IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD

September 3-6, 1985
Boardroom - Boise, Idaho

On Tuesday, September 3, 1985, Board members Foster, Meiners, Salter, and Vaughn met with Forest Service personnel in Ketchum to discuss with area outfitters the management of the Sawtooth Wilderness and adjacent areas. A copy of the sign-in sheet is attached hereto.

A regular meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Board convened at 0830 hours on Wednesday, September 4, 1985. Present were: Chairman Glen Foster, Vice Chairman William Meiners, Robert Salter, and Harry Vaughn.

Board Minutes: MSC (Salter--Vaughn) THAT THE APRIL 16, 1985, INTER-AGENCY MEETING MINUTES BE APPROVED, THAT THE JUNE 10-14, 1985, BOARD MEETING MINUTES BE APPROVED, AND THAT THE JULY 10-13, 1985, BOARD MEETING MINUTES BE APPROVED.

David Powers: Pursuant to action noted in Board minutes of August 8, 1985, an outfitter's license was issued to David Powers for archery hunting only of elk, deer, cougar, and predators. Elk and deer hunting activities were restricted to a maximum of four (4) hunters per week for the first two (2) years of operation based on the operating plan submitted May 27, 1985. The area description reads as follows:

Beginning at Orofino on the road to Grangemont via Whiskey Creek (Sec. 7, T36N, R2E); thence easterly on said road via Grangemont to Hollywood and the junction with State Highway 11 (Sec. 16, T37N, R5E); thence south and west on State Highway 11 via Pierce and Weippe to the junction with U.S. Highway 12 at Greer (Sec. 11, T35N, R2E); thence northerly on U.S. Highway 12 to Orofino and the point of beginning. [Clearwater National Forest Map, 1980]

Gerald Kooyers: MSC (Salter--Vaughn) THAT A LETTER BE WRITTEN TO GERALD KOOYERS OUTLINING THE VARIOUS QUESTIONABLE ACTIVITIES WHICH ARE ALLEGED TO HAVE OCCURED IN HIS OPERATION DURING THE SUMMER OF 1985, IE: QUALITY OF EQUIPMENT AND SUBSEQUENT P.U.C. INSPECTION; THE POSSIBILITY OF AN UNLICENSED GUIDE (PARSONS); AND THE TAKING OF A TRIP DOWN A SECTION OF THE SALMON RIVER WHICH WAS DIFFERENT FROM THAT FOR WHICH THE GUESTS HAD CONTRACTED. THIS LETTER SHOULD CONCLUDE WITH REFERENCE TO THE FACT THAT KOOYERS IS NOT BEING REQUESTED TO APPEAR BEFORE THE BOARD AT THIS TIME, BUT THAT IF HE WISHES TO APPEAR BEFORE THE BOARD AND EXPLAIN THE CIRCUMSTANCES SURROUNDING THE ALLEGATIONS, THE BOARD WOULD OFFER HIM THAT OPPORTUNITY.

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Board Minutes: MSC (Salter--Meiners) THAT THE AUGUST 7-9, 1985, MINUTES OF THE BOARD BE APPROVED AS AMENDED.

Michael W. Butler: MSC (Salter--Vaughn) THAT MICHAEL W. BUTLER BE TAKEN FROM THE CONSIDERATION LIST ON THE NORTH FORK OF THE PAYETTE RIVER FROM CABARTON TO SMITHS FERRY BRIDGE AND BE ISSUED AN OUTFITTER'S LICENSE FOR THIS SECTION OF RIVER FOR FLOAT BOATING AND FISHING.

Cal Butterfield: MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) THAT CAL BUTTERFIELD DBA INLAND CHARTER SERVICE OUTFITTER APPLICATION FOR FISHING CHARTER SERVICES ON THE COEUR D'ALENE, PRIEST, AND PEND OREILLE LAKES BE APPROVED WHEN COMPLETED.

