IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD

February 3-7, 1986
Boardroom - Boise, Idaho

A regular meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Board convened at 0830 hours on Monday, February 3, 1986, with all members in attendance except Scott Farr.

Board Minutes: MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) THAT THE JANUARY BOARD MINUTES BE APPROVED AS CORRECTED.

Audit Report: The Board reviewed the draft of the confidential audit report received from the Office of the Legislative Auditor, following which MSC (Meiners--Salter) THAT THE REPORT BE ACCEPTED SUBJECT TO CORRECTION OF THE ERRORS NOTED REGARDING LICENSE FEES.

Scott Farr arrived at 1145 hours. The Board recessed for lunch at 1200 hours and reconvened at 1315 hours.

Al Lewis: The Board acknowledged receipt of a Certificate of Appreciation from the U.S. Forest Service awarded to Mr. Lewis for his investigative work on the Pat Kelley case. Mr. Lewis is to be commended for his work on this case.

Rules Package: The Board again reviewed the Rules Package and determined that the definition of "membership" should be eliminated. The definition of "nonuse" will be replaced with the definition of "nonuse" used in the first sentence of Rule 22.a. which will read as follows: "Nonuse shall mean an outfitter's failure to use at least 40% of the use capability of the area for each activity for any two of the three preceding years (See Rule 22.a.)."

Rule 9 has been modified to read as follows: "An outfitter license shall not be issued to any individual, group, corporation, or club which limits its services to a membership or does not offer services to the general public. A group, corporation, or club formed in a manner so as to solicit participation from the general public and to provide services on a guided and/or paid basis beyond the sharing of expenses shall be required to utilize the services of a licensed outfitter or shall be required to comply with the provisions of the Outfitters and Guides Act (Idaho Code, Title 36, Chapter 21)."

Rule 16.c.vii. the wording is changed to read: "A list of the basic equipment, facilities, and livestock necessary to conduct the proposed outfitter activity."

Rule 57 - Salmon River, Iron Creek to North Fork, is modified to reflect that there will be two (2) designated seasons of activity. During the "winter" season, October 1 to April 30, the limits will be 2 power boat outfitters and 8 float boat outfitters with each power boat outfitter being allowed to use only 1 power boat at any one time and each float boater being allowed to use a maximum of 3 boats at any one time.

Rule 57 - Salmon River, Vinegar Creek to Hammer Creek, is modified to read: "Each outfitter may use at any one time a maximum of 3 boats for fishing. From Spring Bar to Hammer Creek closed to all commercial boating from October 1 to March 31 EXCEPT 3 designated outfitters may utilize float boats to fish from the Riggins city boat dock to Hammer Creek during the period from October 1 to March 31."

The Board recessed at 1720 hours and reconvened at 0830 hours on Tuesday, February 4, 1986, with all members in attendance.

George Duncan/Ray Cox: MSC (Salter--Vaughn) THAT THE CHAIRMAN BE REQUESTED TO WRITE A LETTER TO MESSRS. DUNCAN AND COX POINTING OUT THAT THE BOARD IS INVESTIGATING THE OVERLAP BETWEEN THE TWO OUTFITTERS FOR COUGAR HUNTING, AND ASKING FOR THEIR PAST AND CURRENT USAGE OF THIS AREA SO THAT THE BOARD CAN MAKE A DETERMINATION AS TO WHETHER OR NOT THE OVERLAP CAN BE ELIMINATED.

David Powers/George Duncan: The Board reviewed the request from Mr. Powers to allow Mr. Duncan to guide for him and to be allowed to guide for Mr. Duncan, following which MSC (Farr--Meiners) THAT PENDING RECEIPT OF A WRITTEN REQUEST FROM GEORGE DUNCAN TO EMPLOY DAVID POWERS, PERMISSION BE GRANTED AND AMENDMENTS BE ISSUED FOR THEIR RESPECTIVE LICENSES.

