

## MINUTES

### IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD

November 6-8, 1985  
Boardroom - Boise, Idaho

A regular meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Board convened at 0830 hours on Wednesday, November 6, 1985, with all members in attendance.

**Orv Burmaster/Boise State University:** The Board discussed a telephone call received from Mr. Burmaster regarding an internship for a technical writing class and agreed to sponsor an internship with BSU at no monetary cost to the Board. The intern could be used to re-write examinations and/or to develop a sample operating plan or format to be used by outfitter license applicants.

**October Minutes:** The Board reviewed the Minutes of the September 30-October 2, 1985, meeting, following which MSC (Meiners--Vaughn; Salter abstained) THAT THE MINUTES BE APPROVED AS AMENDED.

**Michael R. Best:** The Board interviewed Mr. Best for a part-time position as an Enforcement Officer, following which MSC (Farr--Vaughn) THAT MR. BEST BE OFFERED EMPLOYMENT AS A PART-TIME ENFORCEMENT OFFICER.

**Computer Update:** The Board reviewed with personnel from the State Auditor's office the current status of the computer set-up and also reviewed and approved forms and formats for licenses, applications, and reports. The Board also approved the progress report.

**Heyward Jack:** The Board accepted the resignation of Heyward Jack, part-time enforcement officer, which he submitted due to poor health.

**Mike Mulligan:** The Board interviewed Mr. Mulligan regarding his outfitter license application for snowmobiling, following which MSC (Farr--Meiners) THAT THE APPLICATION BE APPROVED PENDING POSITIVE FEEDBACK FROM THE FISH AND GAME DEPARTMENT WHICH MEANS THAT A LETTER WILL BE WRITTEN TO THE FISH AND GAME DEPARTMENT REQUESTING INPUT. IF THE RESPONSE IS POSITIVE, THE LICENSE APPLICATION WOULD BE APPROVED. IF THE FISH AND GAME HAS A CONCERN ABOUT A CERTAIN AREA, THAT AREA WOULD BE CUT OUT OF HIS REQUESTED AREA OF OPERATION.

**Ray Hammel:** Mr. Hammel did not appear for his scheduled appointment with the Board.

**Steve Settles/Vinson Johnson:** The Board interviewed Mr. Settles as the potential buyer of Mr. Johnson's business formerly owned by Guided Outdoor Adventure Tours, Inc. on the Salmon River, North Fork to Spring Bar. Following the interview, MSC (Farr--Vaughn) THAT THE APPLICATION OF STEVE SETTLES AND SALMON RIVER WHITEWATER, INC. BE APPROVED AS SUBMITTED WHEN COMPLETE, WHICH WOULD INCLUDE THE PAYMENT OF FEES, THE BOND, AND A LETTER OF INTENT OF EMPLOYMENT BETWEEN A QUALIFIED LICENSED LEAD BOATMAN AND THE CORPORATION.

**Rule 22.c.:** The Board reviewed the part of Rule 22.c. which indicates that an outfitter wishing to be placed on a consideration list must file a completed application. It was the Board's decision that a licensed outfitter may be placed on the consideration list by submitting a letter of interest. If the party is not a licensed outfitter, a completed application must be submitted (except the bond and fee) in order to be placed on a list.

**Michael P. Sullivan:** The Board reviewed Mr. Sullivan's letter dated October 7, 1985, and directed that a response be written indicating that Galena Lodge has not been licensed as an outfitter in Idaho because it was conducting a downhill ski business operating on groomed slopes. If cross-country or backcountry skiing is conducted in the winter and guided horseback trips are conducted in the summer, application must be made for an outfitter's license before such commercial activities could be conducted or advertised.

**Mrs. Dick McAfee:** The Board reviewed Mrs. McAfee's letter dated October 9, 1985, requesting the Board to consider a wrangler license for employees strictly dealing with horses and camp chores. The Board will inform her that this matter has been a topic of discussion for some time, that some alternative licensing classification of guides does seem to be in order, and that the Board will continue to work on this, but that it needs industry support.

