

IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD MEETING

Boise, Idaho

July 20, 21, 22, 1970

Members present: Rex Lanham, chairman, J. F. Baughman and H. W. Guth.

The meeting was called to order by the chairman at 9:15 a.m. for the purpose of reviewing license applications and any other business which might be brought before it.

Mr. Cecil Sanford appeared to discuss his contract as investigator for the Board. It was arranged for him to get a special officer's card from Law Enforcement commissioner, Warner Mills, and he requested a badge for identification purposes. Signing of the contract was completed by both parties. The Board suggested that he make a trip to Salmon to assist Mike Wilkins in checking river boatmen.

The meeting recessed until 1:15 p.m. for lunch.

The Board approved the temporary employment of Chris Omeron as typist at \$1.78 per hour.

Gordon Stimmel applied for the hunting area formerly licensed to Max Walker to be added to his license. This was approved with the exception of a small area overlapping the hunting area of Harold Hodges which was deleted: from Scurvy Saddle southwesterly on Trail 531 around the head of Lookout Creek to Lookout Peak.

Mr. Phillip Johnson's application to add the Muley-Burnt Creek area to his hunting area was denied as it is licensed to Mrs. Beulah Reeves.

The meeting recessed at 5:30 p.m. until 9:00 a.m. the following morning.

The meeting reconvened July 21, with the same members present.

Three Prock brothers appeared to request separate deer and elk hunting areas for Homer and Curtis, in the vicinity of Warren-Burgdorf. After considerable discussion it was decided that there is no open area in that vicinity which would stand the pressure of the extensive operation Curtis wished to conduct and he withdrew his request.

Homer Prock's application was tabled for further study and discussion with the Fish and Game officials in the area. Larry Walker has applied for some of the same area.

After checking with Fish and Game personnel and a number of people very familiar with the area, the Board reached the decision that a commercial operation in the area would not serve the best interest of the general public, that a further concentration of hunters would endanger the safety and welfare of the public and the outfitter's guests. All applications for this Warren Burgdorf area were denied.

Homer Prock had also applied for a small area at Yellow Pine and this was granted.

Larry Walker's license was issued for the same as his previous license--bear hunting in the Dubois vicinity and cougar hunting statewide.

The application of Henry Allen for big game hunting in the Sawtooth National Forest was approved, but the Danskin area in the Boise National Forest was denied after conferring with Fish and Game personnel and people familiar with the area. They felt the area is already overhunted and would not stand the pressure of a commercial operation.

An area was worked out for the Sun Valley outfitters who wish to have a big game hunting operation. Paul Ramlow's license was issued to include this area and he is to be notified

that he will use it jointly with other former Sun Valley guides who apply for big game hunting.

Other applications reviewed showed no request for change.

A letter from the Idaho Department of Water Administration was read, suggesting that Idaho should attempt to make available to boatmen on our rivers information concerning stream flow and hazardous conditions during high water. A letter was written stating that this Board would cooperate in any way possible to make this information available to the public.

The meeting recessed at 5:30 p.m until 9:00 A.M. the following morning, July 22, 1970.

Members present were J. F. Baughman, vice chairman, H. W. Guth, and R. J. Holmes.

The minutes of June 4 and 5 were read and approved as read.

A bill from the Rex Lanham Co for air charter service for the Board to Lewiston, Priest Lake, Coeur d'Alene and Emmett in the amount of \$320.83 was approved.

Payment was approved for J. F. Baughman for two half-days spent in work at the office on June 22, and July 8.

Mr. Vernon Johnson's telephoned request for an area for big game hunting was reviewed. The Board found that there is a very small area near his summer camp which might suit his small operation. He is to be notified of this and asked to make written application and send a map if he wishes to operate there.

Mr. K. R. Strickler's and Mr. Ted Strickler's licenses were approved. They are to be requested to keep accurate records of the number of their guests and animals killed in the future. Ted Strickler's big game hunting area was revised to conform to the agreement made with Mike Loening at Salmon, on May 14, 1970.

Mr. Robert Sherwood of the Fish and Game Dept. at Idaho Falls made a statement at the Salmon meeting that "There is no outfitter in unit 69." Since Earl Smith is licensed to hunt that unit, he is to have a letter asking for details concerning his plans for the coming season.

In reviewing the application of Gary Maxwell, it was found that he listed only boats as equipment, yet he applied to conduct scenic tours, trailrides and backpacking. He is to be asked for more details.

Harry Vaughn is to be notified that the new area he applied for has been revised at the heads of Marten and Mink Creek to eliminate an overlap with Nitz Brothers.

August 13, was the date set for the next meeting.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 6:00 p.m.