Mike Stockton: The Board reviewed Mr. Stockton's request for bear hunting and the letter of response from Jerry Thiessen of the Idaho Department of Fish and Game dated January 16, 1986, following which MSC (Salter--Meiners) THAT THIS REQUEST BE DENIED BASED ON THE PROVISIONS OF IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b). SPECIFICALLY, THE RECOMMENDATION FROM THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME AND THEIR REQUEST THAT THE BOARD NOT LICENSE ANY ADDITIONAL BLACK BEAR HUNTERS IN UNITS 8A AND 10 FOR THE NEXT TWO (2) YEARS.

Proposed Rules: At 1015 hours the Board met with Dave Wolf of the Salmon area BLM. The BLM position with regard to the proposed rules is essentially as reflected in the letter to the Board dated January 6, 1986. Mr. Wolf expressed agreement with the Board's numbers in the proposed rules package regarding the two sections of the Salmon River, Challis to Iron Creek and Iron Creek to North Fork.

David Powers: The Board reviewed the letter from Mr. Powers dated January 24, 1986, requesting an amendment to his license to allow black bear hunting, following which MSC (Meiners--Salter) THAT THIS REQUEST BE DENIED PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b). THE DENIAL IS BASED ON A RECOMMENDATION FROM THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME RELATIVE TO A SIMILAR REQUEST FROM MIKE STOCKTON AND ON A TELEPHONE CONVERSATION BETWEEN BOB SALTER AND JERRY THIESSEN REGARDING THE SPECIFIC REQUEST OF DAVID POWERS IN UNIT 10A.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1200 hours and reconvened at 1315 hours.

MSC (Vaughn--Farr) THAT PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE SECTION 67-2345(b), THE BOARD GO INTO EXECUTIVE SESSION TO DISCUSS MATTERS OF PERSONNEL AND A MEMORANDUM FROM THE ADMINISTRATIVE SECRETARY. Votes were cast as follows: Farr..."Aye"; Foster..."Aye"; Meiners..."Aye"; Salter..."Aye"; and Vaughn..."Aye". The Executive Session began at 1315 hours and ended at 1500 hours with no formal action being taken during the session.

Proposed Rules: The Board reconsidered the wording of certain proposed rules based on recent telephone calls and determined that Rule 5.c. should be modified to read as follows: "An outfitter's qualifications to guide must be reviewed by the Board and, if approved, he will be issued both an outfitter and a guide license at no additional fee."

In Rule 57, the Salmon River-Iron Creek to North Fork section should be reworded as follows: "(a) License period from May 1 to September 30. Each outfitter may use at any one time a maximum of three (3) boats for fishing and five (5) boats for other boating activities. The Board may approve adjustments of these boat limitations to accommodate canoeing and/or kayaking activities that are part of an outfitter's operating plan. [Power-6; Float-16] (b) License period from October 1 to April 30. Each power boat outfitter may use at any one time a maximum of one (1) boat and each float boat outfitter may use at any one time a maximum of three (3) boats. [Power-2; Float 8]"

Don Wilson: The Board reviewed Mr. Wilson's letter of January 8, 1986, requesting a modification in his area description. Following research and a review of the maps, MSC (Salter--Farr) THAT THE BOARD WRITE TO THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME AND THE U.S. FOREST SERVICE CONCERNING MR. WILSON'S REQUEST TO BE LICENSED FOR THE FOGG MOUNTAIN/THREE LINKS AREA INDICATING THAT THE BOARD WILL MAKE A FULL ATTEMPT AT ITS MARCH MEETING TO MAKE A FINAL DECISION ON THIS REQUEST. DEPENDING UPON THE RESULTS OF RECOMMENDATIONS FROM THE FOREST SERVICE AND FISH AND GAME, THE BOARD MAY THEN CONTACT AFFECTED OUTFITTERS CONCERNING A REALIGNMENT OF BOUNDARIES TO INCORPORATE MR. WILSON'S PROPOSAL.

