

OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD

April 19, 20, 21 and 22, 1982

Boise, Idaho

Monday, April 19th, at 8:30 A.M., four members of the Outfitters and Guides Board convened for a regular meeting. Those in attendance were Chairman Jim Baughman, Glen Foster, Ivöl Sies, and Harry Vaughn--Bill Guth was absent. Ads and news items were reviewed.

Old Business was first on the agenda--with the decision of Hearing Officer Matt Mullaney reviewed, whereby he upheld the Board's action in denial of the outfitter application for James D. Farnam. The statement of services by the Hearing Officer was approved to be paid.

Enforcement Business was reviewed which included court case decisions: Ray Ralls has received a \$1,000 fine plus 2 year probationary period, with a \$2,500 restitution payment to be offered to the two clients who pressed for fee recovery; John Anderson, Boise case--in which Anderson plead guilty, a \$300 fine levied, with a one-year withheld judgement plus a restitution of \$800 deposit to the cougar client, Robert Lee; Marvin Todd & guide, Kenny Hoffman also plead guilty on an unlicensed Idaho cougar hunt and were fined \$300 each plus \$1,700 to \$1,900 restitution to client Miller, with 6 more counts pending in court against them; and discussion of the Tarbox & guides, Gibbs & Mach cases pending in Clearwater and Latah Counties. There was discussion on what enforcement officers were available to work, and a brochure referred to the Board by outfitter McAfee on an illegal California man named Caswell will be given to Al Lewis to follow up on.

Outfitter Business was worked on next. A compliment letter written about Dick McAfee and Jim Smith's operation was read; the compliment was sent in by Dick McAfee but was unsolicited by the outfitters it was written about. A letter from Travis York sent in about his Guide School was also reviewed. A letter was read which advised that Donald Whitecotton was withdrawing his application, in favor of Rick Grunch being licensed in the area was discussed. Also Cecil's comments were mentioned. It was determined that a DA-8 will be written and sent to Mr. Whitecotton to refund his license fee, along with a letter.

Forest Service people's contact with the office was noted--Clifton Blake, Ogden's call wanting numbers and dollars concerning Idaho outfitters; Earl Dodd's Environmental Assessment of Cabin Creek airfield was looked at; problems of Kenny Smith and Micky Roskelly in using a common trail for bear hunting was discussed--also Kenny Smith's guide, Rick Braaten will be licensed with a note advising his license was good as long as a current R.C. ^{card} was on file in the office; and Jo Moltzen's Red River Rgr. District draft on future outfitter licensing will be responded to--Glen will work out a response for the Board to review. Also, after review of Jim Temple's request for an exception to rule 26-a and 26-b, Glen said he would work up an outline of what criteria the requesting boating outfitter should adhere to for approval by the Board for an exception.

The board meeting was then recessed for lunch.

When the same four members reconvened, they invited in Norman Huntsman, District Ranger at Idaho Falls, and Steve Rushton of the St. Anthony Forest office; also Dave Giles joined the meeting concerning Eastern Idaho outfitter licensing and permit issuance. Maps were presented which had the F.S. suggested area revisions outlined on them, and the current operations of the following outfitters was reviewed, along with new applicants: Hincks, Robson, Kunz, Haderlie, Hill, Park, Angell, and new applicants Bob Anderson, and Tony B. Hincks...Tony's application is incomplete, as yet.

After a review of the F.S./Outfitter meeting held at Idaho Falls on March 22, 1982, suggestions were discussed concerning those outfitters not using all their past licensed areas, and those requesting additional use area, as well as areas which should not be licensed or should be left open for public use. The Board also mentioned their policy of non-use over a two year period having the licensing removed and put on a list for consideration. The F.S. explained they have a one-year non-use limit, and that it has been advised to the area outfitters as well as established in the Greater Yellowstone Policy Plan.

Norm Huntsman said that each outfitter will be met by the F.S. individually prior to permit issuance this year. There was quite a bit of discussion on whether to allow Glen Park one more opportunity to secure a permit and show use of his long held area--he will be contacted and if agreeable as determined by the Board and F.S., he will be allowed a permit for this license year. The areas finally mutually agreed to will be revised on a map by the F.S., and a copy sent to the Board. Norm said he would work closely with Glen Foster as the board member available in the area. There was discussion of illegals who hunt the area, then the two Forest Service men left the meeting.

