IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD

June 10-14, 1985  
Boardroom - Boise, Idaho

A regular meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Board was called to order by Chairman Foster at 0830 on Monday, June 10, 1985, with members Farr, Meiners, Salter, and Vaughn in attendance. The following matters were discussed:

**Proposed Rules Package:** After considerable discussion, the following changes were made to the 1984 Proposed Rules Package:

B.e.i.v. now reads - "A ten dollar (\$10) fee shall be charged for every amendment to any license."

22.b.9. now reads - "Clearwater River -- Lowell to Kooskia [Each outfitter may use at any one time a maximum of (a) three boats for fishing and (b) five boats for other boating activities. The Board may approve adjustments of these boat limitations to accommodate canoeing and/or kayaking activities that are part of an outfitter's operating plan.].....none 5"

22.b.10. now reads - "Clearwater River -- Kooskia to Orofino [Each outfitter may use at any one time a maximum of (a) three boats for fishing and (b) five boats for other boating activities. The Board may approve adjustments of these boat limitations to accommodate canoeing and/or kayaking activities that are part of an outfitter's operating plan.]....5 10"

MSC (SALTER--FARR) THAT THE CURRENT NUMBER OF LICENSED POWER BOAT OPERATORS (10) BE ADVISED THAT THEIR LICENSE IS GRANDFATHERED IN BUT THAT IF AND WHEN THERE IS A TRANSFER OF THEIR LICENSE, THAT THE SECTION FROM KOOSKIA TO OROFINO WILL NOT BE AUTHORIZED FOR TRANSFER. THIS POLICY WILL HOLD UNTIL SUCH TIME AS THE NUMBER OF LICENSED POWER BOAT OUTFITTERS REACHES 5. THIS WOULD PRECLUDE ANY OF THE EXISTING POWER BOAT OPERATORS FROM SELLING THAT PORTION OF THEIR CURRENT BUSINESSES FROM KOOSKIA TO OROFINO UNTIL SUCH TIME AS THE NUMBER OF LICENSED OUTFITTERS IS 5.

22.b.11. now reads - "Clearwater River -- Orofino to Lewiston [Each outfitter may use at any one time a maximum of (a) three boats for fishing and (b) five boats for other boating activities. The Board may approve adjustments of these boat limitations to accommodate canoeing and/or kayaking activities that are part of an outfitter's operating plan.]....10 10"

22.b.13. now reads - "Selway River -- Selway Falls to the mouth of the Selway River at Lowell [Each outfitter may use at any one time a maximum of (a) three boats for fishing, and (b) five boats for other boating activities. The Board may approve adjustments of these boat limitations to accommodate canoeing and/or kayaking activities that are part of an outfitter's operating plan].....

22.b.14. now reads - "Lochsa River.....none 5"

22.b.15. now reads - "Salmon River - Dagger Falls to Indian Creek.....none 29"

22.b.16. now reads - "Middle Fork of Salmon River -- Indian Creek to confluence.....none 29"

22.b.18. now reads - "Salmon River - First Highway 93 bridge above Challis to Iron Creek - (All boating activities, other than fishing from boats, are prohibited. Each outfitter is restricted to a maximum of three boats at one time.).....none 5"

22.b.19. now reads - "Salmon River -- Iron Creek to North Fork -- (All boating activities, other than fishing from boats, are prohibited. Each outfitter is restricted to a maximum of three boats at one time.).....none 3"

22.b.25. now reads - "Snake River, Henry's Fork -- Henry's Lake Outlet to Hatchery Ford [Each outfitter may use at any one time a maximum of (a) eight boats for fishing (No more than three of these boats may be used at any one time on any of the following river reaches: Henry's Lake Outlet to Island Park Dam; Island Park Dam to Last Chance; Last Chance to Osborn Bridge; Osborn Bridge to Hatchery Ford.), and (b) five boats for other boating activities. The Board may approve adjustments of these boat limitations to accommodate canoeing and/or kayaking activities that are part of an outfitter's operating plan.]..none 7"

