

OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD

Boise, Idaho

April 29, 30 and May 1, 1981

On Wednesday, April 29, 1981, the Board convened at 1:00 PM, with Vice-Chairman Jim Baughman presiding, Ivol Sies and Glen Foster in attendance.

The maps were checked as the Board considered Ray Ralls' request for extension of area. His outfitter license has been held up because of late bond arrival, therefore the extension fee will be returned. The area request was approved to be licensed when a late fee is paid.

Bill Guth arrived during the discussion to join the other board members.

At 2:00PM, Grant Simonds and Fred Choate, of Boise, appeared to explain to the Board their involvement in an April 17, 18 & 19, 1981 float trip on the Hell's Canyon portion of the Snake River.

The two men explained they had put together a private trip of friends and wives, with Tom Kelma's "Perrigan River Outfitters", of Cortez, Colorado. They said that he was a friend and that they did not pay, although admitted that some of the group did pay and there was money collected above expenses. Mr. Kelma was cited for not having a permit, by Stan Kiser of the Lewiston Forest Service, as they came off the river.

Mr. Simonds explained that he was a licensed guide but had not been on the Snake River before, but had hiked along the river scouting the rapids to insure safety. Mr. Choate said he had organized the trip--both men said they did not know they were in violation of the law.

The Board advised that although they did not actually pay money, they had worked out their compensation, and had placed Mr. Simonds' guide license in jeopardy. After the law was read to them, they admitted they had acted as "outfitter and guide" in organizing and executing a river trip, but said again that they had not intended to break any laws.

After the men left the meeting, the Board determined that they would let Mr. Choate off with the warning given to both, but would issue a "probationary" amendment to Grant Simonds' guide license for the balance of this license year, with notification to his outfitters, Kenny and Elwood Masoner.

The Board resumed review of applications, which included a protest from Jack Briggs in the Board's request for licensing of his guest ranch, although his outfitting business is not separated and it is incorporated.

A telephone call from the Salmon office of Fish and Game informed the Board on the outcome of Fish and Game's court case against outfitter Ray Torrey--guilty, but with a withheld judgement. The Board determined that the case would not enter into their decision, but because Mr. Torrey had falsified his R.C. card, they denied his application for a new license.

The Board also determined that Garn Christensen's expired R.C. card would hold up the licensing for him as M.A. of Sawtooth Outfitters & Guides, Inc.--the same with Clay Woods, M.A. for Middlefork Ranch, Inc., unless they secure licensed guides...letters will be mailed to them.

A call from Eugene Brock, Payette N.F. has given approval for back-packing use for Christensen, once he gets licensed, too was noted.

A request for additional hunting area by John Hill, Jr.--M.A. of South Fork Expeditions, Ltd. was reviewed and denied. The area requested is assigned to other outfitters.

Letters to Lyle Kunz and Dale Robson about lack of updated R.C. training and having no guides licensed, were read. Also the reply of Mr. Kunz,

which did not address the questions asked. The Board unanimously agreed that another letter should be sent requesting answers about the guiding and for clarification of last year's activity report.

Ivol left the meeting at 5:00PM.

Bill Benjamin's request for walk & wade fishing of the Henry's Fork was reviewed--he will be approved for a portion of the Henry's Fork. And there was discussion of Tom Webb's request of the Danskin float boating on the Henry's Fork, along with his other requests for extension of licensing which included additional area for bird hunting and big game hunting.

The Board then recessed at 5:45PM, upon motion made by Glen and seconded by Bill.

THURSDAY, APRIL 30, 1981, the members of the Board reconvened at 8:30AM, with all four in attendance.

Discussion of the Guth operation, and a release was given by Bill, was the first order of business. Bill said articles of the corporation dissolution have been filed with the Secretary of State, and that a copy would be sent in for the Guth file. Norman is relicensing in his name only.

Mr. Baughman also noted that a call had come in about the Devil's Bedstead. The buyers of the operation would include Tim Gardiner, possibly as M.A., if approved, but the Lost River F.S. was concerned that Tim Gardiner get his operation straightened out first, and that Butch Harper was concerned too, about Gardiner not staying in his area of operation.

At 9:00AM, Bud Callahan, Jackson, Wyoming met with the Board about extending his established hunting area over into Idaho for spring bear hunting only. Rifle hunts--no dogs, he uses bait as dogs are not allowed in his Wyoming operation. Targhee N.F. contact says there are no other spring bear hunters in the area, however he was advised that his request would be checked out with Fish and Game also. The area encompasses areas assigned to Hincks, Parks & Haderlie, but Mr. Callahan said he would not hunt in the fall--only spring.

After this appointment, the Minutes of January 15 & 16, 1981, were read and approved by motion by Bill, seconded by Ivol. The January 19 & 20, 1981 minutes were read then and approved by motion & second by Bill and Ivol.

