

OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD

May 24 and 25, 1979

Boise, Idaho

Thursday, May 24, at 8:30 a.m., the following members of the board convened for the regular board meeting: Jim Baughman, Vice-Chairman, Lon Jarvis, Bill Guth and Ivol Sies. Also in attendance was their attorney, Guy Hurlbutt. Chairman Rex Lanham telephoned to advise that he was attending the Wilderness Council Meeting and would be along later.

Attorney Hurlbutt talked with the Board about the federal case pending against the Board and the hearing scheduled on Grand Canyon Dorries/Flying H Ranches vs. State of Idaho. He mentioned that James Gellein of Flying H Ranches has approached him about getting an Idaho outfitter license on the Hell's Canyon section of the Snake River if he can get the F. S. to make an exception and give him a permit. The Board said they would check once again to determine if there is an open space, but if there is one, it should go to the outfitter who has or can get a permit. They also agreed that if Mr. Gellein requested a meeting with the board, that they would listen to him, and that he could file an application.

Reciprocal licensing between the states was discussed, and the Hell's Canyon stretch of the Snake River is unique to Oregon and Idaho only was pointed out.

Guy then brought up again the problems he is encountering in obtaining the misdirected fine monies from Lemhi County. The George May fine money from Idaho County was also discussed and Guy suggested that the office call to see if it was paid as agreed, then to proceed with a written request for the state's share and advise the procedure. Guy then left the meeting.

At 9:30 a.m.. Max and Jeff Bitton, and State Representative, Dan Kelly, all of Mountain Home met with the Board regarding a denial to Bittons of their request to hunt big game on the East Fork of the Salmon River. They requested an explanation, and the Board told them that information from Fish and Game, the Forest Service, and the Board's own knowledge of the accessibility and hunting pressure by the general public has indicated that an outfitter was not needed in that area. Jeff said the local C.O. had indicated the herd regrowth was sufficient and the herd would not be impaired by trophy hunts as they have planned. He said the Forest Service was agreeable to a "trial year" on trophy hunting.

Lon mentioned the local hunting pressure and asked where they would locate a camp. Mr. Baughman mentioned that the area was not remote enough for commercial hunting. After more discussion on distance etc., Rep. Kelly then asked a few questions. He said that his interest was in what affects the most people. Rep. Kelly also asked if there was a conflict between the agencies, and Mr. Baughman explained that all agencies are working together and that once a license is issued, it is hard to pull that license, therefore we cannot issue a license on a "trial basis".

Jeff mentioned that the Board could talk with Guy Pense of the Forest Service, as they were leaving the meeting. The Board then determined that they would seek another determination from the Fish and Game on whether the area could support another outfitter, but Bill and Lon both said they were against issuance of limited licenses.

Then, as a new outfitter applicant, J. Brad Stockman, Ketchum, joined the meeting, Chairman Lanham also arrived. Mr. Stockman explained that he wanted to outfit "custom" fishing and trailride trips in the S.N.R.A. area, as he plans to work with young people in that area. He explained and showed on the map where S.N.R.A. Manager, Dave Lee approved the

use of little used lakes in the Boulder Mountains. Lon said he had just talked with Dave Lee and that permits could be approved to both Stockman and Stager in the area, but they will monitor their operations very closely. The Board gave Mr. Stockman a test to complete and approved his application.

Regular business then was taken up and the minutes of the February meeting were read. An objection was registered by Mr. Baughman concerning the wording of the motion made to deny Larry Jarrett's additional area request. The Board denied Larry Jarrett's extension of area for big game hunting as well as bear and cougar hunting, as it was worded. All members of the Board concurred and the secretary was instructed to correct the minutes.

