

OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD

September 8 & 9, 1981

Boise, Idaho

Tuesday, September 8 at 8:30 a.m., there was meeting of the Board called, with Jim Baughman, Vice-Chairman presiding, Ivol Sies and Glen Foster in attendance. It was noted that Harry Vaughn has just undergone heart surgery in a Spokane hospital.

Applications for licensing was the first order of business, then there was discussion about eastern Idaho fishing and the Fenwick School. Bear hunting in Unit 1, as is being requested by Steve Haslip was discussed. He filed his application ahead of the state-wide moratorium on new licensing, but investigation has proved the populations of bear and cougar in Unit 1 as down--therefore, the Board denied the license application. It was determined that if an appeal is registered, Dale Baird of Fish & Game would be called in.

New Business included a closure without prior notice of bear hunting in F & G Units 8, 8A, 10 and 10A, which affects a number of dog-use outfitters. There was discussion on what could be done for those outfitters with bookings, and determined that investigation would be made into other area licensing, if requested.

At 10:00 a.m., Tom McDonald, Boise met with the Board as a new applicant for power boating and fishing from Bliss Dam to Brownlee Dam and also chukar bird hunting between the Brownlee and Hell's Canyon Dams. He explained he notes increased demand for the Snake River boating and plans to outfit more in the off seasons from his construction job, fishing for sturgeon, and for crappie, bass & channel cat in the dam areas. He will not have a partner but use only the self-owned boat in his business, was stated.

The meeting was interrupted for a couple telephone calls--Mose Shrum, F.S., called about the case on illegal outfitter, Leo Jarvis, and Mrs. Henry Katz called about the court case scheduled for tomorrow for the Katz illegal guides--she will seek a postponement so her husband can be there as he is still busy outfitting in Alaska. The citation was made on the lower Salmon River on the Katz guides.

At 11:00 a.m, Mr. & Mrs. Bud Cunningham, Hagerman, came in to meet again with the Board on the denial of a portion of their license request--bird hunting on the Snake River in the area of their privately owned property. They have earnest money down on more property for the bird hunting aspect of their plans, but the Board explained the precedent that has already been established in non-licensing of easily accessible public areas. They asked about establishing a private hunting retreat, and was warned they were to serve the public as outfitters. Before they left the meeting, they mentioned <sup>that</sup> with the concern registered by Harry previously, in disposal of the remains in the bow-fishing, they had located a hog farmer at Mtn. Home and a methane gas processor will also take the carp at Twin Falls, and the bow-fishing is already going.

Old Business was next brought up--a letter from Harry Vaughn about Al Maynard, Kooskia declining the enforcement job was read, and a phone call from Don McPherson was mentioned in which he said he wanted a year off since retiring from Fish and Game, then he would consider working for the Board. There was then discussion about Fish and Game taking over the enforcement work of the Boards as there was duplication. It was agreed by all three members that the Fish and Game Commission would be contacted to discuss the plausibility. Ivol suggested that it should start with Dale Baird, however. The members agreed too that any area disputes should remain with the Board for settlement.

It was also brought to their attention that Attorney Hurlbutt will correct the Board's law wording, ie., misdemeanors instead of civil cases. The Hearing case for James D. Farnam has been determined to be conducted in the Board office, with Matt Mulaney as Hearing Officer, with Guy as representation for the Board.

The meeting then recessed for lunch.

The Tuesday, September 8 meeting reconvened after lunch, with the same three members--Jim Baughman, Ivol Sies, Glen Foster, and with the fourth member joining them, Bill Guth.

The Board checked the area release that A. W. Angell, St. Anthony, has submitted in favor of licensing Keith Rush, Lima, Montana, prior to these two men joining the meeting. It was explained that Mr. Rush adjoins the areas being released in Game Units 61 & 62A, and it would help Mr. Rush in his early hunts. The areas were checked on the maps for Angell too, which would change his licensing to be within the forest boundaries in most instances. Mr. Angell was willing to compromise to what the Board proposed, and Mr. Rush was advised he maybe would not be licensed for all he was requesting, but that it would be considered.

Nolan Woods, Pollock, Idaho then met with the Board about licensing for power boating on the lower Salmon River and the Snake River. There was discussion about hauling hunting guests for other outfitters, and Mr. Woods was warned that the hunting outfitter must be along. Mr. Woods asked about his training being accepted. It was agreed that a statement from Stan Kiser on his training would be acceptable, and Mr. Woods also mentioned he had to get Coast Guard licensing before he could get his Snake River permit.

