

OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD

August 29, 30, & 31, 1979

Boise, Idaho

The Outfitters and Guides Board convened at 8:30 a.m., with Vice-Chairman James Baughman, Lon Jarvis and Ivol Sies in attendance. Applications were reviewed and approved.

Chairman Rex Lanham joined the meeting at 9:00 a.m., and the Mortar Creek fire, involving outfitter areas of Middle Fork Lodge and Bob Cole (mostly) and Middlefork Ranch, Joe Peck and Gary Madsen, was discussed.

Bill Guth joined the meeting at 9:20. Then Homer and Dennis Joseph (father & son) of Taylorsville, California, accompanied by Bruce Henderson, Lucile, met with the Board about transfer of Bruce's area to Dennis Joseph. Homer Joseph will guide for his son, beginning next year. The Board explained that the summer activities would be joint use with Paul Boyer licensed in the same area at present, and warned of overbooking on short hunting season. Bruce mentioned there was also bow hunting, and bear and cougar hunting. Dennis Joseph may use the boating on the lower Salmon River. Bruce said he would take care of his clients this year and will assist the Josephs for the next two years. Dennis will work two weeks with Bruce this year and Homer will guide for Stan Potts this year.

At 10:00 a.m., the minutes of July 17-19, 1979 were read, corrected, and approved by motion of Lon, seconded by Jim and passed.

Then outfitter business was worked on, which involved the Ken Smith/Ron Malone proposed division of Malone's area, which the Forest Service will not approve; Lyle Kunz phone call regarding Rick's College canoeists on the Teton River, the Board will write a letter to Mr. Clark; letters written to Red Cross Chapters by the Board regarding those altering their Red Cross cards were reviewed; Sun Valley Co. getting their guides licensed and letters written to Sun Valley Co., and Lon's contact of the managing agent, Donald Anderson; Bill Crombie, new outfitter of Ken Smith area, meeting with board members Jim Baughman and Ivol Sies--notes taken were read; Heatherington transferring area to Kindt and Knutson; and then the request of Gary Madsen to transfer part of his area to Jim Smith was discussed.

The Madsen to Jim Smith transfer of area in Unit 27-A, which borders on Smith, was checked on the map and discussed at length. The Board's decision was to contact Fish and Game for game population, and write Madsen and Smith that an application, with Forest Service comments and fee were due for the Board's decision.

Rex left the meeting at 11:45, as the Board discussed licensing of the old Gillespie area to Jerry Meyers, Salmon. After much discussion, checking of map and review of Fish and Game report on resources, it was passed by motion made by Bill, and seconded by Lon that all hunting, except elk and deer, and fishing and trailrides be licensed. Ivol cast a descending vote.

The meeting then recessed for lunch, and reconvened at 12:55 p.m. All members were present except Rex Lanham. Cecil's call about a previous outfitter back in the area of Sweeners was discussed...determined that Cecil be instructed to investigate and arrest if possible, and the Forest Service to be informed. Ivol called Cecil.

Donald Whitecotton, St. Maries being unlicensed but accepting deposits was reported by telephone call from prospective client. He was instructed to contact the Attorney General's office, as they are working on a consumers protection complaint. The outfitter application is incomplete as no bond has been received.

At 1:30 p.m., William and Kris Kellum, Lewiston met with the Board regarding their citation of boating without a license on the Snake River, Idaho Code 36-2104. The Board reviewed brochures, letters, pictures and maps of where they power operate their craft, "The Whatever", and contend that their operation is not outfitting or guiding, only a pleasure/dinner combination, operating in the backwaters of Lower Granite Dam at Lewiston and up to the mouth of the Clearwater River, and would not seek an outfitter license.

The Board's decision was to have Attorney Guy Hurlbutt obtain a determination on whether this case should be continued.

Then outfitter business was continued: Tim Craig's, Lewiston, request for Lochsa River was approved; Con Hourihan, Clover Valley, Nevada letter to the Board about his camp and the Board's answer were read; Ed McCallum's, Bonner Ferry, Idaho extension for big game, bear and cougar hunting was reviewed and approved for bear and cougar - denied for big game; Ron Vaughn's letter regarding overlap area with Ken Smith, now licensed to Crombie, was reviewed--maps and licenses and files of Rex Lanham and Sandy Brooks were checked. Determination was that a letter will be sent explaining that area was originally licensed in 1962 to Brooks, then in 1966 to Lanham. The (Smith) Crombie campsite near the boundary was the problem and the Board determined that the Forest Service be advised, as well as Crombie, that this camp be moved away from the boundary.

