

OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD

Boise, Idaho

July 17 & 18, 1980

Thursday, July 17, 1980 three members of the Board convened making a quorum, Vice-Chairman Jim Baughman presiding, Bill Guth and Ivöl Sies. Chairman Lanham was absent as he was undergoing doctor's tests.

It was noted that with deep regret, the Middle Fork boating accident that took board member Eldon Handy's life on June 22, 1980. The office was closed for the funeral in Jerome on Wednesday, June 25, with Chairman Rex Lanham, Pat Davis and Edy Blele, office staff, attending.

Enforcement problems of BLM Mark Hilliard's inquiry of Steve Jordan's trips on the Birds of Prey area: He advised this is setting still so the Board instructed Randy to pick up the warrant and cite Jordan. Ivöl suggested the Bitton case be taken up by new officers.

A letter was read that was sent to Mike when he called for return of his deputy card and telephone credit card. He says he needs them for the court cases pending. The Board determined then to have him check eastern Idaho as soon as court cases are through. The Board reviewed Mike's claim for additional hours for pay over the 8-hour day he has been hired on and determined that it will not be paid. This was advised in a letter written to Mike. The Board then determined that Dewey Cavin be sent to Dagger Falls, check on Bitton case at Stanley, and check Sun Valley outfitters. Ivöl then mentioned a call he has received regarding a Glenn Allen of Rocky Mountain Fly Shop, Boise, supposedly outfitting on the S. Fk. of the Boise River -- this will be checked into.

Phil Swanstrum's unavailability in his summer employment with the Forest Service was discussed. It was determined that the Board will write him to have his badge back for use by another officer, and to advise he is not fired -- to keep his card as he may be used when his Forest Service job is through this fall.

Further enforcement was discussed -- Dean Helfrich's boating exception for the Middle Fork -- word will be advised to Dave and Dewey. Also the Fish and Game will be contacted as the radio contract is due for renewal.

The Board then discussed outfitter financial statements and determined that certified bank or accountant signed statements only be accepted. Ivöl made a motion, seconded by Bill and passed.

At 10:45 A.M. Noel Beasley, Ellis, Idaho met with the Board, submitting a map showing an area for outfitting of the old Ish Martin area. It is being released by Ron Malone as Beasley bought out his equity. "Sixty-two Ridge Outfitters" is the new dba name.

Ken Smith's involvement was asked -- only will work as a guide and not furnishing any equipment, said Beasley. Bill mentioned the problems that could arise -- Forest Service does not recognize sub-leasing either. Smith's advertising, that the Board has heard was mentioned and Beasley was warned that this should be watched as Smith could be advertising for his own hunters. Jim explained that Beasley is responsible without having knowledge of what is promised. Mr Beasley will finish his application -- he was instructed to get back to the new District Ranger prior to the Board's approval. He also needs the Red Cross course for his guiding, as planned.

The Board then recessed for lunch.

At 1:30 P.M., the same three members reconvened and were joined by the Board's attorney, Guy Hurlbutt, as the William Bishop, M.A. and Dick Alf's Fly Shop re-hearing before the Board was discussed. Mr. Bishop will be advised of this opportunity and senior officer, Attorney General Deputy Tom Frost will direct the Board on the procedure.

Then at 2:00 P.M., Richard Baker, Lewiston met with the Board, with Guy in attendance, about his denial of outfitter license for float boating on the lower Salmon-Snake Rivers. He claimed he was told by the office staff that he had two Fish and Game violations, when he only had one conviction. He then explained what precipitated the citations -- spot lighting deer and another incident, not tagging properly, which was the conviction. He explained his involvement in lobbying for better Fish and Game laws, on Lewiston City Council and active in politics and wildlife clubs. He then asked for the Board's earliest decision while still fresh in their mind. They advised he would be notified by letter.

After Mr. Baker left the meeting, a vote was taken and the earlier decision was upheld, as nothing new was presented.

The Board then reviewed the Danskin-Artful Angler (Doug Miller) applications with their attorney, then asked Jim Danskin and Doug Miller, West Yellowstone, MT to meet with them.

Mr. Danskin was asked about his sale of business to a Bill Berndt, Bozeman, MT, a year ago that came to light when this business was then sold to Mr. Miller. Jim Danskin said he sold only the retail business and retained his outfitting business in both instances. His residence in West Yellowstone was questioned which he maintained is permanent, also the use of his guides. Danskin says they are all independents, working on contract. Idaho law and rules and regulations were cited by Jim, and Attorney Hurlbutt mentioned insurance liability would possibly not cover in such an arrangement.

Mr. Miller explained The Artful Angler advertising as all fouled up -- printed prior to finding out Danskin would retain the outfitter license; the problems of the applications and mail, and the ill-will generated in West Yellowstone and problems of getting that straightened out.

In answer to Attorney Hurlbutt, Doug Miller said he knew full well that the outfitter business would be retained for 5-years by Danskin and that he is a <sup>Danskin</sup> director of their corporation and will be the managing agent. Mr. Miller said Montana waived his residency requirement and he is now licensed for the Madison River and has 8 boats on the Madison.

Jim Danskin mentioned his early application to avoid penalty. The Board said all okay until the other problems that kept coming up. Mr. Danskin said he would relinquish immediately, if Miller is approved as outfitter, but otherwise will continue as always as manager with payment from clients to him and would continue to contract guides. The Board warned of exelcerated use of guides and mentioned the Bill Benjamin hearing, challenging a limit on licensed use of the Henry's Fork. The Board requested a copy of their contract which Mr. Miller thought had been sent in, but will supply immediately. In answer to Jim, says the actual outfitter will be The Artful Angler, Inc., with Jim Danskin the M.A. until he qualifies. He further stated that Bill Berndt was completely out of the picture.