Dave Giles stayed to discuss his work with the Board. There was discussion on reports received by the Board concerning his hunt with Norm Guth this past fall. He explained they were just friends and what had happened, but the Board advised that his work as an enforcement officer would require discretion. Dave asked what work was available to him as he could get outside work. The Board said 5-6 months on a part-time basis. Also Dave asked about a friend going along on some of his investigation--Ivol said that it was common for a fellow officer to go along on some cases, but to use good judgement on who is picked to accompany him, was advised.

After Dave left the meeting, the Board worked on applications. It was unanimously determined that Hershel Coulter be denied--citing Idaho Code 36-2109. The Board also determined that Flying Resort Ranches would be licensed solely in the area formerly licensed for elk hunting jointly to them and Rick Hussey. The meeting recessed at 5:45 P.M.

TUESDAY, APRIL 20, 1982, the same four board members reconvened in the boardroom to continue their meeting. Board Member Bill Guth was not in attendance.

There was discussion on removing from licenses river areas which show no use in the immediate past two year period, as not serving the public -- as outlined in the rules and law. Those outfitters will be advised of the Board decision, and rather than denying the licensing, the names will be held on the list for license consideration in the future.

At 11:50 A.M., LaMont Anderson, of Burley and Salmon, came in about the North side area of the Salmon River licensed to Cal Stoddard, dba Cold Meadows Outfitters. He said the area adjoined the Eakin Ridge Outfitter area and that portion was all he would be interested in. The Board mentioned that the South side area alone would not support an outfitter operation, and the Board has been advised the areas would not be split for permits. Mr. Anderson said that the F.S. seemed agreeable to combining with Eakin Ridge, but they would want the South side to go to an adjoining outfitter rather than to be split off for a new operator. The Board concurred that this was a best way to go, but advised they had not received any proposal from Cal concerning this.

LaMont then asked about referral of his clients to Jerry Meyers for the bear and cougar hunting in the Lemhi Combination area. The Board said it could be a problem if everybody did this, but saw no problem in what he explained--Jerry has also sent a letter. In response to his question about bear hunting by power boat, he was advised to keep to the area on Eakin Ridge Outfitters license. The Board then recessed for lunch at 12:30 P.M.

After the lunch hour, the four board members met with Ron Fudge, Sun Valley, who was submitting late applications and wanted to be sure to have the Silver Creek area added to his and his partner's (Dexter Haymond) licenses this year. Ron said that Dexter was not a guide outfitter and explained how he runs his business. He is asking for the Little Wood River added as well.

The Board explained an earlier telephone call to Guy Bonniver, Mgr. of the Nature's Conservancy on Silver Creek, in which he would allow two more outfitters (Fudge & Jonas) on a temporary basis--"cooperative basis, with use during the lighter demand" on Silver Creek. Ron said he also wants the Purdy Ranch and that he and Bud Purdy were on good terms. He will complete his applications.

Outfitter Ray Ralls, New Meadows and his attorney, Dale Luplow came in to meet with the Board concerning his licensing and his recent court case of illegal outfitting and guiding. The Board's enforcement officer, Al Lewis and a witness in the case, Idaho State Police Corporal, Ron Moore were also in attendance.

Attorney Luplow started by explaining that Ray Ralls had been to court on his citation, that he had plead guilty to outfitting without a license and had been found guilty, but was given a withheld judgement and 2 years maximum probation. Mr. Luplow gave the Board a copy of the Order Withholding Judgement, and went on to say that the "court judgement entered was entered to not influence the Board on licensing", that he had asked for this and that it was not a conviction. The Board members read the law section out of the Outfitters and Guides Act, Idaho Code 36-2113, #8 to Mr. Luplow and Mr. Ralls, and all looked at the statute.

It was also mentioned by the Board that they had a Breach of Contract complaint against Mr. Ralls to consider. Mr. Ralls was asked directly about his operation, which he answered that he was "not operating anywhere else, only hunted for himself"--that his "son is guiding", just "got a license, and his last client was last year." He further stated that he plans to "work more out-of-state as there are not enough animals in his area in Idaho."