Paul Filer, Riggins and Neal DeWitt, Route #1, New Meadows met with the Board about Filer transferring his outfitting business to DeWitt. DeWitt will train for power boat operation as the river level permits, Filer will train. DeWitt explained that the float boating business may be expanded as his son and son-in-law are interested. Paul will not train the float boating. Chukkar hunting was requested to be added--no applications but the Board saw no problem to add bird hunting.

Then Race Davies, Director of Public Policy Research Center, ISU, Pocatello, Idaho and Ron Timpson, Research Assistant met with the Board about federal agencies management of Idaho land and its effect on the outfitting industry.

Rex Lanham left the meeting at 4:50 p.m.

Then outfitter business was finished which included: Forest Service letters and phone calls regarding outfitter applicant John Waite boat-fishing the Salmon River; Dan Rotthoff's use permit may be cancelled if insurance not renewed; and Gladys York's poor clean up of campsites may impede permits; and other miscellaneous letters and phone calls.

The meeting recessed at 5:10 p.m. by motion of Iv01, seconded by Lon and unanimously passed.

Thursday, August 30, 1979

The board meeting reconvened at 8:30 a.m. with all members, except Rex Lanham, in attendance.

Cecil was called by Iv01 on an enforcement problem regarding Whipple (now of Montana) back in his old area assigned to James Sweeney.

The Board reviewed their budget for FY 1980-81 and approved it. They noted that the reward money budgeted at \$1,000 has not been offered, but determined it may be offered for conviction inducement.

Rex joined the meeting at 9:00 a.m. and new business was reviewed as follows: Auditor's EIS training session and state switching to 2-week pay periods; mileage rate increase; Administrative Procedure Manual requested by I.P.C.; the office's purchase of a hat/coat rack; typewriter repair and IBM contract being dropped; our Attorney's July services claim paid; the Parks Department September 18 meeting at McCall - Board's decision that Ivol will represent the Board; and the print shop's poor job on our outfitter lists - 800 accepted/1200 to be reprinted.

Then Cecil Sanford was called by members of the Board--he reported the Harold E. Hedrick, Clarkston, Washington case was thrown out and that he was writing a summary of his citation in the Kellum case for the court and will send the Board a copy.

At 10:00 a.m. James Black, a teacher at Eastern Washington University met with the Board about the University's use of Idaho rivers. He explained that he is paid for his boating trips over and above his wages but the trips were primarily to cover costs of get-acquainted excursions for faculty, staff and families, but EWU plans to escalate to include students in their river program. They will apply by priority for other Idaho rivers but are mainly interested in the lower Salmon, and Snake Rivers at present. They will attempt to obtain licenses.

Then Mike Wilkins' enforcement and attitude was discussed by the Board. When Guy Hurlbutt joined the meeting at 11:30 a.m. he was asked questions about enforcement. He said that a guide's responsibility was for the safety involved, and that boat identity was the responsibility of the outfitter.

Attorney Hurlbutt was then asked about the Grand Canyon Dorries/Flying H Ranch case and he told the Board that the Judge has been out of town for the past five weeks and the case is awaiting him.

Then the Kellum case was explained to Attorney Hurlbutt and Guy said from this explanation that it was probably not an outfitter operation per se, but because there is the question, obtaining a license would insure others not assuming that licensing was not necessary in their operation. Guy said he would talk to the Prosecuting Attorney and would then advise the Board.

The meeting recessed for lunch and reconvened at 1:00 p.m. with all members, except Rex, reviewing and approving application. Then a summary of July 18 board meeting in which "Guidelines for Enforcement Pay" was determined, was read and approved to be mailed to each enforcement officer by motion of Bill and seconded by Lon.

Rex joined the meeting at 2 p.m.

Bob Hetherington, Albuquerque, NM, and two applicants, Doug Kindt and Richard Knutson of S. Dakota and Challis, met with the Board about release of Hetherington's assigned area. Their applications were incomplete, but they will complete them for both to be outfitters operating with Doug Kindt as M.A., dba KD Bar K Outfitters. They were advised to complete first aid course before they would be licensed as they plan to guide their hunters.

Jim Taul, Irwin, Idaho and a new outfitter applicant, from Swan Valley, Lyle Piram (a guide for John Hill), met with the Board. No application was presented for Lyle Piram but Taul said he would release his area if agreement can be made. Lyle Piram asked to extend the float operation on the South Fork of the Snake River to the mouth of Henry's Fork.

