

OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD

Boise, Idaho

May 15 & 16, 1978

The regular meeting of the Outfitters and Guides Board met on May 15, 1978 at 8:30 a.m. with Rex Lanham, Chairman, James Baughman, Lon Jarvis and Ivol Sies present.

The Stanton Miller case order was discussed. A letter is to be sent to Mr. Miller and his attorney, James Hendron, about the questionnaire for Miller's guests, and the statement for the hearing expenses.

Receipts and disbursements from January to May 15 were read and discussed.

Minutes of the Feb. 13-51, March 9 and March 27-30 meetings were read and approved.

Tom Hansen and Dave Howard met with the board to inquire if Mr. Hansen released his area around Smiths Ferry if Dave Howard could be licensed for it. Mr. Hansen is to send a letter to the board releasing this area, and then the board will consider the request from Mr. Howard.

Fred Crane of Pocatello met with the board to discuss a horse race next year from Delaware to California which will go thru a corner of Idaho, and what they will need to do to be legal. He also inquired about horseback riding around McCammon. He was advised to complete an application, send a map of the area requested, and complete the test he was given and when it was all received the board would consider the request for the horseback riding.

Don McPherson of the Fish and Game Department telephoned to notify the board that Gladys York has bought 79 hunting licenses to this date.

The board discussed hiring new help as the secretary is resigning August 1st.

The minutes of April 11-13 was read and corrected.

The board talked to Bill Bernt on the telephone about Red Cross card requirements for his guides.

Minutes of the April 19-20 meeting were read and approved.

Gordon Bransford and John Dark met with the board to discuss the possibility of John Dark releasing his area to Gordon Bransford. Mr. Dark wrote a letter releasing his area if the board approves the application of Gordon Bransford. Mr. Bransford was given an outfitter test to complete and return.

The board recessed for lunch at 12:00 and reconvened at 1:15 p.m. with the same members present.

Grady Smith met with the board to discuss his new outfitter application. No decision could be made as the completed application was not received.

A letter from Richard Jones of World Wide Expeditions asking to have one guide for every five sportyaks was read. The board unanimously approved this exception as stated in rule 26b, for this year.

A letter from Dave Giles asking for an exception to rule 26b was read. This was tabled for more information.

It was the board's opinion that if a guide application was submitted and it included a request for trainee cards for boating along with other activities that a \$10 fee should not be charged when the extension was added to the license for boating after the copy of the training card was received in the office.

The board decided that Mary Shrier's training trip taken this spring would not count as an application had not been submitted before the trip was taken.

Patrick Silvers, Gilbert Powell and Roy Brock, guide applicants, were placed on probation for game violations.

James Baughman made a motion to "reincind the statement that the Outfitters and Guides Board will obtain the concervation officers signature on applications." The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

The board discussed nonuse of rivers and the possibility of not renewing a license for this reason.

The board recessed at 4:45 p.m.

Tuesday, May 16, the meeting reconvened at 8:30 a.m. with Rex Lanham, Chairman, James Baughman, Lon Jarvis and Ivol Sies present.

Phil Swanstrom, investigator, was present and discussed his next assignment in eastern Idaho on the 24th to check the outfitters and guides in that area.

Guy Hurlbutt, the board's attorney, arrived and discussed with the board the minutes and the public access to them.

Guy will call the prosecuting attorney in Lemhi County to proceed with the Grand Canyon Dories guide case.

Guy said that it would be legal to issue licenses early but each person must be informed the license would not be effective until April 1, of the license year.

There was a discussion whether the person who runs the hounds for bear or cougar hunting should be licensed, but no decision was made.

The board's questionnaire to go to Stanton Miller's guests this boating season, was reviewed. A copy of the questionnaire will be sent to Guy Hurlbutt to approve the contents. A letter will be sent to James C. Herndon, attorney for Stanton Miller, by Guy, concerning the questionnaire and a statement for hearing expenses.

The board discussed proposed changes for the rules and regulations to be presented at the formal hearing on June 12, at the Fish and Game building beginning at 9:00 A.M.

The board recessed for lunch and reconvened at 1:00 P.M. with the same members present.

The discussion on the proposed changes in the rules and regulations continued.

Hank Miller's guide license applications were discussed and a letter is to be written.

The board received a telephone call from Bill Bernt about his boat trainees Red Cross cards.

The next board meeting will be on June 12 & 13 for the public hearing on the rules and regulations and regular business.

The meeting adjourned at 4:00 P.M.
