

MINUTES

IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD

September 11, 12, and 13, 1984
Boardroom - Boise, Idaho

A regular meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Board was called to order by Chairman Foster at 0840 on Tuesday, September 11, 1984, with members Farr, Meiners, Salter, and Vaughn in attendance.

The Chairman led brief discussions on the following topics and action was taken as noted below:

Recording Equipment - MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) THAT THE BOARD PURCHASE A COMPATIBLE DICTAPHONE UNIT FOR RECORDING HEARINGS AND OTHER BOARD MEETINGS.

James S. Searles - Administrative Secretary instructed to prepare and file a Certificate of Service, indicating Mr. Searles has twice been sent notification of the Board's decision to deny him a license via certified mail, both of which were returned unclaimed.

Chartered Boat Fishing in North Idaho Lakes - Mr. Salter will make a survey before the next legislative session to determine whether or not there is merit in this becoming a covered activity.

Telephone System - It was determined that the cost of installing a telephone in the Workroom (\$670) and the cost of installing a speaker-telephone unit in the Boardroom (\$500) were not necessary expenses at the present time.

Dave Stucker failed to appear before the Board at the appointed time of 0900.

The August 13, 1984, memorandum from Clive Strong, Deputy Attorney General, regarding proposed Rule 9(b) was reviewed. The possible inclusion of the "Board's practice" of not licensing more than one outfitter in a given elk/deer area was discussed. The Chairman noted that the attorney recommends this exclusionary portion not be included at the present time; he further noted that Mr. Strong recommends proposed Rule 9(b) be invoked as an Emergency Order so that it is in effect prior to the Brent Hill hearing.

The Chairman appraised the Board of recent telephone calls he had received:

9/5/84 from Jon C. Goodman - Expressed his dissatisfaction with Don McPherson who discussed Goodman's camp situation with Barry Hicks of the Forest Service. It was the Board's position that it should cooperate with other state and federal agencies whenever possible and be supportive of its enforcement personnel. Responding to Mr. Goodman's request that future checks not be done by Don McPherson, Mr. Salter said he would contact Barry Hicks, requesting the Forest Service to conduct a check this fall on Mr. Goodman's activities and report any adverse findings to the Board.

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9/10/84 from Ted Anderson - Advised that Dameon Cecil, P. O. Box 1623, Sun Valley, and Taul Paul were conducting outfitted and guided float trips on the Middle Fork of the Salmon this year. Mr. Salter stated he would have this matter checked out. (Mr. Anderson is with the U.S.F.S.-Middle Fork Ranger District in Challis.)

At 0950, the Chairman distributed the Complaint Folders and the following were reviewed:

Ernest E. Duckworth - Letter received from the U.S. Coast Guard advising they renewed Mr. Duckworth's license on 8/30/84. The Board will make a decision on the boat/raft incident at a future meeting.

Tom E. Chivers - Chairman reported he had talked with Mrs. Twilegar and asked her to send the Board a letter stating her views of the paddle boat incident at Red Fish Lake involving her son. The Board briefly reviewed Mr. Chivers' letter relative to the aforementioned incident, but continued this matter pending receipt of Mrs. Twilegar's letter.

Cecil Weddle - Letter received from Attorney Kathleen Hardcastle stating that Mr. Weddle has filed for bankruptcy. MSC (Meiners--Farr) THAT THE FEDERAL BANKRUPTCY COURT BE CONTACTED TO ASCERTAIN TYPE OF BANKRUPTCY ACTION TAKEN AND THAT A LETTER BE SENT TO MR. WEDDLE ADVISING HIM THE BOARD IS AWARE OF HIS RECENT BANKRUPTCY AND WOULD, THEREFORE, NEED A CERTIFIED FINANCIAL STATEMENT SHOWING HIS FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY TO CONDUCT AN OUTFITTING OPERATION ALONG WITH THE NUMBER OF FALL BOOKINGS HE HAS FOR THIS YEAR. A copy of this letter to be sent to Attorney Hardcastle.

At 1100, Jack Kappas and Toni Peterson met with the Board to discuss their proposed cross-country skiing operation in the vicinity of the Valley County/Idaho County line. MSC (Meiners--Salter) THAT UPON COMPLETION OF THE APPLICATIONS, THESE LICENSES BE APPROVED. Notification to be sent by certified mail.