Jon C. Goodman: MSC (Meiners--Salter) IN REGARD TO MR. GOODMAN'S PERMIT, THE FOREST SERVICE'S TERMINATION OF SAME, AND THE PERFORMANCE EVALUATION INCLUDED AS A PART OF A LETTER FROM JOHN TWISS, ACTING DISTRICT RANGER ON THE MOOSE CREEK RANGER DISTRICT, THAT THE BOARD ADDRESS A LETTER TO MR. TWISS INDICATING THAT IT WAS AWARE OF AND HAD INVESTIGATED THE CIRCUMSTANCES SURROUNDING THE ISSUANCE OF MR. GOODMAN'S LICENSE AND HAD CONCLUDED THAT THEY WERE OF SUFFICIENT CONSIDERATION TO MITIGATE HIS DELAY IN OBTAINING THE LICENSE IN A TIMELY MANNER. ALSO, IN RELATION TO THE RECENTLY SIGNED MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH THE FOREST SERVICE AND MORE RECENTLY THE AGREEMENT ON SUBSEQUENT OPERATING PROCEDURES TO IMPLEMENT THE MOU, THAT THE BOARD REQUEST MR. TWISS TO RECONSIDER HIS RATING OF MR. GOODMAN'S OPERATION FOLLOWING SAID PROCEDURES.

Al Latch: The Board reviewed Mr. Latch's request to be licensed for additional areas for cougar hunting. It also reviewed Forest Service letters regarding same. MSC (Meiners--Farr) THAT THE BOARD WRITE A LETTER TO THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME REQUESTING INPUT ON THE AREA REQUESTED BY MR. LATCH THAT IS NOT CURRENTLY LICENSED TO ANOTHER OUTFITTER, I.E.; THAT AREA LYING JUST WEST OF THE ELK CITY TOWNSHIP. ALSO, THAT A LETTER OF INQUIRY BE WRITTEN TO THE FOREST SERVICE INDICATING THAT THE BOARD IS CONDUCTING RESEARCH ON MR. LATCH'S REQUEST AND INDICATING THAT THE AREA CURRENTLY LICENSED TO MR. JARRETT WOULD NOT BE CONSIDERED LICENSEABLE TO MR. LATCH AS THE BOARD HAS A POLICY AGAINST THE STACKING OF CONSUMPTIVE ACTIVITIES.

Ken Smith: The Board reviewed the outfitter evaluation of Mr. Smith dated January 23, 1986, as received from John Twiss and determined that a letter be addressed to Mr. Twiss expressing two major concerns: (1) the form used for this rating purpose had not been approved for use; (2) the form used indicates that before an unfavorable rating is given, that the Board would be consulted and allowed to register its concerns. For these reasons, the Board feels this action is in violation of the intent if not the actual content of the recently signed MOU.

Ben Grammar/Middlefork Ranch, Inc.: The Board reviewed the letter of January 29, 1986, from Mr. Grammar, following which MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) THAT THE REQUEST FOR ADDITIONAL AREA BE DENIED PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109 AND 36-2113(a)(13). SPECIFICALLY, THE DENIAL IS BASED ON THE FAILURE OF MIDDLEFORK RANCH, INC. TO SERVE THE PUBLIC WITH THE AREA CURRENTLY LICENSED.

Gerald Kooyers/Ken Jacks/Peter Grubb: MSC (Meiners--Farr) THAT MESSRS. KOOYERS, JACKS, AND GRUBB BE NOTIFIED THAT THE PENDING TRANSFER AND SALE OF BUSINESS FROM MR. KOOYERS TO MESSRS. JACKS AND GRUBB IS HELD IN ABEYANCE FOLLOWING RECEIPT OF INFORMATION FROM MYRNA BEAMER REGARDING A PRIOR SALE CONTRACT WHICH APPEARS TO NULLIFY THE ABILITY OF MR. KOOYERS TO GRANT A CLEAR TITLE AND TRANSFER OF THIS BUSINESS AND THAT UNTIL SUCH TIME AS THIS IS CLARIFIED AND RESOLVED BETWEEN THE PARTIES INVOLVED, NO FURTHER ACTION WILL BE TAKEN ON THE TRANSFER OF THIS BUSINESS. A COPY OF THIS LETTER SHOULD ALSO BE SENT TO MYRNA BEAMER.