22.b.26. now reads - "Snake River, Henry's Fork -- Mesa Falls to St. Anthony [Each outfitter may use at any one time a maximum of (a) eight boats for fishing (No more than three of these boats may be used at any one time on any of the following river reaches: Mesa Falls to Warm River; Warm River to Ashton Dam; Ashton Dam to St. Anthony.), and (b) five boats for other boating activities. The Board may approve adjustments of these boat limitations that are part of an outfitter's operating plan.].....none 8"

22.b.27. now reads - "Snake River, Henry's Fork -- St. Anthony to confluence [Each outfitter may use at any one time a maximum of (a) three boats for fishing, and (b) five boats for other boating boating activities. The Board may approve adjustments of these boat limitations to accommodate canoeing and/or kayaking activities that are part of an outfitter's operating plan.].....none 4"

MSC (SALTER--FARR) THAT APPROPRIATE MEASURES BE TAKEN TO PREPARE THESE RULES IN FINAL FORMAT AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. However, before final approval, all Board members will be furnished with copies for one last opportunity to proofread and examine them for final Board approval.

Omer H. Drury: MSC (SALTER--MEINERS) THAT BASED UPON THE LETTER DATED MAY 3, 1985, FROM OMER H. DRURY, M.D. OF TROY, IDAHO, AND RECEIVED IN THIS OFFICE ON MAY 7, 1985, DR. DRURY'S CURRENT OUTFITTING LICENSE BE AMENDED TO DELETE ANY BOATING ACTIVITIES ON THE CLEARWATER RIVER.

Omer H. Drury: MSC (SALTER--MEINERS) THAT BASED UPON THE ABOVE ACTION TAKEN ON DR. OMER H. DRURY'S LICENSE, THE BOARD MAKE SPECIAL NOTE ON ON THE CONSIDERATION LIST THAT IT WOULD NOT RELICENSE ANYONE FOR DR. DRURY'S POWER BOATING ACTIVITIES ON THE KOOSKIA TO OROFINO SECTION OF THE CLEARWATER RIVER, BUT THAT IT WOULD RELICENSE SOMEONE IN HIS PLACE ON THAT PORTION OF THE CLEARWATER FROM OROFINO TO LEWISTON. THIS IN EFFECT WOULD REDUCE THE NUMBER OF LICENSED OUTFITTERS FOR POWER BOATING ON THE CLEARWATER RIVER FROM KOOSKIA TO OROFINO TO 9. (Refer to above motion with regard to reduction of power boat operators from Kooskia to Orofino.)

Henry's Fork--Snake River: MSC (SALTER--MEINERS; FOSTER ABSTAINED) BASED UPON THE TESTIMONY RECEIVED AT THE VARIOUS PUBLIC HEARINGS AND THE CORRESPONDENCE RECEIVED CONCERNING SAME, THAT NO ACTION BE TAKEN BY THE BOARD TO INCREASE THE NUMBER OF LICENSED OUTFITTERS FOR FISHING ON THE HENRY'S FORK OF THE SNAKE RIVER. APPROPRIATE ACTION WILL BE TAKEN TO NOTIFY PETITIONERS OF THIS DECISION AND THE BOARD'S LEGAL COUNSEL WILL BE INSTRUCTED TO PUT THIS IN FINAL FORM FOR THE BOARD'S OFFICIAL ADOPTION.

**Hank Miller/Idaho Adventures, Inc.:** MSC (SALTER--FARR) BASED UPON HANK MILLER'S LETTER DATED MAY 13, 1985, RELATIVE TO HIS PROPOSED PURCHASE OF ANDRON CORPORATION'S BUSINESS ON THE SALMON RIVER FROM IRON CREEK TO NORTH FORK AND NORTH FORK TO CORN CREEK AND FOR OTHER PRACTICAL REASONS, THAT THE ANDRON BUSINESS BE INCORPORATED INTO HANK MILLER'S OPERATION AND THAT THE ANDRON LICENSE BE RETIRED. THE BOARD TAKE APPROPRIATE ACTION AT THE NEXT HEARINGS SESSION ON REGULATIONS TO REDUCE THE FLOAT LICENSES PERMITTED ON THESE SECTIONS OF RIVER FROM 17 TO 16 ON IRON CREEK TO NORTH FORK AND FROM 20 TO 19 ON NORTH FORK TO CORN CREEK. (The Board will notify Hank Miller of this action per his request.)