It was agreed by the Board to have new applicants wait in the reception area following their interview for the Board's decision, unless the matter is complicated and/or needs additional research.

It was also agreed by the Board that if Fish and Game cannot get information to the office within one business day regarding possible violations of an applicant, the license should be issued and office check to continue thereafter. This same practice is to be followed regarding Red Cross cards.

At 1145, the Board reviewed the following complaints:

Ramshorn Ranch - Letter received from Dick McAfee of Castle Creek Outfitters indicating Ramshorn Ranch is conducting possible illegal outfitting activities. MSC (Salter--Meiners) THAT THE OWNER OF THE RAMSHORN RANCH BE SENT A LETTER REQUESTING HIM TO APPEAR BEFORE THE BOARD IN OCTOBER TO ASCERTAIN JUST WHAT THE OPERATION ENTAILS, TO APPRAISE HIM OF THE COMPLAINTS ON FILE, AND TO ADVISE HIM OF THE PROVISIONS SET FORTH IN THE IDAHO CODE AND THE RULES AND REGULATIONS PROMULGATED THEREUNDER.

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South Fork Expeditions - After reviewing the response from John Hill, Managing Agent, to the allegations of Steve Farner, MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) THAT A LETTER BE SENT TO MR. HILL, CAUTIONING HIM AGAINST USING A GUIDE WHO DOES NOT HAVE A LICENSE IN HIS POSSESSION AND CALLING HIS ATTENTION TO RULE 25 RELATIVE TO HAVING AN EXTRA OAR. A copy of this letter to be sent to Mr. Farner.

The meeting recessed at 1215 and was reconvened at 1330, at which time Al Lewis appeared before the Board to discuss enforcement matters. He informed the Board that Ramshorn Ranch is owned by Dr. Krueger of Boise and is managed by Dave Rackow, HC82, Box 4051, Challis, Idaho 83226.

At 1420, Mark Hilliard of the Bureau of Land Management met with the Board to discuss Birds of Prey Conservation Week to be held October 7-13, 1984. The Chairman suggested BLM submit an agenda so that the information can be sent to the Outfitters and Guides Association for distribution to interested outfitters and commended Mr. Hilliard for the work done in preparation of this designated week.

At 1515, the remaining complaints were reviewed:

Middle Fork River Co. - After reviewing a letter from Mr. & Mrs. Sterling Topol addressed to the Middle Fork River Co., MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) THAT A LETTER BE SENT TO MR. & MRS. TOPOL ADVISING THE BOARD FINDS NO EVIDENCE OF WRONGDOING UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES ACT AND THAT THE MATTER IS CLOSED.

Mark Thorkelson - The Board reviewed a note sent in by Randy Shuff expressing displeasure over Mr. Thorkelson's being issued a Guide's License. MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) THAT MR. SHUFF BE SENT THE SAME LETTER AS WAS SENT DAVID WILLIAMS REGARDING THIS SAME MATTER.

John Hatch-Falcon Berry Ranch - Anonymous letter received regarding the possibility of illegal outfitting. Mr. Farr suggested a copy of this letter be sent to Bud Hamilton of the U.S. Forest Service in Challis to see if they know anything about this or can find out.

Whitewater Shop River Tours - Board reviewed letter from Steven J. Guinn indicating the U.S. Air Force is possibly conducting illegal outfitting activities. MSC (Salter--Meiners) THAT A LETTER BE SENT TO THE COMMANDING OFFICER AT MOUNTAIN HOME AIR FORCE BASE, REQUESTING HE APPEAR BEFORE THE BOARD ON OCTOBER 10, 1984, TO RESPOND TO THIS ALLEGATION.

There being no further complaints, the Chairman then proceeded with the following general business:

Air Conditioning System - Mr. Vaughn noted the inefficiency of the office cooling system and suggested the Chairman notify the owners of the Board's displeasure and discomfort.

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Income/Expense Recaps - It was the general opinion of the Board that only the Chairman and Vice Chairman need these monthly reports. Mr. Salter noted how helpful it is to have an itemized breakdown of expenses versus the income and appropriation for a specific time.

FY86 Budget - The Chairman noted the Budget Analyst has superficially approved the budget as submitted. MSC (Salter--Vaughn) THAT THE CHAIRMAN BE COMMENDED FOR HIS EFFORTS IN PREPARING THE BUDGET AND THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT THE BUDGET AS SUBMITTED.