Robin Brown: MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) THAT THE AREA DESCRIPTION WRITTEN TO ACCOMMODATE MR. BROWN'S DOG SLEDDING ACTIVITIES IN THE SUN VALLEY AREA BE APPROVED. (See Addendum 1)

April Board Meeting: The Board set the April meeting dates as April 7-11, 1986.

Forest Service Meeting: The Board determined to postpone the proposed meeting on February 12, 1986, and to reschedule same for March 4, 1986, at 9:00 a.m.

Mike Daly: The Board reviewed Mr. Daly's letter of January 10, 1986, regarding the requested amendment for backpacking in order to conduct a survival school. MSC (Vaughn--Farr) THAT THE REQUESTED AMENDMENT BE GRANTED FOR THE CONDUCT OF THE COURSE AS OUTLINED IN MATERIALS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD IN CONNECTION WITH MR. DALY'S REQUEST. FURTHER, THAT THE KEY INSTRUCTORS INVOLVED IN THIS PROGRAM MUST BE LICENSED AS GUIDES.

William Joseph Fisk: The Board reviewed Mr. Fisk's guide license application presumably for the 1985-1986 license year, following which MSC (Farr--Meiners) THAT THE LICENSE APPLICATION BE APPROVED AND THE LICENSE ISSUED.

Richard L. Norris/Jon Goodman: The Board reviewed Mr. Norris' letter of January 23, 1986, requesting an amendment to his license to be allowed to conduct spring bear hunts in an area presently licensed to Mr. Jon Goodman. MSC (Meiners--Farr) THAT MR. NORRIS' REQUEST BE DENIED PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b)(4) AND (b)(5). SPECIFICALLY, ON THE GROUNDS THAT THE AREA AND ACTIVITY ARE CURRENTLY LICENSED TO ANOTHER ACTIVE OUTFITTER AND THAT THE BOARD HAS AN ADOPTED POLICY AGAINST THE STACKING OF CONSUMPTIVE HUNTING ACTIVITIES. A LETTER SHOULD ALSO BE SENT TO MR. GOODMAN INDICATING THAT WITH THE ADOPTION OF NONUSE RULES, THE BOARD WILL BE RE-EVALUATING HIS USE OF THE AREA FOR SPRING BEAR HUNTING. A COPY OF THIS LETTER WILL BE SENT TO MR. NORRIS.

Dale Robson: The Board reviewed Mr. Robson's request for an amendment to add snowmobiling to his license. The Board also reviewed a telephone call this date from Keith Birch, Acting District Ranger of the Driggs District-Targhee National Forest. Mr. Birch's concerns were: (1) potential sociological conflict with Teton Mountain Touring, and (2) potential conflict with Fish and Game winter range. MSC (Meiners--Farr) THAT THE REQUEST BE SUBMITTED FOR COMMENT TO THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME WITH PARTICULAR CONCERN FOR THE GAME WINTER RANGE AND THAT A LETTER BE SENT TO TETON MOUNTAIN TOURING REQUESTING THEIR INPUT AND COMMENTS ON POTENTIAL CONFLICT WITH THEIR OPERATION.

