

OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD

Boise, Idaho

September 8 & 9, 1980

Monday, September 8, 1980, all four members of the Outfitters and Guides Board met at 8:45 a.m., for a regular board meeting, with Chairman Lanham presiding; Jim Baughman, Bill Guth and Ivor Sies in attendance.

The minutes of July 17 & 18, 1980, were read and passed upon, by motion of Ivor and second by Jim.

Chairman Lanham mentioned his protest to Governor Evans concerning the States's implimentation of a bi-weekly payroll by November 1st, which is time-consuming, costly and not wanted; all members concurred.

Bill mentioned the priority numbering system needed changed in our next hearing, as the board still has the consideration of qualification in their determination of whom-so-ever should be licensed. All agreed that this change should be implimented in the next rules hearing.

The Board then discussed the Forest Service refusal to allow Bill and Norm's hunting business transfer to Mike Anderson to include power boat access. Bill says that Salmon Mountain trail snows in but doubted if this pending deal would be completed--Mr. Anderson has not submitted a completed outfitter application as yet.

The power boating to the Rusty Munn area was for access only too was noted, and now has been esculated into a full river operation. Rusty Munn's newly incorporated business was discussed at length--the Board agreed to write to Fish and Game for impact on resource, as "50% fill of 14 hunters" was too many for the small area. They also heard that there was a planned change of outfitters.

At 10:00 a.m., Ed Hunt, Cataldo, Idaho met the Board as a new hunting outfitter applicant for the Wynn "Big Red" Agee area. Map description given has a little variance with old description of area. Mr. Hunt has just completed schooling at Erv Malnarich's Guide School with an excellent rating, and he is a sawyer/woodsman by trade. He asked to be licensed right away and advised that Red Agee would assist this year.

At 10:45 a.m., Dave Stucker, Big Creek came in to talk to the Board about an encounter with T. P. Rick, Burgdorf and Bruce Morelli, Yellowpine, who have a camp set up at Mosquito Springs. They use horses owned by Carol King and he caught one and tied it to a tree he said, after they got into his corrals and chewed the leathers on his saddle equipment. He believes they are outfitting as Lois Van Hover and a "fat gal" at Yellowpine had seen a letter advertising taking 10 hunters @ \$1,500 apiece.

At 11:00 a.m., Warren Sohrakoff, Riggins, who is a licensed guide for Shepp Ranch for several years, met with the Board about licensing as an managing agent outfitter for Paul Resnick dba Shepp Ranch. Darrell Brown has quit as M.A., and returned with his wife to Oklahoma. Neither Sohrakoff or Brown are involved as owners. Warren plans to train as a power boat guide--his son, Mike is trained and licensed for power boating now. The Board advised they would call the F.S. about this change in M.A.'s, because of short notice to get licensed, hunting season opens September 17th.

After this appointment, the Board passed a motion, (by Jim & seconded by Bill), to disregard the land managers signature requirement on managing agents, if the business license has the F.S. or BLM tentative approval--with notification to the various land managers when there has been a change.

Also another motion was passed unanimously, which was proposed by Bill and seconded by Jim, to disregard the financial statement requirement of a M.A., if the business is already licensed.

Enforcement Problems were discussed which included Steve Jordan's protest (talked to Alaire at office) of vandalism to his vehicles and others and equipment left at end of road above Riggins. His court case for outfitting without a license is scheduled for

September 11, 1980, in Ada County court--the secretary has received a subpoena.

Wayne Beuke, Lewiston being cited for outfitting without a license, and his call to Bill at Salmon, complaining, was discussed. His case has been postponed to November 24, 1980; as well as the September 10 date was noted for Richard "Rich" Keller, Spokane, for interference with an officer. The case for the Bitton unlicensed guides at Challis has been postponed without a date, and no word on the Ken Smith trial yet from the Challis court.