Edythe I. Blele - The Board directed the Administrative Secretary to contact the Outfitters and Guides Association and former Board members and ask if they would like to make a contribution toward a gift for "Edy" in remembrance of her years of service.

Office Furniture - The Chairman advised that prices have been requested from Woodman's Office Furniture and Boise Office Equipment on the new furniture. Administrative Secretary directed to contact Prison Industries regarding a conference table and shelves for the storage closet. In addition, a light should be procured for the map cabinet.

The following guide applications were taken under consideration:

Greg D. Garris - MSC (Meiners--Farr) THAT HIS GUIDE APPLICATION BE APPROVED.

James L. Upchurch - Following considerable discussion about this applicant, Mr. Meiners suggested the Board investigate the circumstances of the felony noted on the application. The Chairman placed a telephone call to Dave Peterson, who plans to employ Mr. Upchurch.

The meeting recessed at 1705 and reconvened at 0840 on Wednesday, September 12, 1984. MSC (Salter--Farr) THAT PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE SECTION 67-2345 (b), THE BOARD GO INTO EXECUTIVE SESSION TO DISCUSS MATTERS OF PERSONNEL. ALL MEMBERS PRESENT CAST "AYE VOTES; NO "NAY" VOTES CAST. The Executive Session began at 0845 and ended at 1125 with no formal action being taken at the session. However, the Chairman instructed the Administrative Secretary to secure all personnel files.

The Chairman requested the Board review letters he had prepared and action was taken as noted below:

MSC (Salter--Meiners) THAT THE LETTER TO GLADYS L. YORK REGARDING A CAMPSITE IN AN AREA ASSIGNED TO HAROLD THOMAS BE APPROVED AS REVISED AND THAT COPIES BE SENT TO JO MOLTZEN, HAROLD THOMAS, AND DON McPHERSON.

MSC (Meiners--Farr) THAT LETTERS TO ROBERT JONAS AND DAVE HELFRICH REGARDING THEIR NON-USE OF RIVER PRIVILEGES NOT BE SENT, BUT THAT A LETTER IN SUPPORT OF THE BLM DRAFT LETTER BE SENT WITH A REQUEST THAT THE BOARD RECEIVE CARBON COPIES OF SUCH LETTERS.

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At 1205 the meeting recessed; it reconvened at 1325 with a brief discussion of the proposed "Established Office Hours". MSC (Salter--Vaughn) THAT THE EXISTING POLICIES RELATIVE TO OFFICE HOURS BE RESCINDED AND THE FOLLOWING POLICY BE ADOPTED AND BECOME EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY:

WORK WEEK: Monday thru Friday / 8:00 a.m. thru 5:00 p.m.
with 1-hour lunch recess (except those weeks
having an officially recognized state or federal
holiday, which we will observe)

LUNCH RECESS: Receptionist - 11:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.
Clerk - 12:30 p.m. to 1:30 p.m.
Admin. Sec'y. - 12:00 p.m. to 1:00 p.m.

OVERTIME: Administrative Secretary - May not accumulate
more than 40 hours of overtime without prior
written approval of the Chairman or Vice Chair-
man of the Board.

All Other Office Employees - May not accumulate
any overtime without prior written approval of
the Administrative Secretary, who may authorize
up to a maximum accumulation of 40 hours.

No overtime will be paid in cash. All overtime
shall be used as compensatory time and taken with-
in six (6) months of the time accrued.

COMPENSATORY TIME: Earned compensatory time shall be exhausted be-
fore annual leave is used, unless this would re-
sult in the loss of annual leave.

Compensatory time will be taken in lieu of cash
payment for overtime.

Compensatory time will be taken at a time and manner
acceptable to the employer.

Current compensatory time balances to be exhausted
no later than June 30, 1985.

MSC (Salter--Meiners) THAT THE BOARD, IN CONFORMANCE WITH THE NEWLY ADOPTED
POLICY ON WORKING HOURS AND ATTENDANCE, INSTRUCT THE ADMINISTRATIVE SECRETARY
TO TAKE WHATEVER ACTION IS NECESSARY TO REDUCE THE OVERTIME HOURS WHICH HAVE
BEEN ACCUMULATED BY COLLEEN SWEENEY. THIS ACTION TO BE DONE IN AS RAPID A
MANNER AS POSSIBLE AND IN NO CASE TO EXTEND BEYOND 6/30/85.