Jerry Kooyers, Riggins and recently from Los Altos, CA, met with the Board at 11:30 a.m., and presented a partially completed application which represents four old friends who have hunted Idaho around Riggins and decided to go into outfitting, but for boating and fishing. They purchased the property, boat building, and one boat of Bruce Oakes' who has moved his boat building business to Lewiston. Bruce Oakes has written a letter releasing what he is presently licensed for in Idaho. Mr. Kooyers said they have mining interests on the old Cook Ranch, and the Board pointed out that the hunting area is presently licensed to Moose Creek Outfitters and any commercial hunting would be illegal. The rest of the forms required to complete the applications were given to Mr. Kooyers. There will be two outfitter licenses--one for the partnership that will be called Havlah Group, and one for Jerry Kooyers, as managing agent. Mr. Kooyers will qualify for boating as soon as possible.

The Board recessed for lunch, and reconvened at 1:15 p.m., with all members of the Board present.

Spence Warner, Swan Valley met with the Board for a license as a new boating outfitter. A. W. Angell has released this area for consideration for licensing to Mr. Warner on the South Fork of the Snake River. Mr. Warner advised the Board that he has a lodge on the South Fork in Connant Valley and will operate the outfitting business from there. After Mr. Warner left the meeting, the Board discussed his previous operation on the rivers and read a letter of complaint by outfitter John Hill regarding Mr. Warner. They determined that he should be licensed and would approve his application as soon as it was completed.

The Board received a call from enforcement officer, Mike Wilkins, regarding Hank Miller's trainee, Mike Osborn taking friends on the river; outfitter Lingnaw being short one guide and claiming only a private trip and one of Lingnaw's guides having a blank card.

The March 26 through 29, 1979 minutes were read. They were approved, by motion of Ivol, seconded by Jim and passed. The April 10 and 11, 1979 minutes were then read and approved. Jim proposed the motion and Ivol seconded and passed by all members. Also a list of expenses paid for the past three months were reviewed by the Board and approved.

The 3:00 p.m. appointment was George Duncan, Orofino asking for licensing as a bear/cougar outfitter in the area released by Daniel Supple. He said he has purchased some of Mr. Supple's dogs and asked further for another area to be licensed around where he lives on Orofino Creek. The Board said they would consider his application as presented and will consider the Orofino Creek area where he lives if presented at a later date.

Complaints and investigations were then presented for review as follows: Cecil's report on his investigation of Ansel Roberts' complaint; Phil's investigation of Ken Robertson,

Grants Pass, OR, and his summary report was read; Mike's citation of Hal Stanbrook (shooting incident); Sisson's guides training on the Snake River--Mr. Baughman's check of training; Barbara Unkie, guide training for outfitter, Richard Jones reviewed; Andreessen/Knauff court case and most of complaint regarding licensing, etc. dismissed; and George May was discussed as the Forest Service had called and Consumer Protection has written a letter. It was agreed by the Board to accept an unnotarized statement on Barbara Unkie's training from Steve Gale.

The meeting was interrupted by a telephone call from one of John Jones' guides, Charles Hortorf, about his lost training card, and what proof was needed to substantiate his training. Then his outfitter, John Jones, called. Bill took the calls. There then followed a discussion by the Board on what should be required. It was determined that in this case, a statement signed by the training supervisor would be accepted, and the Board then could have Mike check the F. S. permits.

The Jarrett denial was again brought up and the denial letter written to Jarrett was read. It was in error. A letter will be written to correct the wording in the denial letter of February 16, 1979.

The Board recessed at 5:20 p.m., by motion made by Lon, seconded by Bill and unanimous agreement.

Friday, May 25, 1979

At 8:00 a.m., the Board reconvened with all members present.

Mr. Mark Powell, Boise met with the Board about obtaining an outfitter license to hunt bear and cougar. He said he knew bear hunting best and has hunted the past 10 years. He further stated he had about 30 hounds and has a hearing difficulty and has devised an electronic finder which he and his brother now manufacture.

The area in units 33 and 39 were discussed and the map was checked for other areas he might have if not allowed in those areas. He said he would forego cougar hunting if it was determined he might have an area limited to bear only.

