IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD

March 4-7, 1986
Boardroom - Boise, Idaho

A regular meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Board convened on Tuesday, March 4, 1986, at 0830 hours with all Board members in attendance.

Meeting with Forest Service: Forest Service documents were reviewed and at 0900 hours a meeting commenced with representatives of the Forest Service, namely Frank McElwain, Clem Pope, Earl Kimball, and Art Seamans. This meeting continued until 1530 hours at which time it was concluded that another meeting with the Forest Service would be called for April 7, 1986, at 1100 hours at the Holiday Inn. Notification of the precise location will be made by letter to the respective parties. At that time document modifications discussed at the meeting this date will be presented for discussion. The Board was also given a document from the Krassel Ranger District asking for a decision on the current status of the Forest Service research on the Quentin Selby area and the Kim Horrocks area. An attempt will be made to reach a decision later this week on that issue and to notify the Forest Service by letter. It was also determined at this meeting to scrap, for the present, the joint efforts to draft an operating plan. Additionally, the Board discussed with the Forest Service an application for an outfitter operation for fishing, trailrides, and bird hunting in the Howard Peak and Rapid River drainage areas. It was determined to wait until the April 7th meeting and the approval of the modified procedure for dealing with new outfitter applications before further research would be conducted on this request.

Patricia Davis: At 1600 hours the Board met with Ms. Davis, General Typist, and her counsel from the local AFL-CIO Warren Lundquist for a grievance hearing. Mr. Lundquist requested that the hearing be continued before an impartial panel of three (3) in order that the matters and issues may be considered in an impartial manner. The Board took this request under advisement.

Stanley P. Meholchick: The Board reviewed a Fish and Game citation issued to Mr. Meholchick on July 22, 1979, following which MSC (Meiners--Farr) THAT NO FURTHER ACTION BE TAKEN AGAINST MR. MEHOLCHICK FOR THIS CITATION.

Howard W. Pierce: The Board reviewed an old Fish and Game citation issued to Mr. Pierce on March 6, 1983, for fishing without a valid license. MSC (Farr--Vaughn) ON THE BASIS OF THE FACT THAT THIS CITATION WAS DISCUSSED WITH MR. PIERCE WHEN HE WAS INTERVIEWED BY THE BOARD FOR HIS INITIAL OUTFITTER LICENSE AND

THAT THE BOARD TOOK NO ACTION AT THAT TIME AGAINST THE LICENSE,
THAT THE BOARD TAKE NO ACTION AT THIS TIME AGAINST MR. PIERCE FOR
THIS CITATION.

John H. Stover: The Board reviewed the Fish and Game citation issued to Mr. Stover on October 26, 1983. This citation had been discussed with Mr. Stover at the time it was issued and the matter was fully resolved at that time. Therefore, no further action will be taken on the citation.

Victor Frederickson: The Board reviewed a copy of the May 26, 1985, Fish and Game citation issued to Mr. Frederickson and noted the Board action on April 19, 1985. This citation had been the subject of the probationary license issued to Mr. Frederickson for the 1985-1986 license year. Following this review, MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) AS THERE IS NO ADDITIONAL ADVERSE INFORMATION ON FILE AGAINST MR. FREDERICKSON FOR THE 1985-1986 LICENSE YEAR, THAT IF AND WHEN HE APPLIES FOR A 1986-1987 LICENSE, THAT LICENSE BE ISSUED ON A NON-PROBATIONARY BASIS PROVIDED THAT NO ADDITIONAL ADVERSE INFORMATION COMES IN IN THE MEANTIME.

Fred F. Ehlert: The Board reviewed the Fish and Game citation issued July 26, 1980, to Mr. Ehlert of the Alpenhaus Motel and Fly Shop. MSC (Vaughn--Meiners) THAT THE BOARD TAKE NO FURTHER ACTION AGAINST MR. EHLERT AS HE WAS FINED FORTY DOLLARS (\$40.00) BY THE COURT.