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The Board next discussed a variety of matters and the following actions were taken:

MSC (Salter--Meiners) THAT A LETTER OF REPRIMAND BE SENT TO JERRY MEYERS RELATIVE TO HIS FAILURE TO OBTAIN PROPER APPROVAL FOR HIS RECENT SHEEP HUNT AND NEGLECTED TO NOTIFY THE OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD, THE APPROPRIATE LAND MANAGEMENT AGENCIES, AND AFFECTED OUTFITTERS.

MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) THAT THE CHAIRMAN ADDRESS A LETTER TO RANDY BRINK OF THE PAYETTE RIVER COMPANY STATING IT HAS BEEN BROUGHT TO THE BOARD'S ATTENTION THAT HIS BOATS APPEAR TO BE IMPROPERLY IDENTIFIED AND ARE NOT IN COMPLIANCE WITH IDAHO CODE 26-2113 (a)(2) AND WITH RULE 25 OF THE OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES RULES AND REGULATIONS, AND THAT THE BOARD WOULD APPRECIATE HIS EARLY ATTENTION IN CORRECTING THIS SITUATION.

MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) THAT A 90-DAY LIMIT BE PUT ON INCOMPLETE APPLICATIONS RECEIVED AFTER JULY 1, 1984, AND THAT AT THE EXPIRATION OF THIS LIMIT, THE CURRENT APPLICATION AND DA-8 FOR A REFUND OF ANY APPLICABLE MONIES BE SENT.

MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) THAT A PROPOSED RULE BE DRAFTED FOR THE NEXT RULES HEARING PERTAINING TO OUTFITTERS HUNTING MOOSE, SHEEP, GOAT, AND/OR ANTELOPE OUTSIDE THEIR ASSIGNED BIG GAME HUNTING AREA WHICH REFLECTS CURRENT BOARD POLICY, SPECIFICALLY THAT THE OUTFITTER SHALL: (1) NOTIFY THE BOARD, REQUESTING APPROVAL BEFORE HUNTING IN ANOTHER'S AREA; (2) GET CLEARANCE FROM LAND MANAGEMENT AGENCIES; AND (3) NOTIFY OUTFITTERS, WHEN APPLICABLE, OF INTENT TO HUNT IN HIS/HER AREA.

MSC (Salter--Meiners) THAT STEVE CURRY'S REQUEST FOR A REFUND BE GRANTED.

MSC (Meiners--Farr) THAT ALL MONIES ACCOMPANYING OUTFITTER AND/OR GUIDE APPLICATIONS BE DEPOSITED IN THE APPROPRIATE ACCOUNT AND THAT A LETTER BE SENT TO AN APPLICANT WHEN DISCREPANCIES EXIST NOTING EITHER: (1) INSUFFICIENT MONIES WERE SENT, INDICATING THE BALANCE DUE, NOTING THAT ONLY "X" NUMBER OF LICENSES CAN BE ISSUED UNTIL THE BALANCE IS REMITTED; OR (2) MORE MONIES WERE SENT THAN NECESSARY AND THAT A REFUND WILL BE ISSUED UPON RECEIPT OF THE DA-8 WHICH MUST BE SIGNED AND RETURNED.

MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) THAT THE APPLICATION OF DOUG RANK BE DENIED AND THAT A LETTER BE SENT ADVISING HIM THAT THE AREAS APPLIED FOR ARE ALREADY LICENSED TO ACTIVE OUTFITTERS AND THAT NO SPACE IS, THEREFORE, AVAILABLE FOR ADDITIONAL OUTFITTING ACTIVITIES PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109 (b)(4) and (b)(5).

MSC (Vaughn--Meiners) THAT THE APPLICATION OF RON GILLETTE TO GUIDE FOR JEFF BITTON BE APPROVED.

MSC (Salter--Meiners) THAT THE CHAIRMAN WRITE A LETTER TO FISH AND GAME ABOUT THE MOTION MADE IN OCTOBER 1983 REGARDING A MORATORIUM ON FLOAT BOAT OUTFITTING ON THE CLEARWATER RIVER, ASKING FOR THEIR RECOMMENDATIONS AND/OR TIMETABLE RELATIVE TO THIS MATTER. (Mr. Salter further requested that current copies of all Fish and Game regulations be procured for the office and Board.)