Two calls were received by the Board from outfitter, Richard Jones regarding Barbara Unkie's training during the morning's meeting. It was determined that she needed at least one more trip, by what has been reported, and that Mike should check the trip by Jones advising of the training 3-days in advance. A note was put in the Unkie file.

Complaints and investigation was then continued--Bill Crombie, and L. A., California policeman who is advertising and booking the Ken Smith area; Zeke West's letter complaining of the Guth brothers hunting bear in his area--Bill explained they and Giles have hunted bear that far down the river for years without any problem, but felt that an overheard conversation had prompted the complaint. The Board determined that they should get together and resolve the problem and that the Board would write a letter to Zeke West.

There followed a discussion of the outfitters acceptance of combining the bear/cougar hunting areas and the agreements among the outfitters. Jim and Bill said they thought there was much opposition to the concept but Lon felt it was being accepted okay among some.

Next, Jack Wemple not being in his summer area as reported by Powell Ranger District was discussed; and then Al Beam Floats, Inc. use of the Bruneau and Owyhee Rivers was discussed. The Board determined to contact Wally Meyer, of BLM, to find out what use his permits report, and to write Beam a letter regarding this.

New business was next reported. The Fish and Game Department's radio contract with the Board renewal which was agreed by the Board to be renewed--it was noted also that Cecil has the one radio and that Phil would try to get the second unit; an adding machine for the office was decided upon, the same machine as was bid by Capitol Machines for the Liquor Dispensary Dept.; also the Dept. of Administration's inquiry of this office's out of state travel; the report of the insurance meeting attended by the secretary; and finally, the interview of the office staff by Bill Hagdorn of Department of Parks and Recreation.

Next miscellaneous outfitter and state business was taken up which included the following: a letter from Edwina and Don Nitz expressing a desire to sell their outfitting business; Joe Peck, Bob Cole, Middle Fork Lodge and Garry Madsen's agreement on hunting their combined areas for bear and cougar only from the end of the regular elk and deer season through June 30th each year--The Board voted to accept this proposal, by motion made by Lon, seconded by Ivol, and carried; a letter from the F. S. to Cal Stoddard was read; Elwood Masoner's last minute demands for licensing and his comments of the Board approving Mackay Bar to put-in at Morgan Ranch on the Middle Fork of the Salmon, and their denial of his request on the Selway; David Giles' request for float trips exception in accordance with Rule No. 26 (a), which was approved by motion by Bill, seconded by Jim and passed--a letter will be sent on this approval, with a carbon copy to Mike; Jerry Hughes' request to be relicensed in his name only--not using the corporation business, he has returned his corporation license and it will be attached to his file; and Jay Verle Duerden's apology letter of his comments made against the licensing board at the McCall meeting was read--determined to send an acceptance letter back to him.

At 11:00 a.m., an appointment with the Board was James Campbell, M.A. for Shepp Ranch Inc., and a new owner, Paul Resnick of Atherton, CA, for consideration of turning over the business named Shepp Ranch to Mr. Resnick, which would include the hunting area and the power boating on the Main Salmon River. Jim Campbell would retain some of the land and would retain the float boating on the Main Salmon River and would continue as managing agent for Shepp Ranch, at least one year he said. Mr. Resnick has purchased two jet boats but does not plan to qualify for guiding at present. Mr. Campbell will continue his business under the name of Wild Rivers-Idaho.

The Board saw no problem but determined that new licenses would be required of Mr. Campbell. Forms were given to be completed.

Attorney Guy Hurlbutt telephoned to inform the Board the results of the preliminary hearing in the Grand Canyon Dories, Inc./Flying H Ranches case.