Randy Baugh: MSC (Salter--Vaughn) BECAUSE OF THE APPEARANCE BEFORE THE BOARD OF RANDY BAUGH AND MARIA LOANA AS REQUESTED IN THE AUGUST 7-9, 1985, MINUTES AND THEIR SUBMISSION OF A PLAN OF OPERATION, COMPLETE WITH NUMBERS OF CLIENTELE THEY PROPOSE TO ACCOMMODATE, AND THE RECEIPT BY THE BOARD OF A LETTER FROM BRENT T. ROBINSON, AN ATTORNEY FOR MR. PEPCORN, STATING THAT THE CONTRACT DISPUTE BETWEEN BAUGH AND PEPCORN HAD BEEN RESOLVED, THAT THE PROPOSAL FOR VALLEY RANCH OUTFITTERS TO ACQUIRE THE DENNIS HILL OPERATION BE APPROVED WITH THE PROVISIO THAT THEIR SUMMER ACTIVITIES WILL BE CONDUCTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE USE CONSTRAINTS AS PRESCRIBED BY THE U.S. FOREST SERVICE. The area description to read as follows:

AREA 1 FOR BIG GAME HUNTING: Beginning at the mouth of Warm Springs Creek (Sec. 27, T11N, R15E, BM); thence westerly up the ridge between Warm Springs Creek and the Salmon River to the Elk Creek/Warm Springs Creek watershed divide (approximate section corner common to Secs. 28/29/32/33, T11N, R15E); thence southwesterly along said watershed divide to Prospect Peak; thence southwesterly on the Rough Creek/Prospect Creek watershed divide to Lookout Mountain; thence continuing southwesterly on the Casino Creek/Garland Creek watershed divide to the Challis/Sawtooth National Forest boundary (SW 1/4 Sec. 27, T10N, R14E); thence south and east along said National Forest boundary to its intersection with Forest Service Road 132 [Aztec Mine Road (Sec. 30, T9N, R15E)]; thence southwesterly down Fisher Creek Road (Forest Service Road 132) to State Highway 75 (NW 1/4 Sec. 4, T8N, R14E); thence southerly along State Highway 75 to Beaver Creek Road (SE 1/4 Sec. 21, T7N, R14E); thence southwesterly up Beaver Creek Road (Road 204) and Beaver Creek to the Blaine-Camas County Line; thence following said county line easterly to a point in the headwaters of the Salmon River and a juncture with Trail 072 (SW 1/4 Sec. 36, T6N, R14E); thence northerly on Trail 072, Forest Service Road 215, and State Highway 75 down the Salmon River to the juncture with Pole Creek Road (Road 194) (SW 1/4 Sec. 26, T7N, R14E, BM); thence northeasterly up Forest

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Service Roads 194 and 197 to the Salmon River/East Fork Salmon River watershed divide (NW 1/4 Sec. 3, T7N, R15E); thence continuing northeasterly on said watershed divide via Washington Peak to the head of Warm Springs Creek east of Born Lakes (SE 1/4 Sec. 32, T9N, R16E); thence northwesterly via Born Lakes to Warm Springs Creek Trail (Forest Service Trail 671)(SW 1/4 Sec. 32, T9N, R16E); thence northerly along said trail via the Meadows to the ridge between Warm Springs Creek and Swimm Creek (Sec. 21, T10N, R15E); thence southeasterly on said ridge and around the head of Swimm Creek to the Swimm Creek/Slate Creek watershed divide (SE 1/4 Sec. 2, T9N, R15E); thence northerly on said watershed divide and continuing around the head of Swimm Creek and down the Warm Springs Creek/Slate Creek watershed divide to a point at the head of Beaver Creek (SE 1/4 Sec. 12, T10N, R15E); thence northeasterly down the Beaver Creek/Slate Creek watershed divide to the Salmon River (Sec. 28, T11N, R16E); thence westerly along the Salmon River to the point of beginning. [F&G Unit 36] [Sawtooth National Forest, Northern Division, 1972]

