IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD

April 15-21, 1985
Boardroom - Boise, Idaho

A regular meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Board was called to order by Chairman Foster at 0835 on Monday, April 15, 1985, with members Farr, Meiners, and Vaughn in attendance. The following business was conducted:

Larry Walker/Tim Craig: At 0920 Messrs. Walker and Craig met with the Board to discuss the purchase of Larry Walker's business by Tim Craig. Mr. Craig outlined his proposed plan of operation, indicating he would employ Larry Walker as a guide. The Chairman noted the Board's concerns center around the complaints the Board has on file regarding the size and scope of Craig's current outfitting business. The decision on this matter was deferred.

Robert Gillihan: At 1030 Mr. & Mrs. Gillihan met with the Board to express their objections to the Ron Vaughn application for big game hunting activities in the Cougar Basin area. The Chairman indicated research would be conducted by the Board before a decision was made. He further noted that the Gillihan's would be notified by mail with specific questions requiring a written response for the Board's records.

Steve Jones: At 1105 Mr. Jones and his fiancée Marlana Knight met with the Board to discuss his business relationship with Mike Bishop of M & M Outfitters. Mr. Jones stated that he and five others worked as guides during the 1984-1985 license year and that Mr. Bishop supposedly obtained licenses for them. Mr. Jones further indicated he was half owner of the business and that after the 1985-1986 license year he had the option of buying out Mr. Bishop's half. The Chairman requested a copy of the partnership agreement and noted that if there was going to be a change in Managing Agents from Mr. Bishop to Mr. Jones, the Board would need a new Managing Agent application, applications for guides, and a copy of the advertising brochures. MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) THAT THE M & M OUTFITTERS RENEWAL APPLICATIONS FOR THE 1985-1986 LICENSE YEAR BE HELD IN ABEYANCE PENDING RECEIPT OF A MANAGING AGENT'S APPLICATION. THIS APPEARS TO BE NECESSARY FOLLOWING THE APPEARANCE BEFORE THE BOARD OF STEVE JONES WHO INDICATED HE WAS NOT AWARE THAT MIKE BISHOP IS TRYING TO SELL AND THAT MR. JONES HAS NOT AGREED TO SUCH A SALE. FURTHER, THAT HE IS DESIROUS OF BECOMING THE MANAGING AGENT FOR THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR AND THINKS THAT HE WILL BE THE SOLE OWNER OF M & M OUTFITTERS EFFECTIVE APRIL 1, 1986.

The meeting recessed at 1210 and reconvened on Tuesday, April 16, 1985, in the Maui Room of the Holiday Inn where an Inter-Agency Meeting was held. Minutes of this meeting are attached hereto.

The Board met with a number of people at the Holiday Inn during the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Association meetings. Meeting with the Board were:

Steve Welch: Mr. Welch is the new Managing Agent for American River Touring Association. He stated that there is no foreseeable change in the Idaho operation of ARTA. The Chairman noted that Mr. Welch would need to become qualified as a guide or employ qualified guides. Mr. Welch indicated he would either be forwarding guide applications or employment agreements so that ARTA can be issued a license for the current year.

W. Jim Spickelmire/Lawrence Voss: Messrs. Spickelmire and Voss met with the Board to discuss the purchase of Charley Thompson's outfitting business. They indicated the new business would be called Idaho Fishing Charters and included a copy of the purchase contract with their applications. It was noted by the Chairman that photocopies of the backs of their Red Cross cards were needed for the Board's records. The Chairman further noted that a financial statement, a copy of the partnership agreement, and a signed bill of sale would be required before the Board could make a final decision.

Bill Bernt: Mr. Bernt met with the Board to discuss steelhead fishing on the upper Salmon River as it pertains specifically to the number of float boaters licensed and the possible congestion that could occur if all the licensees were to have and utilize anadromous fishing privileges at the same time.

Mike Daly/Archie George: Messrs. Daly and George requested the Board's support of their position in opposition to roading and timber harvest on Meadow Creek. Verbal support was given by the Board and a letter will be drafted and sent to the appropriate agencies.

David Giles: Mr. Giles indicated he would like to modify his area of operation to allow for a campsite and day-use trailrides in the Cold Meadows vicinity. The Board will review his request.

Carlyn Hagaman/Dick Miller: Mr. Hagaman indicated that Mr. Miller will be buying his outfitting business in November 1985, but will be licensed as a guide for Mr. Hagaman this year.

