

OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD

June 1, 2 and 3, 1981

Boise, Idaho

Monday, June 1, 1981, four members of the Outfitters and Guides Board convened at 8:30 a.m., with Jim Baughman, Vice-Chairman presiding, Ivol Sies, Glen Foster and Harry Vaughn in attendance--Bill Guth was absent. Mr. Vaughn was welcomed as a new member, which completes the board to a five-man status again.

The minutes of March 30, 31 and April 1, 1981, were read. After suggested corrections, a motion for approval was proposed by Glen, and with Ivol's second, the minutes were approved. The minutes of the McCall, Idaho meeting of April 8 & 9, 1981, next were read and approved, by motion made by Ivol and seconded by Glen.

Then Outfitter Business was worked on. A compiled list of figures on the number of licenses issued over the past 10 years and the rate of increase was looked at. There was discussion about licensing of Carl P. Russell, although he may not be issued use-permits on portions of his area. The licensing of managing agents who include more than one business and the problems presented for permits was also discussed.

Dave Howard, Cascade then met with the Board about his incomplete outfitter application for last year, (completed except for payment of the late filing fee), and his request for consideration of the same area for 1981-82 licensing.

Mr. Howard explained he had left the state last year, after filing and had not hunted, but that he has bear and cougar clients coming for this season. In addition, he is requesting fishing to be licensed for use of the lakes in his area. The maps were checked, and although it was pointed out that there was one other bow hunter and a dog hunter in the area, Dave said there should be no problem, as there are lots of bear in that area.

Information was given the Board by the office of Special F.S. Agent, Blaine Layton, concerning the date and time of the Richmond case to be held in the Federal Magistrate Court--Randy will be advised to contact Mr. Layton. Also the advertising of Kenneth Jones's Exodus II listing Idaho river trips was discussed--this will be followed up also.

The Board next reviewed the file of guide applicant, Pat Silvers, which included an altered Red Cross card, then Pat Silvers and Mac Settles, M.A. for Middle Fork River Expeditions, Inc.--his employing outfitter, came in to meet about the problem of his license denial. Mr. Settles talked for Pat, explaining that the card had been changed by a Howard Sipes so that Pat could get a mining job. After much discussion, the Board asked why the card had been changed when it was still good until August 15, 1981, which surprised both men. The Board finally asked Pat to answer the question of whether Pat knew the card had been altered--he answered that he did know. The Board said a decision on reconsideration of his licensing would be made later, after this had reviewed with all members of the Board since Bill Guth was absent.

A letter received by the Board from Tony Compagnone, of California, about ARTA and ERT (American River Touring Assn. and Elliot River Tours) was read, which has had copies sent to the Governor, the Forest Service, and the The Idaho Statesman. The California informant pointed out that possibly two outfitter businesses are operating in Idaho under one name; that ARTA was a non-profit organization, with ERT the main outfitting business.

The Board then recessed for lunch--12:20 p.m. to 1:20 p.m.

The next appointment was Lynden Symods, Lava Hot Springs, who met with the four members of the board when they reconvened from lunch. Mr. Symods is interested in getting an outfitter license for hunting deer, bear and cougar, predators and birds, and for trail rides, snowmobiling and backpacking in an area in vicinity of his 520 acre ranch north of Lava (Unit 71, Caribou N.F. and Unit 74, BLM & State land). It was explained that outfitter Davis is currently licensed in Unit 74 for deer hunting. Mr. Symods said his first consideration was for trailrides and he has a string of 7 horses. He has access to the forest through his neighbors for deer hunting, and the snowmobiling would be on the BLM and State lands in Unit 71. Mr. Symods was asked for a map outlining the area being requested, to complete his application, and he needs a first aid card.

Ed Peterson (and a friend, Les Udy), Leadore, Idaho met with the Board next about big game hunting, bear & cougar, predators & birds in Unit 58. Maps were checked and all agreed the area was all accessible to within 5 miles. He explained his plan was to take 4 people at a time--12 total, as there is approximately 3 weeks for the deer season and a 5-day antlered only elk season. The Board will check out the request.

