

OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD

Boise, Idaho

February 8-9, 1973

The meeting convened at 9 a.m. with members Baughman and Renshaw present.

Law changes were reviewed and then the meeting recessed to go to the statehouse to discuss our need with legislators. An appointment was made to meet with the House Resources and Conservation Committee.

The meeting reconvened at 1 p.m.

Herman Konrad and Lonnie Cash appeared to discuss a complaint from a client of Mr. Konrad. He said his hunts are not usually guided hunts. He usually goes out on Wed. to get groceries on Thurs. and bring the next group of hunters in on Fri. He said this particular group said they didn't want to hunt any more, they wanted to take a boat trip with Zeke West.

Chairman Lanham arrived at 1:45.

It was decided to send information concerning Mr. Epley's performance bond to the clients making the complaint about booking during closed season.

Correspondence was reviewed.

The meeting recessed at 5:30 p.m. to meet at the statehouse to appear before the House Resources and Conservation Committee at 8:30 a.m. on the 9th.

The meeting reconvened at the office at 10:30 a.m. with Baughman, Renshaw, Holmes and Lanham. The complaint against C. J. Prock was reviewed.

Mr. Prock appeared. He said the complainant knew, at least when he reached Boise, that the elk he was offered was in a large pen. He said the bear he shot was his personal property. The guide was not licensed, but Prock was with the client all the time in Idaho so the guide didn't need a license. Prock said he thinks there is a need to accommodate people who are not able to hunt by releasing caged animals.

Permission was received from the Board of Examiners to destroy cancelled checks, vouchers, and applications dated 1961 through 1967. A motion was made by Renshaw and seconded by Holmes to authorize the secretary to review these documents and destroy any no longer of value. The motion passed.

Some of the special fund boards have had some meetings to discuss the coming government reorganization, with the possibility that they might seek a department for professional licenses. Minutes of these meetings were sent to all of the special boards along with a questionnaire to be completed prior to the next meeting called for the 20th. These were reviewed and the secretary was authorized to complete the questionnaire and to attend the meeting.

A draft of a letter to be sent regarding the Snake River was read and approved with changes.
