

IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD

Boise, Idaho

April 16-20, 1973

The meeting convened at 8:30 a.m. with members present Vice Chairman James Baughman, Jim Renshaw and Lon Jarvis.

Legislation was reviewed and the changes which will be required in our licensing procedure.

John Croner, Sr. appeared to discuss investigations he is conducting. Results have been negative to date.

Marty Rust and Harold Thomas appeared to discuss an outfitter license for the Allison Ranch which they have purchased from the Mackay Bar Corporation.

Chairman Rex Lanham arrived.

Correspondence was reviewed until noon when the meeting recessed till 1:00 p.m.

Wayne Crookston, our new representative in the attorney general's office appeared. He answered some questions: a partnership must pay non-resident license fee unless all partners are residents; a foreign corporation does not qualify for a resident license even when registered in Idaho; when guiding fishing trips, Utah boatmen must pay the fee equivalent to the nonresident fee for fishing guides in Utah. He advised that we should review advertising and trip schedules of Utah boat outfitters to determine if the guides should be required to pay the higher fee.

Zeke West appeared in regard to his game violation and his application for an outfitter license. He asked if he could get a guide license if he were denied an outfitter license. The board agreed to consider it.

Eggs Beckley appeared to discuss the insurance requirements imposed by the Forest Service this year.

Lon Jarvis made a motion, seconded by Jim Renshaw, that Zeke West's application for a 1973-74 outfitter license be denied with a recommendation that no outfitter or guide license be issued to him for a 3 year period, thru the 1975-76 license year. The motion passed unanimously.

Gary Barton appeared in connection with his application for a bear outfitter license in the vicinity of Smith's Ferry. The Board will review it in due time.

Roy Green and his attorney David Cantrell appeared in connection with Mr. Green's attempt to repossess outfitting equipment sold to Dick Fromm and to request a license for the big game hunting area transferred from him to Mr. Fromm. Mr. Fromm had already released the area and Bob Eaton had been given campsites by the Forest Service. The board told him Mr. Eaton had already made application and would most likely be given a license for the area.

Correspondence was reviewed.

The Meeting recessed at 5:30 p.m. till 8:30 a.m. on April 17, when it reconvened with James Baughman, Lon Jarvis, Rocky Holmes and Jim Renshaw present.

Applications were reviewed and licenses issued.

Emmett Cleaver, Elk City, appeared in connection with his covered wagon trips. He was advised to complete his application.

Kenny Smith appeared to answer to a complaint. He said he was only 1 day late getting the party into camp -- if they were in Challis earlier, he didn't know it. He said a party killed 2 elk in 3 days and one of them was eaten by ravens before he could get it out.

The meeting recessed at 12:00 till 1:00 p.m. for lunch.

Watson Perry appeared in connection with the complaint from John Luety regarding the refund of a prepayment made to Gene Nichols and transferred to Mr. Perry. Mr. Perry said he would return the money if that would satisfy Mr. Luety and close the case.

Dick Norris appeared to discuss his operation during the previous season and to request the area be transferred to Orval Rice and that Norris be licensed for the Moose Creek area released by Moose Creek Ranch Company. The board approved his application.

Orval Rice appeared: The board told him the area he applied for will support only a small operation and that it overlapped the area licensed to Hidden Valley Ranches. He said Jim Smith would be operating Hidden Valley Ranches this year and they had already agreed on the use of the overlap.

Carl Singleton and Hank Steel appeared to discuss obtaining a license for the Sheep Creek area. The board didn't approve this area for a commercial operation.

Applications were reviewed until 6:00 p.m. when the meeting recessed till 8:30 a.m. on Wednesday with Baughman, Jarvis and Renshaw present. *Mr. Holmes was at Proj. Dept. until 1 p.m.*

Applications were reviewed.

James Doyle and Richard Bergkamp appeared to inquire about an outfitter license for trail rides for the Prospector at Ketchum, Idaho. They were told the requirements for a corporation license. The meeting recessed from 12:00 to 1:00 p.m. for lunch.

Applications were reviewed until 6:00 p.m. when the meeting recessed till 8:30 a.m. on Thursday with Baughman, Renshaw, Jarvis and Holmes present.

Gene and Thelma Nichols appeared to discuss the complaint from John Luety. They said they would refund the money sent in prepayment for the hunt which was called off because of the exchange of areas.

A call was made to Frank Elder, the Salmon River Ranger, regarding present usage on the Main Salmon. He said there was very little use above the mouth of the Middle Fork. It was decided to hold outfitters to areas of past use as much as possible.

Joe Peck appeared to discuss complaints that Ron de Cardinal guided without a license. He said he guided the complainants only one day but he guided a party the next week.

The meeting recessed at 6:00 p.m. till 8:30 a.m. on the 20th with the same members present.

Plans were made to hold the next meeting in Salmon on May 9 and 10, prior to the Association meeting and to meet with the Forest Service on Thursday at 1:00 p.m.

Jim Harvey, Nezperce National Forest called in regard to Forest Service regulations on the Snake River. He said they have received 16 new applications for camp permits and they will approve them and require advance notice of dates and size of party. They expect to complete an analysis by October 15. A tri-state meeting was discussed and he thought it might be beneficial.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read, corrections noted and approved.

Jim Campbell appeared to discuss his takeover of the Shepp Ranch and leave a copy of his recommendations for requirements for boaters.

The following were denied additional areas for boating because of crowded conditions on the new areas of operation applied for:

Harold Hanson was denied float boating on the Salmon because of the moratorium and also lack of float boating experience.

Kurt McCullough was denied a license for the North and South Forks of the Snake River and the Boise River and "all unclassified rivers".

Percy Lyda was denied power boating on the Selway River as this river is not suitable for power boating.

Dwight Switter and Michael Switter were denied licenses for boating on the St. Joe River, as they showed no boating equipment nor boating experience on their applications.

Siegfried B. Rolland was denied a guide license for bird hunting because his outfitter employer, H.W.W. Johnson, is not licensed for bird hunting.

Larry Moats was denied boating on classified rivers because of the moratorium on the issuance of new licenses on these rivers and also because his equipment is not adequate.

Dan Rotthoff was denied power and float boating on the Deadwood River and was asked to limit boating on the South Fork of the Payette to times when they would not interfere with fishermen.

Arnolt Oswald was denied additional big game hunting area as it is being used by other outfitters.

Dick Helfrich was denied a boat license for the Main Salmon because of the moratorium of new outfitter licenses. He license was approved for the Middle Fork because he purchased the Middle Fork business of Everett Spaulding.
