

OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD

Boise, Idaho

August 18 & 19, 1980

Although there was not a quorum to conduct a board meeting, at 11:30 A.M. on Monday August 18, 1980, Peter and David Grubb, Spokane, WA met with Vice-Chairman Jim Baughman and member, Ivol Sies, concerning their applications as new boating outfitters. Peter has been working for ARTA as a guide for the past two years. Their application request was for almost all floatable rivers in Idaho and Peter explained they made that request hoping for whatever they could get. The Board members explained the river limitation and availability, so the Grubbs revised their application for the Kootenai and Moyie Rivers, with all other for priority. Their equipment includes 2 Yampa 16 ft. boats and a school bus. David, who is a brother and is a psychiatrist, will license as an outfitter partner and furnish financial backing. They will complete their applications and plan to conduct their business in Idaho the same as in Washington and Oregon, dba River Odysseys West. (Notes will be read at next meeting.)

At noon, board members Jim Baughman and Ivol Sies joined Fish and Game Director, Jerry Conley and Asst. Director, Bob Salter for lunch. The Fish and Game Directors had been invited to join the Board for a luncheon meeting to get acquainted and exchange ideas.

At 1:15 P. M., Rusty Munn, Salmon, and new partner, LaMonte Anderson, Burley met with the two board members to explain their newly incorporated business, which they plan to license as Eakin Ridge Outfitters, Inc., with Rusty Munn licensing as the managing agent. Their attorney, M. Jay Meyers, Pocatello has written the Board for application which will be finished for the Board to review for approval.

LaMonte, who is the new (2-year term) President of Flying Resort Ranches, says he has been a director for them for the past 4 years. He will manage the Root Ranch also, therefore no time to work with Munn, and that Rusty will essentially continue as in the past but they are incorporating to protect their interests. 500 shares in the corporation with Anderson owning 375 shares and Munn has 125 shares.

There was considerable conversation about Munn's escalation of a small outfitter operation. He was also warned of bear hunting down the river with the power boat where he is not licensed. It was discussed about this small operation being expanded further when a proposal of 15-18 hunters was mentioned. Rusty said that it was only good business to expand where possible and he wanted a year around business. A divorce settlement has cut into his operation capital and he has taken in a partner to not lose the business completely. (Notes will be incorporated into next board meeting.)

At 3:45 P.M., a Boise realtor, Ron West met with Jim and Ivol about his client, Paul Resnick dba Shepp Ranch obtaining the James Ranch and what might be licensed in the old Idaho Vacations area.

The board meeting came to order at 4:00 P.M., as Chairman Lanham joined the meeting with Jim and Ivol, as weather had finally cleared to allow him to fly out of Big Creek. The meeting then continued with Realtor Ron West explaining a trade of property of Resnick's in the San Juan Islands for Mott's interest in the James Ranch, which Resnick would then rejuvenate and cabins added if an outfitter license can be obtained on the area adjacent. The old Idaho Vacations area is presently licensed to James Powell, and a deal would probably have to be made there. The Board warned however about hunting not being good in the area for outfitting and public needs protected. Other outfitting business might be licensed okay.

At 4:45 P. M., Rusty Munn and LaMonte Anderson came in again to meet with the 3-man board. Rusty and LaMonte explained their proposed operation. Rusty said hunting would be limited to 2 or 3 hunters each, 6 times a year maximum, run out of Eakin camp; jet boat for steelhead fishing, (but none this year), day trip boating, backpacking and trailrides as licensed, also spring bear hunting. Rusty will get someone else to complete his power boat guiding as Hanson's not available and claims to need 12 more hours. Rex, too, mentioned the sideline operation being expanded and warned controlling shares owner could change operations completely. They left the meeting at 5:15 P.M. and the Board recessed.

On Tuesday, August 19, 1980, the Board meeting reconvened with all members, Rex, Jim, Bill and Ivole present. Bill too had been weathered in and could not make Monday's meeting.

Outfitter business was worked on which included the late filed application of outfitter Lynn Davis in which he claimed he had not received his application forms by 3rd class mail, the late filing fee was waived. A letter will be sent advising him of his lack of Red Cross card for personal guiding and lack of guides licensed.

At 9:00 A.M., Dennis Sergeff, Milwaukie, Oregon met with the Board about the licensing of Joe Peck's outfitter business with a partner Brian Simi, now working in Alaska. Mr. Simi will meet with the Board in September. Peck is selling them 25 head horses, pack saddles, 4 tack and short wave radio. They know the area as they have guided in the past (1977) for Peck and will license to guide again this year for him. Peck will work with them when they take over December, 1980. They do not plan any summer activity for first two years, only hunting, but hope to work into year around operation. Peck's problems were discussed with him. Mr. Sergeff will license as outfitter for 1980-81, as they want to start advertising. Both will license as S & S Wilderness Outfitters, if approved, for 1981-82, and will operate as a partnership.

Randy Ross then met with the Board to explain his enforcement/investigation of Beuke and Steele, at Lewiston. He says the Prosecuting Attorney is hesitant to prosecute as Beuke, although cited in Idaho, lives out of state, Clarkston, WA. Bill mentioned that Beuke had called him "crying" about citation. Tim Steele had heard that Randy was there, checking.

On Dick Baker, Lewiston, his boat is sitting in his yard slowly deflating and his wife advises he will not run the river until next year.

Forest Service will advise of next trip for Ken Warren, he usually camps twice in Idaho, Granite Creek and Cottonwood Bar.

