Boise, Idaho June 17, 1970

The purpose of the meeting was to take care of applications for licenses and plan the next regular meeting.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Lanham.

The next regular meeting was set for July 1 and 2. Mr. Cliff Cummings is to be asked to meet with the Board and Mr. Dale Baird of the Fish and Game Department. Mr. Archer Wirth is also to be notified.

Middlefork Ranch Co. is to be asked to attend the meeting to discuss the game harvest in their licensed area.

A letter is to be written to Mr. Ken Strickler to find out if his overlap with Mr. Norris can be resolved without a formal hearing.

A letter was sent to Mr. Don Hatch of Hatch River Expeditions, Vernal, Utah, in which the Board states that his guides who reside in Utah should pay a license fee of \$150 since his brochures advertise fishing. This conforms to the Utah regulation for nonresident fishing guides.

June 17, 1970


Norman Riddle and Charles Grubin requested that Snake River Outfitters be licensed to conduct a big game hunting operation along the Snake River. They also protested the omission of Float boating from their current guide licenses. In the opinion of the Board, they both have the necessary qualifications for float boating and that activity was added to their licenses. As for the hunting area requested, they were told that an application for that area had been previously submitted by Max Walker who has more than adequate equipment and is well qualified by reason of many years spent in the outfitting business. The matter was tabled for investigation.


Mr. Reed Clements, attorney for Everett Spaulding, R. B. Rivers, Floyd Harvey, and Guy Snyder, presented a letter in their behalf in which they request that no additional big game outfitting licenses be granted along the Snake River on the grounds that adequate services are now available and additional license would not benefit the public. He further requested that the big game hunting area description on their respective licenses be made to read uniformly: Three air miles from the shore lines on the Salmon River and five air miles from the Idaho shore line on the Snake River. The letter was read by the chairman and tabled for investigation.

Ralph Page and Leona Aslett appeared to make formal application for a big game hunting area extending beyond the Snake River Shoreline downriver to Granite Creek. An area was drawn out on the map and given tentative approval by the Board.

R. B. Rivers opposed the licensing of Max Walker as per his application. After discussion he withdrew his objection. He requested that his license cover the area along the breaks of the Snake River from Lewiston to Granite Creek and along the Salmon River from the mouth to White Bird.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned at 5:30 p.m.

Cecil Sanford was interviewed in regard to contracting his services as an investigator for the Board, primarily in North Idaho. We agreed to send him a contract to be signed if approved by him.
