

OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD

July 19, 20 and 21, 1982

Boise, Idaho

Monday, July 19, 1982, all members except Norman Guth convened at the Boise office for a regular meeting beginning at 8:30 A.M. Those in attendance were Chairman Jim Baughman, Glen Foster, Ivol Sies and Harry Vaughn.

The minutes of April 7 & 8, and April 19, 20, 21 and 22 meetings were read and approved by motion made by Glen and seconded by Harry.

The first appointment before the Board was outfitters R. B. Rivers and his wife, of Lewiston, and Myrna and Wally Beamer of Heller Bar, Asotin, Washington. They explained that the Beamers have purchased the total outfitter business of Dick Rivers, and that Wally Beamer will license as the outfitter. There was discussion on how the second set of permits/licenses would be kept. The Beamers advised that there would be two complete sets of books kept. A 10-year contract has been written and the Rivers' will keep their lodge on the Oregon side along the Snake River. Mr. Rivers will keep the mailrun in his name also and Wally will subcontract the mail business thereby continuing the Rivers' business essentially the same.

The outfitting business includes jet boating only on the Snake River, Hell's Canyon Dam to Lewiston and the lower Main Salmon River; power and float boating on the Clearwater River; fishing and chukar hunting along the rivers; and big game hunting along the Snake & lower Salmon River breaks. Wally said that if approved, this business would be kept complete and if at some future time he wanted out, he would not release portions in business dealings with others, the same with Heller Bar business. Outfitter application forms will be completed by Wally.

Mr. Baughman explained a telephone call he had with Al Lockett, in which Al said he has an agreement with Leo Jarvis and Jim Kirk, as managing agents, netting Lockett 20%. Then the two new managing agent applicants came in to meet the Board.

Leo Jarvis, Nampa and Jim Kirk, Boise have been friends on a "father/son" basis for many years, hunting the area they were cited in for outfitting/guiding without licenses was explained. Leo feels he was wrongly accused and wanted his side explained which he did. The case resulted in \$100.00 being paid by Mr. Jarvis to make restitution on the Board's deposit. The Board advised they had not received the money as yet, but were not prejudiced against the men in this case.

The men explained they had obtained some good gentle horses and equipment and will get their applications in order for approval.

There was discussion about the enforcement men's new special deputy cards taking so long to be renewed by the Dept. of Law Enforcement, and where they are working, then the next appointment came in to meet with the Board.

Buddy Broussard, Pierce, Idaho and guide applicant, Ned Lougee, Orofino, Idaho came in to explain that Mr. Broussard has worked out a 50-50 partnership deal with Everett Woodworth. He explained that he was a former Colorado outfitter with a friend named Bill but they sold out. He has leased 75 acres of private property, and has spent some time in the Woodworth area cleaning up Woodworth's "improvements" and trails etc, to meet the F.S. requirements. His guide, Ned Lougee will not supply horses was stated, and it was explained what constitutes guiding. Woodworth is not qualified to guide too was mentioned.

Mr. Broussard said he wants summer activity and mentioned several lakes, in connection with the B-Bar-C Lodge he has, and wants to take children in during the summer.

Spot camp problems were mentioned by the Board, and Buddy said he plans to purchase a refrigerated truck and the lodge has a cooler--he said he was a meat cutter as well, and could take good care of the animals. The Woodworth horses are gone he mentioned, and he will be getting the application complete, and will be sending in 6 guide applications too.

The meeting then recessed for lunch--12:15 to 1:00 P.M.

Three members reconvened after lunch, with Ivol and Norman absent, and there was

review of the application for Charley Thompson, Sr., for power boating and fishing on the lower Salmon River.

Ivol returned to the meeting, then Charley Thompson and his wife, Grangeville, came in about a new license and his citation.

The Board first asked about his connection with Kenneth Colson and Mr. Thompson explained that he thought that they were legal in what they were doing, and Mr. Colson had the license. He said he has paid a fine of \$511.50 to the court in the Board's case, and the case filed by Fish and Game has been dismissed. He showed the Board a copy of his cancelled check. He further explained his arrangement with Colson, saying that he did the work receiving 10% in the deal, but now Mr. Colson has sold his boat.

Concerning his license application, Charley Thompson explained there was 45 miles of the river where he was interested in being licensed mainly, and that he would have to obtain a Coast Guard permit for use on the Snake River. He will complete his applicatio

After the Thompsons left the meeting, the Ken Colson outfitter application was reviewed, and with no response to the Board's inquiry on what equipment he now has, his financial status, etc., the Board denied his application--Idaho Code 36-2113-1, citing failure to provide information requested. He has a license to guide for Paul Resnick's Shepp Ranch already and his wife is also employed there, it is understood.

Larry Wells, Idaho Falls, next came in to discuss licensing the Rehabilitation Survival Program he conducts in the remote areas of Idaho. He had obtained permission for backpacking in the Chamberlain Basin area from F.S. Mgr., Earl Dodds. He said he will have a trip in August, starting at Big Creek, down Beaver Cr. Trail to Smith Creek, using experienced instructors, and he will license four as guides. As the application was complete, the Board approved it for licensing.