Randy then explained his encounter of a large party which Forest Service Ranger Stan Kiser and he checked. It turned out to be a private (though rowdy) party trip. But Randy cited the leader, Rich Keller, for interfering with an officer when he would not cooperate in his investigation. Bill said he had word of all this as Rich Keller and some of the group had been guests of theirs in the past and had telephoned him. Bill further said it was kinda bad to get into it with the public but said he knew the nature of the group. But Bill, along with other members of the Board, agreed it would be up to Randy on whether to withdraw the charges or to continue the case.

Randy said Rich was the leader and that he had showed his badge and ID card to Rich, and was mannerly to all the group, and he felt Rich Keller could of nipped

it all in the bud. The Board agreed that the public should not interfere with Randy's, or any other investigator's job. Randy said Stan Kiser, River Ranger, was there too to straighten out the "mooning the jet boat girls" situation.

The Board asked Randy to go into Big Creek and check around. They also advised that Randy call the Board's attorney and explain the problems with the Nez Perce County Prosecutor that Guy might call him.

At 10:30 A.M., Chuck R. Stelling and Richard Nelson, of Darby, Montana came in to a meeting with the Board concerning the Drinville/Indian Lake Outfitters, Inc. licenses. Mr. Nelson is the proposed new M.A. of Indian Lake Outfitters, Inc., and Mr. Stelling is one of three corporate owners.

They explained that they held two permits, one in Idaho, one in Montana and that in the settlement, Drinville was given the Montana permit. They both feel though, that Drinville's licensed conduct in Idaho should reflect on his Montana licensing, and asked if the two states would work together on this. The Board said they would reciprocate, if Montana requested information. Mr. Nelson mentioned he had worked as an enforcement officer for Montana Fish and Game and had worked with Montana Association's Board of Directors.

They have met with the new Nez Perce District Ranger, Barry Hicks and with Ranger Warren at Lost Horse. They will get their applications complete.

Richard Nelson said he has been working with Ed Link, Northwest River Expeditions, and has gone 3 trips on the river this year. The Board suggested he get a training card.

Mr. Stelling said although they have had a lot of trouble with Tom Drinville and he is no longer associated in anyway with Indian Lake or Trappers Peak, that Brian Drinville, his son, is a "super fine young man" and hopes his father's problems do not carry over. He said also that Brian will not be working for them either.

Before the two men left, the Board asked for an explanation of an investigation of misuse of horses by Richard Nelson while outfitting in the past in Montana. He explained that he had the corrals and three other outfitters used it too -- up to 150 head some of the time, and it wasn't his horses and nothing proved on any of the other outfitters. Board said that they just wanted to avoid future problems and have a clean operation -- treatment of stock included.

Outfitter business was then continued: 2. Bill Bernt, Salmon -- power boat training only on the upper end, Cor n Creek to Salmon Falls, on the Main Salmon -- approved as that is all his outfitter, Cal Stoddard is licensed for. 3. A complaint was read sent from a Salmon River Challenge guide about Kooyers operating a power boat in a careless manner.

The meeting was interrupted by a phone call from Dewey Cavin about outfitter Albert Lockett -- Bill and Jim talked. Then a recess was called for a late lunch hour.

The meeting reconvened at 2:00 P.M. with all members except Rex, and enforcement problems were discussed which included Custer County Prosecutor's letter on Bitton case, Mike's report on eastern Idaho which included 24 outfitters, 68 guides and 84 boats checked, and Edy's subpoena to court on September 11 on the Steve Jordan case.

Rex joined the meeting at 2:30 P.M., and there was discussion on the Teton River fishing outfitters and Rick's college canoeist conflict. A letter which Jim has written was read and approved to mail regarding a proposed meeting to solve this problem.

Other outfitter problems brought up included a problem between Hincks and Park in Palisades area. It was determined to investigate what was decided by a hearing several years ago and use of the area questioned, then write to the two outfitters. Also the Danskin/Artful Anglers licensing problem was discussed. A letter to them from the Board after our attorney researched the Danskin/Berndt contract was reviewed -- still no answer. Their guides request for refund of fees paid will be honored.

The Board then motioned and approved issuance of the Bishop/Dick Alfs Fly Shop extension, as was proposed by the Hearing Officer.

New business included those on the priority list for the lower Salmon River being notified -- Katz/Boyd/Epley/Mel Hughes and Eastern Washington University. Jim Smith (&Mike Thomas) incorporating Sleeping Deer Ranch -- their attorney's letter was read. Rod Newcomb's avalanche training school letter read and approved -- he will be notified. And Dave Toff, Prosser, Washington's request for new area for licensing was reviewed. The Board determined they will write Fish and Game about the resource and also contact Charles Mosier, Clearwater Forest Service, Canyon Ranger District.

Unfinished business included Rusty Gore's request for licensing the float boating on the Middle Fork that Wayne England had once licensed which had no permit. He will contact the Board later on this, he had advised by letter. The meeting of Burk, Pocatello with the Board will be again scheduled for September meeting -- his attorney will be notified.

Forest Service/BLM/ Fish and Game business: A letter from Fish and Game Director Jerry Conley was read whereby he requests copies of or full particulars of the new application be forwarded for their Conservation Officer's personal contact.

Ivol said he would discuss this further with the director.

State and Board business was reviewed in which the Board was advised that the secretary is in training for Bi-Weekly payroll which this agency is directed to start November 1st.

The minutes of June 10, 1980 board meeting were read and approved prior to the meeting adjournment at 5:20 P.M.