**Leo Jarvis:** MSC (FARR--MEINERS) THAT THE OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION OF LEO JARVIS BE APPROVED FOR THE SAME ACTIVITIES AND AREA THAT WAS PREVIOUSLY LICENSED TO ALBERT LOCKETT. (Flag for Bill's attention so it can be changed on the maps.) This license cannot be issued until Mr. Jarvis obtains the signature of the Land Manager in the appropriate area.

**Bill Bernt:** The Board reviewed the outfitter license amendment application of Mr. Bernt for a trailriding operation in the Tower Creek area. It also considered the letter of response received from Jon Goodman regarding same. The Board noted that Goodman had requested a personal appearance to discuss this request further and the Board will notify Goodman that it needs to have his input in order to fully understand his objections to licensing Mr. Bernt.

**John D. Patterson:** MSC (MEINERS--VAUGHN) THAT THE GUIDE APPLICATION FOR JOHN D. PATTERSON BE APPROVED FOR FISHING AND POWER BOATING ON THE CLEARWATER RIVER UNDER S & S OUTFITTERS/DAVID J. BREAM, M.A. AND THAT HE BE SENT THE NECESSARY TRAINING CARD FOR COMPLETION. UPON SATISFACTORY COMPLETION OF A TRAINING CARD, THAT HE BE LICENSED FOR THE SNAKE RIVER AS WELL. THAT HE BE FURTHER INFORMED AS TO THE PROPER RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN AN OUTFITTER AND GUIDE AND THE USE OF EQUIPMENT OF S & S OUTFITTERS, THAT MR. BREAM SHOULD LEASE SAID EQUIPMENT FROM MR. PATTERSON WITH PROPER IDENTIFICATION ON SUCH BOATS AS BEING S & S OUTFITTERS AND THAT MR. PATTERSON, RATHER THAN OPERATING ON A PERCENTAGE BASIS, BE PAID A FLAT SALARY FOR SERVICES RENDERED. THE BOARD WILL REQUEST A COPY OF THE EQUIPMENT LEASE AGREEMENTS BETWEEN THESE PARTIES.

**Hell's Canyon Adventures, Inc./Gary R. Armacost:** MSC (VAUGHN--SALTER) THAT THE OUTFITTER LICENSE AMENDMENTS REQUESTED BY HELLS CANYON ADVENTURES, INC./GARY R. ARMACOST TO ACQUIRE THE LOWER SALMON BUSINESS OF JIM WALKER FOR FLOAT AND POWER BOATING, CHUKAR HUNTING, AND FISHING AND TO EXPAND HIS OUTFITTED ACTIVITIES TO INCLUDE BACKPACKING TRIPS FROM BLACK LAKE DOWN GRANITE CREEK TO THE SNAKE RIVER AND FROM BLACK LAKE DOWN GRANITE CREEK TO THE SNAKE RIVER, BE APPROVED AS REQUESTED SUBJECT TO THE RECOMMENDED BY THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME (WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE SUGGESTION THAT NO OUTFITTER CAMP BE ALLOWED AT EMERALD LAKE) AS DETAILED IN THEIR LETTER OF MAY 15, 1985.

**James H. Vermillion:** The Board considered the guide license application of Mr. Vermillion to guide fishing and float trips on the Henry's Fork of the Snake River for Thomas Webb. MSC (MEINERS--FARR) THAT THE APPLICATION BE APPROVED AS SUBMITTED ON A NON-PROBATIONARY BASIS.

**Vern Bressler:** The Board again reviewed the outfitter license application of Mr. Bressler for purchase of the Lyle Kunz fishing business. The Board noted that this transfer had been approved on February 14, 1985, subject to completion of the file. Once the contract has been cleared through legal counsel, the license will be issued.