Atty. Luplow defended Mr. Ralls in the statements made by his clients, Orlando (Rick) Gonzalez, W. J. Lockman, Kei Higashi and Jim Yen, advising that all had not made complaint. Atty. Luplow also mentioned that Mr. Ralls had reimbursed two of the clients and will also reimburse the other two, that two had signed release statements.

Officers Al Lewis and Ron Moore mentioned Mr. Ralls camp conditions and the condition of his stock. Mr. Ralls stated that he "was not an elk hunter--I've given that up, will stay with what I know, bear and lion hunting--know I made a mistake." Al asked him about his advertising of deer, showing him a card. Mr. Ralls claimed it was an old card about Nevada hunting.

Finally the Board stated that there would be no decision made at this meeting, that they would wait for an official copy of the court's decision, then carefully consider all input applicable, prior to making a decision on issuance of a new 1982-83 outfitter license for Mr. Ralls.

The meeting recessed at 5:45 P.M.

WEDNESDAY, APRIL 21, 1982, the meeting reconvened at 8:30 A.M. with the same four members present--Bill Guth absent.

Outfitter Business was continued with letters to be sent concerning Robert M. Smith's request for bear hunting in the area currently licensed to Wm. Heinrich. Also Heinrich's partner was brought up, --Bob Smith (Robert W.), who will be coming in to meet with board members, Jim Baughman and Ivöl Sies, on Friday, April 23rd about an outfitter license w/guiding.

Ora Medlock, Bovill has submitted an altered R.C. card--the Board denied his license application for a one-year period. He will be notified of the denial.

Martin Capps letter request for licensing for the area previously licensed to his son, Randy, was reviewed and found to already be on Martin's license. He will be advised.

Applications were reviewed for license approval until the lunch recess break.

At 1:15 P.M., the four board members reconvened and a letter from the Governor's office was read, advising that the fifth board member has been appointed--Norman Guth of Salmon, Idaho.

Outfitter Business was then continued. A letter request for exception to rule 26-b sent by Bob Doppelt, Oregon River Experiences, Inc. was approved--with reference to the same stipulations as approved for 1981 boating.

Outfitter George Duncan, Orofino, requesting additional area, will have input requested from the Department of Fish and Game, before final consideration.

Enforcement Officer, Al Lewis came in to meet with the Board. He advised that the Owyhee County court case on Marvin Todd and Kenny Hoffman on the 6 additional counts has been continued--Todd wants his attorney present. The case on Ray Tarbox & guides has been moved to Orofino. Al also had word that Ray Ralls is buying all bear skins he can get hold of, and Ken Colson does not own a boat for his outfitting business--the Board will request a list of equipment and financial statement for his new application. Other investigation was reviewed--Al will follow up on Flying H Ranches advertising and Cactus Pete's advertising on Idaho outfitting.

Outfitter Applications were worked on again for licensing: Tom Hansen will be requested to meet with the Board prior to license reconsideration; the late fees for the Three Bears Lodge & M.A. and Big Western Pine & M.A. will be waived, by their letter of explanation; in the Al Lockett case, the Board decided to consider Leo Jarvis as a Managing Agent, if they clear themselves in the Jarvis & Jim Kirk illegal outfitting case; and boat-ing outfitters, Steven Shephard dba Salmon River Outfitters' letter and also Dave Helfrich's letter will be answered. Mr. Shephard wants a letter advising a client that he is indeed a licensed and bonded outfitter, as there was a misunderstanding by the client in his inquiry to the Association and Board, and Dave Helfrich will be advised to get a certified statement of his qualification for guiding from Wally Meyer, BLM on the South Fork of the Owyhee River. New applicant, Robert C. Kirchman, was approved for outfitting the former Askin's area known as the Hole-In-The-Wall, with some additional adjoining area which was approved by the Clearwater N.F., along with those applicants who were approved for re-licensing.

The meeting then recessed at 5:30 P.M.

THURSDAY, APRIL 22, 1982, the same four board members reassembled at the board office at 8:30 A.M., and continued work on outfitter relicensing.

Glen Park's telephone call was explained--he is sending names and addresses of those guests he had to substantiate his area use, and he advised that his son, Marvin Park will work with him this fall.