After Mr. Taul and Mr. Piram left the meeting, Rex explained, the outcome of his lunch meeting with Attorney Hurlbutt: Guy will continue to serve as the Board's attorney and not cancel his contract with the Board at the present time.

Then "State and Board Business" was worked on as follows: a letter from State Insurance Specialist, Don Barklow was reviewed which claimed the Board has no right to the overpayment on premium money paid to Continental Life Insurance per Idaho Code 59-1210 (3), as revised 1975. He advises that overpayments refunded goes to Group Insurance Fund. Then the \$375.00 check received from Idaho County for fine money paid on George May court fine was presented. Ivol made a motion, seconded by Bill and passed that the Board instruct our attorney to take whatever steps necessary to recover our Lemhi County fine money. Jim then made a motion that the State Insurance recovery money situation also be turned to our attorney, Bill seconded and passed.

Complaints and investigations were then reviewed: Dr. Phillip's letter and the Board's answer reviewed (complaint against Ken Smith); William Mason, M.A. for Snug Co. letter claiming innocent and refuting Fish and Game Conservation Officer report of guilty plea and fine. The Board determined that Mr. Mason must meet and explain to the Board's satisfaction as proof was presented that he did appear and pay a fine; Tom Drinville's complaints from two different trips and clients were read -- determined that Drinville must meet with the Board; and a complaint against Tonsmeire Wilderness River Outfitters, Inc. about a Montana river trip was read. Con Hourihan and Tom Drinville will be scheduled to meet with the Board in December.

Boating was presented which included letters from Eldon Beam of his use of the Owyhee River; and Hank Miller's explanation of use of a guide trainee being used on a commercial trip when a guide was injured and his comments about the rules not working.

The meeting then recessed at 5:05 p.m.

Friday, August 31, 1979

The board meeting reconvened, with all members present, and Dave Stuckers application was reviewed and approved but ~~to be~~ determined to be held for Big Creek Recreation approval.

The radio received from Fish and Game was brought to the Board's attention and the Board discussed obtaining Bob Judson, Lewiston Sheriff's Deputy as a part time enforcement officer.

Then "Boating" was continued: Incomplete applications of guide Merrill Zilkowski and outfitters Ken Warren and Ken Jackson were reviewed; Steve Curry's Western Rivers of Idaho numerous complimentary letters and phone call complaint about docks being tied up for overly period of time were discussed. The Board will write Steve about the problem; Attorney General's compliment letter about John Jones' operation; and letters to and from the office about rules and regulations from Janet Cremin and Curtis Chang and Attorney Herndon for Woodrow Hassinger.

Then rules and regulation changes were worked on until lunch recess.

After lunch, all members, except Rex, reviewed rules and regulations again and listed tentative changes. Rex joined the meeting at 2 p.m.

Ken Smith telephoned to discuss this years operation in Malone's area--Mr. Baughman

and Lon talked to him. It was agreed that he would work for Malone as a guide, but Forest Service may give a permit after October 15th. His complaintant, Dr. Phillips, too was discussed and Smith agreed he would get the refund on his hunt to him.

In discussing the rule changes, it was determined that opening of the following new rivers for commercial operation would be proposed: E. Fork of Owyhee River; Pend Oreille River; Main Salmon from Highway 93 Bridge south of Challis to North Fork with no limitations; Blackfoot River; also change the Salmon River sections for power boating on Main Salmon: mouth of Middle Fork to Salmon Falls: Salmon Falls to Mackay Bar and Mackay Bar to Spring Bar to require 25 hours of training on each section to qualify to guide.

The Board determined that the next meeting will be September 10, 1979, and Bill Guth left the meeting at 3:45 p.m.

Guide license applications were reviewed and the following changes proposed: Lon made the motion, Jim seconded and was passed that the five references required of guides be taken off the applications, Section C-2; change the wording to read "all guides" must have a current Red Cross card, and to list all animals determined to be big game.

A motion was made, by Iv01 and seconded by Lon, and passed that every license application mailed shall have a set of rules and regulations sent with it. Also the law and rules and regulations be sent with new outfitter applications was made by Iv01, seconded by Lon and passed.

A change on the guide license application to have the outfitter sign a certified statement that the guide has had the required training, etc. was also discussed.

A list of outfitters and guides who have been licensed, extended, or denied is included as a part of these minutes.

The meeting adjourned at 4:45 p.m.
