Idaho Outfitters and Guides Board
Boise, Idaho

January 18, 19, and 20, 1984

A regular meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Board was called to order by Chairman Glen R. Foster, at 0830, January 18, 1984, in the office boardroom at Boise, Idaho. Other members present were: Robert L. Salter, William R. Meiners, Scott Farr, and Harry W. Vaughn.

Meiners mentioned some problems encountered with worded area descriptions not coinciding with mapped big game hunting descriptions as he entered this information on the new maps he is preparing for the Board's use, and that some specific areas will need the Board's attention later in the meeting.

The minutes of December 5-10, 1983 board meetings were read and corrected. Vaughn then moved, and Farr seconded and the motion passed THAT THE MINUTES OF THE DECEMBER, 1983, BOARD MEETINGS BE APPROVED AS CORRECTED.

Following discussion, the Board determined that the practice of listing as a part of the minutes outfitters and guides who are issued or denied licenses, extensions or amendments, be discontinued. It is a duplication of a listing now being made showing all licensees by name, number, action taken and date issued, as well as Board's action recorded in the minutes. The secretary was also instructed to research and design an amendment form which would expedite issuance of license extensions or amendments.

Attorney General Deputy Kurt Burkholder joined the meeting. Steve Alley, Garden Valley, then came before the Board to discuss his application for cougar and predator hunting, explaining it was his desire to take only a limited number of cougar, with no hunting in December, as they hunt bobcat then. He also mentioned a desire for an elk hunting area in an "unused" portion of the Dan Rotthoff area.

Following the meeting with Alley, Attorney Burkholder advised he would again contact Alley's attorney, Raymond K. Setske, Jr. Chairman Foster also asked that he try to speed up a finalization of this litigation, as Mr. Burkholder left the meeting.

Expenses and income were reviewed, along with an itemization of 1983 W-2 wages. Following review, Meiners moved, Vaughn seconded and the motion passed THAT THE ATTORNEY GENERAL'S DECEMBER, 1983, BILLING BE PAID.

Ron Burch, Caldwell, appeared before the Board with a new application for licensing in Fish and Game Units 40 and 42 for deer, antelope and bird hunting. Letters of inquiry will be sent to the Idaho Department of Fish and Game and the licensed outfitters in the area being requested.

Following review of the complaints of guides Tom Bower, and Robert & William Babcock that outfitter Gerald Richie had not provided them with licenses they had purchased, it was determined that copies of the licenses will be sent to the guides. Also, Laurie Hovie's guide license was never received by her and a copy will be sent.

Gary Peters and Tom Wright, Corvallis, Montana, met with the Board concerning new licensing as outfitters of the area being released by Bobby Crick. Both men have licensed as guides for Crick and helped run the business for the past season, and Mr. Wright is a formerly licensed Montana outfitter. They were advised of a complaint against Mr. Crick filed by a Mr. Hervieux which must be resolved before Board action on their request. Then following this meeting, Salter moved, Farr seconded and the motion passed THAT IN THE EVENT GARY PETERS AND TOM WRIGHT DBA 5 BEARS OUTFITTERS PARTNERSHIP COMPLETE THEIR APPLICATIONS AND SATISFY MR. HERVIEUX AND INDICATE THAT THEY WISH TO BE LICENSED FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE 1983-84 YEAR, THAT THE LICENSES BE APPROVED AND ISSUED WHEN THE ABOVE REQUIREMENTS ARE MET. THIS ALSO WOULD APPLY IF THEY WISH TO BE LICENSED FOR THE 1984-85 LICENSE YEAR.

Prior to the appointment of Homer and Dennis Joseph, Riggins, the Board reviewed the complaints from their hunters, a statement from Norman Rudolph who supplied the rental horses used during this hunt, and a report by U.S. Forest Service Special Investigator, Mike Merkle.

Then the Josephs, dba Seven Devils Outfitters, came before the Board to explain the events of the hunt and answer to the complaints. Homer Joseph explained that Sutton, who was unlicensed, only did camp chores, cutting wood and did not actually do any "guiding".

Jim Renshaw, Kooskia, Bill Heinrich, Heinrich's son-in-law, and Gene Fish, who was Heinrich's cook and wrangler, came before the Board to try to work out an area dispute. Renshaw explained the agreement worked out between the former area outfitters, Shawley and Smolinski, on joint-use of the Smolinski (Heinrich) area after the first two weeks of the season. Renshaw, assuming the old agreement still valid, has continued joint-use for the 11 years he has been licensed in the old Shawley area. Heinrich explained that guests and guide had encountered Renshaw's son while guiding clients in the Heinrich area both in 1981 and again in 1983. He expressed his feeling that this violated Idaho law and that it could not be continued. Agreement was reached to move the area boundary between the two outfitters from the trail to Weitas Creek, thus allowing the base camp to remain in its present location but be within Renshaw's area. Also, a topographic map will be supplied showing a part of Heinrich's area which may be used by Renshaw during the last one-half of the rifle season set by the Idaho Department of Fish and Game. The agreed upon area is bounded by Trail 103, the 7th Standard Parellel North, and Middle Creek.