Dan A. McFarland: The Board reviewed the Fish and Game citation issued October 22, 1979, against Mr. McFarland, following which MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) THAT AS THIS CITATION WAS FIVE (5) YEARS OLD WHEN MR. McFARLAND INITIALLY APPLIED AND AS MR. McFARLAND HAD HONESTLY REPORTED NO CITATIONS WITHIN THE PAST FIVE (5) YEARS, THAT THE BOARD TAKE NO FURTHER ACTION AGAINST THE LICENSEE AT THIS TIME.

The Board recessed at 1730 hours and reconvened on Wednesday, March 5, 1986, at 0830 hours with all Board members in attendance.

Dan Rotthoff/Garden Valley Outfitters: At 0900 hours the Board met with Garn Christiansen, Earl and Suzie Maggard, and their attorney. Also present during this meeting was the Board's attorney, Steve Addington. Immediately following this meeting, the Board met with Mr. Rotthoff and his attorney. The subject of this series of meetings was a complaint against Mr. Rotthoff.

Roger and Margaret Williams/Buffalo Hump Nordic Center: At 1315 hours the Board met with Mr. & Mrs. Williams regarding an outfitter application to conduct cross-country ski operations in the Gospel Hump Wilderness area. MSC (Salter--Vaughn) THAT THE APPLICATION BE APPROVED AND THE LICENSE ISSUED UPON COMPLETION OF THE APPLICATION PROCESS.

Harlan Opdahl: The Board then met with Mr. Opdahl regarding a boundary adjustment between him and Gordon Frost. After reviewing the written description with Mr. Opdahl, he found that his concerns were due to a misreading of the area description; he is in perfect agreement with the revised area description as recorded in the letter to him and the matter is resolved.

Marty Matson: The Board met with Mr. Matson of West Yellowstone, Montana. Mr. Matson requested a decision from the Board as to whether he needs an outfitter or guide license in order to continue his snowmobiling activities there. The Board will render a declaratory ruling/judgment on this request when he puts the proposal on paper and submits it to the Board for consideration.

Larry Cross: MSC (Salter--Meiners) THAT THE BOARD CONTACT THE PROSECUTING ATTORNEY OF FRANKLIN COUNTY AND ACCEPT THE PLEA BARGAINING ARRANGEMENT WITH LARRY CROSS WHEREIN HE WOULD PLEAD GUILTY TO THE CHARGE OF OUTFITTING WITHOUT A LICENSE. THE BOARD WOULD AGREE TO ISSUE HIM A 1986-1987 OUTFITTER'S LICENSE ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS WITH THE PROBATIONARY PROVISION BEING THAT HE NOT BE CONVICTED OF ANY FISH AND GAME OR OTHER VIOLATIONS DURING THE LICENSE YEAR TO AVOID THE POSSIBILITY OF HIS LICENSE BEING REVOKED. A COPY OF THIS ACTION IS TO BE FORWARDED TO THE APPROPRIATE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER.

Ronald Vaughn: The Board reviewed the letter of February 21, 1986, from Mr. Groll, District Ranger in the Cobalt Ranger District of the Salmon National Forest. This letter concerns alleged recent approval from the Board authorizing Mr. Vaughn to take clients in the Waterfall Creek area. A letter of response will be sent back to Mr. Groll indicating that Waterfall Creek has been on Mr. Vaughn's license for some time and requesting information on whether Mr. Vaughn could obtain a permit for the area.

Jerry Hughes: The Board reviewed Mr. Hughes' letter of February 25, 1986, requesting a lead boatman license on the Owyhee River in Idaho. The Board reviewed the extenuating circumstances enumerated in Mr. Hughes' letter, following which MSC (Farr--Vaughn) THAT THE REQUEST BE GRANTED.

Kirk Bachman: MSC (Salter--Vaughn) IN ANSWER TO MR. BACHMAN'S REQUEST TO ADD CROSS-COUNTRY SKIING TO HIS OPERATIONS IN THE SAWTOOTH WILDERNESS, THAT HE BE REQUESTED TO SUBMIT A DETAILED PLAN OF OPERATION SHOWING THE EXACT AREAS IN WHICH HE PLANS TO CONDUCT THIS ACTIVITY. UPON RECEIPT OF THIS, THE BOARD WILL CONTACT THE OTHER OUTFITTERS IN THE AREA AND THE U.S. FOREST SERVICE TO GAIN THEIR INPUT ON THE REQUEST.

