baughman, Jim Renshaw, and H. W. Guth. Absent: R. J. Holmes

The purpose of the meeting was to adopt new forms and procedures as required by the changes in the Outfitters & Guides Act.

Mr. George Detweiler was present to advise and interpret the law.

The University of Idaho would like information on getting the Jess Taylor big game hunting area licensed. Chairman Lanham said he would contact President Hartung in regard to this.

Dr. Simmons appeared to learn what effect, if any, the new law would have on scouts running the rivers. He was satisfied when told the law covers only commercial operators.

Mr. Carlos Taylor appeared for clarification of the boat license requirements. He was told he could lease his boats to anyone and there should be a copy of the lease on the boats.

Letters are to be written to the parties who complained about services provided by Cliff Cummings and by Floyd Harvey. The Board has no way of making or requiring refunds to be made.

Mr. Ryle Semple is to be contact via telephone to determine if he would attend a formal hearing in regard to Mr. Jim Taylor's outfitter license.

Don French is to be asked to meet with the Board to discuss a number of complaints from clients, either at the Salmon meeting or a later meeting in Boise.

The meeting recessed for lunch until 1:30 p.m.

Problems were discussed and those to be requested to meet with the Board at Salmon are: Elvin Hincks, Joe Scoble, Mike Loening and Ted Strickler.

Lyle Phelps and Cliff Cummings are to have letters asking them to be more careful in providing the quality of service their clients rightfully might expect.

George Detweiler gave his opinion that the manager for a corporation licensed as an outfitter may have a guide license rather than an outfitter license, but he must have the qualifications of an outfitter.

The meeting recessed at 5 p.m. until 9 a.m. on April 24.

The meeting reconvened at 9 a.m. with Vice Chairman Baughman conducting the meeting until the arrival of Chairman Lanham. Other members present were H. W. Guth and Jim Renshaw.

The need for a meeting with the Snake River boatmen was discussed. Max Walker wants to pack in the Seven Devils area, and there appears to be a need for an outfitter with stock for packing up from the river. Present licensees do not have stock.

There also need to be a public meeting in the Coeur d'Alene area. After discussion, the matter was tabled.

Mr. Guth recommended that the Board hire another investigator whose application is on file. He is to ask Mr. George Simons to meet with the Board at Salmon on May 14.

Correspondence was reviewed and letters answered.

A boat outfitter license was issued to Ray J. Taylor.

The secretary was certified to sign vouchers and receipts transmittals for the chairman in order to conduct the day to day business of the office.

The following bills were reviewed and approved, and checks were ordered drawn on our bank account as we are not yet set up to make withdrawals through the office of the state auditor.