The Board recessed for lunch, with Vice-Chairman Baughman, Bill Guth and Ivol Sies reconvening at 1:30 p.m., to meet with outfitter applicants for Joe Peck area, Dennis Sergeff, Milwaukie, OR and Brian Simi, Centerville, WA--also another of Peck's guides, Elmer Reed, Centerville, WA sat in on the meeting. They mentioned they had all completed Jim Smith's Sleeping Deer Ranch guide school together.

Brian Simi will be a partner-outfitter next year, but will only license as a guide this year. Dennis Sergeff has completed his application for an outfitter license so that he can be licensed by December 1, 1980, to begin his advertising. He will get a release from Joe Peck at that time...Dennis Sergeff explained the contract was being negotiated, which would keep the horses in Idaho for the next 2 years. Then, a previous complaint on horse abuse was mentioned, and the Board explained that this ^{is} other problems could cause loss of an outfitter license.

The licensed agreement for bear and cougar hunting in joint areas of Peck, Middle Fork Lodge, Bob Cole and Gary Madsen was mentioned. The Board explained that it would take a signed agreement from all those outfitters and the new license holders to add this to their license.

At 2:30 p.m., Rex joined the meeting as Kirk Bachman, Stanley came in about licensing as a cross-country ski outfitter in the Targhee National Forest in eastern Idaho. Kirk has licensed for 2 years as a day and night cross country ski guide for Joe Leonard, but said he gained most of his experience through Idaho State University--at cost only. He is also a kayak guide and worked this year building kayaks in Salmon at the Salmon River Boat Works. A possible partner, Jerry Madsen, was mentioned as coming into the business for finance only. The Board explained that he would have to change his licensing, whether he was a silent partner or not--Ivol mentioned he would be just as responsible. Mr. Bachman will license only himself this year, dba Teton Mountain Touring, and will work with Grand Targhee for clients. He asked for expediency as he plans to advertise also.

Forest Service and Fish & Game Business was reviewed which included a letter from Butch Harper for Ranger Gilbert Farr about the activities of the various outfitters in the Ketchum--Sun Valley area; a phone call about sheep permit hunts being advertised by Andrew Warwick, Salmon area; Lloyd Reesman, West Fork Rgr. Dist., notifying of a Montanian, Robert Ralls, outfitting in Idaho; and a F.S. report about outfitter Crombie leaving a dead horse in the creek and on the trail, also garbage & equipment not being packed out.

The reports of the enforcement men were read and discussed prior to recess at 5:30.

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 9, 1980

The board meeting reconvened at 8:45 a.m., with Vice-Chairman Baughman, Bill Guth and Ivol Sies present. Rex Lanham joined the meeting as enforcement was again discussed. It was determined to advise Mike that he would not have to shoe his horses, in answer to his inquiry, as he probably would not be sent to ride in to camps, and sending him back to eastern Idaho on the Teton River use problem too was talked about. A certified statement which was prepared by this office for Prosecuting Attorney Springer was read, concerning the license application status of the Bitton guides.

Completed applications were reviewed and approved in which two probationary licenses were issued for Fish & Game violations for Jerry Stager, Bellevue, and Lance Darin Gamette, Bruneau.

Outfitter Business was again worked on: Rusty Munn incorporating, which transferred controlling interest to a new stockholder--the Board decided to contact our attorney on a denial as ownership has changed; letters from Dick McAfee on a sheep hunt in the Flying Resort Ranches area and Tim Craig's proposed use of Herman Kuykendall as a guide were read; the Parks and Hincks problems & letters over licensed area use was reported, also the F.S. at Palisades contact; a report that Ray Tarbox may sell his business to a Texan, Jack Townsend; new applicant in Unit #10, David Taff, Prosser, WA will have an inquiry made on resource with F. & G.; Ansel Roberts extension request for bear hunting in Unit #4, same as Carter of Olsen Bros, Spokane, WA was reviewed and a F. & G. letter read, and was denied; and then the bear and cougar consolidation hunting was brought up--a phone conversation between Jim Baughman and Dale Baird, F & G, was reported which concluded that the F & G Dept. will shorten seasons as a result if opened up. Ivol says there's too much misunderstanding--Bill says not all will hunt that are given the consolidated hunting for licensing.