**River Queen, Inc.:** MSC (Meiners--Farr) THAT THE BOARD ADDRESS A LETTER TO REG LANG, PRESIDENT OF RIVER QUEEN, INC., IN RESPONSE TO HIS LETTER OF OCTOBER 28, 1985, ASKING THAT HE SUBMIT A MORE COMPLETE PLAN OF OPERATION DETAILING HOW HIS PROPOSED RIVER BOAT BUSINESS IS TO BE OPERATED AND THE RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES PARTICIPANTS MAY ENGAGE IN. SUCH INFORMATION WOULD BE NECESSARY IN ORDER FOR THE BOARD TO MAKE A DECLARATORY JUDGMENT AS TO WHETHER THE PROPOSED OPERATIONS DO, IN FACT, FALL WITHIN THE PURVIEW OF THE OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES ACT. HE SHOULD ALSO BE ADVISED THAT HE MAY BE REQUIRED TO MEET COAST GUARD OR OTHER LICENSING REQUIREMENTS BEFORE HIS PROPOSED ENTERPRISE MAY BE OPENED.

**American Avalanche Institute, Inc.:** MSC (Meiners--Farr) THAT ROD NEWCOMB, PRESIDENT OF AMERICAN AVALANCHE INSTITUTE, INC., BE ADVISED THAT HE WOULD NOT BE REQUIRED TO LICENSE HIS INSTRUCTORS FOR HIS PROPOSED AVALANCHE SCHOOL TO BE HELD AT KETCHUM, IDAHO, FEBRUARY 21-23, 1986.

**Gary K. O'Malley:** The Board reviewed a letter dated October 28, 1985, from Mr. O'Malley regarding transportation of big game hunters on the Salmon River by outfitters licensed only for fishing and recreational power boating. The Board determined that at the present time there is not sufficient justification to propose a change in Rule 33, that the rule still is necessary to enhance management along river corridors, but that it will continue to monitor problems related thereto.

**James H. Riddle II:** The Board reviewed the guide license application of Mr. Riddle and his Fish and Game violation, following which MSC (Farr--Vaughn) THAT THIS LICENSE BE ISSUED ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS FOR THE 1985-1986 LICENSE YEAR. A cover letter will be sent indicating that the terms of probation are that he adhere to all state, local, and federal laws for the balance of the license year, and that he adhere to any restrictions imposed by the court.

**Bill White:** The Board reviewed the guide license application of Mr. White and his Fish and Game warning citation, following which MSC (Meiners--Farr) THAT THE LICENSE APPLICATION BE APPROVED AND THE LICENSE ISSUED WITHOUT PROBATION.

**Elmer E. Bardwell:** The Board reviewed the guide license application of Mr. Bardwell and his Fish and Game violation, following which (Vaughn--Meiners) THAT THE LICENSE APPLICATION BE APPROVED AND THE LICENSE ISSUED PROBATIONARY FOR THE BALANCE OF THE 1985-1986 LICENSE YEAR. A letter will be mailed outlining the terms of probation.

**Willard Woodby:** The Board reviewed the guide license application of Mr. Woodby, following which MSC (Meiners--Farr) THAT THE APPLICATION BE APPROVED AND THE LICENSE ISSUED AS REQUESTED. HE WILL BE A GUIDE FOR ANDRE MOLSEE.

**David Whitworth:** The Board reviewed the letter from Jerald D. Tower, District Forest Ranger, Pocatello Ranger District, Caribou National Forest, dated November 1, 1985, concerning Mr. Whitworth dba Hammerhead Outfitters. The Board also reviewed the call which had been received from the Forest Service and the call which had been received from Mr. Whitworth explaining why he did not have a special use permit. This file should be flagged so

that the Board verifies that this matter has been resolved before a 1986-1987 license is issued to Mr. Whitworth. Mr. Whitworth was advised by telephone conversation on November 5, 1985, that he should meet with the Forest Service and get this special use permit matter resolved prior to the expiration of his 1985-1986 outfitter license.

