

OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD

June 7, 8, 9 and 10, 1982

Boise, Idaho

Monday morning, June 7th, all members of the Outfitters and Guides Board met for a regular meeting beginning at 8:30 A.M. Those present were Chairman Jim Baughman, Ivol Sies, Glen Foster, Harry Vaughn and Norman Guth.

After review of information, the five members of the Board left for a meeting with Idaho Attorney General, David Leroy, concerning the outcome of the outfitters trip which included Member Norman Guth, to Washington DC concerning the F.S. Bid & Prospectus.

When the board members returned, the Board determined that a letter would be written and sent to Governor Evans advising him on the outcome of their trip also.

Outfitter Business was then worked on, with ARTA's request to have a baggage boat rowed by a trainee who did not have a validated training card and had <sup>not</sup> submitted an application, fee or RC photocopy. The rules were looked at, and it was agreed that the rule was not explicit for a situation of this type. Also Steve Cutright's letter requesting copies of Tony Compagnone correspondence--the Board will refer his request to their attorney for response.

New Business included Chairman Baughman's explanation of his meeting at Vale, OR with Bureau of Land Management officials, Oregon Marine Board, outfitters Bob and Jay Sevy, and other interested parties.

The meeting concerned the Owyhee River-Wilderness vs. Recreational designation with discussion and use-figures on commercial and private use; problems with disturbance of wildlife; put-in and take-out access which involved private land at present, etc. A Recreation Use Allocation Manual was given out for study--the next meeting is scheduled for early August. A member of the Board will plan to attend if possible.

Old Business came before the Board--the deadline of May 25 for appeal on the Board's Proposed Decision on the James D. Farnam Hearing Case has passed and the Board unanimously decision was to accept the Proposed Decision as the Final Decision and will advise Mr. Farnam.

Other old business included a copy of a follow-up letter written by the Assn.'s attorney concerning Myrna Beamer's client, Lyn Schoenfeld, of Media, PA, which was read.

Board Business included discussion concerning the work load of the office staff. It was the Board's decision that additional office space will be inquired into prior to hiring another girl to start training.

Lunch recess was then called, with all members returning at 1:00 P.M., meeting with the Board's attorney, Pat Riceci, and the file of Hershel Coulter was reviewed prior to him coming in for a Hearing before the Board on his license denial.

At 1:50 PM, Hershel Coulter and wife & daughter, of Donnelly, came in. Mr. Coulter asked first to have the denial reasons explained. Mr. Baughman cited Idaho Code 36-2109, as was advised in the denial letter of April 19, 1982 to Mr. Coulter. Following this, Mr. Coulter was asked again about his dogs and equipment available for use, if licensed.

Mr. Coulter explained that he had 6 hounds--4 are old dogs, but has access to more dogs; has a Datsun truck, with additional transportation available to him which belongs to his wife and father; snowmobiles & sleds; and explained what he hoped to line up for a place for his clients to stay--the Baum Shelter at Warren, but it could not be completely monopolized, he said. The Board said this was a major concern--that the clients have adequate and comfortable accommodations.

Hershel said when the Baum Shelter was not available, as it would not be on the holidays, he would take an extra tent, extra bedroll & clothes, grub boxes, etc.-- and that his wife would cook. Glen asked about his financial status. He explained his present jobs and also his intentions to build a lodge on some land he has. Ivol asked if there were any one else involved, and mentioned that bear hunting was not available to him at this time.

The bear moratorium was explained again in detail, and Mr. Coulter was advised it

probably would be continued another year, which would limit his income for outfitting, with only cougar hunting licensed. There then was considerable discussion on other outfitter operations already licensed. Mr. Coulter mentioned that Dean McGuire was a friend "who could help him", in answer to Harry about guides. Mr. Baughman then explained that by law guides only furnish personal services, no dogs or equipment. Hershel said this was different than Nevada, where guides furnish dogs as well--he said he and Dean McGuire had both hunted for Ray Ralls in Nevada several years ago.

