MINUTES

Outfitters and Guides Board Boise, Idaho

APRIL 13, 1983

At 0845, a meeting was called to order by Chairman James Baughman at the Holiday Inn, Boise, Idaho. Other members present were Glen Foster, Harry Vaughn, Norman Guth and Robert Salter.

The members discussed hiring of an enforcement man for the Salmon area, and also decided to hire Heyward Jack for parttime work in the Riggins and Grangeville area.

Increase in fees to offset the Board's operation expense was brought up, and the differential in resident fees and nonresident fees. Several points were mentioned in support of the nonresident fee charge being at a higher rate than the resident fee: they were the investigation made by the Legislature and their support of the increase for nonresident fees, the evidence of less taxes collected by nonresident outfitting in Idaho, and the additional cost to the Board for investigation and enforcement con-

The Board reviewed the input from the Agency meeting, and determined that with the increased interest in steelhead licensing, it would have to be carefully monitored and researched before licensing.

After review of all information secured, Robert Lamm's application for a guide license was denied by all members, citing his Fish and Game violation. Letters will be immediately sent explaining to both Mr. Lamm and his outfitter.

The meeting adjourned at 0930.

At 1600, another meeting was called to order by Chairman Baughman, with all members except Norman Guth present, meeting with outfitter Hank Miller, M.A., Idaho Adventures, Inc., regarding his request to the Board for exception to Rule 26.b.

Mr. Miller will provide the Board with a copy of his boating procedures for his proposed U-DO-IT trips he is booking for 1983, and the Board will draft and send him an exception procedures format to complete and return for the Board's consideration.

The meeting adjourned at 1630.