**Jon Goodman:** The Board reviewed the letter from John C. Twiss, Acting District Ranger, Moose Creek Ranger District, dated October 25, 1985, together with the use report of Mr. Goodman for spring bear hunting, and concluded that a letter be written to Mr. Goodman asking for an explanation of why he was guiding guests from May 1 through May 7 for spring bear hunting without an outfitter's license. The outfitter's license was not issued until May 10, 1985.

**Large Corporate Private Landowners:** MSC (Salter--Vaughn) AFTER REVIEWING THE RESPONSES FROM LARGE CORPORATE PRIVATE LANDOWNERS (SEE PAGE 10 OF THE AUGUST 7, 1985, MINUTES), THE BOARD WILL CONTINUE TO RELY ON FORMER RULE 18 (PROPOSED RULE 8.A.) RELATIVE TO THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN OUTFITTERS AND SUCH LANDOWNERS.

The Board recessed at 1730 hours and reconvened on Thursday, November 7, 1985, at 0830 hours.

**January Board Meeting:** The Board set the January meeting dates as January 15-17, 1986.

**Clinton Galbraith:** MSC (Salter--Meiners) THAT MR. GALBRAITH'S AREA OF OPERATION BE AMENDED, BY ADMINISTRATIVE AMENDMENT, TO READ AS NOTED IN ADDENDUM #1 OF THESE MINUTES.

**Philip A. Johnson:** The Board reviewed a letter from Mr. Johnson dated October 14, 1985, following which MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) THAT ANOTHER LETTER BE SENT TO MR. JOHNSON INDICATING THAT BEFORE A 1986-1987 LICENSE CAN BE ISSUED, THE BOARD MUST HAVE A COMPLETE OPERATING PLAN FOR HIS ENTIRE OPERATION...THE HUNTING OPERATION AS WELL AS THE RIVER OPERATION. SAID PLAN SHALL BE AS INDICATED IN THE BOARD'S LETTER OF SEPTEMBER 13, 1985, INCLUSIVE OF THE INGRESS AND EGRESS POINTS FROM THE RIVER, NUMBERS OF GUESTS SERVED, PERIOD OF OPERATION, CAMPSITES, AND OTHER MATTERS RELEVANT TO THE HUNTING OPERATION.

**Robert M. Sykes:** The Board reviewed its April 29, 1985, letter to Mr. Sykes of Pocatello. Mr. Sykes had requested fishing on Cascade Reservoir and Payette Lake. The Board had indicated in its April 29th letter that public information hearings would be held on the opening of these two and the following additional lakes for commercial activity: Oxbow Reservoir, Lucky Peak

Reservoir, Brownlee Reservoir, Hells Canyon Reservoir, and Arrowrock Reservoir. A hearing date was set as January 13, 1986, from 4:00 pm to 7:00 pm in Cascade and January 15, 1986, from 4:00 pm to 7:00 pm in Boise. Appropriate notices will be sent to Mr. Sykes and other interested parties concerning this matter.

**Steve Wieber:** MSC (Salter--Vaughn) THAT MR. WIEBER'S REQUEST FOR AN AMENDMENT TO HIS LICENSE TO INCLUDE DEER AND BEAR HUNTING ON THE SNAKE RIVER BREAKS AND THE SALMON RIVER BREAKS BE DENIED PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b)(5) AND BASED UPON THE RESPONSES RECEIVED FROM THE EXISTING OUTFITTERS IN THE AREA, THE FOREST SERVICE, THE BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT, AND THE FISH AND GAME DEPARTMENT, PROVIDED FURTHER THAT SHOULD A VACANCY FOR THIS ACTIVITY OCCUR IN THE AREA IN THE FUTURE, THAT MR. WIEBER BE GIVEN PRIME CONSIDERATION FOR THE ACTIVITY.

**Tim Craig:** MSC (Salter--Vaughn) THAT MR. CRAIG'S REQUEST TO BE LICENSED FOR DEER AND BEAR HUNTING ON THE SALMON RIVER BREAKS BE DENIED PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b)(4) AND (b)(5) AND BASED ON THE RESPONSES RECEIVED FROM THE EXISTING OUTFITTERS IN THE AREA, THE FOREST SERVICE, THE BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT, AND THE FISH AND GAME DEPARTMENT.

