

BOARD MEETING

Boise, Idaho May 30, 31, June 1, 1973

The meeting convened at 8:30 a.m. with members Baughman, Jarvis, Renshaw, and Holmes.

Our attorney, Wayne Crookston, appeared to discuss the licensing of boatmen from Utah. As our law now reads, we can license them as fishing guides only if they apply for it; we cannot assume they will fish. Our applications will need to be changed to separate fishing from boating.

It was noted that an error had been made in issuing the outfitter license for Everett Spaulding to include the Middle Fork. He has released all his rights on the Middle Fork to Dick Helfrich. He is to have a letter that the Middle Fork has been deleted from his license. He does not have Forest Service trip permits.

Applications were reviewed and licenses issued until noon when the meeting recessed until 1 p.m.

Bob Eaton appeared to discuss his application. The board will consult with the district ranger.

Hollis Oakes' letter objecting to the limitation on his license for boating was reviewed. Mr. Crookston advised that it is within the board's power to designate the area of operation with the applicant having the right of appeal in accordance with the statute. Mr. Oakes' claim that his coast guard license permits him to outfit anywhere on the Snake River and Salmon River is not in accordance with the statute.

7 Wayne MacGregor, Grangeville attorney, appeared to submit an application for an outfitter license for Idaho Wilderness School, Inc. and Loren L. Smith, managing agent. Mr. Crookston was consulted for an opinion on whether Judge Quinlan's order (Case No. 8140, Second Judicial District of Idaho) restrained the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Board from enforcing the Outfitters and Guides Act in so far as it pertained to Idaho Wilderness School, Inc. and Mickey Smith acting as outfitters as well as acting as guides and furnishing personal services in power boating, float boating, or rafting on the hazardous rivers of Idaho. Mr. Crookston studied the briefs submitted in the case and gave the opinion that the judge's order applied only to guides and not to the outfitter, that, since Idaho Wilderness School, Inc. did not have a license in 1972, it is a new applicant, that the applications could be returned for completion or the board could deny them because of unlicensed outfitting activities in 1972.

The meeting recessed at 5:30 p.m. until 8:30 a.m. on May 31, with the same members present.

The applications of Ben Smith and Richard Norris were approved with the same overlaps and joint usage as when the areas were held by Jim Renshaw and Moose Creek Ranch Co.

Merle Meyers' application was incomplete and was returned with a notation that the big game hunting area applied for was heavily used by the general public and would not be suitable for a commercial operation.

The meeting recessed at 12 o'clock until 1 p.m.

Mr. Crookston appeared after having reviewed the case of Idaho Wilderness School vs this board. He said it appears that the board would have ample grounds to deny an application from Idaho Wilderness School and Loren Smith, managing agent, because of his unlicensed activities during 1972, pursuant to Idaho Code 36-5409c as set forth in Idaho Code 36-5413-8. After further consideration the board decided that the applications should be returned in their entirety because the forms used were obsolete and didn't have any information about the equipment to be used. He is to be informed that should valid applications be received, it appears that they would be denied because there is a moratorium on the issuance of new licenses on the Middle Fork of the Salmon and the Main Salmon River.

The application of Denver Hammons was denied pursuant to Idaho Code 36-5409c for reason set forth in Idaho Code 36-5413-6. The meeting recessed at 5:30 pm till 8:30 am on June 1, with members Baughman, Jarvis and Renshaw.

The application of Curtis J. Prock to hunt Boundary and Bonner Counties was denied as these areas are already licensed to a number of outfitters and Mr. Prock has a large area in units 23, 24, and 32A.

The application of Indian Lake Outfitters, Inc., and Richard A. Higgins, managing agent, was reviewed. No fee was submitted for the corporation. The application of Mr. Higgins was denied pursuant to Idaho Code 36-5409c for the reason set forth in Idaho Code 36-5413-9. Bill White and Jerry Hassell were arrested for guiding without a license on October 7, 1972, and pleaded guilty in Magistrate Court in Grangeville on October 13, 1972. The application of Indian Lake Outfitters, Inc. was returned because it was incomplete.

A request from Stan Miller to extend his license to cover boating from Salmon City to the mouth of the Middle Fork was approved.

Applications from Jesse Rice and Max Walker to outfit for big game hunting in the Deadwood Ridge area were both denied because it is an area with very little game and already is licensed to an outfitter.

Other applications which were denied in part are as follows:

Jack Modrell, additional area east to Slate Creek for which we already have an application. We will hold his request on file.

Quentin Selby, additional big game hunting area in the vicinity of Lake Fork which is very heavily ^{visited} by the general public. He was granted additional area for fishing and trailrides.

Sun Valley Corp. and Don Anderson, managing agent, kayaking on Wood River, Lost River, and Upper Salmon and floating on the Henry's Fork, South Fork, and Teton Rivers. They have had no previous license for these activities and no new licenses are being issued by the board.

Dave Burk, float boating on the Upper Salmon, Main Salmon, bear and cougar hunting in the area licensed to Nez Perce Outfitters and Guides.

Harry Lewies, big game hunting, boating on Henry's Fork, Warm River, Robinson River, and Falls River.

Steve Jordan, big game hunting in areas licensed to Mackay Bar and Shepp Ranch.

Jim Correll, big game hunting in units 73 and 74, already hunted to capacity.

Gary Madsen, additional area on the Pahsimeroi River which is accessible to the public. Application will be kept on file.

Teton Expeditions and Silvon K. Foster, boating on Blackfoot River. Melvin Foster, Glen R. Foster, Verl Foster, Kenneth Foster denied Blackfoot River, Salmon River above the Middle Fork, Snake above Hells Canyon Dam because the employing outfitter is not licensed for these areas; Larry Pond same as above and also the Main Salmon and Selway for lack of qualifying experience.

Rex Miller, Blackfoot and Salmon above the Middle Fork; the Snake above Hells Canyon; Chet Miller, Blackfoot and Salmon above the Middle Fork because outfitter is not licensed for these areas.

Michael Kelly, float boating on Snake River until training trips have been completed.

Franklin K. Stratton, float French Creek to Riggins; George McKissick, float Warm River; Kim Goode, Teton and Falls River; Wm. W. Mason, Jr., Teton and Falls River all denied because the outfitter employer is not licensed for these areas.

Floyd Posing and Allen Thompson, power boating classified rivers for lack of qualifying experience.

Norman Glose and Terry Beeler, floating the Middle Fork for lack of qualifying experience.

Leslie Abbott, Middle Fork and Main Salmon for lack of qualifying experience.

Rick Lowe, Main Salmon and Sharon Miller, Middle Fork for lack of experience.

Kenneth Dilworth, float boating, outfitter not licensed for this.

H. B. Hashagen was denied predator hunting as the outfitter has not applied for this activity.

Richard McConnel was denied the big game hunting area between Long Creek Ridge and Long Creek. He is a new operator and this additional area would extend to the road from which the general public hunts extensively.

The application of Salmon River Properties, Inc. was reviewed and the license was approved after deleting the overlap with Martin Capps.

The next meeting of the board was tentatively set for June 25 & 26.

Licenses approved via telephone since the last meeting of the board were reaffirmed and are included with licenses issued at this meeting. The meeting adjourned at 5:15 p.m.