The Board requested the advertising be changed, until the Artful Angler, Inc. is legally licensed. Mr. Danskin and Mr. Miller then left the meeting at 4:30 P.M.

Guy then explained the Drinville proposal to the Board which would eliminate him from the Indian Lakes Outfitters, Inc. and proposes Richard Nelson, Darby, MT be considered instead. This would eliminate the Drinville Hearing, if acceptable but Guy says until approved, he would just continue the Hearing until a later date. The Board then approved unanimously a decision to this proposal, and application forms will be supplied to have Mr. Nelson comply for license approval.

It was then determined by the Board to pay the expense of Marshall Everhart, Jerome in his testimony for the Board in the Bishop-Benjamin hearing.

Then prior to recess at 5 P.M., Guy mentioned a flaw in the Board's law, Idaho Code 36-2116/36-5416, which was brought to his attention by Attorney Ted Springer of Challis, which needs to be researched and possibly corrected by legislation. A letter concerning this from Guy was read: Idaho Code 36-2116 and 36-2117 were changed in 1978 legislation which dropped the misdemeanor action and makes all cases civil action now.

Friday, July 18, 1980

The meeting reconvened, with all four members, Chairman Lanham, presiding, Jim Baughman, Bill Guth and Ivol Sies.

Office staff wages and vacation time was discussed -- also the expense of the hearing was brought up.

Discussion on enforcement issuing warning tickets and reports of Richard Baker on the river with 19 people, and Wayne Beuke, both of Lewiston, booking on all classified rivers all as private trips with several people listed each time. Other enforcement problems too were discussed: Contacts from SNRA regarding suspect illegal outfitting of a Jack Williams and Tim Gardiner on Silver Creek reports. Cavin will be sent to check out Sun Valley area. Then Mike was called to go to eastern Idaho and it was explained again that he works on call and on 8-hour days.

At 10:00 A.M., Mike Anderson, Toledo, Ohio met with the Board about the hunting outfitting of Guth Enterprises. License would be to him, but Bill and Norm would assist this first year. Applications need to be completed.

At 11:00 A. M. Deputy Attorney General, Tom Frost appeared to explain the next steps in the Bishop/Dick Alf's Fly Shop Hearing case: The proposed hearing officer's decision be considered; the proposed decision sent by letter to the parties, (according to Statute 57-5211), and a firm date set to hear exceptions in oral argument in 10-20 days before the Board; and the Board then to accept only written request for exception hearing when the Board's attorney may also be present. Then if parties are not satisfied at this point, they have the option to continue the case (cases) in District Court.

After Mr. Frost left the meeting, the Board voted to accept Hearing Officer, Matthew Mullaney's proposal for William Bishop, M.A. and Dick Alf's Fly Shop, Sun Valley. Mr. Baughman did not vote as he was a witness. The Board also passed a motion by Ivol, seconded by Jim, to send a letter immediately setting the firm date for exception hearing before the Board of August 11, 1980, to Mr. Bishop, etc.

The Board then recessed for lunch between 12:30 and 1:30 P.M., when all members reconvened.

A phone call complaint from two outfitters was received by the Board on Rick's College canoeists floating the Teton River -- 12 in the party -- spread out, floating twice a day, for the past 12 days. The Board determined that Dick Clark, M.A. will be called about this complaint. Ivol mentioned that a space should be made available on the Teton for Ricks College and emergency rules could be promulgated to effect this.

Outfitter business was worked on which included the following: 1. Mackay Bar's reports on two accidents was read; 2. Masoners (and guides), forcing the Board office to accept cash for fee payments; 3. Stelling's complaint about outfitter Phil Johnson's use on the upper Salmon River, which is licensed but Forest Service does not "permit" as private land involved.

Forest Service/BLM/Fish and Game business included: 1. LuVerne Grussing's inquiry and letters sent to "priority" applicants on the lower Salmon River; 2. Middle Fork Lodge licensing questioned by SNRA forester, Hank Lee; 3. copy of a letter to Gladys York on camp condition was read; 4. Loyal Willis's son-in-law, Bill Gaechter, Denver/Reno being advised by F. S. to get an outfitter license on old George Dovel property; 5. new section opening on St. Joe River proposal from Avery F. S.; 6. copies of Tom Chiver's licenses to be sent to F. S. from Board, as he is now licensed; and 7. Garrigus's letter for his file information - the Board will advise he and attorney may review in Board's office.

Old business: A letter from Dave Burk's attorney of Pocatello was read. The Board will propose a possible appointment for an informal hearing before the Board for the September meeting, with Attorney Hurlbutt notified of the date.


The boating business was reviewed: Dave Gile's report of intercepting ARTA in camp on the Middle Fork and they were one boatman short -- warned, and Ernie Duckworth's complaint of Loren Rogers & Floyd Held both operating illegally. The \$20.00 fee check submitted for power boat licensing as an extension for the Clearwater River on the Duckworth licenses will be returned with a letter advising no space available and priority listing made.

New business: 1. a new nominee for a board member to replace Eldon Handy will be determined in the December Association meeting, then the Governor has 30 days in which to appoint the replacement. 2. Office receipts, as proposed by the legislative auditors, will not be instigated as payment is now registered in 3 places (application, face sheet and ledger); also the Audit Summary was reviewed by the Board for FY 1976-77-78. 3. A report of an unusual amount of duplicate licenses requested this year. The Board determined that a list be made and checked from time to time.

A list of the outfitter and guide licenses issued, denied or extended follow and are apart of these minutes. These licenses are from the last meeting to this one.

At 5:15 P.M., there being no further Board business the meeting adjourned.