Board Business was worked on--there was formal approval for purchase of a new typewriter, as has been discussed previously. Telephone conference calls were discussed--it was agreed that no controversial problems will be decided without further board meeting action.

A complaint made by Ron Malone of outfitter Richard Norris's encroachment into Malone's area was discussed. The Board will attempt to get some enforcement into the situation.

At 10:30AM, Jack Schubert, Cusick, Washington came in about licensing for spring bear and a 7-day cougar season in an area NE of Coeur d'Alene. There was much discussion over his unlicensed activities in the past. The cougar hunting was doubtful, said Ivol--populations down, which Schubert countered. He hunts exclusively with dogs and trouble with local people hunting too was explained to Mr. Schubert. Fish and Game will be contacted for input on the resource prior to the Board's reviewing his request.

At 11:00AM, Robert G. Brown, Elk City, met with the Board about licensing archery hunting for trophy bull elk and possibly moose hunting, in Unit 15, an area close in to Elk City not currently licensed for outfitting. He is a guide for Don Nitz and plans to use Nitz's horses. Application is incomplete--Mr. Brown said that the Forest Service wouldn't approve a permit at this time. The Board said that his request would be checked out carefully.

Following this appointment--a letter was read that will be mailed to outfitter Ted Epley, warning him about his guests floating the South Fork of the Salmon River by his guest ranch. Glen Foster explained he has warned him also and that his son, Danny, helps the guests which involves guiding. Ted wants the South Fork opened for day trips but Ivol mentioned it is prime spawning ground and probably the Fish and Game would not approve.

The Board recessed for lunch. Then at 1:00PM, Jack Hendren and John S. (Smoky) Nicholas, Elk City met with the Board about big game hunting in Unit 15--the same area as applied for by Robert Brown, and a part of Joe Wilson's area. The Forest Service said they would issue a permit if they can obtain their license. They also want summer fishing and trailriding for photography in Units 15 and 20. The Board explained that the public's hunting accessibility would enter in, but would check out their request.

A telephone call then came in to the Board from Ken Smith, Ahsahka, in which he discussed getting a guide licensed, the sale of the joint business of Beasley & Smith which includes 19 head of horses, and another complaint about treatment of those horses, as reported by Pauline Martin.

Marilyn Ann Mueller, Ketchum & Obsidian, then met with the Board about licensing the area released by Frank McMasters. She has worked in his business including trailriding for many years, but the Forest Service will not issue a permit for trailrides, as McMasters had given it up and Bittons give the area too much use for another operation at this time. Ms. Mueller is applying for the big game and bird hunting, and for fishing. She asked about a neighbor helping her and supplying some of the equipment. The Board warned about licensing his involvement. She will complete her application.

At 3:00PM, Gladys York, Elk City, came in to explain a complaint registered against her last hunt this past season, by Jack Russell, Schullykill, PA. She explained that they had a guaranteed hunt with no money paid if no shots fired, and that one of the three men did get his horns after his wounded animal was found 3 days later--a 6 point bull. The older man was the only hunter of the three, the others were noisy, was the report of her guides who included her son. She doubted the complaint about the guides and explained the guests were well fed and well treated, and seemed happy enough when they left.

The Board mentioned that most of Gladys's complaints came from having too many people at one time. She countered that her hunting camps were well organized with private (new) tents, plenty of food with a good cook who bakes bread, pies, etc., good equipment and plenty of guides. And as to the pot smoking and drinking, she claimed she doesn't allow this and got rid of an Indian guide who did drink too much. She said some of the guests bring in their own, and if the guides drink, it is in the evenings, if at all. Gladys does not personally guide anymore she said.

Before leaving, Mrs. York asked about her area extension request which includes the township of old Elk City, 6 square miles. She wants fall bow hunting for elk & bear, & spring bear hunting with bait. It is being investigated by the Board.

At 4:25PM, David Mix, Hayden Lake dba Great Northern Expeditions, met with the Board about elk, deer and bear hunting in Units 2, 4, 7 & 9--all small areas; he is also requesting fishing and backpacking. Ray Morgan will be a guide, not a partner in the operation, Mr. Mix said, and would not come in to meet with the Board. However the Board advised that Morgan should be licensed as a partner as they'll share expenses, etc. Mix said. Applications will be completed.

The meeting recessed at 5:00PM.

FRIDAY, MAY 1, 1981, the board members reconvened at 8:30AM, with Vice-Chairman Baughman, Ivol Sies and Glen Foster present, who first met with Harry Vaughn, Moscow, about the problems in the wording of the contract with Don Wilson, on the sale of his outfitting business. The problem will be corrected and sent back to the Board.

Applications for Guth and Fosters were reviewed and approved next, as Bill Guth joined the meeting at 9:00AM.

The February 10 & 11, 1981 minutes were read, corrected, and approved, by Bill's motion and Ivol second, and passed.