R. J. Lewy: Mr. Lewy met with the Board to request approval to conduct outfitting activities in the Copper Basin area. The Board indicated that at the present time it is not amenable to such a request since it has just denied Milton Butler's request for the same area.

Rich Cromwell: Mr. Cromwell discussed a partnership agreement with Punk Wolfenbarger. The Board requested he send a copy of this agreement plus other pertinent documents to the Board's office for its records.

Richard Cook: Mr. Cook discussed his proposed purchase of Kooyer's Salmon River Challenge power boating operation on the lower Salmon River. The Board indicated that Mr. Cook's record of alleged illegal activities would perhaps preclude his getting Board approval for a license.

Scott Farr/Stan Potts: Bob Martin and Jim Wylie of the North Fork Ranger District-Salmon National Forest, met with the Board to discuss the Farr/Potts joint-use agreement. Messrs. Martin and Wylie will meet with the Board or its Chairman and Vice Chairman at some future date to review the Board's maps.

Enforcement Officers: The Board met with Jerry Gifford, Richard D. Hudson, and William B. Means who are applying for part-time Enforcement Officer positions. No decisions were made at this time.

Patricia Davis: At the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Association banquet, our receptionist Pat was honored for seven years of service to the industry. The Association presented her with a floral arrangement.

The Board reconvened on Thursday, April 18, 1985, and conducted the following business:

Jimmie D. Mitchell: Mr. Mitchell met with the Board and expressed his displeasure about the lack of public notification for the rules hearings held in Rexburg in January 1985. The Chairman explained that the legal requirements of the Rules of Practice and Procedure were met inasmuch as notices appeared in four newspapers under the Legal Notices section. Mr. Mitchell was further advised by the Board of the upcoming hearings to be held on May 2, 1985, in Rexburg and Idaho Falls. Mr. Mitchell then asked why he had not received a response to his written communication relative to the Henry's Fork issue. He also noted that a Mr. Ferguson was not given a response either. The Chairman apologized and indicated responses would be sent out this coming week.

Art Griffith: After reviewing Mr. Griffith's application, MSC (Meiners--Farr) THAT A NON-PROBATIONARY LICENSE BE ISSUED TO MR. GRIFFITH FOR THE 1985-1986 LICENSE YEAR.

Clearwater Fish Creek Drainage: Pursuant to a telephone conversation between the Chairman and Mel Fowlkes, MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) THAT THE CHAIRMAN RESPOND TO MR. FOWLKES TELEPHONE INQUIRY REGARDING OUTFITTING ACTIVITIES IN THE CLEARWATER NATIONAL FOREST AND THAT FOLLOWING CONVERSATION WITH HIM AND RECEIPT OF INFORMATION REQUESTED, THE CHAIRMAN FORMULATE A LETTER TO JON BLEDSOE ADDRESSING THE BOARD'S CONCERNS ON THIS MATTER, SPECIFICALLY REQUESTING A DEFINITION OF "ADDITIONAL", ASKING IF THE DEFINITION OF OUTFITTING INCLUDES TRAILRIDES, AND INQUIRING IF ANY ALLOWANCE HAS BEEN MADE FOR THE EXPANSION OR TRANSFER OF CURRENT LICENSED OUTFITTERS IN THE AREA.

Cal Stoddard: At 1010 Mr. & Mrs. Stoddard met with the Board to discuss David Giles' proposal to put camps in the Cold Meadows area. Mr. Stoddard expressed his concerns about the elk population and the levels of activities in this area. The Chairman indicated letters will be sent to all affected outfitters regarding the Giles' request for additional area. He further indicated that an investigation into the size of Giles' area, the possibility of boundary dispute hearings, and/or the regulation of the number of trips he might be allowed to take into the area would be factors in the Board's decision-making process. Mr. Stoddard was then given a copy of Rule 9(b) and the Rules of Practice and Procedure relative to petitioning the Board for changes to rules. The Chairman then asked Mr. Stoddard about a transfer from Eakin Ridge to him that was initiated last year. Mr. Stoddard indicated the matter has been dropped as he has received no word from Eakin Ridge.

MSC (Farr--Vaughn) THAT PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE, SECTION 67-2345(b), THE BOARD GO INTO EXECUTIVE SESSION TO DISCUSS MATTERS OF PERSONNEL. Voice votes were recorded as follows: Foster.."Aye"; Farr.."Aye"; Meiners.."Aye"; and Vaughn..."Aye". The Executive Session began at 1115 and ended at 1150 with no formal action being taken at the session.