**John E. Anderson:** MSC (Meiners--Salter) THAT MR. ANDERSON'S APPLICATION FOR AN AMENDMENT TO HIS LICENSE TO ADD BEAR AND COUGAR HUNTING PER HIS LETTER DATED JULY 16, 1985, AND SUBSEQUENT RESEARCH AND RESPONSE FROM THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME AND THE FACT THAT THE AREA IS ALREADY LICENSED TO OTHER OUTFITTERS, BE DENIED.

**John Patterson/David Bream/S & S Outfitters:** The Board reviewed the new lease agreement between Messrs. Patterson and Bream, following which (Farr--Vaughn) THAT THE LEASE AGREEMENT BE ACCEPTED AND THAT THE PARTIES BE SO NOTIFIED.

**Ernest Duckworth:** The Board reviewed the Duckworth situation with its attorney. The attorney asked for an additional thirty (30) days in which to research the legal documents submitted by Mr. Duckworth so a decision on his request will be postponed until the December meeting.

**Hershel Coulter Area:** The Board again reviewed the disposition of the area formerly licensed to Mr. Coulter and the recommendations of the U.S. Forest Service and Idaho Department of Fish and Game. MSC (Farr--Meiners) THAT THE BOARD WRITE THE BORDERING EXISTING OUTFITTERS OF THE DEER AND ELK HUNTING PORTION OF THE COULTER AREA (ONLY THOSE BORDERING THE AREAS THAT WERE RECOMMENDED TO BE RELICENSED BY THE FOREST SERVICE AND THE FISH AND GAME) AND ASK FOR AN OPERATING PLAN AS TO HOW THEY WOULD UTILIZE SAID ADJOINING

AREA. FURTHER, THAT THE BOARD NOT CONSIDER ANY NEW APPLICANTS BECAUSE THE AREAS RECOMMENDED FOR RELICENSING ARE NOT VIABLE AS NEW OUTFITTER AREAS. THIS MEANS THAT FOR THE ELK AND DEER HUNTING PART OF COULTER'S AREA LYING ADJACENT TO EPLEY'S AREA, LETTERS WILL BE SENT TO TED EPLEY, MACKAY BAR, JAMES THRASH, AND JIM POWELL. ON THE NORTHERN WILD PART OF COULTER'S AREA FOR ELK, DEER, AND COUGAR, LETTERS WILL BE SENT TO SHEPP RANCH AND HARVEY WHITTEN ONLY. THERE WILL BE NO BEAR HUNTING AREA RELICENSED. THE BEAR HUNTING IS ALREADY LICENSED TO EPLEY AND DEL DAVIS. THESE LETTERS WILL REQUEST AN OPERATING PLAN TO INCORPORATE THE FORMER COULTER AREAS INTO THE EXISTING LICENSEE'S AREAS OF OPERATION. THE ULTIMATE RELICENSING OF MR. COULTER'S AREA WILL NOT TAKE PLACE UNTIL AFTER THE BOARD HAS RECEIVED APPROPRIATE NOTICE FROM THE COURT THAT HIS CURRENT APPEAL HAS BEEN DENIED.

**R. W. Laughlin:** The Board reviewed a letter from Mr. Laughlin filing application for a part-time enforcement officer position. The Board directed the Enforcement Coordinator to write Mr. Loughlin and tell him that at the present time the Board's enforcement team is fully staffed.

**Robert M. Smith/Bob Dennis:** The Board again reviewed the Smith/Dennis situation and concluded that as no operating plan has been received from either party and no response has yet been received to the Board's letter of September 13, 1985, that these matters be returned to the inactive file and that no further action be taken by the Board until the parties respond to its requests.

The Board recessed at 1735 hours and reconvened at 0830 hours on Friday, November 8, 1985.

**Don Wilson:** The Board reviewed a complaint dated November 4, 1985, against Mr. Wilson, Coolwater Ranch Outfitters, and determined that an attempt would be made to contact the Georgia hunter who was in hunting at the same time as the complainant and would request Mr. Wilson to appear before the Board to discuss this complaint at the December meeting. It would also try to identify the date on which Wilson fired this Tuck or Tom Russell.