George Truppi, Sulphur Cr. Ranch, Eagle, came in about his "Probationary license" issued because of a F & G violation--untagged elk. Mr. Truppi explained the mistake made of forgetting to tag the animals and said that he was very cognizant of how a violation could affect his licensing and the existence of the ranch. The seriousness of the violation was discussed and the Board said they hoped this was impressed upon Mr. Truppi.

Problem Applications were worked on--William Heinrich, Weippe, has submitted an alter Red Cross card, was determined by the Board--a letter to the R.C. Chapter is being sent to substantiate the suspicions. The mail being the problem in David Peterson's late filing was determined to be a factor--no late fee will be required; Jim Smith, M.A., Sleeping Deer Ranch, Challis will be required to pay the late fee--second year, filed late; Duane M. Whipple, Victor, MT, must pay the late fee; and it was determined that Jeffrey Bitton, Mtn. Home would not need to meet with the Board--he has in the past with his father, and it was established then that he would take over in the future--his license was approved.

Dan Simmons and George Hauptman, Salem, Oregon, dba Oregon River Outfitters, Inc., met with the Board about licensing the area acquired from David Mills--the Snake River, Hell's Canyon to Lewiston. They are established outfitters in Oregon, but discussed getting their guide training. Each will license as managing agents & applications will be completed.

At 11:25AM, Outfitter Tim Gardiner, Sun Valley, met with the Board about advertising what he's not licensed for and operating outside of his assigned area, and as a partner (& possibly, M.A.) for the new corporation, who have made a deal for the business of The Devil's Bedstead.

On the complaint, Tim said he went into a broker deal with Lon & Tom Jarvis & Milt Butler, with Tim getting 10%--the Board said that this was okay, but the advertising did not list him as a broker. Tim further claim - ed he had only been in the Copper Basin and on Silver Creek "privately and personally." The Board further advised that he could get his problems cleared up with the Forest Service, before consideration of licensing more area.

There was discussion then on the new area being licensed. There are 35 head of horses to be leased from Milt Butler to be used in Tim Gardiner's

trailriding operation, and because The Devil's Bedstead wants to use Milt Butler's horses and him as a guide, the Board requested a copy of signed lease agreement, and there was discussion on separate books being kept. It was suggested that Milt Butler could license as a M.A., as Tim has not hunted The Devil's Bedstead, and if this is the way they go, Milt must get a current R.C. card for guiding. Tim said it was not a corporation but a limited partnership, and was advised about completing his applications. His fishing was amended to be only on the Elkhorn property for his own personal outfit business.

The meeting then recessed for lunch at 12:20PM.

When the Board reconvened, all four members worked on applications. Letters will be sent to advise Bob Blackadar of a late fee due; Gordon Bransford must clear up name being requested licensed; Middle Fork Lodge, & Bob Cole, M.A. requesting fish & trailrides--F.S. will be contacted; Martin Riddle will have his license issued according to contract received; Norm Riddle's license to be amended; Don Nitz needs to pay a late fee; also Salmon River Properties & Charles L. Willmore, M.A. & Gerald Richie have to pay late fees, Richie also needs a bond; Jim Walker's request for more outfitting area was denied; Robert Rall, Darby, MT. new applicant for Richie area, was denied; Effie Spaulding, Lewiston not using area was discussed--no decision on licensing; Pat Silver's, Stanley, letter was read explaining the reason for altering of his Red Cross card--his license has been denied; and Tom Webb's request for additional activities was reviewed with the following decisions: Big game hunting--Angell's area: denied; Bird hunting--Sagehen: denied; Waterfowl (Mud Lake): denied; Grouse: denied; Duck & Goose along Buffalo River shoreline: approved; float boating on Henry's Fork: no decision--determined to add Webb's name to the Pending List, as the river is presently licensed to maximum. Also an extension request of Spence Warner's was determined to be checked into with Fish and Game.

State & Board work was brought up which included the Board's attorney's statement okay'd to be paid; a telephone credit of \$55.00 returned in Mtn. Bell's foul-up in charges; copier service agreement will not be renewed; 3-year subscription renewal for Outdoor Life approved; and the budget cut on personnel costs was explained.


Complaints reviewed were the George May bear hunter problem reported by F.S. at Grangeville, and a letter will be sent to Mr. Pasco; the letter sent to Mr. Seever's on the Salmon River Lodge complaint was read; also a letter from a Texas client about Lee Bridges--Bridges advertising did not say he was hunting Idaho, and a letter was read from Jay Currier, Tensed, Idaho about his feeling of licensing non-Idaho bear hunters, regarding Jim Jensen.

Boating, Forest Service and Fish and Game correspondence was reviewed; also BLM's letters and maps regarding the Owyhee River and the "East Fork".

There was a motion to adjourn at 5:30PM, after the business was completed. A list of all licenses issued, extended, amended, and denied since the last meeting is a part of these minutes.