Miscellaneous outfitter business was continued. A report of outfitter applicant, Tim Drew, Driggs, Idaho, dying from an accident. He had applied as managing agent for Infinite Odyssey, and now Jenny Marsh, Boston, Massachusetts will apply as M.A.; outfitter Garn Christenson's Pilot Survival School brochure was reviewed; the Governor's letter of Bill Guth's reappointment for term expiring April 20, 1982; BLM's Environment Survey and Tour participation was talked over; Snake River NRA newsletter was presented; and miscellaneous state correspondence was reviewed.

Unfinished business which included resolutions on the new rivers being opened to commercial operation was conducted. The following boating was enacted: South Fork of

Payette River--by motion made by Bill, seconded by Lon and passed that the first year float boating be revised to include 3 total for boating of the 5 maximum set, and a study moritorium to continue; North Fork of Payette River--by same motion, passed un-animously that the dates set by the Board, March 1 through June 30 are determined to be dates for float boating both river sections; Clark Fork River and Middle Fork of Payette River, by same motion, that these two rivers are not suitable for boating; then, by motion made by Ivol, seconded by Bill and passed unanaimously, that the Kootnai River, Montana Boundary to Canada Boundary, and St. Maries River (entire section) are opened the entire year for power and float boating, maximum each is 5, with 2 float and 2 power boaters each the first year with a study moritorium; then, by the same motion, passed unanaimously that (lower) Priest River, Dickensheet Camp-ground to Priest River City, and Moyie River, International Boundary to Bonners Ferry Municipal Dam, and South Fork of Clearwater River, South Fork Lodge to Clearwater River, and North Fork of Coeur d'Alene River, Devil's Elbow to South Fork, all four rivers will have boating dates of March 1 through June 30, maximum 5 each with 2 each for float boating only, no power boating, and a study moritorium. The North Fork of Payette River, Cabarton to Smith's Ferry had previously been determine in the minutes of March 28, to be maximum 5 with limit to 2 float boaters the first year, with a study moritorium, and no power boating, with cut-off date as July 1. The Main Payette River, Banks to Black Canyon Dam was previously determined in the minutes of March 28, 1979 to be maximum 5 with limit to 3 licensed float boaters the first year, with a study moritorium, and no power boating, with no cut-off date for float boating.

Other boating business was then brought to the attention of the board: Richard Helfrich's letter of concern because of no use in 1978 and possibly none in 1979 on the lower Salmon River. He stated he had bookings in 1976 and 1977 however, and the Board determined that a letter be sent stating there would be no jeopardy. Also a letter was read from John R. Jones about his efforts to obtain permits on the Middle Fork and Main Salmon Rivers, Selway and the Snake River - Hell's Canyon section; Ken Warren of Portland, Oregon advertising Idaho rivers that he is reportedly purchasing some of Mike Carey's business--also LuVerne Grussing's letter regarding his use of the Snake River and attempt to use the lower Salmon River; Chuck Boyd and Johnny Joe Bryant's request for priority list on the lower Main Salmon; and Skip Zapffe's letter about fishing being poor and afraid of loosing the permit and license he has on the lower Salmon River. The Board determined to write letters in answer to those above.

A letter from Fish and Game showing the bear harvest in each unit was reviewed. Also Jim brought up that in the Board's correspondence to Fish and Game, it would be wise to avoid names in our inquiries, and all members concurred.

Ivol mentioned that the minutes of the previous meeting should be sent out to each member in advance of the meeting and this was discussed. The Board's decision was, the minutes be typed and a copy be placed at each members seat around the table so that they may review them as they are read, and that they be read first thing each meeting.

Applications were reviewed and approved. Also the Forest Service's letter about not approving a permit for Waller into the old Lafe Cox area was read. The applications for Waller/Howard/True Trophy's are not complete, therefore no decision.

The requests from three outfitters that their late filing fees be waived were re-viewed with the following decisions: Stanley Sweet would have to pay his late fee; Timothy Gardiner and Willard Godfrey would have their fees waived. Notations of the requests and reasons for approval or disapproval are entered in each outfitters' file.