AREA 2 FOR BIG GAME HUNTING: Start at the mouth of the East Fork of the Wood River (Sec. 7, T3N, R18E, BM); thence east and north along the East Fork of the Wood River to Hyndman Creek; thence up Hyndman Creek to Hyndman Peak; thence north and west on the Custer-Blaine County Line (the divide) to Trail Creek Summit; thence southwest on Trail Creek Road to U.S. Highway 75; thence north and west on Highway 75 to the mouth of Prairie Creek; thence south and west on Prairie Creek and Trail 134 to Trail 138 and on to Baker Lake; thence southeast on a line to Castle Rock (Sec. 32, T4N, R16E); thence east to Warm Springs Creek; thence easterly along Warm Springs Creek to Trail 180 at Alturas Gulch; thence southeasterly on Trail 180 to Greenhorn Creek; thence east on Greenhorn Creek to the Big Wood River; thence north on the Big Wood River to the point of beginning. [F&G Unit 48]

AREA DESCRIPTION FOR FISHING, TRAILRIDES, AND BACKPACKING: The Sawtooth Wilderness and the following designated areas within the White Clouds Mountains: Starting at the mouth of Warm Springs Creek on the Salmon River westerly to Rough Creek; thence southerly up Rough Creek to Rough Lake; thence continuing southerly up the ridge from Rough Lake to the Casino/Garland Creeks watershed divide and Forest Service Trail 616; thence southerly on said divide to the Challis/Sawtooth National Forest boundary (SW 1/4 Sec. 27, T10N, R14E); thence northwesterly on said National Forest boundary and Forest Service Trail 616 to its juncture with Forest Service Trail 103 (SE 1/4 Sec. 20, T10N, R15E); thence southwesterly on Forest Service Trail 103 to Boundary Creek and continuing down Boundary Creek to Highway 75; thence southerly on Highway 75 to Forest Service Road 194 (Sec. 16, T8N, R14E); thence easterly on Forest Service Road 194 and Forest Service Trail 197 (SW 1/4 Sec. 35, T8N, R15E); thence

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easterly on Forest Service Road 194 and Forest Service Trail 105 via Champion Lakes to Germania Creek and Forest Service Road 197 (SW 1/4 Sec. 35, T8N, R15E); thence easterly down Germania Creek to the East Fork of the Salmon River (Sec. 9, T8N, R17E); thence northerly on the East Fork of the Salmon River to the mouth of Big Boulder Creek to Jim Creek and continuing up Jim Creek to its head (SW 1/4 Sec. 4, T9N, R16E); thence in a straight westerly line to a point on the watershed divide between Swimm and Slate Creeks (SE 1/4 Sec. 2, T9N, R15E); thence northerly on said watershed divide and continuing around the head of Swimm Creek and down the Warm Springs/Slate Creeks watershed divide to a point at the head of Beaver Creek (SE 1/4 Sec. 12, T10N, R15E); thence northeasterly down the Beaver/Slate Creeks watershed divide to the Salmon River (Sec. 28, T11N, R16E); thence westerly along the Salmon River to the point of beginning. [F&G Units 36A & 39] [Sawtooth National Forest, Northern Division, 1972]

The Board recessed at 1715 hours and reconvened at 0830 hours on Thursday, September 5, 1985. Messrs. Del Allmon and Ron Sherer met with the Board and discussed the cougar situation in their respective areas. The following action was taken:

Larry Jarrett: MSC (Salter--Vaughn) THAT LARRY JARRETT'S REQUEST FOR AN EXTENSION OF HIS COUGAR AREA IN UNIT 39 BE DENIED BASED ON IDAHO CODE 36-2109 (b)(4) AND (b)(5). SPECIFICALLY, THIS DENIAL IS BASED ON THE BOARD'S ADOPTION OF A NO-STACKING POLICY ON COUGAR HUNTING AND ITS CONCERN FOR OVER-HARVEST IN THAT AREA IF IT IS LICENSED TO TWO (2) OUTFITTERS.