Explanation was made by both Mr. and Mrs. Coulter concerning the "kidnapping" charges on file for Mr. Coulter--it involves Mrs. Coulter's former marriage and her children. They explained that the probationary time has about expired, and names were given for the Board to check further if more information was wanted.

The size of the business was again mentioned, with Norman asking how he would conduct his business for a livelihood. Mr. Coulter said he only wanted a small business and lived very frugal by other people's standards. That he had other income, but his business would be an "honest" business.

The Board said that if licensed, the area would not be considered as transferrable in a sale of business. It was finally determined what criteria must be met before reconsideration would be made on the licensing. Mr. Coulter must supply a lease agreement for the Baum Shelter (5 years or yearly w/option) for his clients a place to stay and if he planned to have someone help him, to have a lease agreement on the dogs. It was suggested that a letter will be sent regarding this. The Board's attorney also warned that there should be no operation until a license is issued. Mr. Coulter advised that he wanted his license by November, as they left the meeting.

Then, before Attorney Riceci left the board meeting, there was discussion on ARTA's request for all information Tony Compagnone has sent to the Board in their lawsuit against him. A letter will be sent advising that a subpoena would be in order; Mr. Riceci also advising sending back in entirety the confidential records which ARTA's managing agent has sent to the Board.

Attorney Luplow's request for a formal hearing was also mentioned, in the denial by the Board of Ray Rall's license. Pat said he would inquire for the Board on this.

Jerry Meyers, Salmon, then came in to talk to the Board about an amendment he wants to have added to his licensed outfitting, which would allow an access to his hunting area by boating the Middle Fork of the Salmon River, then going up Wilson Creek the 2 to 3 miles to his area. This would be for the sheep permit-hunting only, September through October 24th, he said. He said that Fish and Game had increased permit hunting in the area he has licensed, and that he has called the Forest Service and they said it was after their control season. Glen pointed out that there is still some boating going on then, for steelhead fishing.

Jerry said that put-in would be at the Flying B, and he would then float 33 miles and planned to train to be his own boatman. He presented the Board with copies of a letter he had mailed out to various outfitters to try to work a deal for them to boat his clients, but said he had received little interest.

The Board said that Jerry could work with the Forest Service on a permit, but he was warned that the licensing would have to be carefully considered, as it could have considerable effect--as many others have wanted on that river, one way or another.

The Board discussed this proposal after Jerry left the meeting, then recessed for the evening at 5:15 P.M.

TUESDAY, JUNE 8, 1982, all members of the licensing board reconvened, and worked on Outfitter Business. A call was then received from Steve Cutright, M.A. for American River Touring Association concerning their problems in the Compagnone case.

Glen gave a report on his meeting with Fremont County Parks & Recreation Board and the area snowmobilers on May 19th, at Ashton. His opinion was that emergency rules should be adopted for groomed trails exception. The suggestion that was agreed upon was one guide for 10 to 12 snowmachines, then a 2nd guide--no more than 30 snowmachines in one group. The Board members discussed this and unanimously agreed to instigate emergency rules, but to hold off until just before the season because of the 120 day limit, then to change the rules through a regular hearing later.

Other rules to be considered for changes would be the closing dates on northern Idaho rivers and canoe guiding. Fish and Game input will be considered in making changes, as well as the Board agreed to send letters again to the Sportsmen's Clubs, and Chambers of Commerce also in the areas involved.

There was given more input from the May 19th meeting that the Fremont County Commissioners are concerned and want "No more fishermen licensed on the Henry's Fork, Teton River or the South Fork of the Snake River". Also that there is strong feeling against the commercial use of the Fall River. Glen also mentioned his meeting with Lyle Kunz and Dale Robson, and that they understand about the area removed from their licenses with no permits. Glen said he felt this was a good constructive meeting.

Randy Berry's license request for trailrides and bird hunting was reviewed. The Forest Service did not realize that there are six outfitter operations licensed in the Big Hole Mtns and they feel there are enough licensed, except possibly for day trips in the Teton District. Keith Birch has advised his signature on the application was not for approval of bird hunting and trailrides, and that they will contact the Board on his application.