Don Simmons/Three Rivers Ranch: The Board reviewed the letter from Mr. Simmons dated January 16, 1986, regarding the two changes in his license situation, following which MSC (Farr--Vaughn; Foster abstained) THAT THE LIMITATIONS OF 12 FISHERMEN PER WEEK AND ONLY WEEKDAY FISHING ACTIVITY BE REMOVED FROM THE LICENSE OF THREE RIVERS RANCH FOR WALK AND WADE FISHING ON BUFFALO RIVER AND THE HENRY'S FORK OF THE SNAKE RIVER FROM HENRY'S LAKE OUTLET TO HATCHERY FORD. THIS ACTION IS BASED ON THE BOARD'S CONCLUSION THAT SUCH LIMITATIONS ARE OVERLY RESTRICTIVE AND THAT REMOVAL OF SAME WOULD NOT UNDULY STRESS THE RESOURCE NOR COMPOUND SOCIOLOGICAL PROBLEMS IN THESE AREAS. FURTHER, THAT FISHING ON HENRY'S LAKE AND ISLAND PARK RESERVOIR IS ON THE LICENSE OF THREE RIVERS RANCH AND IS NOTED IN THE WORDED AREA DESCRIPTION. THE USE OF A POWER BOAT(S) OR ANY OTHER BOAT DEVICE WITH ANY KIND OF PROPULSION IS AUTHORIZED WHEN AN OUTFITTER IS LICENSED FOR FISHING ON ANY LAKE OR RESERVOIR. ✓

Three Rivers Ranch, Inc./Fly Fishing Center International, Inc.: MSC (Meiners--Vaughn; Foster and Salter abstained) REGARDING THE REQUEST FOR TRANSFER OF BUSINESS BY AND BETWEEN THREE RIVERS RANCH, INC. AND FLY FISHING CENTER INTERNATIONAL, INC., NAMELY THE PURCHASE OF A BUSINESS NOW IN THE NAME OF FLY FISHING CENTER INTERNATIONAL, INC. ON THE SOUTH FORK OF THE SNAKE RIVER BY THREE RIVERS RANCH, INC., THAT THE BOARD REQUEST FROM THE PARTIES CONCERNED EVIDENCE OF SOME TANGIBLE OR INTANGIBLE PROPERTY THAT WOULD BE INVOLVED IN THE SUBJECT TRANSFER, SUCH AS MAILING LISTS, EQUIPMENT, ETC. FURTHER, THAT A LETTER BE WRITTEN TO MR. GODFREY ASKING FOR VERIFICATION OF HIS HAVING A BUSINESS ON THE SOUTH FORK OF THE SNAKE RIVER THAT IS AVAILABLE FOR TRANSFER. FURTHER, UPON RECEIPT OF A LIST OF TANGIBLE AND/OR INTANGIBLE ASSETS WHICH ARE BEING TRANSFERRED, THAT AN INSPECTION OF SUCH TANGIBLE ITEMS WOULD BE MADE TO VERIFY THAT SUCH EQUIPMENT EXISTS.

Richard L. Sourbrine: The Board reviewed the guide license application of Mr. Sourbrine and noted that it was undated, following which MSC (Farr--Vaughn) THAT THE APPLICATION BE APPROVED AND THE LICENSE BE ISSUED, BUT PRIOR TO ITS ISSUANCE THE CHAIRMAN IS TO MAKE TELEPHONE CONTACT WITH MR. SOURBRINE OR GERALD RICHIE AND DETERMINE WHICH YEAR THE APPLICATION IS FOR. IF IT IS FOR A 1986-1987 LICENSE YEAR, THE LICENSE WOULD HAVE TO BE HELD UNTIL MR. RICHIE IS LICENSED.

David L. Whitworth: The Board reviewed Mr. Whitworth's request to extend his area for additional hunting activities and also reviewed the Fish and Game letter dated January 24, 1986, regarding this request. MSC (Vaughn--Salter) THAT THE REQUEST BE DENIED PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b)(1), (b)(4), AND (b)(5), AND THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME. SPECIFICALLY, THE AREAS REQUESTED ALREADY HAVE A HIGH DENSITY OF HUNTERS, THE FISH AND GAME DEPARTMENT RECOMMENDS AGAINST THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH AN AMENDMENT, AND THERE IS NO DEMONSTRATED NEED FOR ADDITIONAL OUTFITTED ACTIVITY.

