

OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD

Boise, Idaho

March 10-11, 1976

The meeting convened at 9 a.m. with members present: Vice-Chairman Baughman, R. G. Holmes, Jim Renshaw and Lon Jarvis.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read, corrections noted, and approved as corrected by a motion from Renshaw and seconded by Holmes. Approved unanimously.

There was a discussion of the new requirement that all those acting as guides shall have first aid training. A letter was approved to be sent to outfitters who say they do not guide. It is the opinion of the board that almost every outfitter provides some service that comes under the definition of guiding.

Correspondence was reviewed. John Jones replied to an inquiry concerning his advertising for trips on the Main Salmon and Hells Canyon for which he is not licensed. In a separate brochure, in fine print, he states that he is authorized by "Whitewater Adventures" to book these trips. K. Elwood Masoner advertises under "Whitewater Adventures" but the license is in his name. The board tabled the matter until it can be discussed with Jones and Masoner.

Reports from the district ranger and the conservation officer in the Elk City district indicate that it would not be feasible to license another outfitter in the Ten Mile Creek drainage. It is heavily hunted by private parties. This information is to be conveyed to Kenneth D. Thompson, Elk City. He has not contacted the board directly but consulted the ranger.

Gary Bader, St. Joe Outfitters, called to say he was in Nevada and wouldn't be able to appear before the board regarding a complaint.

Complaints were reviewed. The board will consult the attorney general regarding action to be taken.

Plans were made for the next meeting to issue licenses. Board members will come in as they have time to review applications and there will be a meeting on April 12 & 13, possibly the 14th depending upon final plans for the association meeting at Sun Valley.

The meeting recessed at 5 p.m.

The meeting reconvened at 8:30 a.m.

Applications were reviewed. A list of those approved follows as a part of these minutes.

Richard Wells and Don Bryant appeared to discuss a license for power boating on the Snake River in the vicinity of Three Island State Park at Glens Ferry. They would take tourists on one or two hour trips by jet boat. The board had no objections but would need an application before a final decision could be made.

Ken and Don Carpenter, Lewiston, appeared to request float boating on the Clark Fork River from the dam to the town of Clark Fork, a distance

of 8 or 9 miles. Ken Carpenter has been a guide on the Snake River in Wyoming and would like to start a similar trip. Later he would like to expand to Priest River. Since Carpenter has not run either of these rivers the board told him he should do some research on the matter. The board will research the feasibility of outfitting on these rivers.

Lynn Davis and Hulme Dunford appeared to request transfer of Davis' big game hunting area in units 78&75 to Dunford. None of the area in southern Idaho is suitable for outfitting in the traditional sense. A letter from the supervisor of the Fish and Game department in that district did not recommend any additional game harvest. Davis claimed that an active outfitter in the area would discourage illegal activities. The board agreed to look into the matter further.

The board finished reviewing applications and the meeting adjourned at 5 p.m.