The meeting then recessed at 1850 hours.

Thursday, January 19, 1984, all members reconvened at their Boise office boardroom as Chairman Foster called the meeting to order at 0830. Other members present were Robert Salter, William Meiners, Scott Farr and Harry Vaughn.

Applications were reviewed for license approval. There followed discussion of the Board's new policy of contacting existing outfitters for input on new license applicants. The secretary was instructed not to notify existing outfitters until she received direction from the Board.

Attorney General Deputy Clive J. Strong joined the meeting as Larry A. Jarrett, Kuna, dba Lazy J Outfitters, and his attorney, John Sutton, came before the Board to answer to a complaint alleging mistreatment of private hunters using his area. Mr.

Jarrett also submitted a counter complaint against outfitter Robert M. Smith, Kooskia. Smith had accompanied the private hunting party who filed the complaint against Mr. Jarrett. Letters and pictures were submitted by Jarrett as the incident was explained, and the attorney advised he will forward the Board additional material.

Following the appointment, the Board's enforcement officer, Albert Lewis, who also sat in during the Jarrett meeting, advised he had been contacted by Larry Jarrett about Bob Smith, and that a report he had submitted a year ago would be on file.

Attorney Strong then discussed the two court cases involving Rich Cook and B-Bar-C Outfitters in Idaho and Clearwater Counties. He also discussed his contact with Legislative Council Director, Myron Schlechte, and then left the meeting.

Gary Armacost, Council, dba Hell's Canyon Adventures, Inc., came before the Board to discuss the safety of his jet boating operation on Hell's Canyon. He also responded to a letter of complaint written by a member of the Sportsmen's Club. Letters by witnesses to the Sportsmen's Club incident were submitted. Armacost assured the Board that his intent is to continue to keep his clients' safety foremost in his operation. Information was given on unlicensed operations on the Snake River needing enforcement investigation.

John Stover, Council, next appeared before the Board to explain his past year's operation as a managing agent with Todd Hill and Skull Creek Outfitters, Inc. He explained that he would probably be taking the business back for default of contract. Copies of letters to the Hills by Stover's attorney were submitted to the Board.

Following the lunch recess, all members reconvened and reviewed a letter received from the Legislative Council, Mike Nugent, with regard to the proposed rules changes.

Alice Sonnichsen and Randy McBride, Twin Falls, came in as new applicant managing agents for the High Adventures River Tours, Inc. business. Mr. McBride will replace Randy Stone, as a boating managing agent, while Ms. Sonnichsen will take care of the bookings and deposits.

Following this meeting, Salter moved, Meiners seconded and the motion passed THAT THE APPLICATIONS OF RANDY MCBRIDE AND ALICE SONNICHSEN, AS MANAGING AGENTS OF HIGH ADVENTURES RIVER TOURS, INC., BE APPROVED.

Brent Hill, Challis, and his wife, appeared before the Board with an application for licensing as Cougar Ranch Outfitters, Ltd., with Hill as managing agent. He is applying for the area being released by Phillip Whitley and Brian Simi of S Bar W Wilderness Outfitters, Inc. Hill explained he has worked for other outfitters, Gene Nichols and Ron Malone. The boundary dispute between S Bar W Outfitters and Middle Fork Lodge, Inc. from Sliderock L.O. to the Middle Fork of the Salmon river was discussed, and the Board asked that Hill meet with Robert Cole to try to work out an agreement on the common boundary.

Following this appointment, motion was proposed by Meiners and seconded by Farr, but the following substitute motion was made by Salter and passed THAT THE BRENT HILL, MANAGING AGENT, COUGAR RANCH OUTFITTERS, INC. REQUEST FOR TRANSFER BE APPROVED EFFECTIVE JANUARY 27, 1984. PROVIDED FURTHER, THAT IF A BOUNDARY ADJUSTMENT AGREEABLE BY MR. HILL AND MR. COLE IS REACHED BY THAT TIME IT BE INCORPORATED ON THE NEW LICENSES.

Cindy Bradley, Idaho City, and her husband, came before the Board with an application to license as an outfitter for trailriding, backpacking and fishing in an area adjacent to the private property they own and use for training horses. The Board explained that investigation with the Idaho Department of Fish and Game will be made concerning the fishing request, and that the Forest Service will be contacted for information on exact trails for use in the area requested.