Al Lewis, Enforcement Officer, then came in to discuss his investigation with the Board. He explained the court case which involved Tarbox's guides, Gibbs & Mach--that they were found not guilty of illegal guiding. However, Richard Mach will be brought up later in court on the charge of altering an official document, which he admitted to doing. Other cases Al will be working on, were mentioned, then he left the meeting.

There was discussion on applications submitted with altered Red Cross cards, then a motion was made concerning the Board's policy. Glen made a motion--"that the minutes of September 10, 1979 be recinded as a 'set' policy"...('a one-year license denial be mandatory on a proven altered first aid card. '), "that now each case be up to the discretion of the Board concerning altered R.C. cards." Ivol seconded the motion, and it was approved unanimously by the four board members present.

There followed discussion on issuance of citations in these cases. It was decided to be researched with the courts, etc.

Kery Secrist, Idaho Falls, came in next about his guide application which is being held up because of the altered R.C. card he has submitted for a license. He presented a new card and explained how he had missed the first aid class scheduled, as a job was available and he had been desperate for work. Then when he had the opportunity to guide for John Hill, as he has worked for in the past, he altered the date on the card to get the license. He further explained that the outfitter was unaware that he had altered the card when his application was signed. He also explained what hardship would be imposed if he was denied a license for a year, as he works for John Hill tying flies and guides as the opportunity presents it's self. The Board impressed upon Mr. Secrist the seriousness of his deed and after he left the meeting, it was discussed and determined he would be issued a probationary license as he has secured the updated training and has lost work to get this straightened out.

There followed this meeting, a telephone call from the board's attorney, Pat Riceci, in which the Chairman and Vice-Chairman discussed several issues which included the Colson denial, Ray Ralls' hearing request, and Ray Tarbox's case--the Prosecuting Attorney will be advised to drop the state's charges on outfitter Tarbox.

At 5:00 P.M., Troy Merrill, Winchester, Idaho, came in for an appointment. He explained his new outfitter proposal, as well as submitted a completed application. The Board saw no problem in his request for fishing and trailrides on private and Idaho lands, where he has obtained permission. He explained it was in close proximity to his home and would be a family operation. The Board warned him of using his children as guides and what guiding constituted. He mentioned he hopes to expand into cross-country skiing if this operation takes hold.

After Mr. Merrill left the meeting, his application was approved, then the meeting recessed at 5:45 P.M.

TUESDAY, JULY 20, 1982, the meeting reconvened at 8:30 A.M., with the same four members--Jim Baughman, Glen Foster, Ivol Sies and Harry Vaughn present. Also in attendance was Al Lewis.

The complaint of Marvin Todd, Sweet (formerly of Boise), and the report of Dennis Ray Miller, Moscow was read again. Then Mr. Todd was called at his Sweet store. It was explained that the Board had not reversed their decision on his license denial and that there are still 6 counts of violation registered against him in Owyhee County court.

Following the phone call, Al discussed his work with the Board again. Al then left the meeting at 11:30 A.M.

The members next worked on Outfitter Business--discussing Tom Webb and the Fenwick School's use of Henry's Fork. The protest by Del Davis on a late fee charge was reviewed and it was determined that he will be refunded the extra charge, as his bonding company had caused the delay in mail request for a new financial statement. Aaron Wilson of Riggins, new application was reviewed, and with the Dept. of Fish and Game input, it was denied for reason--Idaho Code 36-2109, b-4 & b-5. Bob Anderson's new application for the Glen Park area was reviewed and it was decided that the Board will contact Norm Huntsman of the Forest Service, prior to approval.

The members then recessed for lunch, with the same four reconvening at 1:15 P.M. meeting with Jeff Amsberry, Albany, Oregon. Mr. Amsberry is a guide applicant for outfitter Dan Simmons, Oregon River Outfitters. Jeff admitted he too had falsified his Red Cross card, but has since taken a new course--submitting a new card with a copy of his receipt. He was told by the Board that it was a felony to alter public records, and he replied that he was unaware of this. He said he had updated his training with the Fire Department in 1980, but couldn't find that card, so he took an older card and changed the date to the proximity of the date of the 1980 class. He explained that he realizes now the folly as he has lost a trip as well as the expense and embarrassment of having to come in before the Board.

Steve Wieber, Asotin, WA, next came in about an Idaho outfitter license. He has been running the Snake River for several years dba Happy Hooker Excursions. His power boating, fishing and bird hunting application has been approved for a permit by Art Seamons, HCNRA, and he said that he and Gary Swift, both, will be approved to go up as far as the dam next year.

Mr. Wieber expressed his interest in bear hunting and backpacking up the canyons as well as working together with Gary Swift on trailriding into the Seven Devil Mtns., up Sheep Creek. His bear hunting was explained--no baits, no dogs, taking about two bear a season. The Board explained the moratorium on licensing on new bear hunters.