Del Allmon: MSC (Salter--Vaughn) THAT THE CURRENT RESTRICTION OF TWO (2) COUGARS ON DEL ALLMON'S OUTFITTING LICENSE IN UNIT 43 BE REMOVED.

Ron Sherer: With respect to Ron Sherer's request to have Larry Jarrett's cougar hunting area in Fish and Game Unit 39 cut back to the south side of the South Fork of the Boise River, the Board will continue research on this matter by writing a letter to the Fish and Game Department and a letter to Mr. Jarrett requesting comments on this proposal.

Jim Powell: MSC (Salter--Meiners) THAT JIM POWELL'S APPLICATION FOR RENEWAL OF LAST YEAR'S OUTFITTER LICENSE FOR SALMON RIVER GUIDE SERVICE BE APPROVED AS SUBMITTED SUBJECT TO COMPLETION.

James Thrash: Following a review of James Thrash's request, MSC (Vaughn--Meiners) THAT AN AMENDMENT BE ISSUED TO ALLOW JAMES THRASH TO GUIDE FOR SHEEP HUNTING WHEN EMPLOYED BY OUTFITTER DAVE BREAM.

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Salmon River Guide Service/Hershel Coulter Areas: The Board reviewed requests by Mike Ducharme, James Thrash, Ted Epley, and Doug Rank for licensing in the Salmon River Guide Service area and also the area which has formerly been licensed to Hershel Coulter. It was concluded that the Board will continue to hold these requests until (a) it concludes its review of selection criteria, and (b) the litigation against Hershel Coulter has been completed. The interested parties will be so notified and will also be notified that the Salmon River Guide Service area has been re-licensed to Jim Powell as in past years.

Ed Wright/Harlan Opdahl/Gordon Frost/Albert Latch/Jack Nygaard: MSC (Salter--Vaughn) THAT THE 1985-1986 OUTFITTER LICENSES OF MESSRS. WRIGHT, OPDAHL, FROST, LATCH, AND NYGAARD BE ISSUED WITH THE AREA DESCRIPTIONS TO BE THE SAME AS SENT TO THOSE INDIVIDUALS BY CERTIFIED MAIL ON JULY 29, 1985. FURTHER THAT THE ABOVE-MENTIONED INDIVIDUALS RECEIVE COPIES OF EACH OTHER'S LICENSES AS WELL AS THEIR OWN, AND THAT COPIES OF ALL OF THE LICENSES BE SENT TO PETE DEAN OF THE U.S. FOREST SERVICE, POWELL RANGER DISTRICT. [Area descriptions attached hereto - see Addenda 1 through 5]

Peter DePagter: Following a review of Peter DePagter's application for an outfitter's license and for a request to purchase the business from Lyman Dye dba EE-DA-HOW Mountaineering Guide Service, MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) THAT THE LICENSE APPLICATION BE APPROVED AND THE LICENSE ISSUED AS REQUESTED FOR THE SAWTOOTH WILDERNESS PORTION OF THE SNRA.

Elvin Hincks: Following review of Elvin Hinck's request for a waiver of late penalty and the circumstances surrounding his late application, MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) THAT THE LATE FEE BE WAIVED.

Steve Jones/Cully Erdman/Cascade Raft Company: The Board reviewed the July 31, 1985, letter from Steve Jones and Cully Erdman of Cascade Raft Company and concluded, after reviewing the license, that Cascade Raft Company is already licensed to conduct the activities requested in said letter and that a letter of reply will be drafted clarifying this issue with the principals involved.

Tony Skoro: Mr. Tony Skoro appeared before the Board regarding employment as an enforcement officer. Following this interview, it was the Board's decision to hire Mr. Skoro.