**Mike Bishop:** The Board reviewed the complaint against Mr. Bishop, M & M Outfitters, and determined that an investigator would be sent to interview Tim Craig, Don Wilson, and the Jones' and perhaps Mike Bishop, and that Mr. Bishop would be requested to appear before the Board to answer to this complaint in December.

**Leo Crane/Clearwater Outfitters:** The Board reviewed the complaint letter against Clearwater Outfitters, Leo Crane, with reference to his guide school and determined that both the complainant and Mr. Crane be asked to appear before the Board at the December meeting.

**Mackay Bar:** The Board reviewed the letter of October 28, 1985, from Mackay Bar concerning the complaint against his operation by a guide school and determined to write Ken Olson a letter thanking him for taking care of this problem and hoping that it doesn't recur in the future.

**Northwest River Expeditions:** The Board reviewed the letter from Henrietta Nelson of Boulder, Colorado, and her complaint against Northwest River Expeditions. It was determined that the Chairman write her and request additional details and indicate to her that the Board is the licensing agency responsible for outfitting in Idaho.

**Ken Smith/62 Ridge Outfitters:** MSC (Farr--Vaughn) THAT THE BOARD WRITE TO THE COMPLAINANT AGAINST 62 RIDGE OUTFITTERS CONCERNING THE INCIDENT ON MEEKER RIDGE AND TELL HIM THE BOARD HAS INVESTIGATED THIS AS FAR AS POSSIBLE AND, DUE TO CONFLICTING INFORMATION AND LACK OF EVIDENCE, THAT THE BOARD FEELS NO FURTHER ACTION CAN BE TAKEN, THAT THE BOARD DOES NOT CONDONE THIS TYPE OF ACTION FROM GUIDES OR OUTFITTERS, AND THAT THE BOARD HOPES THIS TYPE OF INCIDENT WILL NOT RECUR. FURTHER, THAT THE BOARD WRITE KEN SMITH A LETTER TELLING HIM IT WILL TAKE NO FURTHER ACTION ON THIS INCIDENT ALTHOUGH IT DOES NOT CONDONE CONFLICTS WITH THE GENERAL PUBLIC AND HOPES THAT HE CAN AVOID THIS TYPE OF SITUATION IN THE FUTURE.

**Don Wilson:** MSC (Vaughn--Farr) THAT RELATIVE TO LAWRENCE CLARK'S COMPLAINT AGAINST MR. WILSON, A LETTER BE WRITTEN TO MR. CLARK INDICATING THAT AFTER EXTENSIVE INVESTIGATION WITH MR. WILSON AND THE TWO FORESTS INVOLVED, THERE SEEMS TO HAVE BEEN NO VIOLATION COMMITTED THAT CAN BE PENALIZED AND THAT THE BOARD HOPES SUCH INCIDENTS WILL NOT RECUR. COPIES OF THIS LETTER SHOULD BE SENT TO THE RESPECTIVE FOREST SERVICE AGENCIES.

**Richard Grunch:** The Board again reviewed the complaint against Mr. Grunch and concluded that a letter be sent to him requesting his explanation of the incidents involved on Sunday, September 29, 1985, and the horses tied under the trees. Also, that Mr. Grunch be informed that investigators were in his camps, that there appeared to be some attempt to improve the camp situation but that the Board still questions the complaint of rubbish around the camps and the pile of tack and equipment that was apparently left out through the winter. The Board will request some explanation of this and a report on his operation in the

fall of 1985, location of camps, number of guests, and so on. This is a follow-up to the probationary conditions under which he is operating this year. The Board will not contact the complainants until after it hears from Mr. Grunch.

**Tim Craig/Larry Walker:** The Board reviewed an October 8, 1985, letter from the license section of Fish and Game concerning licenses and tags for Keith Allen, Ray King, and Brent Mallott and determined that a letter would be sent to Larry Walker and Tim Craig asking if they had any information to shed on this situation.

At 1100 hours the Board recessed and reconvened at the Fish and Game headquarters in Boise to meet with the Regional Supervisors, the Bureau Chiefs, and management personnel of the Idaho Department of Fish and Game, following which the Board had lunch and returned to the Boardroom, reconvening at 1330 hours.