After Nolan Woods left, the Board discussed the licensing from the Consideration List--Myrna Beamer and Jim Walker for power boating. Frank Santos has withdrawn his name from the list, as he says he cannot get a permit on the middle Main Salmon, to get on down. The float boating outfitters, Stephen Guinn & Steven W. Shephard, have been notified of their opportunity, and have indicated they will license immediately. An incident involving Loren Bud Rogers was discussed--it will be investigated prior to advising him of the opportunity to license from the Consideration List.

Enforcement Business was worked on next. A Motion for Dismissal on the federal case in Grangeville Court on Kenneth Jones, Dawn Jones and three others, was reviewed--they must stay off the rivers for three years. A call from Cecil Sanford was mentioned in which he says Bror Borjesson has a trailer back in the hills. Cecil said his wife was better and he would check the outfitter camps in Unit 17, if the Board would like him to. Legislator and Outfitter, Ron Beitelspacher was mentioned by the Board as a possibility in contacting the courts in the dismissals of cases. It was agreed that a luncheon date would be beneficial.

Reports were read on Dave Giles, Randy Ross and Al Lewis investigation. It was decided that the office would attempt to contact the caretaker's wife, Rita Romine, at Big Creek on the Cabin Creek fire.

The Board discussed the use of the F & G citation books and determined to look into the price of printing their own pads.

Boating Business included a letter to the Henry's Fork users to find out what change was made in the years the licenses read simply Henry's Fork as opposed to portions of the river. The majority did not use below St. Anthony--Will Godfrey's letter also posed a question and it will be answered. James Danskin letter was read--no reply as yet, and his application is still incomplete. ARTA/ERT response to the Forest Service (copy) was read concerning their attempt to get both permitted.

The meeting then recessed at 5:00 p.m., by motion by Ivol and second by Bill.

Wednesday, September 9, 1981, the same four board members reconvened at 8:30 a.m.--James Baughman, William Guth, Ivol Sies and Glen Foster. License applications were worked on first, and it was determined that letter inquiries will be sent out on the first aid cards of guides, Yost and Christman.

Outfitter Business was discussed, returning to the Angell-Rush area division. After considerable discussion, it was decided to call Mr. Angell about his release on area Unit 62A. The Board also agreed to continue to license in Unit 60 the area Mr. Angell hunts.

David Williams letter request for bear hunting September 14 through September 31 as a guide in the Jerry Meyers area, was discussed and approved. Also his request for cougar outfitting in Cal Stoddard's area was reviewed and approved to be added to his licensing. There followed this a phone call about two prospectors being taken into the Phil Johnson area by Jeff Bitton. Mr. Johnson was called and he will contact the F.S. on what this is about.

Outfitter Complaints were read and it was decided that Robert M. Smith, Kooskia must meet with the Board about his complaint; also Hank &/or Sharon & Hank Miller about their complaint on a client's river trip. A letter by the Assn. Grievance Committee to Franklin Greves, Pleasanton, CA was read; and the problems of Donald Wilson and Tim Craig were discussed. Tim will continue as the managing agent this year.

The Board then recessed for lunch--re-assembling at 1:00 p.m., with the same four members: Jim Baughman, Bill Guth, Ivole Sies and Glen Foster. Outfitter Business was continued with letters read from the F.S. on John Jackson application. The overlap review requested by Scott Farr on the Crombie (Jackson) area was looked into. The F.S. has been contacted, and the Board agreed that the boundary should follow the F.S. natural boundary. John Jackson will be required to pay a new fee as he had not completed his last year's license application--both Mr. Jackson and Scott Farr will be sent letters.

Board Business was worked on--Attorney Guy Hurlbutt's letter resignation as of October 15, 1981 was read. Guy also suggests contact with the Attorney General's office. The FY 83 budget, a new copier, and the travel cards offered to state employees was discussed. Micro-filming of the Board's outfitter licenses and the masterfile areas will be looked into further, and the Minutes of the August meeting were read and approved.

Then the proposed Rules & Regulation changes were worked on for the balance of the day. A letter from the F.S. concerning the South Fork of the Clearwater River as not being a viable float boating river was discussed--the Board agreed to remove it as a commercial water.

Bill left the meeting at 5:00 p.m., and after discussion of election of officers for the Board, and the time-consuming work involved, the meeting adjourned at 5:40 p.m.

The licenses approved, extended, amended or denied since the last meeting are listed and become a part of these minutes.