The Nature's Conservancy meeting at Hailey was then reported on, which had most outfitters who use the area in attendance. Guy Bonnevier had called the meeting as there was reports of increased use by Ron Fudge, with his new licensing, and he was pressed to limit his use. Glen advised the group that the Board has promised to not license any more outfitters for Silver Creek, and Guy Bonnevier had agreed to a limited licensing for Ron Fudge. There was discussion on the Board removing bird hunting, but it was explained and all appreciated the Board's representation at the meeting.

The next appointment then came in to meet with the Board--Jim Searles and Rob Fuller, Challis, concerning a license for drift-boat fishing on the main Salmon River; fishing on the E. Fork of the Salmon and Pahsimeroi River too for walk and wade fishing. They said they have permission to use private access. They are dealers in boating equipment and have referrals for this type of an operation. They did not have their applications complete and will finish them for consideration, paying the fees etc. for licensing.

Outfitter Business was again worked on. Stan Meholchick, Boise was approved for additional licensing, also Don Waller was approved for additional business. Then James L. Conner, North Fork was approved to be licensed for the Lemhi Combination Area Bear Hunting as he took over the area formerly licensed to Cummings--the extension will be sent with no fee charged, as this was a correction on licensing. Also a telephone call was discussed about Larry Jarrett in a deal to obtain the Double K Outfitters area which adjoins his.

The Board then recessed for lunch.

At 1:00 P.M., all members again worked on outfitter and guide licensing. Vinson Johnson, M.A. for Wild Rivers West will be advised that the late fee he protested must be paid, as both applications are incomplete by Idaho Code 36-2102 (b).

Al Lewis came in to review his investigation and court cases. He explained the jury trial at Salmon where Corky Torrey has been found not guilty; also other investigation he made while in the Salmon area. The Jesse Caswell court fine of \$1,000 plus being put in jail (90 day sentence), and a deposit he has made with another out-of-state hunter who will be coming to Idaho to hunt this fall, was explained. Several other investigations are under way, and the Board approved Al to go ahead.

The altered R.C. card of Cliff Gallagher's guide, Irvin Schmitt was discussed--it was determined to contact all involved, and there had been several telephone calls.

Norm Guth left the meeting at this time--4:55 P.M., as other suspected falsified R.C. card applications were looked at, also the F. & G. citation on Richard M. Winkler was discussed and the Board determined he would be issued a probationary license.

The contract with Fish and Game on radio use was approved to be renewed. It will be typed, signed and sent to Fish and Game for their approval.

The meeting then recessed at 5:30 P.M.

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 9, 1982, all members again convened at 8:30 A.M., with discussion on the Owyhee River study which is going on.

Outfitter Business was again worked on which included a report that bankruptcy has been filed by outfitter Tom Hansen--it was noted that he has not completed his application for licensing as yet. The input from F. & G. was read on the Board's consideration of John Anderson's licensing, and amendments to licenses of George Duncan, Edward McCallum, and Ed Hunt were approved to be mailed. John A. K. Barker's request for big game hunting along the Snake & Salmon River breaks will be researched more to F. & G. (as Barker had not supplied the information). R. B. Rivers' letter objecting to having some of his boating removed because of non-use will be responded to, also, concerning the bird hunting. The request made by David Mills to transfer credit of a guide's license which has already been issued cannot be done--a letter advising will be sent to him. And the letter from Robert Gregg, Lewiston protesting removal of his non-used boating will also have a letter sent.

The Board called a recess for lunch, then resumed their meeting at 1:30 P.M., meeting with Homer and Dennis Joseph, Riggins. They came in to clear up a problem on their licenses, which the Board checked out. It involved an area overlap in Unit #18, which allowed Harvey Whitten the same area for elk hunting, which was an oversight by the Board. This will be corrected on both licenses.