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MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) THAT THE CHAIRMAN CONTACT JOHN HENDRICKSON, EXPLAINING THE MORATORIUM PENDING THE OUTCOME OF THE FISH AND GAME FEASIBILITY STUDY, AND FURTHER ADVISING THE BOARD IS REQUESTING AN UPDATE FROM FISH AND GAME AS TO WHETHER ADDITIONAL FISHING GUIDES COULD BE ACCOMMODATED.

MSC (Salter--Vaughn) THAT THE APPLICATION OF TERRY VANDENBURG BE DENIED BECAUSE OF A FALSIFIED RED CROSS CARD AND THAT HIS OUTFITTER BE SO ADVISED. The Chairman then called Tim Craig to report this denial.

The Chairman instructed the Administrative Secretary to notify the appropriate agencies as to the time and place of the December meetings of the Outfitters and Guides Association, and that a checklist of matters to be discussed be started. The following are to be put on this checklist:

- (1) Proposed rule change on the method of handling goat, sheep, moose, and antelope hunting.
- (2) Possibility of breaking up the Clearwater River into two (2) sections; namely Orofino to Kooskia and Orofino to Lewiston

The meeting recessed at 1650 and reconvened at 0830 on Thursday, September 13, 1984, with the Chairman conducting a review of the Outfitters and Guide Applications and Supplements so that new ones can be printed with wording in accord with the new Idaho Code and pertinent Rules and Regulations.

At 0900, Clive Strong, Deputy Attorney General, met with the Board to discuss various legal matters as noted below:

Proposed Rule 9(b) - Following a discussion with Attorney Strong, MSC (Salter--Meiners) THAT BECAUSE OF THE IMMEDIATE BENEFIT TO THE PUBLIC'S HEALTH, SAFETY, AND WELFARE, THE BOARD ADOPT ON AN EMERGENCY BASIS PROPOSED RULE 9(b) OF THE RULES AND REGULATIONS, IMPLEMENTING IDAHO CODE SECTION 36-2110.

Brent Hill - Attorney Strong noted he has been in contact with Carl Olsen, Attorney for Mr. Hill, and there is no settlement in sight. Based upon the recommendation of Attorney Strong, MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) THAT ATTORNEY STRONG BE AUTHORIZED TO RETAIN AN INDEPENDENT HEARING OFFICER AND THAT THE BRENT HILL MATTER PROCEED AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

Andron Corporation - Attorney Strong will send memorandum outlining his recommendations in this matter.

Robert Rall - Copy of Attorney Strong's letter dated 9/4/84 sent to Prosecuting Attorney Albers and Don McPherson.

Harry Lewies - Letter received from Fish and Game relative to their opposition to an increase in the number of outfitters and guides having access to the Henrys Fork of the Snake River from Mesa Falls upstream to Henrys Lake Outlet. The Chairman noted a draft of a proposed rule should be prepared and that a public hearing should be held on a petition for additional outfitting on the Henrys Fork.

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At 1000, the Hearing in the Matter of Denial of an Outfitter's License to Jim Walker dba Walker River Expeditions was held (Case No. 84-3). Attorney Strong requested the following documents be admitted into evidence:

Exhibit A -- Outfitter's License Application prepared by Mr. Walker and received by the Board on April 2, 1984.

Exhibit B - Copy of Red Cross card submitted by Mr. Walker with his application.

Exhibit C - Letter from Walker River Expeditions dated August 12, 1984, wherein Mr. Walker admits he falsified the Red Cross card (Exhibit B).

The Chairman then gave Mr. Walker an opportunity to present his defense and the following exhibits were admitted into evidence:

Exhibit D - New Red Cross card

Exhibit E - Current Oregon license to conduct outfitting activities

Exhibit F - Letter from the State of Oregon to Mr. Walker stating his Oregon license would be taken away if Idaho refuses to grant him a license, and that he would not be able to obtain another license in Oregon for two (2) years.

Exhibit G - Copy of letter dated August 17, 1984, sent by the Board to Mr. Walker, along with certified mail receipt for same dated August 28, 1984.