**Leo Crane:** MSC (SALTER--FARR) THAT THE INFORMATION REQUESTED BY MR. CRANE IN HIS LETTER OF MAY 16, 1985, BE SUPPLIED THEM AND THAT A LETTER ALSO BE SENT TO MR. MOLSEE QUESTIONING THE BASIS FOR HIS ADVERTISEMENT IN "OUTDOOR LIFE" PERTAINING TO A 500 SQUARE MILE AREA FOR SHATTUCK CREEK OUTFITTERS.

**Mark S. Thorkelson:** The Board reviewed the guide license application of Mr. Thorkelson. MSC (VAUGHN--FARR) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT THIS APPLICATION AS SUBMITTED ON A NON-PROBATIONARY BASIS FOR THE YEAR 1985-86.

**Richard J. Cook:** The Board reviewed the guide license application of Mr. Cook to work as a power boat guide for Salmon River Challenge on the Salmon River--Vinegar Creek to the confluence with the Snake River. Following a review of this application, MSC (MEINERS--SALTER) THAT THE APPLICATION BE DENIED PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2104, 36-2109(C) AND 36-2113(A)(4), (8), AND (14), SPECIFICALLY FOR VIOLATION OF REGULATIONS OF THE U.S. FOREST SERVICE AND FOR VIOLATION OF REGULATIONS OF THE IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD.

**Proposed Future Rules:** Rule 26.d. indicates that a validated training card should be immediately forwarded to the Board's office for a license. The Board may want to have a photocopy of that validated training card immediately forwarded by certified mail to the Board's office so that they have some proof and we have some proof that it was actually mailed. The Board may want to consider the elimination of the validated training card for both river outfitters and for hunting outfitters in a future rules hearing.

**Dale R. Turnipseed/Donna L. Turnipseed/Norman B. Turnipseed:** The Board reviewed the guide license applications of the Turnipseeds and approved the issuance of validated training cards. When the training is completed, the guide licenses will be issued.

**Back-Country Skiing/Helicopter Skiing/Rock Climbing/Etc.:** MSC (MEINERS--FARR) THAT IN RESPONSE TO THE BOARD CONTACTING MR. STACY GEBHARDS, MR. CURT OLSON, AND MR. TOM NAYLOR AND THEIR OFFER TO SERVE AS A COMMITTEE OF EXPERTS TO REVIEW THE QUALIFICATIONS OF INDIVIDUALS MAKING APPLICATION FOR THESE ACTIVITIES, THE BOARD ACCEPT THEIR OFFER AND SEEK RECOMMENDATIONS FROM THIS COMMITTEE ON SUCH APPLICATIONS.

**Stan Morris:** MSC (MEINERS--FARR) THAT THE BOARD NOTIFY MR. MORRIS OF THE AFOREMENTIONED COMMITTEE'S REVIEW OF HIS APPLICATION AND THE ADDITIONAL MATERIAL THEY HAVE REQUESTED THE BOARD ACQUIRE BEFORE FINAL DECISION ON HIS APPLICATION. FURTHER, THAT HE BE REQUESTED TO COMPLY BY PROVIDING THE ADDITIONAL INFORMATION REQUESTED.

**Ski Guiding/Back-Country Activities:** The Board also reviewed the recommendations of the above-referenced committee for revisions of the rules regarding ski guiding and other back-country activities, including helicopter skiing. The Board commits to examining these recommendations for adoption at a future rules hearing.

**Committee Referrals:** The guide application of Mr. Craig W. Hill (signed by Stan Morris) and the application of Joe Tonsmeire for ice climbing will be submitted to the aforementioned committee for review and recommendations.

**Ed McCallum:** The Board notes that there was an error made in the amendment to Mr. McCallum's license as reflected in the letter of April 29, 1985. The reference in that letter to the licensed hunting area to be used after July 1 for the Guide School operation should be clarified to include all of the currently licensed area of Mr. McCallum. A letter will be written to him which will supercede the letter of April 29, 1985, with copies being sent to the same people who received copies of the April 29, 1985, letter.