John Woodworth, Boise, came before the Board to explain a change in plans for Treasure Valley Seminars; that one cross-country skiing trip would be made through Sawtooth Outfitters and Guides, Inc., for the 1983-84 license year, if it could be approved by the Board; that Stacy and Sandy Gebhards would license to lead the trip; and that the Treasure Valley Seminars would then complete their application for the 1984-85 license year.

During the balance of the day, as board business was conducted, the following motions were passed.

Farr moved, Meiners seconded and the motion passed THAT A STERN LETTER BE WRITTEN TO HOMER AND DENNIS JOSEPH IDENTIFYING THE THREE MAJOR POINTS OF CONCERN TO THE BOARD: SPOILED MEAT, GUESTS SHOULD BE HUNTED AS ADVERTISED, AND ADDITION OF 3 EXTRA HUNTERS TO THEIR NON-DRINKING PARTY. It was also determined that letters be sent to the complainants indicating that the Josephs were called in, reprimanded and that letters have been placed in their files.

Meiners moved, Vaughn seconded and the motion passed THAT A LETTER OF REPRIMAND BE SENT TO JIM RENSHAW THAT HE CANNOT UTILIZE AN AREA THAT IS NOT DEFINED ON HIS LICENSE, AND FURTHER THAT THE BOARD APPROVED THE AREA BOUNDARY ADJUSTMENT FROM THE CURRENT TRAIL TO WEITAS CREEK FROM THE MOUTH OF LITTLE WEITAS CREEK TO THE GUARD STATION, AND FURTHER THAT THE JOINT-USE AGREEMENT BETWEEN MR. HEINRICH AND MR. RENSHAW WILL BE APPROVED UPON RECEIPT OF SUCH AGREEMENT FROM PARTIES INVOLVED AND IT WILL BE MADE A PART OF ALL FURTHER LICENSES, WITH ANY EXTRA DAY IN THE DIVISION OF TIME GOING TO HEINRICH CONCERNING THE JOINT-USE AREA. It was agreed that a copy of this letter be sent to Heinrich.

Meiners moved, Farr seconded and the motion passed THAT APPROPRIATE LETTERS BE DRAFTED AND SENT TO THE COMPLAINANTS AGAINST LARRY JARRETT AND TO ROBERT M. SMITH, RELATIVE TO THE COMPLAINT RECEIVED BY THE BOARD FROM MR. JARRETT, AND FURTHER THAT COPIES OF THESE LETTERS BE SENT TO MR. JARRETT FOR HIS INFORMATION.

Salter suggested a letter be written to Armacost thanking him for appearing before the Board and that the Board is pleased to hear that his attitude continues to reflect a strong emphasize on safety in his operation.

Maps and area descriptions were reviewed in the English and Sweet outfitter areas, and the overlap discussed.

The meeting recessed at 1800.

Friday, January 20, 1984, Chairman Foster called the meeting to order at 0830. Other members present were: Robert Salter, William Meiners, Scott Farr and Harry Vaughn.

It was determined by the Board that because of an error on the description of the Richard English area, that an area amendment would be made for the 1984-85 license year.

Salter moved, Vaughn seconded and the motion passed THAT THE LICENSED AREA FOR RICHARD W. ENGLISH BE DEFINED AS FOLLOWS: BEGINNING AT THE IDAHO-MONTANA STATELINE WHERE STATE HIGHWAY 200 CROSSES THE LINE (SECTION 27, T 55 N, R 3 E); THENCE NORTHWEST ON HIGHWAY 200 TO SANDPOINT; THENCE NORTHEAST ON U.S. HIGHWAY 95 TO NAPLES; THENCE EASTERLY ON STATE HIGHWAY 9 AND ROAD 408 (TWENTYMILE PASS ROAD) TO THE IDAHO-MONTANA LINE; THENCE SOUTH ALONG THE STATELINE TO THE BOUNDARY-BONNER COUNTY LINE; THENCE DUE WEST TO THE KOOTENAI NATIONAL FOREST BOUNDARY NEAR CALDER MOUNTAIN; THENCE SOUTHERLY ALONG THE NATIONAL FOREST BOUNDARY TO PURDY MOUNTAIN, MOUNT WILLARD, AND MOUNT PEND OREILLE; THENCE CONTINUING SOUTHERLY ON TRAIL 67 TO LUNCH PEAK AND CONTINUING DUE SOUTH TO ROAD 275; THENCE DUE EAST TO ROAD 419; THENCE SOUTHERLY ON ROAD 419 TO RATTLE CREEK AND ROAD 473; THENCE EASTERLY ON ROAD 473 TO THE IDAHO-MONTANA STATELINE AT A POINT JUST NORTH OF THE INTERSECTION OF THAT LINE AND THE 12TH STANDARD PARALLEL NORTH; THENCE SOUTH ALONG THE IDAHO-MONTANA STATELINE TO HIGHWAY 200 AND THE POB. THIS TO BE DONE IN ORDER TO CORRECT AN ERROR IN HIS 1983-84 DESCRIPTION WHEN HE WAS INADVERTENTLY GIVEN AN AREA NORTH OF THAT WHICH HE HAD ORIGINALLY REQUESTED.