In summation, Attorney Strong cited Rule 8(b)(ii) and Rule 5(b) of the Outfitters and Guides Rules and Regulations. Mr. Walker apologized to the Board, indicating an awareness of his wrongdoings.

MSC (Meiners--Farr) THAT THE BOARD GO INTO EXECUTIVE SESSION IN ACCORDANCE WITH IDAHO CODE SECTION 67-2345 (f), TO DISCUSS MATTERS OF LITIGATION, PASSING WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT CASTING "AYE" VOTES; NO "NAY" VOTES CAST. The Executive Session began at 1050 and ended at 1110 with no formal action being taken at the session.

After due consideration of the records, exhibits, and arguments of Attorney Strong and Mr. Walker, MSC (Farr--Meiners) THAT A PROBATIONARY LICENSE BE ISSUED JIM WALKER ON THE BASIS OF: (1) MR. WALKER'S "GOOD FAITH" IN CANCELLING TWO (2) TRIPS SCHEDULED BETWEEN THE TIME HE RECEIVED NOTIFICATION FROM THE BOARD ON AUGUST 28, 1984, AND THE HEARING OF THIS DATE: (2) MR. WALKER'S LOSS OF REVENUE CAUSED BY THE ABOVE-NOTED CANCELLATIONS; (3) THE BOARD'S ABILITY TO SUSPEND OR REVOKE THIS LICENSE IF SUBSEQUENT ACTIONS BY MR. WALKER WARRANT SAME.

The Chairman next asked Attorney Strong to consider the possibility of rule-making for refusing to grant a license when non-use of previously licensed areas has come to the Board's attention. Also, it was requested of Attorney Strong that he prepare a certifying statement for the new Outfitter and Guide applications so it will be in proper legal form.

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The meeting was recessed at 1145 and reconvened at 1315 with all members present except Farr and Vaughn.

Tim Steele - Failed to appear for his appointment scheduled for 1315.

MSC (Meiners--Salter) THAT THE GUIDE APPLICATION OF BRUCE SCOTT BE APPROVED.

Patricia R. Rush & James G. Davis, dba Lolo Trail Expeditions - At 1400, a hearing was scheduled on the suspension of their Outfitter Licenses due to the notification of Likkel Insurance Agency, Inc. that Bond #223398 had been cancelled. The Chairman reviewed the files with the Board, noting that Mr. Salter received a telephone call from the defendants indicating they probably would not appear at this hearing since they were not currently operating the business and were not interested in maintaining licenses this year. Based upon their failure to appear and pursuant to the bond cancellation, MSC (Salter--Meiners) THAT THE OUTFITTER LICENSES OF PATRICIA R. RUSH AND JAMES G. DAVIS, DBA LOLO TRAIL EXPEDITIONS, FOR THE 1984-85 YEAR BE IMMEDIATELY SUSPENDED.

Mary Austin - At 1410 the Director of the Blaine County Recreation District met with the Board to discuss various proposed recreational activities and the possible need or desirability of getting an Outfitter's License. Following much discussion, Ms. Austin requested the Board table her application until such time as she advises otherwise.

James L. Upchurch - The Chairman received a telephone call from David L. Peterson relative to the Class C Felony noted on the guide application of Mr. Upchurch. Based upon Mr. Peterson's statements that he has known the applicant for quite some time, that this charge stemmed from an incident wherein the applicant was protecting his own property, and that Mr. Peterson does not believe the applicant has a volatile temperament, MSC (Salter--Meiners) THAT THE LICENSE FOR JAMES L. UPCHURCH BE APPROVED.

The Board then finalized their review of Outfitter and Guide Application and Supplement Forms. Several suggestions were made and will be incorporated on paste-ups to be prepared by the Administrative Secretary.

The Board reviewed the letter received from Fish and Game dated September 5, 1984, and took the following actions:

Ray Cox - MSC (Meiners--Salter) THAT THE APPLICATION OF RAY COX, DBA TROUT CREEK OUTFITTERS, BE DENIED IN PART RELATIVE TO ELK, DEER, AND BEAR HUNTING, BASED UPON THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF FISH AND GAME AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH IDAHO CODE SECTION 36-2109 (b)(4) and (b)(5).

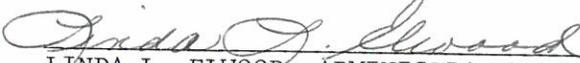
