

OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD MEETING

*Approved*

Boise, Idaho

March 28, 29, 1974

The meeting convened at 8:30 a.m. with following members present: Vice Chairman James Baughman, Lon Jarvis and Jim Renshaw.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read. A motion for approval was made by Mr. Renshaw and seconded by Mr. Jarvis.

Investigations regarding complaints were reviewed. Complainants were asked if they would appear at a formal hearing and no response has been received from any of them.

The meeting recessed from 12 to 1 o'clock.

New complaints were reviewed and investigations planned.

Actions of the legislature were discussed. A subcommittee of the Senate Resources and Conservation Committee is reviewing our rules and regulations.

The meeting recessed at 5:15 p.m. until 8:30 a.m. on Friday, March 29, with the same members present and, also, R. J. Holmes.

The lawsuit Idaho Wilderness School and Loren Smith vs Idaho Outfitters and Guides Board et al was discussed.

Mr. and Mrs. Charles Grotzinger appeared to discuss the complaint from one of their hunters. The board reviewed their advertising brochure which seemed to be the basis for the complaint. They were advised to revise their brochures as it contains some discrepancies and that he should define terms used unless he used them as generally accepted in the outfitting industry in Idaho. Mr. Grotzinger said the client booked by telephone before receiving the brochure so he could not have booked because of anything in the brochure.

The meeting recessed from 12 to 1 o'clock.

Lloyd Gilman appeared with Rod Moser and Bob Knobel who would like to purchase his outfitting operation. Mr. Gilman submitted his application for license to act as managing agent for Wilderness Riders which would be a partnership between Moser and Knobel. The partnership would be required to submit a certified copy of an assumed-name certificate obtained from the county of operation and obtain a bond.

Plans were made for Mr. Baughman and Mr. Jarvis to review applications in advance of the April meeting set for the week of April 15. In this way applications with no changes may be handled quickly by the whole board, allowing more time for problems encountered in applications for summer activities.

The meeting adjourned at 5:30 p.m.
