

OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD

November 7 & 8, 1977

Boise, Idaho

The Outfitters and Guides Board regular meeting convened on November 7, 1977 at 8:35 at the board office with the following members present: James Baughman, vice-chairman, Ivol Sies, Lon Jarvis and Bill Guth.

Richard Jones met with the board to discuss the new rules and regulations. In rule number 26a Mr. Jones suggested having motorized boats instead of extra boatman, as it was his opinion that it would be more effective in rescuing people. He suggested the ratio be one guide to five guests for Tahiti and sport yaks. The board suggested to Mr. Jones that he work with a boating committee of the association to make recommendations to the present regulation. Rex Lanham arrived at 9:00.

Dick McAfee and K. R. Strickler met with the board to request the Hidden Valley Ranches area be transferred to Dick McAfee. Mr. Strickler signed a release to the area and Mr. McAfee gave the board a financial statement and resume of his proposed activities. Mr. McAfee will obtain the forest ranger signatures from both ranger districts in this area. Mr. McAfee stated that he will change the corporation name to Castle Creek outfitters next year.

A letter and proposed changes in the Outfitters and Guides Act to be presented to the legislature, from Guy Hurlbutt, were read.

The minutes of the August 29 & 30 meeting were read and approved.

The Grand Canyon Dories law suit was discussed.

The board recessed for lunch at 12:00.

The meeting reconvened at 1:30 p.m. with the same members present and Guy Hurlbutt, attorney from the Attorney General's office.

Dave Wishney, attorney for Grand Canyon Dories came to the office to request some information from our files for the trial.

The board discussed the investigators contracts, and will consider a raise of \$5.00 a day in next years salaries. The secretary was instructed to write the investigators and ask them if they will come to the December meeting, and inform them that due to a shortage of money the board will pay their expenses, but not their daily fees. The board agreed that James Baughman and Ivol Sies, board members, should be responsible for the investigators itineraries.

The board reviewed the request of Guth Enterprises, Inc. to transfer their Main Salmon float boating license to William R. Guth. Lon Jarvis made a motion to approve the transfer, seconded by Ivol Sies and unanimously approved.

The board reviewed the incomplete guide application of Thomas Fenger and Steven F. McFarland for outfitter Randy Berry. A letter will be written instructing Mr. Berry to complete these applications and to get his house in order as the next time he violates a rule and regulation or law the board will take the maximum action.

November 7 & 8, 1977

Cal Stoddard's request for Chuck Willmore's hunting area, and letter from James C. Herndon, attorney for Willmore and Stoddard, was reviewed. Mr. Baughman made a motion to approve the transfer and to include Willmore's power boating in the transfer, seconded by Bill Guth, and approved unanimously.

Ron Malone's application for the Flying Dutchman big game hunting area was tabled. Mr. Malone will be asked to appear at the December meeting to discuss this and a complaint from John H. Andresek of Menomonee Falls, Wisc.

A letter from the Lowman Ranger (Brock) about not issuing a permit to Steve Jordan next year and recommending that the board not issue him a license was read and discussed. The board telephoned Mr. Brock and discussed the problem with them.

A letter from Roy E. Powis was read asking for a refund on the money paid on James S. Keener's guide application. A letter is to be written quoting Idaho Code 36-2108 (b-2) on refunds for first year applicants.

Three letters from Cecil Sanford about Wally Beamer, H. K. Barker, and Windy Caldwell about boating hunters on the Snake River were read.

The meeting with the forest service and bureau of land management personnel was set for Wednesday morning, December 7. All forest service supervisors of Idaho and B.L.M. personnel will be written as to the time and place.

December 5 will be the hearing date for the Stanton C. Miller case. Paul Boyd will be the hearing officer.

A list of lodges and resorts from the paper with activities listed which could be outfitting was discussed by the board and will be given to our investigators to be checked.

The price of installing another telephone and the monthly bill was discussed and tabled until the office lease, which expires July 1, 1978, is decided upon.

A letter from the legislative fiscal analyst on the budget was reviewed.

A letter from the Public Employees Retirement System on volunteer life insurance plan was read.

A copy of a letter from Bill Worf to the Montana Outfitters and Guides was read.

The board recessed at 5:45 p.m.

On Tuesday November 8, the meeting reconvened at 8:45 a.m. with Rex Lanham, chairman, Bill Guth, Lon Jarvis and Ivol Sies present.

Eldon Beam and Dave Stelling met with the board to discuss making Dave Stelling managing agent for Beam's upper Salmon River boat operation. An application will be sent in for next years license to this effect.

Stanton C. Miller's formal hearing was discussed. Tim Rich and Forest Hayes will be contacted to see what they know about this case and then decided if they should be asked to come to the December 5 hearing. The board gave the Sec. approval to sign all necessary papers.

Grand Canyon Dorries law suit was again discussed.

Mr. Baughman arrived at 10:00 a.m.

A letter from A. M. Oakes, Jr. with a complaint against Duane Beale was read. As the complaint concerns Lyle Phelps and Duane Beale, both will be called in to the December meeting.

Ted Epley's letters on complaints about Terry Barkell illegally outfitting in his area was read. A letter is to be written to Mr. Epley stating that our investigator tried to contact him but since he did not that the board will continue our investigation into the matter.

Letters from Dick McAfee and K. R. Strickler about Jim Smith outfitting in the Hidden Valley area was read. Mr. Smith and Mr. McAfee telephoned the office about this matter and a letter has been written to Mr. Strickler about settling this problem.

A letter from John B. Conti requesting the number and name of Lewis Blair Harrington's bonding company was read.

Replies from all the outfitter Ryan Hunt complained about cougar hunting out of their areas were read.

Complaints from Teeter L. Lily, Ron Waggoner, Robert Crist and Gary Vaughn against Big Creek Recreation Unlimited, Inc. and Bruce Minter, and Mike Silvers, an unlicensed guide, was read. The board decided to have Mike Silvers and Scott Farr, M.A. for Big Creek, to meet with the board in December to discuss this complaint. Brent Hyde of Fish and Game also telephoned that he had a call from a man that Mike Silvers had been a guide with him and they had gotten lost.

The board recessed for lunch at 12:00

The meeting reconvened at 1:15 with the same members present.

A copy of a letter from Richard E. Abraham, sent to the Attorney General's office about Ramshorn Lodge was read. The secretary was instructed to advise him that lodges who furnish horses, but do not guide, are not under our jurisdiction and suggest that he contact the Better Business Bureau.

Mr. Baughman and Mr. Sies reported on a conversation with Mr. E. E. Bollinger of Mountain Home, about an itinerary of a hunt that he, J. L. Patterson of Mountain Home and J. T. Patterson from Texas were suppose to have with Wally York. However, when Wally York was contacted he had no knowledge of this hunt. As no money was paid to anyone, the board tabled the matter until more information is received.

Guy Hurlbutt of the Attorney General's office telephoned and said

the judge for the Grand Canyon Dories case had postponed the trial until January as there is a case before the supreme court concerning the fees of nonresident fish and game licenses and the judge though this would have a bearing on this case.

A complaint from a Walter Hurlimann against Dave Stucker was discussed. Dave Stucker is to be asked to meet with the board in December.

The board instructed the secretary to write Guy Hurlbutt of the attorney generals office for his legal opinion that if the forest service or the bureau of land management does not sign an outfitter application if it is legal for the board not to issue a license for this reason.

The following incomplete applications were discussed and the outfitters will be written to have all the applications completed by the next meeting or to come in and explain why they are not complete.