A phone call from Dave Giles, Salmon was received--he was advised to plan on a trip through eastern Idaho hunting camps. He will be given an itinerary route, and copies of the outfitter licenses. The Board then agreed to have Dewey Cavin sent into the Grangeville/Elk City area, and Ivol and Jim will work up a route for each man.

The Board then recessed for lunch break, in which they had a business luncheon with their attorney, Guy Hurlbutt. The meeting reconvened at 1:15 p.m. and Old Business was worked on: Drinville wanting to hunt his special guests in Idaho was reported by Chuck Stelling's phone call--no way says Board; Bishop-Benjamin Hearing report, which Matt Mullane notified of just receiving the Benjamin brief, and a letter to Bishop was read giving the recommended extensions to the Bishop/Dick Alfs Fly Fishing licenses; Dave Burk, Pocatello request for a hearing review on his 1974 license revocation--no response from Burk's atty.; and Danskin/The Artful Angler incomplete applications--nothing new received from Board's letter inquiry.

A telephone conversation between Board member, Jim Baughman and Dale Baird was then discussed at length, concerning licensing of a consolidated bear & cougar area. There was mention of shut-down of area, cut-off of bear tags, certain hunting units being of chief concern, and the hunting methods of outfitters--a deadline of end of November was also mentioned. The Board finally decided this would be put together by next meeting, and the bear and cougar areas would not be transferrable, as well as change of outfitter area licensing would be subject to review--same with new areas licensed, for this licensing. Bill mentioned the purpose it not to add more outfitting but to stabilize those who are actively hunting the area for bear and cougar.

Boating Business was worked on next which included Teton River Outfitters problem with Rick's College canoeist; Rusty Gore applying for float boating of Wayne England's old Middle Fork of Salmon, which has no permit--letters were read and Bill told of his discussion with Attorney Herndon who called on this. Bill explained to him the 3-year use required to maintain the permit, which England had let lapse. The Board then talked of their contact with the F.S. which advised that surface waters are under their control now and that this has held in a test court case. This could be of consequence to Middle Fork Lodge and to Al Tice, as well as the Gore/England case. Other Boating business included: Steve Currey's letter advising a split of his Main Salmon River business--the F.S. have agreed to a split of the permit, the Board must determine if there is a place available for the new applicant and advise Steve; a letter from Bub Lilly's Trout Shop was read advising they have identified their boats, following Mike's warning; and a former John Jones client's letter was read complaining of Spokane Community College's use of the rivers in a commercial manner...the Board will contact the college; and the Board's letter to Jim Gellein about his private business (Flying H Ranches) checks being refused as not complying with the rules and regulations. Also a request by Artful Angler's guide, Val Schreiber, for refund of his guide license fee, as outfitter never was licensed, was discussed. Mr. Baughman feels that it probably would be illegal even if outfitter was not licensed, but will wait to make a determination when a written request comes in. He said he has tried

to reach Danskin in West Yellowstone, but was unsuccessful.

The Board again discussed Rusty Munn's licensing. His small area was discussed and it was agreed by all members of the board, that they were talked into licensing an area too small to be operated as a bonafied outfitter hunting area. The Board's attorney has upheld their decision to deny the incorporated business now known as Eakin Ridge Outfitters, Inc. with Rusty Munn, managing agent. The applications are still incomplete at this time, therefore no final action.

State and Board Business was brought up which included the forthcoming budgeting for additional enforcement men; the Board also declined the Mountain Bell offer to add an additional listing in the new directory; and, a report on the Law Library meeting, which explained the new method of setting up substantive rules changes.

At 4:30 p.m., there being no further business, Bill proposed a motion to adjourn, Ivof seconded the motion, and the meeting was adjourned with Bill and Rex leaving--(Jim and Ivof stayed until 5:00, working on board business).

A list of licenses approved, extended, amended and/or denied since the August board meeting follows, and become a part of these minutes.