Richard Grunch: Following a review of Mr. Grunch's application and proposed operating plan, MSC (Farr--Meiners) THAT A LICENSE BE ISSUED ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS AND THAT AN ENFORCEMENT OFFICER CHECK THE CAMPSITE THIS COMING SEASON. FURTHER, THE CHAIRMAN IS TO WRITE A LETTER DELINEATING THE TERMS OF PROBATION, NAMELY: (1) THAT CONSISTENT WITH THE DECEMBER 17, 1984, LETTER, MR. GRUNCH MUST CONTINUE TO SHOW IMPROVEMENT IN HIS FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS; (2) THAT HE MUST IMPROVE CAMP ACCOMMODATIONS, SPECIFICALLY THE SLEEPING ARRANGEMENTS SINCE ONE LARGE TENT IS NOT DEEMED SUFFICIENT; (3) FAILURE TO COMPLY WILL RESULT IN THE DENIAL OF A LICENSE FOR THE 1986-1987 LICENSE YEAR.

The Board recessed at 1215 and reconvened at 1330, conducting the following items of business:

Peter Karp/Dick Linford: At 1345 Messrs. Karp and Linford met with the Board to discuss the proposed sale of Mr. Linford's lower Salmon business to Mr. Karp. MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) THAT PETER KARP BE ISSUED AN OUTFITTER'S LICENSE UPON COMPLETION OF THE APPLICATION PROCESS AND SUBJECT TO FINAL APPROVAL BY THE CHAIRMAN OR VICE CHAIRMAN.

Mike Stanford: At 1420 Mr. Stanford met with the Board. He is applying for an outfitter's license in an area already licensed to Stan Meholchick. The Chairman indicated the Board would conduct research for those activities not licensed to Mr. Meholchick, namely trailriding, fishing, and snowmobiling. The applicant will be notified by mail when the Board renders its decision.

Forrest Wilson: At 1535 Mr. Wilson met with the Board to discuss his partnership arrangement with Mike Madden. Mr. Wilson gave the Board a copy of the agreement and a copy of a letter from his attorney relative to Mr. Madden's default on his financial obligations. The Chairman indicated that until the partnership arrangement has been resolved, no licenses will be issued. Further, the Chairman noted the Board will check with its attorney and will advise Mr. Wilson of the required paperwork to take care of this matter.

Andre Molsee: At 1615 Mr. Molsee met with the Board and presented an agreement signed by both Mike Stockton and himself relative to their respective licensed areas of operation. MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) THAT RELATIVE TO ANDRE MOLSEE'S APPEARANCE BEFORE THE BOARD IN WHICH HE PRESENTED AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN HIMSELF AND MIKE STOCKTON RELATIVE TO THE BOUNDARY DISPUTE, THE BOARD CONCURS IN THE PROPOSED CHANGE IN THE BOUNDARY AS REFLECTED IN THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN MESSRS. MOLSEE AND STOCKTON, WITH MODIFICATIONS TO REFLECT A MORE EXPLICITLY WORDED AREA DESCRIPTION THAN IS PROPOSED IN SAID AGREEMENT. REFERENCE IS MADE TO ROAD 1452 AND THE PROPOSED BOUNDARY FOLLOWING THAT REFERENCE IN THE AGREEMENT USING A SECTION LINE BETWEEN SECTIONS 4 AND 5, THAT ANDRE MOLSEE WAS ASKED TO APPROACH MIKE STOCKTON TO SEE IF HE WOULD AGREE TO USE ROAD 1452 AS A BOUNDARY IN LIEU OF THE PROPOSED SECTION LINE. IF, HOWEVER, THIS IS NOT POSSIBLE, THE BOARD APPROVES THE USE OF THE SECTION LINE TO DEFINE THE BOUNDARY.

Donald D. McPherson: MSC (Vaughn--Farr) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT THE RESIGNATION OF MR. McPHERSON.

Enforcement Officers: MSC (Vaughn--Farr) THAT THE BOARD EMPLOY WILLIAM B. MEANS AND JERRY L. GIFFORD AS ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS.