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Rick VanderMeyden/Richard E. Grunch: At 0200 a denial hearing was held at the request of Mr. VanderMeyden. Following this hearing, MSC (Salter--Meiners) BASED ON INFORMATION CONTAINED IN A LETTER TO THE BOARD DATED SEPTEMBER 4, 1985, FROM RICHARD E. GRUNCH THAT THE AREA WHICH HE IS WILLING TO RELEASE FROM HIS CURRENT LICENSE BE ADDED TO THE EXISTING LICENSE OF RICK VANDERMEYDEN, AND THAT SAID AREA BE REMOVED FROM GRUNCH'S EXISTING LICENSE. [Area description attached hereto - see Addendum 6]

Selection for Big Game Hunting Areas and River Operators: Following discussion with the Board's attorney on the selection process for filling vacancies from waiting lists, MSC (Salter--Meiners) THAT WHEN A LICENSED AREA (HUNTING, BOATING OR OTHER) BECOMES AVAILABLE BY ANY MEANS EXCEPT THROUGH RECOGNIZED SALES OF BUSINESS, THAT THE BOARD (IF IT DEEMS IT ADVISABLE TO RE-LICENSE SAID AREA) SHALL PUBLICIZE SUCH AVAILABILITY AND ACCEPT WRITTEN APPLICATIONS FOR A THIRTY (30) DAY PERIOD OF TIME FROM THOSE PERSONS WISHING TO OPERATE IN SAID AREA. THE BOARD SHALL THEN CONSIDER THE QUALIFICATIONS OF ALL APPLICANTS AND LICENSE THE AREA TO THE CANDIDATE DETERMINED TO BE MOST QUALIFIED. CRITERIA TO BE CONSIDERED IN MAKING THIS SELECTION SHALL INCLUDE, BUT NOT BE LIMITED TO, THE FOLLOWING:

- (1) EXPERIENCE IN AN OUTFITTING BUSINESS
- (2) OTHER BUSINESS EXPERIENCE OR TRAINING
- (3) FINANCIAL RESOURCES AVAILABLE TO OPERATE THE PROPOSED BUSINESS
- (4) EQUIPMENT RESOURCES AVAILABLE TO OPERATE THE PROPOSED BUSINESS
- (5) EFFECT LICENSING WOULD HAVE ON ADJACENT OR CONTIGUOUS OUTFITTERS
- (6) PROPOSED OPERATING PLAN FOR USE OF THE AREA

ANY PERSON WHO HAS SUBMITTED A WRITTEN APPLICATION FOR SAID AREA PRIOR TO ITS BECOMING AVAILABLE MUST RE-APPLY DURING THE OPEN PERIOD AS ANNOUNCED BY THE BOARD IN ORDER TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR CONSIDERATION. BEGINNING IMMEDIATELY, THE BOARD SHALL MAINTAIN A LIST OF SUCH APPLICANTS AND MAKE A DIRECT MAILING TO THEM WHEN AVAILABILITY DOES OCCUR.

Albert Latch: The Board reviewed Mr. Latch's request for snowmobiling in connection with his big game hunting operation and noted that he lacks qualifications and does not have a qualified guide employed to conduct these activities. A letter will be written to Mr. Latch indicating that when qualifications are submitted, this activity may be added to his outfitter license.

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Quaker Hill Conference, Inc.: The Board reviewed the outfitter license applications of Quaker Hill Conference, Inc. dba Backcountry and Beyond and Mike Crevelt as the Managing Agent. Following such review, MSC (Salter--Meiners) THAT THE OUTFITTER APPLICATION BE APPROVED AND THE LICENSE BE ISSUED FOR THOSE ACTIVITIES FOR WHICH THE APPLICANTS ARE QUALIFIED, WITH A LETTER ACCOMPANYING THE LICENSE EXPLAINING THAT WHEN OTHER QUALIFICATIONS ARE RECEIVED, SUCH ADDITIONAL ACTIVITIES MAY BE ADDED TO THE LICENSE BY AMENDMENT. THE AREAS OF OPERATION PRESENTLY APPROVED ARE THOSE AREAS IDENTIFIED ON THE MAP ACCOMPANYING THE APPLICATION WHICH ARE LOCATED IN THE PAYETTE NATIONAL FOREST. IN ORDER TO APPROVE ADDITIONAL ACTIVITIES AND/OR AREAS, WHEN TRAINING CREDENTIALS ARE SUBMITTED, IT WILL ALSO BE NECESSARY FOR THE APPLICANTS TO SUBMIT SIGNATURES INDICATING APPROVAL OF LAND MANAGERS IN THE MOUNT BORAH AND CITY OF ROCKS AREAS. [Area description attached hereto - see Addendum 7]