Tim Gardiner, Sun Valley met again with the Board about his (and Keith Helms) owner-representative interest in the new Devil's Bedstead Ranch, a "private retreat". The Board told him that the public would have to be served in the area licensing. He said that both himself and Milt Butler were planning to license as managing agents--a number of forms were explained to him to complete for licensing.

Board Business was then continued. The past 4-months expenses paid by the office were reviewed, and the current statement of services by the Board's attorney were approved to be paid. Attorney Guy Hurlbutt is currently in Seattle representing the Board on the Grand Canyon Dorries, Inc. federal court case.

The Board's enforcement men available for work was discussed. It was determined to initiate contact with someone who may be interested in work for the Board in the northern sector of the state, as well as to hire additional men interested locally in part-time assignment work.

The joint-licensing of bear and/or cougar areas was explained to the new board member and concern was registered for area licensing which has close-in public access. A suggestion was made to add to the Board's letter inquiries to the Fish and Game Department, a request for input on public sentiment of commercial use of areas, as well as for the resource input. The Board determined that an effort will be made also to meet with the Fish and Game officials to explain their concern.

The meeting recessed at 6:00 p.m.

TUESDAY, June 2, 1981, the same four board members reconvened at 8:30 a.m.-- Jim Baughman, Ivol Sies, Glen Foster and Harry Vaughn.

Outfitter Business was worked on again, which included holding of outfitter-guide licenses which do not have current first aid training--these include Byrd Barton; Sawtooth Outfitters & Guides, Inc. with Garn Christensen, M.A.; Lyle Kunz; Dale R. Robson; and new outfitter applicant, William (Bud) Callahan. Their applications are approved but because of lack of licensed guides and their own personal guiding qualification needing upgraded, the Board will send letters advising of their license status. Letters from Mr. Kunz and Mr. Robson, in reply to the Board's inquiry, were read and accepted.

License extension requests included the following: Dave Stucker's request for a bear area formerly licensed to Dave Howard, will be denied as Mr. Howard is also requesting the license, as well as location proximity; Gerald Neff, Priest River, requesting elk hunting in Unit 10--he will be informed that Unit 10 is adequately licensed at present; Gladys York's request to add an area known as old Elk City townsite was denied.

Thomas O. Webb, Macks Inn, requested extension of area was reviewed--a letter was read that advised him of the approval for additional area for duck & goose hunting, and denial of area already licensed to another outfitter and/or not available to add commercial licensing--his name is added to the list for consideration for licensing; William S. Bishop, M.A. for Silver Creek Sports, of Sun Valley was discussed--it was decided to advise by letter that he should probably license "same as last year", because of the lateness of his applications being completed, and so the Board could have time to investigate the need for licensing of an extensive area he has requested in addition. A list was reviewed by the Board of others licensed in the proximity of Bishop's request, which included Rocky Mtn. Fly Shop, Allen/Anderson, MA's; SNUG Co., Anderson, MA; Sun Valley Co., Mason, MA; and Ron Fudge and Dexter Hayman, Fudge, MA. Also the request of a great deal more area by Rocky Mtn. Fly Shop was noted--it also will be investigated for need of licensing.

New applications were worked on next which included the request of David Mix and Ray Morgan dba Great Northern Expeditions, Hayden Lake, Idaho for several small areas --it was decided that the Forest Service would be contacted for their input on the remoteness of the areas requested; the review of Jack Schubert, Cusic, WA request for bear & cougar outfitting included a letter from F & G citing limited resource--it was the unanimous decision to deny his application; James C. Jensen, Rockford, WA request for bear & cougar & predator outfitting in Units 5, 6, 8 & 8A was reviewed, also a letter from one of Jensen's references, citing local use, and the F & G response was also noted, then the application was denied by majority vote (one approval), as not being a viable commercial outfitting business and public pressure; and James D. Farnam, Port Angeles, WA request of bear & cougar outfitting in an area previously licensed to Lewis B. Harrington (and three other outfitters). It is being researched for consideration of his request, but it was determined that if he is approved to be licensed, there would be an adjustment of the area to exclude a portion that is used by Robert M. Smith for his bait-bow hunters, after consideration was given to the letter from Mr. Smith and the maps were checked.