There was discussion on use of the lower Salmon R. as well, for steelhead fishing and deer hunting (Dug Bar to Wolf Cr.--the owners of the 17,000 acres would give him approval for use from Ghetto Cr. to Wolf Cr.)--the Board suggested he limit his application this first year, as they brought up his citations. He said he felt he had a side to them too

At 3:00 P.M., Radio Shack representatives, Mike Carpenter and Bob Minton, came in with their computer equipment which they set up and explained. The Board expressed their appreciation for the demonstration, and after the young men left, there was discussion on a meeting also with the state representatives from the Auditor's Office--that there was a possibility the Board might be able to hook into the state's computer system.

At 4:15 P.M., the four members of the board then left the meeting to meet with Governor Evans in his office, at the request of Paul Cunningham, the Governor's assistant. The meeting recessed at this time.

WEDNESDAY, JULY 21, 1982, the four members, Jim Baughman, Glen Foster, Ivola Sies and Harry Vaughn, all met back at the office's boardroom at 8:30 A.M., to continue their meeting.

Applications were worked on. It was determined to have our enforcement officers try to contact guide applicants, Stanley Butler and Patricia Formicelli, concerning altered R.C. cards, and possibly guiding without license.

There was also a decision made by the Board that form letters be made to expedite the issuance of denial letters. The Board further determined that their attorney will be contacted again on the fees increase needed, and to have built into the law a civil penalty concerning submission of altered first aid cards.

There was discussion concerning the emergency rules changes needed for the snowmobilers, and also the river closure dates which are being disputed in North Idaho. The 120-day limit will be considered in instigation of the rules--they will be worked on at a future meeting, with this in mind.

Fall River use was brought up and the feeling of the people in that area. It was determined to contact the Fremont County Commissioners for their input on this river's use commercially, for the next rules changes. The additional area and activities requested by Randy Berry, M.A. of Teton Valley Lodge was discussed; a letter from the Teton Ranger District, and a meeting that Glen attended, as well as Jim's conversation with Randy were all brought up. Mr. Baughman also mentioned the Hearing (Docket No. 80-2 & No. 80-3) and the outcome about tying up considerable area for bird hunting, as well as the Board's responsibility to consider the public. The request was then denied--citing Idaho Code 36-2109 (b-5).

Jerry Meyers request for a license extension was then reviewed. The board members agreed that when a transportation request in connection with a sheep or goat hunt was made, with all requirements met, that probably they would approve it as a boating exception request, but determined to deny his request for float boating on the Middle Fork of the Salmon River from the Flying B to Cache Bar, as requested, as the maximum number of boaters are licensed.

The minutes of May 12, 13 and 14, 1982, and the minutes of June 7, 8, 9 and 10, 1982 were read and approved after discussion. The motion to accept the minutes as read was made by Ivola, seconded by Glen and approved by those present.

License amendments were approved for John A. K. Barker, Lewiston for (non-exclusive) deer and elk hunting on the Snake and Salmon River breaks; approved for Robert M. Smith, Kooskia, for an extension to include bow hunting for deer; and also approved for Dal Allmon for his request to increase to 2 cougars for that part of Unit #43 licensed to him. Stan Meholchick's new license extension request will be researched.

A letter was approved to be sent to Jim Renni of the University of Idaho Alumni Assn. advising him that he had not requested all of the lower Salmon River boating, but that it would be considered if he does request it, and advising that he too could request an exception in his row-it-yourself trips, for the Board's consideration for approval.

Other Outfitter Business included a decision that Ray Tarbox would be requested to come in to meet with the Board to have the law and rules and regulations clarified, as well as to reiterate what is needed to complete his application for his license issuance.

The new partner who will be the managing agent for Bob Liming's Alpine Wilderness Leadership School, James Holcomb, will be contacted to complete license application forms. A complaint was read concerning Mr. Holcomb.

Lute Jerstad, Portland, Oregon then came in for an appointment with the Board in getting his Idaho outfitter's licenses. His type of operation would need the Board's approval for exception to the rules it seems. He will send in a resume of his operation for the Board's consideration for boating exception, and will complete his applications--for the Lute Jerstad Adventures with himself as managing agent. There was discussion concerning the Oregon law and his operation under their license. They did not require the guides to have the first aid training, and he will get this requirement too ready for 1983 licensing. He said he had one more trip this year. Mr. Jerstad works also for the government in India, and has been out of the country.


Old Business next included review of the James D. Farnam, Port Angeles, WA hearing decision--there has not been any further request on the Hearing outcome on his 1981 license denial. Then the Board considered the new application of Mr. Farnam, and after contact with their attorney, review of advertising of Idaho in the annual 1982 Hunter magazine by Farnam, and consideration of the Board's moratorium on licensing new bear hunters, this 1982 application was denied--citing Idaho Code 36-2102-b, 36-2104-a, and 36-2113-14.

Misc. Board Business was reviewed--the 1984 budget and expenses and income, as well as additional room rental which is needed. The Board determined to make an offer on additional room space in this building, and if acceptable by Public Works, to go ahead on moving into another suite of rooms.

The business being completed for this meeting, the Board moved to adjourn the meeting, at 5:45 P.M.