Greg Edson: The Board reviewed the request of Mr. Edson to amend his outfitter license to become the Managing Agent for Middle Fork Rapid Rapid Transit #1, following which MSC (Farr--Meiners) THAT THE APPLICATION BE APPROVED AS SUBMITTED.

The Board meeting recessed at 1800 hours and reconvened at 0830 hours on Wednesday, February 5, 1986, with all members in attendance.

Rules Package: The Board contacted the Chairman of the Senate Resources and Environment Committee, Senator Laird Noh, and Senator Beitelspacher by telephone regarding their proposed February 17, 1986, legislative hearing. On the basis of conversation between Bill Meiners and these individuals, MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) THAT AS THE SENATE HEARING PROPOSED FOR FEBRUARY 17, 1986, HAS BEEN CANCELLED AND THE SENATE RESOURCES COMMITTEE MEMBERS HAVE RECOMMENDED THAT THE BOARD GO AHEAD WITH THE ADOPTION OF THE RULES AT THIS MEETING, THAT THE BOARD ADOPT THE PROPOSED RULES AS CORRECTED AND AMENDED TO BE EFFECTIVE MARCH 1, 1986.

John Jenkins: The Board interviewed Mr. Jenkins who is submitting application to be licensed as the Managing Agent for Seven Investors, Inc. dba Idaho River Company. MSC (Farr--Salter) THAT THE APPLICATION BE APPROVED WHEN COMPLETED.

J. C. Merlini: The Board also interviewed Mr. Merlini who is making application to be licensed as a Managing Agent for Seven Investors, Inc. dba Idaho River Company. MSC (Farr--Meiners) THAT THIS APPLICATION BE APPROVED WHEN COMPLETED.

Tim Gardiner/Devil's Bedstead Ranch: MSC (Meiners--Farr)
REGARDING THE PROPOSAL TO ACCOMMODATE MR. GARDINER'S REQUEST TO TRANSFER THE BUSINESS BACK FROM TIM GARDINER, INC. TO DEVIL'S BEDSTEAD, THAT IN THE PROCESSING OF THIS REQUEST THE BOARD CONTACT THE DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME FOR THEIR INPUT REGARDING WHAT THEY FEEL THE HUNTING AND FISHING PRESSURE IS IN THE COPPER BASIN/WILDHORSE CREEK/KANE CREEK AREAS THAT ARE LICENSED TO THE DEVIL'S BEDSTEAD. THIS LETTER SHOULD INDICATE TO THE DEPARTMENT THAT THE BOARD IS PROPOSING TO ALLOW 25 HUNTERS OR 125 HUNTER DAYS AND ASK THEM FOR THEIR OPINION ABOUT WHETHER THE AREA CAN SUSTAIN THAT KIND OF USE. THEN WITH THIS INFORMATION, THE BOARD WILL ESTABLISH A LEVEL OF USE FOR THE DEVIL'S BEDSTEAD THAT WOULD BE APPROPRIATE AND ACCEPTABLE TO THE BOARD. FURTHER, COPIES OF THE BOARD'S CORRESPONDENCE THAT WERE SENT TO BRUCE COLLIER, ATTORNEY FOR R. J. LEWY, AND TO MR. SHIELDS OF DEVIL'S BEDSTEAD RANCH BE SENT TO TIM GARDINER'S ATTORNEY, ED LAWSON. ALSO A COPY OF THE LETTER THE BOARD SENT TO MR. COLLIER SHOULD BE SENT TO MR. SHIELDS. Also, the Board determined that an information hearing should be set up between Dan Rothoff and Mr. Maggard with regard to the proposed transfer of business between said parties. Additionally, the Board decided to change the wording of Rule 16.c.vii. to include the requirement for appropriate financial data. The new wording will be as follows: "A list of the basic equipment, facilities, and livestock, and proof of financial capability necessary to conduct the proposed outfitter activity and/or business." Steve Addington also took Harry Lewies file to prepare a Findings of Fact/Conclusions of Law/Order on the hearing of denial for Three Rivers Ranch.