Mike Crevelt: MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) THAT THE CHAIRMAN BE INSTRUCTED TO INFORM MIKE CREVELT THAT THERE MUST BE A LICENSED GUIDE FOR EACH SIX (6) PARTICIPANTS FOR BACKPACKING AND FISHING ACTIVITIES AND EACH INSTRUCTOR/GUIDE MUST BE LICENSED WHO IS INVOLVED IN TECHNICAL MOUNTAINEERING/ROCK CLIMBING AND/OR CROSS-COUNTRY SKIING ACTIVITIES.

Three Rivers Ranch: Following a review of the letter from Three Rivers Ranch dated August 21, 1985, requesting the Board's decision on an application to float fish the upper Henry's Fork and the South Fork of the Snake River and the Rules and Regulations relating to these two rivers, MSC (Vaughn--Meiners) THAT THE BOARD DENY THE REQUEST ON BOTH RIVERS UNDER AUTHORITY PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109 (b)(4) AND (b)(5), 36-2109(c), AND RULES AND REGULATIONS 22.a.AND b., 25, AND 28. SPECIFICALLY, THE RIVERS REQUESTED ARE LICENSED TO THE MAXIMUM ALLOWED BY RULES AND REGULATIONS AS PROMULGATED THROUGH THE PUBLIC HEARING PROCESS.

Dusty Youren: MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) AFTER REVIEW OF THE FILE AND REQUEST BY DUSTY YOUREN, THAT HIS OUTFITTER LICENSE FOR THE 1985-1986 SEASON BE APPROVED AS REQUESTED WITH THE SAME STIPULATIONS AS WERE SHOWN ON THE PREVIOUS LICENSE ISSUED TO STEVE ALLEY DBA ANDERSON CREEK OUTFITTERS.

Robert M. Smith: The Board reviewed the outfitter license file of Robert M. Smith and the proposed sale to Bob Dennis of Montana. The Board reiterates its position that it has not received a response to its July letter to Messrs. Smith and Dennis and a second letter will be sent indicating that the Board cannot take action on the requested transfer until all of said documents have been received.

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The Board meeting recessed at 1730 hours and reconvened on Friday, September 6, 1985, at 0830 hours.

Data Processing Update: At 0900 the Board met with programmers from the State Auditor's office relative to proposed forms and formats for applications, licenses, trainee cards, and various reports. Following review of same, the Board selected specific designs and asked the programmers to submit proofs before final approval is given.

Teton River Lodge: The Board reviewed with its attorney correspondence from Jim Dewey relative to the Teton River Lodge request for duck and goose hunting on Dewey's property. Following such review, MSC (Vaughn--Meiners) THAT TETON VALLEY LODGE, INC./RANDY BERRY, MANAGING AGENT, BE ISSUED AN AMENDMENT TO ALLOW HIM TO HUNT DUCKS AND GEESE IN THE TWO (2) BLINDS LOCATED ON THE JIM DEWEY PROPERTY. As a result of the letter received from Mr. Dewey, the Board cancelled the denial hearing scheduled for Teton Valley Lodge, Inc. as both parties to the hearing felt the issues had been resolved.