Another telephone call was discussed--Don Dittmer, Emmett Rgr. District requesting copies of Don Waller's application, which will be mailed. Also the Board has talked with Walt Rogers, Payette N.F., McCall on the Waller area being requested by Stepp's outfitter business, D Double S Outfitters for summer use. It also includes the center of Quentin Selby's area. This will be researched more before approved, as Selby's has some objection.

New power boating was approved for Bob Blackadar's licensing--Iron Cr. to Corn Cr., but the Board noted that they will not allow Bob to piece-meal off his business license. His use would be only to Deadwater--the F.S. use-permit signature would not be required, as it is all private land along the area requested. Larry Moats, Salmon was denied power boating on the lower Salmon River, by Idaho Code 36-2109-b-1, 36-2113-13, and rule no. 7-c-v. of the Rules and Regulations.

Curtis Olson, M. A. of Mountain Guides, Inc., Boise came in for an appointment with the Board about an extension of area for Technical Mountaineering and Rock Climbing. He explained he is starting a school, and the method in which he teaches the basics prior to allowing participation. He will have Beginners/Intermediate/Advanced classes, with the student/instructor ratio being a maximum of 8 to 1, but only one participant at a time. He was requested to complete an operation plan for his application, and a scale down of his area request. He wants backpacking in the Birds of Prey area as well--all will be considered for extension, when all is completed.

The Board recessed for lunch, resuming at 1:15 P.M., with the four board members continuing the outfitter licensing business.

Applicants (John Hill and Lyle Kunz) will be advised that late filing fees are required before license consideration; also Con Hourihan because his application was unsigned and Hulme Dunford as his license fee was returned by the bank.

Jim Walker, Enterprise, Oregon, requesting an exception to the rule 26-b will be contacted to list the dates of his scheduled trips and explain the criteria needed to be spelled out for safety.


Terry Ring, M.A. for Silver Creek Outfitters was considered for licensing and Red Fish Lake, Petit Lake, Alturas Lake and the Salmon River were removed from what was formerly licensed to Bill Bishop, per input from the Forest Service land manager--letter dated 2/17/82. Also the Summit Cr. and Wild Horse Cr. areas were removed, with Carey Lake and Fish Cr. Reservoir added by the Board's decision--the licenses were approved and handed to Mr. Ring.

Glen Foster explained a call from Norman Huntsman, Idaho Falls F.S., who advised that Glen Park was contacted and was unhappy with the F.S. and Board's decision to remove the Palisades area from his license, but will take the Bear Creek area. Norm explained to Mr. Park that his history of use would not warrant licensing the full area as in the past, and Mr. Park advised he planned to outfit this year with a possible 8 to 10 elk hunters and 10 to 16 deer hunters. Mr. Park was advised this would be his last opportunity to get permitted and show use of the area.



Capps, Martin R. - Selway River removed from license as he could not obtain a permit from the Forest Service.

Idaho Adventures, Inc. & Henry V. Miller, M.A. - Float boating on the Selway River and power boating on the Snake River from Hell's Canyon Dam to Lewiston as a permit could not be obtained on these rivers from the Forest Service or BLM.

Leonard Expeditions - South Fork of the Owyhee River as the maximum number of outfitters are licensed at that time.

Leonard, Joe - Lead boatman status on the Owyhee River as a training card was not submitted showing the required number of trips.

Malone, Ronald L. - Antelope hunting and additional area for cougar hunting denied as the areas are licensed to other outfitters.

Medlock, Ora Lee - LICENSE SUSPENDED FOR ONE YEAR in accordance with Section 36-2113 (1) of the Outfitters and Guides Act - Red Cross card altered.

Moats, Larry - Power boating on the Salmon River from Vinegar Creek to Lewiston on the Snake River in accordance with Sections 36-2109 (b-1) and 36-2113 (13) of the Outfitters and Guides Act and Rule No. 7 (c.v.) of the Rules and Regulations.

Nichols, John S. - All activities not listed on his license was denied in accordance with Section 36-2109 (b-4 & b-5) of the Outfitters & Guides Act.

Rivers, R. B. - Float boating on the Snake River from Hell's Canyon Dam to Lewiston removed from license as a permit was not obtained from the Forest Service.

Stears, Kent - Bear hunting denied because of the moritorium.