Ernie & Ann Duckworth: The Board met with Mr. & Mrs. Duckworth and concluded that the Board's position as stated in its July 25, 1986, letter would still stand. If Mr. Duckworth can supply the Board with an employment contract or agreement with a qualified guide, the outfitter license could be issued to either Ernie's Hells Canyon Tours, Inc. or to A and E Investments with Ernie Duckworth as the Managing Agent, not qualified to guide, for the balance of the 1985-1986 license year. Beginning April 1, 1986, a license could be issued to A and E Investments or Ernie's Hells Canyon Tours, Inc. and Ernie Duckworth, Managing Agent, qualified to guide. Mr. Duckworth indicated that he would attempt to complete his outfitter application so the license could be issued for the 1985-1986 license year.

Reg Lang: With respect to the request of Mr. Lang for a determination on his riverboat proposal. MSC (Vaughn--Meiners) THAT THE OPERATION BE DETERMINED TO BE BEYOND THE PURVIEW OF THE OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES ACT AND THAT MR. LANG BE NOTIFIED THAT AN OUTFITTER'S LICENSE IS NOT REQUIRED FOR THIS ACTIVITY SO LONG AS HE OPERATES AS OUTLINED IN THE LETTER OF JANUARY 23, 1986.

J. E. Newell: With regard to the letter dated December 10, 1985, from Mr. Newell regarding a paddlewheel operation of a boat from Walter's Ferry to Homedale on the Snake River, MSC (Farr--Meiners) THAT THIS ACTIVITY ALSO BE FOUND TO BE BEYOND THE PURVIEW OF THE OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES ACT AND THE PARTY BE SO NOTIFIED PROVIDED THAT THE ACTIVITIES ARE CONDUCTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE LETTER REFERENCED ABOVE.

Susan Falk/Kootenai River Cruises, Ltd.: In reference to a call from Ms. Falk requesting permission to operate a stern-wheel paddle boat, the Board determined that it needed to have more information from her regarding the operation of this business before it could make a determination. She was asked by telephone to file such papers.

Reservoirs/Lakes in Northern Idaho: MSC (Meiners--Farr) THAT THE RECORD SHOW THAT CONTACT HAS BEEN MADE WITH THE COAST GUARD ON SEVERAL OCCASIONS RELATIVE TO THEIR JURISDICTION AND REGULATIONS IN NORTH IDAHO FOR CHARTER BOAT FISHING ACTIVITIES, AND IN CONVERSATION WITH AND RESPONSE FROM THE COAST GUARD AND THE COUNTY SHERIFFS INVOLVED, THAT THE BOARD WILL NOT REQUIRE COAST GUARD LICENSES FROM THOSE INDIVIDUALS WHOM THE BOARD LICENSES AS FISHING OUTFITTERS ON THE LAKES AND RESERVIORS OF NORTHERN IDAHO.

J. W. Edgar, Sr.: The Board reviewed the letter of November 25, 1985, from Mr. Edgar to the Idaho Department of Fish and Game expressing concern for hunting pressure around the Bernard Airstrip. It was concluded that the Board had only received an information copy and this matter did not fall under Board jurisdiction and, therefore, no reply was necessary.

The Board recessed at 1750 hours and reconvened at 0830 hours on Thursday, February 6, 1986, with all members in attendance.

Salmon River: The Board received a telephone call from Tom Levendofsky at Riggins Fish and Game expressing concern about access up the Salmon River primarily for nonresident hunters who want to have a transportation service provided by outfitters who are not licensed hunting outfitters out of Riggins. As this is a matter which has received some concern over a period of time by the Board, the Board determined to contact the Association and hunting outfitters with areas along the river corridors to see if a panel could be formed for discussion of this matter at the Outfitters and Guides Association meetings in April. The objective of the panel would be to expose the problem, discuss it, and propose solutions.

