

OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD

Boise, Idaho

April 10-14, 1972

The meeting convened at 8 a.m. for the purpose of reviewing license applications. Members present: James F. Baughman, Acting Chairman, Jim Renshaw and Lon Jarvis.

Scott Farr appeared to find out if he could get a license to take over Mrs. Horner's operation. He had discontinued his outfitter operation in 1970 due to game law violations during two successive seasons. He was advised that the board would discuss it with Fish and Game and Forest Service officials at the Salmon meeting in May.

Dan Rotthoff appeared to discuss the necessity for licensed guides for his cattle drive and youth ranch. He would like to hire nonresident university students without paying nonresident guide license fees. This would not be possible if they are guiding,

The meeting recessed for lunch until 1 p.m.

Attorneys John Croner and Warren Felton came in to assist us by reviewing some of the bonds which may or may not have unacceptable discrepancies. Mr. Felton said the name of the applicant must be identical to the name of the principal of the bond and the signature must be the same. Quite a number of bonds must be returned for correction.

Richard Jones, World Wide River Expeditions, appeared to submit his bond and try to expedite his application for license. The board asked for references and a financial statement. Because of his extensive whitewater boating experience, he will be allowed to train his guides on the Main Salmon even though he is not a licensed outfitter as yet.

Applications were reviewed until 5:30 p.m. and the meeting recessed until 8 a.m. on the 11th when the meeting reconvened with the same member present.

Our financial situation was reviewed. The cash balance on March 31 was \$43,378.

Tim Wilhelm appeared to expedite his application for an outfitter license for wilderness backpacking. No action was taken as his bond was not on file.

Roy Strickler appeared to discuss his being licensed as managing agent for both Hidden Valley Ranches, Inc. and Double K Bar Ranchos, Inc. This was approved provided we have a release from Dave Oerke who is named as managing agent on the application submitted by Double K Bar Ranchos, Inc.

Licenses were issued until noon when the meeting recessed until 1 p.m.

Larry Walker and George Duncan appeared to see about getting additional bear and cougar area. There will be no special cougar areas licensed until after the Fish and Game Department releases the information on seasons. Walker's outfitter license was approved for bear hunting in the Manns Creek and Wildhorse areas, joint use with George May and possibly others.

Applications were reviewed until 5 p.m. when the meeting recessed until 8 a.m. on the 12th with the same members present.

Applications were reviewed and licenses issued.

A motion was made by Jim Renshaw that the board recognize any historical use of sheep and goat areas outside an outfitter's regular area as long as the current outfitter uses it, but it will not pass on to a successor; furthermore, it will not appear on current licenses. Seconded by Lon Jarvis and passed.

The sheep and goat area on lower Papoose and Golden Creeks was removed from the license of Pat Reed, and the sheep area at Two Point Peak and Sheephorn Mtn. from the license of Lafe Cox. They are to have letters explaining this action.

Applications were reviewed until 5:15 when the meeting recessed until 8:30 the following morning. The entire day was spent in the review of applications, with a recess for lunch at noon. The meeting recessed at 5 p.m. until 8:30 a.m. on the 14th.

Plans were made for the Salmon meeting on May 11, the day prior to the spring meeting on the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Association, Inc. Telephone calls were made to set up meetings with Forest Service officials. It was decided to ask outfitters in the St. Joe Forest to appear because some of them were requesting boundary changes; also Dr. G. C. Barlow because his bond has been cancelled and the lodge repossessed by the former owner, Arlen Rose.

Gerald Richie and Floyd Weddle are to be asked to answer to hunter complaints.

Jim Kusler and Jack Wemple, new applicants, are to be asked to appear.

Carl Sheppard appeared to request an outfitter license for summer packtrips in the Seven Devils area and meat packing around Bear--no guiding of hunters. It was explained to him in detail that the license for meat packing would be issued on a trial basis because the board feels there is a real need for this service in this locality and a few other areas. It will be an experiment to determine if licensing for this activity is feasible. It will be discontinued if it progresses into a guiding operation.

The following licenses were issued with specific portions of the applications denied.

Because of the moratorium on new licenses, Glenn Schubert was denied boating on the Middle Fork as his file showed no tenure there.

Louis Rebillet was denied a boat outfitter license on classified streams because he has no boating equipment and lacks the required experience. He was denied guiding on the Middle Fork for lack of experience.

Curtis Hansen, Gregory Downs, and Christopher Downs were denied power boating/classified for Don Hatch because Mr. Hatch's license covers float boating only.

Norman Riddle was denied boating on the Selway--no experience shown.

Larry Pond boating on Salmon and Selway for lack of experience.

Verl Foster and Mike Martin, boating/classified rivers for lack of experience.

Larry Moats, power boating/classified portion of the Main Salmon because of moratorium on new outfitters on that section. Also, Dale Ney.

Roy Nicholson denied float boating/classified Main Salmon and Selway for lack of experience.

Del Cameron, Homer Rhett and Lee Bridges denied new bear and cougar hunting areas for lack of available area.

Lynn M. Davis was denied additional big game hunting area south of St. Charles which is licensed to Lee Bridges.

Ralph Dawson was denied additional area licensed to Lester West and Mackay Bar Corp.

Arnolt Oswald was denied additional area licensed to Jim Renshaw.

Mrs. Edna Jackson was denied additional area already licensed to H. H. Hepburn.

Lloyd I. Jones was denied additional area at the head of Little Boulder Creek as it is licensed to Gertrude Maxwell, but he was given the Flint Creek drainage.

Richard Higgins was licensed for the area formerly used by his father, Ray Higgins, except that the overlap with Malnarich at Goat Lake was deleted.

Lonnie Jones was denied area requested which is north of Hwy 90. The area south of Hwy 90 appears to the board to be adequate for the proposed operation which he stated would be primarily on his family's deeded land.