Todd VanBramer/Brian Brockette: At 0910 Messrs. VanBramer and Brockette met with the Board to discuss the change in the corporate structure of the business formerly known as Wayne's of Sun Valley. MSC (Farr--Meiners) THAT BRIAN BROCKETTE AND SUN VALLEY OUTFITTERS, INC. BE ISSUED LICENSES UPON COMPLETION OF THE APPLICATION PROCESS AND SUBJECT TO THE FINAL APPROVAL OF THE CHAIRMAN OR VICE CHAIRMAN.

Omer Drury: MSC (Meiners--Farr) THAT AN AMENDMENT BE ISSUED TO DELETE POWER BOATING ON THE SNAKE RIVER-HELLS CANYON DAM TO LEWISTON FROM OMER DRURY'S LICENSE PER HIS REQUEST DATED MARCH 26, 1985.

John D. Patterson: Following a review of Mr. Patterson's application for an outfitter license and a guide license, MSC (Vaughn--Farr) THAT THE ENFORCEMENT COORDINATOR BE INSTRUCTED TO INVESTIGATE THE WORKING RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN JOHN D. PATTERSON AND DAVID J. BREAM AND THAT A LETTER BE SENT TO MR. BREAM RELATIVE TO HIS NOT HAVING ANY LICENSED GUIDES.

George Duncan: At 1020 Mr. Duncan met with the Board to discuss the addition of deer hunting in the area (#1 notation on his map) for which he is already licensed for other activities plus the addition of a new area (#3 notation on his map) in which to hunt bear, cougar, deer, and elk. The Chairman noted the Board will research this request with the Idaho Department of Fish and Game and will advise Mr. Duncan by mail when it renders its decision.

Memorandum of Understanding: MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) THAT A LETTER BE SENT TO THE REGIONAL FORESTERS OF REGIONS I, IV, AND VI RELATIVE TO THE FINALIZATION OF THE MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING AND THE SUPPLEMENTAL DAY-TO-DAY PROCEDURES TO BE ADDED TO THE BLUE BOOK. ADDITIONALLY, THAT A DATE BE DETERMINED WHEN A MEETING CAN TAKE PLACE BETWEEN THE BOARD AND THE REGIONAL FORESTERS; FURTHER, THAT IF THE REGIONAL FORESTERS ARE UNABLE TO ATTEND SUCH A MEETING, THE INDIVIDUALS SENT TO REPRESENT THEM BE

AUTHORIZED TO SPEAK AND MAKE DECISIONS IN THEIR BEHALF; FURTHER, THAT IF SUCH ARRANGEMENTS FOR PERSONNEL CANNOT BE MET, THE BOARD SERIOUSLY QUESTIONS THE PRODUCTIVITY OF SUCH A MEETING.

June Meeting: Following a brief discussion, the Board decided to hold its June meeting the week of June 10-14, 1985, reserving Wednesday and Thursday only for appointments.

Ricks College: At 1120 a denial hearing was held pursuant to Idaho Code 36-2114(b). David Thompson, Managing Agent, appeared for Ricks College. Steve Addington, Deputy Attorney General, represented the Board. Following testimony and judicial notice of the current licensees on the Teton River along with the Rules and Regulations relative to same, MSC (Farr--Vaughn) THAT THE DENIAL BE UPHELD AND THE ATTORNEY GENERAL'S OFFICE INSTRUCTED TO PREPARE THE NECESSARY FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW, AND AN ORDER.

David Powers: MSC (Meiners--Farr) THAT A LETTER BE WRITTEN TO MR. POWERS INDICATING THE ACTIVITIES HE REQUESTS FALL UNDER THE PURVIEW OF THE OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES ACT AND THE BOARD WILL RESEARCH HIS REQUEST. FURTHER, THAT HE BE ADVISED THAT A MAJOR PORTION OF THE AREA REQUESTED IS ALREADY LICENSED TO SOMEONE ELSE AND THAT THE ONLY AVAILABLE AREA IS THAT PORTION LYING SOUTH OF THE ROAD FROM OROFINO TO GRANGEMONT TO HOLLYWOOD, THEN SOUTH FROM HOLLYWOOD TO PIERCE, THEN VIA WEIPPE TO OROFINO.

Steve Lentz: At 1440 Mr. Lentz met with the Board to discuss his proposed purchase of the float boating operation of Dave Helfrich on the Owyhee and Jarbidge/Bruneau Rivers. MSC (Farr--Vaughn) THAT MR. LENTZ'S APPLICATION BE APPROVED AND THAT HE BE QUALIFIED TO GUIDE FOR ALL REQUESTED ACTIVITIES PER HIS LOGS AND DISCUSSION WITH THE BOARD.