Randy Berry: MSC (Vaughn--Meiners) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE TETON VALLEY LODGE, INC./RANDY BERRY, MANAGING AGENT, TRAILRIDING REQUEST EXCEPT FOR THE MAHOGANY CREEK TRAILS AND THE ELK FLAT AREA. USE OF BOTH THE SOUTH AND NORTH FORKS OF MAHOGANY CREEK AND THE ELK FLAT AREA IS DENIED. THE DENIAL IS BASED ON THE FACT THAT THE AREA IS ALREADY ADEQUATELY SERVED BY EXISTING OUTFITTERS, THAT THE BOARD IS CONCERNED THAT ANOTHER OUTFITTING OPERATION IN THOSE AREAS WOULD UNDULY IMPACT THE RESOURCE BEYOND ITS CAPACITY, AND THAT SUCH ADDITIONAL OUTFITTER PRESSURE WOULD SERIOUSLY CONFLICT WITH THE HEAVY PUBLIC USE RECEIVED BY THE AREA DUE TO ITS GENERAL ACCESSIBILITY. THE BASIS FOR THIS DENIAL IS IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b)(4) AND (b)(5). [Area description attached hereto - see Addendum 8]

Budgets: MSC (Meiners--Salter) THAT THE FY87 PROPOSED BUDGET AND THE FY86 INTERNAL BUDGET BE APPROVED.

Robert M. Smith: The Board spent some additional time discussing Robert M. Smith's proposed sale to Bob Dennis and determined that it would ask for cougar harvest information in the Pete King area for the 1984-1985 season from the Fish and Game Department, that it would inspect equipment alleged to be transferred in connection with this sale, and that it would contact Mike Stockton to see if it might be possible for him to look at the area proposed to be transferred and give the Board a recommendation on its viability as a cougar and bear hunting area of operation.

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School of Urban and Wilderness Survival: The Board has concluded its investigation of the accident relative to the School of Urban and Wilderness Survival, and it is the finding of the Board that, although an accident did occur, it appears not to have been due to any overt negligence on the part of the school or its employees. The Board has found nothing that would justify taking any further action against the school or its outfitter license at this time.

Robert L. Hennefer: The Board reviewed the outfitter file of Robert L. Hennefer of Carey, Idaho, and the letter the Board sent to him on August 7, 1985, and concluded that since he has not responded and his bond has expired, that a hearing be set up for the October meeting to consider the revocation of his outfitter license.

Ray Seal: Following a review of the request by Ray Seal and the Forest Service to change his area description for summer activities, MSC (Vaughn--Meiners) THAT THE AREA DESCRIPTION FOR RAY SEAL BE CHANGED TO READ: "Fishing and trailrides to be in area designated for big game hunting and the Sawtooth Wilderness".

Helmut P. Augustin: The Board reviewed the letter submitted by Helmut P. Augustin dated September 3, 1985, regarding the late fee on his outfitter license application. Following a review of the letter, MSC (Vaughn--Salter) THAT MR. AUGUSTIN BE INFORMED THAT THE BOARD HAS WAIVED THE LATE FEE, BUT THAT HE BE INFORMED THAT THE LATE FEE APPLIES WHEN AN OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION IS NOT COMPLETE BY APRIL 1ST AND THAT THIS RULE BE EMPHASIZED IN THE LETTER.

Dare R. Anderson: The Board reviewed the September 3, 1985, letter from Dare R. Anderson requesting authorization for Ed Peterson to use Mr. Anderson's area for archery elk hunting. Following the review of the letter, MSC (Salter--Vaughn) THAT SUCH APPROVAL BE GRANTED FOR THIS YEAR ONLY. In the letter which goes to Mr. Anderson, it should be explained that this amounts to approval for a joint-use of the area and such is against the basic policy of the Board and that if he wants to employ Mr. Peterson as a guide to work his area, such could be arranged by submitting the application to the Board.