They discussed their operation which they are having trouble with illegals using their area. The men mentioned several names and were advised to call the Board for help in easing this problem, when they knew the illegal operator was there. The Board was also notified by the Josephs in this meeting that Dean McGuire had "pulled a deal" on them and will not be hired back. The Josephs also mentioned a summer packtrip setup they are working on which will be requested to go down from the top down Granite Creek to the Snake River.

After the two men left the meeting, a motion was made by Ivoll, that Whitten will have his license amended to exclude the portion of Unit #18 already licensed (to Josephs); Glen seconded the motion and it was passed.

Dal Allmon, Eagle came in for an appointment to see the Board about removing the limit in Unit #43 on his license which involved his cougar hunting. He advised that F & G has extended the area twice since he became licensed. The Board said they saw no problem in his request and he left the meeting.

Outfitter licensing for the new M.A. for Ricks College, Dave J. Thompson and Dave Wescott, a guide, were approved, but the Board will write for a certified statement from both men concerning their expertise and qualification.

At 3:15 P.M., Marvin Todd, Boise came in concerning his 1982-83 licensing and a citation and complaint against him, involving illegal hunting for cougar<sup>and</sup> in an area not licensed to him. He has been fined \$300.00 and has 6 more counts outstanding against him in Owyhee County court. He complained of the fine and restitution he is having to come up with, along with attorney fees and lost money from cancelled hunts.

He answered the Board on why did he do this--that it was "stupid, and agrees that he shouldn't have", but feels that his punishment was far worse than anybody else gets, etc. He claimed he didn't have a record of this type of operation, but the Board said it was a second complaint. Harry mentioned it affects the whole industry, etc.

Todd admitted he is still licensed to hunt in Nevada, that he was not completely put out of business. After much discussion on all the various aspects of the complaint, Mr. Todd left the meeting and the Board reviewed all the input and denied his license for 1982-83, by Idaho Code 36-2113, a-8 & 11.

Robert West, Boise then came in about his new application for bird hunting in Owyhee County area, also big game in F & G Units 41 & 46. It was determined in questioning and review of the application, that the bird hunting was the major outfitting interest.

There was a long discussion on the bird hunting restrictions the Board is forced to consider, which have come about from a formal hearing. And although Mr. West repeatedly argued that the Board has licensed one strictly "bird hunter", Lee Schultzmeier, and that this should be his opportunity too, the Board explained that Mr. Schultzmeier was licensed ahead of the ruling from the Hearing, and the Board must adhere to the decision. Mr. West left the meeting at 5:30 P.M., and the board meeting was recessed.

THURSDAY, JUNE 10, 1982, all members reconvened at 8:30 A.M., except Norm Guth.

A call came in from Tom Jarvis, Mackay about his former summer operation which involves the area licensed to Tim Gardiner and Milt Butler, M.A.'s for the Devil's Bedstead which would be in the Fall Creek and Broad Canyon area. A call will be made to the Lost R. Ranger District and the area will be added if all okay for permits.

A telephone call from LuVerne Grussing, BLM, Cottonwood was received--Jim and Glen both talked to him. LuVerne agreed with the Board's decision concerning adding the Lower Main Salmon River back on Carl Russell's license, as use was shown, as required.

Outfitter licensing was finished, and Misc. Board Business included reading of the April 6 & 7, 1982 minutes, which were approved by Ivol's motion, and Harry second. Also the minutes requested by Ralls' attorney were discussed. As they were approved, a copy will be sent to Ralls' attorney, Dale Luplow. Jim Baughman left the meeting for an appointment.

The application of Jesse Caswell to guide for outfitter, A. W. Angell, was looked at and denied, as he has been convicted of outfitting w/out a license. The letter from outfitter, Jim Walker, requesting an exception for a boating trip for this year, was approved--he will be notified by letter.

The Board instructed the secretary to look into the price of a computer and setup a demonstration for the next board meeting. Then, with the work completed, the meeting was adjourned at 12:30 P.M.