Dave Helfrich: MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) THAT MR. HELFRICH BE GRANTED A VARIANCE IN ACCORDANCE WITH HIS REQUEST DATED MARCH 18, 1985, TO ALLOW A CLIENT TO ROW HIS OWN BOAT ON THE MIDDLE FORK OF THE SALMON RIVER.

Victor Frederickson: MSC (Meiners--Farr) THAT MR. FREDERICKSON BE ISSUED A PROBATIONARY LICENSE FOR THE 1985-1986 LICENSE YEAR BECAUSE OF THE CITATIONS ON FILE, NAMELY A FISH AND GAME CITATION AND AN OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES CITATION, BOTH ISSUED IN 1984. FURTHER, THAT MR. FREDERICKSON BE ADVISED THE TERMS OF HIS PROBATION ARE THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY STATE OR FEDERAL LAWS DURING THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR.

Hank Miller/Gary Moser: At 1510 Messrs. Miller and Moser met with the Board to discuss the purchase of Miller & Miller (Andron Corporation) by Idaho Adventures, Inc. The Chairman indicated the Board would need an executed purchase agreement and a decision on the name of the company (consolidating both companies) inasmuch as a license cannot be issued showing two company names. Mr. Miller stated he would provide the necessary paperwork and applications in the near future. MSC (Farr--Vaughn) THAT THE SALE OF ANDRON CORPORATION TO IDAHO ADVENTURES, INC. BE APPROVED AND THE LICENSE ISSUED UPON COMPLETION OF THE APPLICATION PROCESS, SUBJECT TO THE FINAL APPROVAL OF THE CHAIRMAN OR VICE CHAIRMAN.

Stacy Gebhards/Curt Olson/Tom Naylor: At 1615 Messrs. Gebhards, Olson, and Naylor met with the Board to discuss qualifications and regulations pertaining to skiing, snowmobiling, mountaineering, ice climbing, etc. It was suggested that written recommendations be submitted to the Board within sixty days and that a committee be established to work on proposed rules changes, waivers, and/or exceptions to training as noted in Rule 38.

The meeting recessed at 1715 and reconvened on Saturday, April 20, 1985, at 0800. The following business was conducted:

Board Minutes/August 1984: MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) RELATIVE TO THE AUGUST 16, 1984, MINUTES-PAGE 4, THAT THE MOTION RELATIVE TO ENFORCEMENT MATTERS BE AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS: THAT ENFORCEMENT PERSONNEL BE ADVISED THAT IN THE FUTURE, WHEN CONDUCTING UNDERCOVER OPERATIONS WHERE FISH AND GAME ANIMALS MAY BE TAKEN IN THE COURSE OF THE INVESTIGATION, THE AGENT OBTAIN SPECIAL TAGS FROM THE FISH AND GAME DEPARTMENT, AND THAT ANIMALS TAKEN UTILIZING THESE TAGS SHALL BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE STATE. IN THOSE INSTANCES WHERE THE INDIVIDUAL ASSISTING THE AGENT UTILIZES HIS OWN LEGAL TAG, THAT INDIVIDUAL WILL BE ALLOWED TO KEEP THE ANIMAL TAKEN.

Boulder Creek Outfitters, Inc./Tim Craig: MSC (Meiners--Farr) THAT THE APPLICATIONS OF BOULDER CREEK OUTFITTERS, INC. AND TIM CRAIG, MANAGING AGENT, BE ISSUED THE SAME AS LAST YEAR WITH THE EXCEPTION THAT THE AMENDMENTS RELATIVE TO SPRING BEAR HUNTING IN THE JACK NYGAARD AREA ARE TO BE DELETED. FURTHER, THAT HIS REQUEST TO ADD THE LARRY WALKER AREA OF OPERATION AS A RESULT OF THE PURCHASE OF MR. WALKER'S BUSINESS BE DENIED PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b)(5) AND RULES 7.c.5., 9(b), AND 13.

Larry F. Walker: MSC (Farr--Meiners) THAT THE APPLICATION OF MR. WALKER BE APPROVED WITH A PROBATIONARY STATUS DUE TO THE ALLEGED EXCESSIVE CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOL AND RELATED SAFETY PROBLEMS AND THE COMPLAINTS RECEIVED PURSUANT THERETO. THE LICENSE WOULD BE THE SAME AS LAST YEAR EXCEPT FOR THIS PROBATIONARY STATUS.