Leo Crane: MSC (Vaughn--Salter) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE LEO CRANE'S REQUEST FOR DEER HUNTING IN THE AREA REQUESTED IN HIS LETTER DATED JULY 10, 1985, AND THAT THE BOARD DENY SPRING BEAR HUNTING AND OTHER FALL BIG GAME HUNTING ACTIVITIES. THE BASIS

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FOR DENIAL IS IDAHO CODE 36-2109 (b)(4) AND (b)(5), THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME, THE ACCESSIBILITY OF THE AREA, AND THE HEAVY USE THE AREA RECEIVES FOR SPRING BEAR HUNTING AND FOR OTHER BIG GAME ACTIVITIES. [Area description attached hereto - see Addendum 9]

Stan Potts: The Board reviewed letters of Stan Potts requesting permission to take sheep hunters in areas to which he is not currently licensed. Following a review of these letters, MSC (Vaughn--Meiners) THAT MR. POTTS BE NOTIFIED THAT THE BOARD DOES APPROVE HIS REQUESTS AND THAT HE SHOULD CONTACT THE APPROPRIATE FOREST SERVICE OFFICES AND MAKE PROPER CLEARANCE WITH THEM AND THAT THE BOARD WILL SEND COPIES OF ITS APPROVAL LETTER TO AFFECTED OUTFITTERS AND TO THE FOREST SERVICE.

Stan Potts/Scott Farr: Relative to the overlap between Stan Potts and Scott Farr, the Board has directed that another letter be sent to the Forest Service requesting information on the current status of their historical research and proposed resolution of this matter.

Middle Fork Lodge/Cougar Ranch Outfitters: MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) RELATIVE TO CLARIFICATION OF THE BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION BETWEEN MIDDLE FORK LODGE AND COUGAR RANCH OUTFITTERS AND THE LETTER DATED JULY 22, 1985, ADDRESSED TO MESSRS. COLE AND HILL WHICH OUTLINED THE BOARD'S RECOMMENDED ALTERNATIVES (ALTERNATIVES 1 AND 2), (A) MR. COLE RECOMMENDS ADOPTION OF ALTERNATIVE 1; (B) MR. HILL HAS NOT RESPONDED WITHIN THE TIME FRAME AS STATED IN THE BOARD'S JULY 22, 1985, LETTER; THUS, (C) THE BOARD ADOPT ALTERNATIVE 1 AS APPROPRIATE TO CLARIFICATION OF THE BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION WITH ADMINISTRATIVE AMENDMENTS OF THE RESPECTIVE LICENSEES TO REFLECT THIS CHANGE. Snake River Llamas: MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) IN RESPONSE TO THE LETTER FROM SNAKE RIVER LLAMAS, OWNERS DOYLE AND CHERRIE MARKHAM, DATED AUGUST 19, 1985, OUTLINING THEIR PROPOSED OPERATIONS AND REQUESTING A DECLARATORY JUDGMENT FROM THE BOARD AS TO WHETHER SUCH OPERATIONS FALL UNDER THE PURVIEW OF THE OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES ACT, THAT THEY BE ADVISED THAT THEIR OPERATIONS DO FALL UNDER THE PURVIEW OF THE OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES ACT AND, THEREFORE, WOULD REQUIRE LICENSING.

Dave Stucker: The Board reviewed a request by Dave Stucker to add forest grouse to his hunting activities in his big game hunting area. MSC (Vaughn--Meiners) THAT THIS REQUEST BE GRANTED.

Consideration List: The Board reviewed the consideration list and determined that where there are applicants waiting and there is space available, letters will be written to persons on the waiting list to ascertain their current interest and to request a current operating plan detailing projected utilization of the resource. A 30-day time period will be allowed for response. As selection of licensees will be based, at least partly, on the operating plan, candidates should be encouraged to be as detailed, comprehensive, and explicit as possible in the submission of such plan. Other criteria used in this selection process will be those identified on page 6 of these Minutes.

Proposed Rules Changes: The Board considered proposed rules changes and made modifications. A package will be typed in draft stage for the October meeting.

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November Board Meeting: The Board established the November meeting dates to be Wednesday, November 6, through Friday, November 8, 1985.

The Board meeting adjourned at 1730 hours.