**Whitewater River Tours/Steve Guinn:** The Board reviewed a letter of complaint against Whitewater River Tours and determined to write Mr. Guinn asking him what he was doing to resolve this matter, indicating that we had received the letter of complaint, and asking for a response. Also, the Board will write Ken Polsen indicating that we had written the outfitter and that perhaps this would bring a resolution to his claim.

**Jeff Bitton:** The Board again reviewed the complaint against Mr. Bitton alleging the poor condition of saddle stock and reviewed the report of the Enforcement Coordinator on the enforcement check which was done to try to determine the condition of these animals. It was concluded that Ms. Martin be contacted and told that the Board was unable to get an investigator in to check the condition of these animals before the operation had closed for the season, that a check will be made next summer during the season of operation to determine the condition of these animals, but in the meantime there is very little the Board can do.

**Indian Creek Guest Ranch, Inc./Cliff Cummings:** The Board reviewed the licensed areas of Indian Creek Guest Ranch, Inc. and Cliff Cummings, both of North Fork, and noted that there is an overlapping area between these two outfitters. It was determined that the Board would write these outfitters and indicate that the overlap had been discovered, that the areas couldn't be transferred until the overlap is eliminated, and ask the outfitters for a suggested solution to eliminate the overlap.

**Kimberland Meadows:** The Board reviewed the request of Ralph Bass, Managing Agent of Kimberland Meadows, to add snowmobiling and cross-country skiing to their existing area and license. Following such review, MSC (Salter--Farr) THAT THE APPLICATION BE APPROVED, PROVIDED THAT THE SCREENING COMMITTEE FINDS THE GUIDES QUALIFIED TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITIES.

**David Markham:** The Board reviewed the request of Mr. Markham to expand the area within which he may conduct cross-country skiing to include the Hot Springs Ranch area. The Board approved that request. The Board also reviewed his requested amendment for authorization to guide technical mountaineering/rock climbing when employed by Boise State University. The Board approves that request once the screening committee is satisfied that Mr. Markham is qualified.

**Larry Jarrett/Dalbert Allmon/Ron Sherer:** MSC (Vaughn--Meiners) THAT THE BOARD DENY MR. JARRETT'S REQUEST FOR AN EXTENSION OF HIS AREA INTO THE RON SHERER AREA. FURTHER, THAT MR. JARRETT BE TAKEN OUT OF THE DALBERT ALLMON AREA FOR COUGAR HUNTING AND THAT RON SHERER BE TAKEN OUT OF THE STACKED AREA WITH LARRY JARRETT SOUTH OF THE MIDDLE FORK, THE OLD SMITH AREA. THE PARTIES WILL BE NOTIFIED THAT THIS IS THE BOARD'S THINKING FOR THE NEXT LICENSE YEAR, 1986-1987, AND THAT IF THE PARTIES WISH TO DISCUSS THIS PROPOSED CHANGE FOR REALIGNMENT OF BOUNDARIES, A MEETING TIME WILL BE SET UP FOR THE JANUARY MEETING SO THEY MIGHT MEET WITH THE BOARD AND MAKE THEIR FEELINGS KNOWN.



AREA FOR TRAILRIDES AND WAGON RIDES

Trailrides and wagon rides shall be conducted in the following areas:

- (1) All of Harriman State Park, Idaho, and
- (2) Targhee National Forest lands described as - Beginning at the Henry's Fork of the Snake River and the approximate northeast boundary of Harriman State Park (SW 1/4 Sec. 17, T12N, R43E); thence westerly and southerly along the boundary of Harriman State Park to West Thurmon Creek; thence northwesterly up Thurmon Creek to Thurmon Ridge (SW 1/4 Sec. 16, T12N, R42E); thence northeasterly along Thurmon Ridge to Island Park Reservoir (Sec. 29, T13N, R43E); thence easterly along the shoreline of Island Park Reservoir to the Henry's Fork of the Snake River at Island Park Dam; thence southerly along the Henry's Fork to the point of beginning.