J. Chris Nelson: The Board reviewed Mr. Nelson's guide license application to guide for Randy Berry and noted that Mr. Nelson was on probation during the past license year. MSC (Meiners--Farr) THAT THE GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION BE APPROVED FOR THE 1986-1987 LICENSE YEAR ON A NON-PROBATIONARY BASIS AS THERE IS NO ADVERSE INFORMATION ON FILE WITH REGARD TO MR. NELSON.

Three Rivers Ranch/Fly Fishing International: MSC (Meiners--Vaughn; Foster abstained) WITH REGARD TO THE PROPOSED TRANSFER OF BUSINESS FROM FLY FISHING INTERNATIONAL TO THREE RIVERS RANCH, THAT THE BOARD AGAIN CONTACT THREE RIVERS RANCH AND ASK THAT THEY RESPOND TO THE BOARD'S LETTER OF FEBRUARY 13, 1986, REGARDING THE ACQUISITION OR PURCHASE OF TANGIBLE OR INTANGIBLE ASSETS AND THAT UNTIL SUCH TIME AS THE BOARD HAS THIS RESPONSE, NO FURTHER ACTION BE TAKEN.

Travis York: MSC (Salter--Farr) THAT THE CHAIRMAN WRITE MR. YORK AND EXPLAIN TO HIM THERE IS NO NEED TO REMOVE FOREST GROUSE HUNTING IN THE SUMMER MONTHS FROM HIS LICENSE DUE TO THE FACT THAT THERE IS NO SEASON OPEN. HOWEVER, THE DESCRIPTION WILL BE MODIFIED TO INDICATE THAT FOREST GROUSE HUNTING MAY ONLY OCCUR IN THE BIG GAME HUNTING AREA, NOT IN THE SUMMER ACTIVITY AREA. FURTHER, THAT HE BE ADVISED THAT THE BOARD WILL NOT PUT HIS GUIDE TRAINING SCHOOL ON HIS LICENSE BECAUSE GUIDE SCHOOLS ARE NOT A SEPARATE LICENSABLE CATEGORY AND ARE COVERED BY THE GENERAL BIG GAME HUNTING PROVISIONS OF AN OUTFITTER'S LICENSE.

Bogus Basin Outfitters: The Board reviewed the document from Thomas Ferguson, Managing Agent of Bogus Basin Outfitters, including the operating plan submitted February 27, 1986, and his request to expand their trailriding operations to include Seven-L lands along Bogus Basin Road. MSC (Vaughn--Farr) THAT THIS REQUEST BE GRANTED FOR THE AREAS INDICATED AND SUBMITTED ON THE U.S. QUAD SHEET AND AS APPARENTLY APPROVED BY THE SIGNATURE OF THE SEVEN-L RANCH MANAGER ON THE AMENDMENT FORM. [See Addendum 1]

Cecil Weddle/Gordon Stimmel: MSC (Meiners--Vaughn; Salter "no") THAT THE BOARD ADDRESS A LETTER TO BOTH REGIONS I AND IV, FRANK McELWAIN AND JIM DOLAN, REGARDING THE PROBATIONARY RATINGS THAT HAVE BEEN GIVEN BY THE FOREST SERVICE TO MESSRS. WEDDLE AND STIMMEL ASKING THAT THEY REVIEW THESE RATINGS RELATIVE TO THE

M.O.U. AND THE ONGOING NEGOTIATIONS IN DEVELOPMENT OF SUBSEQUENT OPERATING PROCEDURES BETWEEN THE FOREST SERVICE AND THE BOARD BEFORE FINAL ACTION IS TAKEN ON THESE INDIVIDUALS.

May Board Meeting: The Board set the May meeting dates as May 6-9, 1986, with no appointments to be established on May 6th which will be reserved for general Board business.