The members then recessed for lunch at 12:10 p.m.--all four members returned at 1:15 p.m. to meet with outfitter Steve Guinn of Boise, who is licensed for the Snake River Birds of Prey area. Mr. Guinn asked to have his Birds of Prey area extended upstream to include Stork Island. The Board saw no problem if he did not use motors during the duck season. He also asked to license on the Payette River, for the areas being released by Bob Blackadar.

The Board members then returned to consideration on new outfitter license applications. The request of John S. (Smokey) Nicholas and Jack S. Hendren, with Hendren the M.A. of Elk City, Idaho was looked at--investigation provided support to the Board's original contention that the area has enough public pressure for hunting, but the trail-rides and fishing request was approved for both areas requested. Robert G. Brown, Elk City has a pending application for bow hunting in the area too which would probably be denied for the same reason, when complete, unless other information comes to light. And finally, the completed application of Stanley Meholchick, Boise for outfitting for deer and cougar in Units 40 & 42 was approved, Units 22, 25 & 27--denied, after review of input from the Forest Service and Fish and Game, along with the Board's note of public access to these areas.

The altered first aid cards submitted for new licensing for Quentin Selby, M.A. for High County Outfitters, Inc., Donnelly, William Heinrich of Weippe, and Ray Torrey dba Lemhi Guide Service, Salmon, Idaho were all looked at. The Board's decision was that Mr. Selby be denied a license as managing agent outfitter for his business because of the card, and that his business will be denied because of not having a qualified licensed outfitter-managing agent; that William Heinrich's request for licensing will be denied because of the card submitted, and his request for additional area not considered at this time; and, Ray Torrey was also denied because of the first aid card alteration.

The meeting then recessed at 5:45 p.m.

WEDNESDAY, June 3, 1981, three members convened at 8:30 a.m.--Ivol Sies, Glen Foster and Harry Vaughn. Jim Baughman and Bill Guth were absent.

The members discussed what areas needed outfitters and the public's use; also what input conservation officers could offer.

Randy Ross came in about enforcement problems. It was agreed that Randy will recheck fishing in eastern Idaho. Glen also mentioned a telephone call about Bob Morino illegally outfitting in Idaho--Warden Dave Estwyler or Bob Jacklin, West Yellowstone should be contacted. Ivol also warned Randy of possible problems involved in taking a friend along

Duplicate licenses for two of Hank Miller's guides and various guide application were looked at for approval.

Jim Baughman joined the other members at 10:30 a.m., and they discussed issuance of licenses as a continuing process, showing only the expiration date--also suggested, was use of a stamp for approval instead of signatures on the licenses.

It was determined that there would be an election of a chairman and vice-chairman as soon as there was a board meeting with all members present.

Enforcement was again worked on--the radio use contract with the Fish & Game Dept. was approved for renewal. It was agreed that Randy should use the radio now on hand in the office--the insurance will be checked on.

Complaint letters were reviewed: Cal Stoddard's client in Pennsylvania claiming he had not received his meat--investigation found that the meat had been shipped and the client was advised to check with his hunting partner. The Board has not received a complaint, but another letter from Fred Wright was read in his concern about a hunter client's demand for a \$1,200.00 refund. And Wally Heath's new advertising was reviewed--he will be advised to correct the float boating being included in his advertising.

Lunch recess--12:15 p.m. to 1:15 p.m., with all four members reconvening.


Boating Business included copies of BLM letters to outfitter Zeke West's brother, LeRoy West and to Dean Helfrich about permit approval on the lower Salmon River. Dave Helfrich's request for a row-it-yourselfer trip approval; also a letter from Gerald Bentley was read.

The file of David J. Bream, Lewiston was looked over--he is applying to guide power boating for Norman Riddle and Myrna Beamer on the Snake River. The Board agreed that in this instance, a photocopy of his current Coast Guard license would be stringent enough proof of his training on this river, in lieu of dates of trips.

New Business: Wages and positions of the Board's office help was discussed. Alaire talked with the Board about her part-time employment. She agreed she would continue in that capacity, but a new girl will be hired to start training.

The meeting adjourned at 4:00 p.m. There is included in these minutes a list of all outfitters and guides who have been issued licenses, extensions, amendments, and/or denials since the last meeting.