John Booker and Mitch McFarland, Salmon and Carmen, appeared before the Board about a transfer of the Booker area to McFarland, with John Booker licensing as managing agent, and continuing the business under the assumed name of Packer John's Guide Service. They also discussed a problem with the new area "ridge" campsite being on the boundary and asked for consideration of the boundary being changed, and a possible inclusion of the Waterfall area for a limited hunt operation.

Prior to the new applicants appointment, the Chairman made a call to Kelly Creek Forest Service representative, Tom Keller, and discussed area boundary changes for B-Bar-C and David Bobbitt, as well as the Hole-In-The-Wall (Askins) area.

Roger Hall, Charles Shepard, Tom Bower, Ken Cunningham, and Jeff Freeman from Alberton, Montana appeared before the Board to discuss the purchase of the Askins business. They registered concern over the area being reduced because of an area revision for David Bobbitt and also mentioned two illegal operations using the area.

Al Lewis met with the Board on several cases he is investigating and his meeting with the Idaho Department of Law Enforcement Commission.

Outfitter Business was completed which included review of a letter from a guide who had requested a refund of a partial fee paid. Salter moved, Farr seconded and the motion passed THAT THE REFUND BE MADE TO CATHRYN O'CONNOR ON A PARTIAL GUIDE LICENSE FEE PAID JULY 6, 1983. A letter was read from Nathan R. Smith who was accused of falsifying a Red Cross card. He submitted an original Red Cross card and evidence was secured that it had not been altered. Vaughn moved, Farr seconded and the motion passed THAT THE BOARD WRITE TO NATHAN R. SMITH, APOLOGIZE FOR THE TROUBLE CAUSED, EXPLAIN THE ERROR MADE BY THE AMERICAN RED CROSS CHAPTER, AND RETURN THE CARD.

The falsification of the first aid card by James Vermillion was discussed and the Board determined to contact their legal counsel for investigation on a complaint being registered through the Ada County Prosecuting Attorney.

Following review of the Idaho Department of Fish and Game input, Salter moved, Vaughn seconded and the motion passed THAT THE MICHAEL DURCHARME AMENDMENT FOR FISHING BE APPROVED AS WAS OUTLINED IN THE FISH AND GAME LETTER. FURTHER THAT A COPY OF THE FISHING EXTENSION AND LICENSE BE SENT TO GARY LOCKHART, CONSERVATION OFFICER, MCCALL, AND ALSO TO STACY GEBHARDS.

The cross-country skiing qualifications submitted by Barbara Sprang Franklin were reviewed, then Salter moved, Meiners seconded and the motion passed THAT THE APPLICATION OF BARBARA SPRANG FRANKLIN BE APPROVED.

Attorney General Deputy Clive Strong joined the meeting. A copy of the Thomas Farbo letter concerning non-use on the Clearwater by licensed outfitters was discussed and will be researched by the attorney. Legislative changes proposed for the Outfitters and Guides Act were reviewed and will be corrected.

Letters were read containing information on unlicensed activity by outfitters Loren Bud Rogers, Steve Wieber, and Ernie Duckworth. Salter moved, Meiners seconded and the motion passed THAT OUTFITTERS ROGERS, WIEBER AND DUCKWORTH BE REQUESTED TO APPEAR BEFORE THE BOARD DURING THE FEBRUARY 16 AND 17, 1984 MEETING TO DISCUSS THEIR ACTIVITIES ON THE SNAKE RIVER LAST FALL, AND THAT THEY BE ADVISED THAT THIS MEETING WILL BE NECESSARY BEFORE THE BOARD CAN CONSIDER 1984-85 LICENSES TO BE ISSUED TO THEM.

Keith Shanafelt's request to hire Woody Hassinger as a lead guide on the Salmon river was discussed. Meiners moved, Salter seconded and the motion passed THAT A NOTARIZED STATEMENT FROM WOODROW HASSINGER THAT HE HAS BEEN HIRED BY SHANAFELT AND WILL WORK UNTIL SUCH TIME AS SHANAFELT IS QUALIFIED AS A LEAD GUIDE OR HIRES ANOTHER WHO IS SO QUALIFIED, WILL SERVE TO COMPLETE THE SHANAFELT APPLICATION SO THAT THE LICENSE MAY BE ISSUED.

March 6-9, 1984 was decided upon as the meeting date to follow the February meeting. Then, there being no further business to consider, the meeting was adjourned at 1810.