**Ed Wright:** MSC (SALTER--FARR) THAT WHEN COMPLETED, THE APPLICATION OF ED WRIGHT TO PURCHASE THE DUANE WHIPPLE OPERATION BE APPROVED.

**Lemhi County/Bear and Cougar Policy:** MS (MEINERS--VAUGHN) THAT THE BOARD ESTABLISH A POSITION EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY TO WORK TOWARD THE GOAL OF REDUCING THE NUMBERS OF LICENSED BEAR AND COUGAR HUNTERS IN THE LEMHI BEAR/COUGAR HUNTING AREA TO NOT MORE THAN FIVE LICENSED OUTFITTERS. THIS IS TO BE ACCOMPLISHED OVER A PERIOD OF TIME AS EITHER NONUSE OR ATTRITION OF EXISTING OUTFITTERS OCCURS, AND THAT LICENSES INVOLVING THIS JOINT-USE AREA WILL NOT BE SOLD UNTIL THE NUMBER FIVE IS REACHED, FOLLOWING WHICH TIME THE BUSINESSES CAN BE SOLD. THE JUSTIFICATION IS TO UNSTACK AN AREA WHICH HAS AT THE PRESENT TIME SOME TWELVE OR THIRTEEN LICENSED OUTFITTERS IN THE AREA AND IN RECOGNITION OF POTENTIAL FUTURE CONFLICTS WITH GAME MANAGEMENT NEEDS AND REQUIREMENTS. This motion was tabled.

**Custer County/Cougar Joint-Use Area:** MS (MEINERS--VAUGHN) THAT THE BOARD ESTABLISH A POSITION EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY TO WORK TOWARD THE GOAL OF REDUCING THE NUMBERS OF LICENSED COUGAR HUNTERS IN THE CUSTER COUNTY JOINT-USE COUGAR HUNTING AREA TO NOT MORE THAN FOUR LICENSED HUNTERS. THIS IS TO BE ACCOMPLISHED OVER A PERIOD OF TIME AS EITHER NONUSE OR ATTRITION OF EXISTING OUTFITTERS OCCURS, AND THAT LICENSES INVOLVING THIS JOINT-USE AREA WILL NOT BE SOLD UNTIL THE NUMBER FOUR IS REACHED, FOLLOWING WHICH TIME THE BUSINESSES CAN THEN BE SOLD. THE JUSTIFICATION IS TO UNSTACK AN AREA WHICH AT THE PRESENT TIME HAS SOME TWELVE OR THIRTEEN LICENSED OUTFITTERS IN THE AREA AND IN RECOGNITION OF POTENTIAL FUTURE CONFLICTS WITH GAME MANagements NEEDS AND REQUIREMENTS. **Barbara Chandler:** MSC (SALTER--FARR) THAT BARBARA CHANDLER'S AMENDED APPLICATION BE APPROVED FOR SUMMER ACTIVITIES (TRAILRIDES, BACKPACKING, AND FISHING) ON THE WESTERN PORTION OF HER AMENDED APPLICATION AND FOR DEER, ELK, AND INCIDENTAL FALL BEAR HUNTING ON THE AREA IN WHICH SHE IS CURRENTLY LICENSED PROVIDED THAT THE NUMBER OF BIG GAME HUNTING GUESTS TO BE TAKEN SHALL NOT EXCEED FIFTEEN IN ANY ONE LICENSE YEAR. ALSO, THAT HER LICENSE BE AMENDED TO INCLUDE FISHING ON THE KOOTENAI RIVER. THIS ACTION OF LICENSING BARBARA CHANDLER FOR DEER, ELK, AND INCIDENTAL FALL BEAR IN AN AREA WHICH IS CURRENTLY LICENSED TO STAN SWEET IS DONE BECAUSE OF THE FACT THAT AN EXAMINATION OF MR. SWEET'S USE RECORD FOR THE PAST THREE YEARS SHOWS THAT IT IS EXTREMELY LIGHT FOR THE AMOUNT OF AREA IN WHICH HE IS LICENSED. (SEE ADDENDUM #2)

**Jack Shubert/Ansel Roberts:** MSC (FARR--VAUGHN) THAT IN THE CASE INVOLVING JACK SHUBERT AND ANSEL ROBERTS REGARDING ILLEGAL OUTFITTING PRACTICES, THE BOARD FINANCE HALF OF THE EXPENSES INVOLVED IN BRINGING THE WITNESSES BACK TO THE STATE OF IDAHO.