Payette River-Grandjean to Deadwood: The Board considered the selection of candidates for this river segment. Following the selection criteria outlined in the Board policy and proposed new Rule 28, Cascade Raft Company/Steve Jones, Managing Agent, was selected as the new licensee on that section of the river.

Payette River-Deadwood to Banks: The Board also made its determination on who the new outfitter would be on this river segment. The licensee selected was Michael W. Butler.

Payette River-South Fork: The new licensing sections on this river are Grandjean to Deadwood and Deadwood River to Banks. According to the rules, there will be five (5) licensees on each of those sections. In connection with the above-referenced selection process, the five (5) licensees for the South Fork section, Grandjean to Deadwood, are: Garden Valley Outfitters, Inc.; Steven J. Guinn; Payette River Company; Ellen Shaw; and Cascade Raft Company. The five (5) licensees for the South Fork section, Deadwood to Banks, are: Cascade Raft Company; Garden Valley Outfitters, Inc.; Steven J. Guinn; Payette River Company; and Michael W. Butler.

John Crowe: The Board interviewed Mr. & Mrs. Crowe concerning a request for a hunting area surrounding Campbell's Ferry Ranch to which Mr. Crowe was licensed in 1964-1965. The Board agreed to do research on this request provided that Mr. Crowe would furnish the Board with a detailed historical account and Forest Service map as well as a defined area description.

Bear Moratorium: At 1400 hours the Board met with Tom Reinecker and Neil Johnson from the Idaho Department of Fish and Game and spent some time discussing the current status of the five year black bear management plan. As the moratorium has now been lifted, applications will be considered on a case-by-case basis based on merit.

Partnerships: The Board reviewed the situation with regard to partnerships, following which MSC (Meiners--Farr) THAT A PARTNERSHIP SHOULD BE REQUIRED TO HAVE A BUSINESS NAME, IE: STEELDUST OUTFITTERS, AND ONE OR MORE OF THE PARTNERS MUST LICENSE AS A MANAGING AGENT AS REQUIRED BY THE CODE. Quarterly Financial Report/Lavon Loynd: The Board reviewed this report, following which MSC (Vaughn--Farr) THAT DUE TO SEVERE BUDGET CONSTRAINTS AND A NEED TO CURTAIL ENFORCEMENT EXPENDITURES, THAT THE ENFORCEMENT COORDINATOR BE DIRECTED TO REQUEST THE TERMINATION OF THE SERVICES OF LAVON LOYND.

Northwest River Expeditions, Inc./Ed Link, Managing Agent: The Board discussed the complaint filed by Henrietta Nelson against this operation and Mr. Link's response to the Board's letter of December 19, 1985, following which MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) THAT THE BOARD FEELS THAT MR. LINK'S RESPONSE TO MS. RUSSELL'S LETTER WITH REGARD TO THE OUTFITTER BEFORE THE 1986-1987 OUTFITTER AND/OR GUIDE LICENSES COULD BE ISSUED TO THE PARTIES INVOLVED. A COPY OF THE LETTERS TO THE RESPECTIVE PARTIES SHOULD GO TO THE ATTORNEY FOR THE COMPLAINANTS.

AREAS FOR DOG SLED RIDES

AREA 1 - BAKER CREEK: Beginning at the mouth of Baker Creek on Big Wood River (Sec. 9, T5N, R16E, BM); thence southwesterly in a one-mile corridor upstream along the bottom of the Baker Creek drainage a distance of some nine miles to the vicinity of the mouth of Bear Lake Creek (Sec. 10, T4N, R15E, BM) with an extension of use area to include the East Fork and South Fork of Baker Creek as bounded in an area comprised of Sections 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 33, 34, and 35, T5N, R16E, BM.

AREA 2 - ADAMS GULCH: Beginning at the mouth of Adams Gulch on Big Wood River (Sec. 1, T4N, R17E, BM); thence northwesterly up Adams Gulch in a corridor one-mile wide along the bottom of Adams Gulch a distance of some five miles.