**Larry Dean Olsen:** The Board met with Mr. Olsen, L. J. Mitchell, and Dennis Thompson with regard to a change in the organizational structure of the School of Urban and Wilderness Survival. During that interview it was concluded that they would submit a new outfitter applications for the School of Urban and Wilderness Survival and for Dennis Thompson, Managing Agent. They also agreed to submit guide applications to insure that at least one licensed guide would accompany every party in the field. These changes were approved by the Board subject to the completion of the files and the furnishing of necessary documents to the Board.

**Kirk Bachman:** MSC (MEINERS--FARR) THAT KIRK BACHMAN'S APPLICATION FOR FISHING, BACKPACKING, AND TECHNICAL MOUNTAINEERING/ROCK CLIMBING BE APPROVED AT SUCH TIME AS IT IS COMPLETE. THE BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION FOR THIS ACTIVITY WOULD BE DESCRIBED ON THE LICENSE AS SAWTOOTH WILDERNESS WITH DIRECT ACCESS TO AND FROM SPECIFIED TRAIL HEADS.

**Tom Ferguson:** MSC (VAUGHN--MEINERS) THAT THE BOGUS BASIN OUTFITTERS, INC./TOM FERGUSON, MANAGING AGENT APPLICATION BE APPROVED WHEN COMPLETE WITH THE AREA OF OPERATION BEING THOSE PRIVATE LANDS OWNED BY THE SKI OPERATION OR OTHERWISE FOR WHICH A USE AGREEMENT HAS BEEN SECURED AND FILED WITH THE BOARD AND CERTAIN BOISE NATIONAL FOREST LANDS AS SPECIFIED IN THE APPLICATION. **Mike Ducharme:** The Board met with Mr. Ducharme regarding the dissolution of partnership between he and Dave Stucker. During that meeting, Mike also indicated that he would like to have wagon rides on the state-leased land in the vicinity of his stables around McCall added to his outfitter license. Following that meeting, MSC (VAUGHN--MEINERS) THAT MIKE DUCHARME'S REQUEST FOR WAGON RIDES ON STATE-LEASED LAND BE APPROVED AND THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT THE DISSOLUTION OF PARTNERSHIP BETWEEN MIKE DUCHARME AND DAVE STUCKER AND MAKE APPROPRIATE AMENDMENTS TO THOSE LICENSES.

**Ellen Shaw/Benjamin Rust/Ron Gillette:** The Board interviewed Ellen Shaw and Benjamin Rust. Mrs. Shaw is making application to amend her outfitter license to include float boating on the South Fork of the Payette River from Grandjean to Deadwood. She intends to employ as her licensed guide Benjamin Rust. Following a review of the files, MSC (MEINERS--SALTER) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE GUIDE APPLICATION OF BENJAMIN RUST TO GUIDE FOR MRS. SHAW ON THE PAYETTE RIVER FROM GRANDJEAN TO DEADWOOD AND THAT HIS APPLICATION ALSO BE APPROVED TO GUIDE FOR RON GILLETTE ON THE SALMON RIVER, FIRST BRIDGE ACROSS SALMON RIVER ABOVE RED FISH LAKE CREEK TO SLATE CREEK. ALSO APPROVED IS MRS. SHAW'S REQUEST TO HAVE THE PAYETTE RIVER ADDED TO HER OUTFITTER LICENSE CONSISTENT WITH BOARD ACTION TAKEN IN JUNE 1984 AS PER BOARD MINUTES DATED JUNE 14, 1984. 