High Adventure River Tours/Randy McBride: MSC (Meiners--Farr) IN REVIEW OF THE ADVERTISEMENT THAT HAS APPEARED IN THE SUN VALLEY MAGAZINE WHERE IT DEPICTS HIGH ADVENTURE RIVER TOURS/RANDY McBRIDE, MANAGING AGENT, AS ADVERTISING INNER TUBE TRIPS DOWN THE MIDDLE FORK OF THE SALMON RIVER, THAT THE BOARD ADVISE MR. McBRIDE THAT SUCH DEVICES ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE CRAFT FOR THE CONDUCT OF COMMERCIAL OPERATIONS ON CLASSIFIED RIVERS IN IDAHO AND THAT HE BE ADVISED THAT HE SHOULD CEASE AND DESIST IN ADVERTISING SUCH TRIPS FORTHWITH.

The Board recessed at 1825 hours and reconvened on Thursday, March 6, 1986, at 0800 hours with all Board members present.

Mike Daly/Bugle Point Outfitters: The Board reviewed the complaint against Mr. Daly and concluded that Mr. Daly be required to appear before the Board at the April meeting and to bring with him the guides (Dennis L. Ekleberry and Michael L. Leiser) who were involved in the subject hunt. Furthermore, the Board will write a letter to the guides involved asking for their appraisal of the events of the hunt. In the letter to Mr. Daly it will be pointed out that perhaps he was confused about the party of hunters making the complaint and he should be prepared to address that issue when he comes before the Board.

Huckleberry Heaven/Andre Molsee: The Board reviewed the letter of complaint from Robert C. Orlando against Huckleberry Heaven and telephone conversations from Mike Stockton regarding same, following which MSC (Vaughn--Farr) THAT MR. MOLSEE BE REQUESTED TO APPEAR BEFORE THE BOARD TO ANSWER TO THE ALLEGATIONS OF THE COMPLAINTS AT THE APRIL MEETING.

Dan Rothoff/Earl Maggard: MSC (Salter--Vaughn) THAT IN THE MATTER OF MESSRS. ROTHOFF AND MAGGARD, ANY DECISIONS BE HELD IN ABEYANCE UNTIL THE BOARD HAS RECEIVED FURTHER REPORT FROM THE FOREST SERVICE ABOUT THEIR INVESTIGATION OF MR. ROTHOFF'S CONDUCT LAST YEAR AND ALSO UNTIL THE BOARD RECEIVES SOME IDEA OF THE COURSE OF POTENTIAL LITIGATION BETWEEN THE REALTY COMPANY AND/OR MR. MAGGARD AGAINST MR. ROTHOFF.

Ed McCallum/Chamberlain Basin Outfitters: The Board reviewed the complaint situation against Mr. McCallum and Chamberlain Basin Outfitters following which MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) THAT MR. McCALLUM BE REQUESTED TO APPEAR BEFORE THE BOARD AT ITS APRIL MEETING TO ANSWER TO THE COMPLAINT AND SHOULD BE ENCOURAGED TO BRING ANY CORRESPONDENCE THAT HE HAS WITH MR. ARNOLD OR THAT HE HAS RECEIVED FROM MR. ARNOLD SO THAT IT CAN BE EVALUATED BY THE BOARD AT THAT TIME.

Richard E. Grunch: The Board reviewed Mr. Grunch's complaint file and the Forest Service letter received February 7, 1986, from Gary L. Reynolds. The Board also noted that Mr. Grunch had not responded to its letter of January 29, 1986, following which MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) THAT A CERTIFIED LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO MR. GRUNCH INDICATING THAT HE MUST RESPOND TO THE BOARD'S LETTER OF JANUARY 29, 1986, BEFORE A 1986-1987 OUTFITTER LICENSE CAN BE ISSUED. ADDITIONALLY, THAT MR. GRUNCH BE REQUESTED TO PREPARE A DETAILED OPERATING PLAN FOR EACH AREA TO WHICH HE IS LICENSED TO SHOW PROSPECTIVE AND PAST UTILIZATION OF SAID AREAS AND THAT MR. GRUNCH BE REQUESTED TO APPEAR BEFORE THE BOARD TO PRESENT THIS PLAN AND TO DISCUSS/SHOW CAUSE WHY HIS CURRENTLY LICENSED HUNTING AREAS SHOULD NOT BE REDUCED TO A SIZE WHICH HE CAN MORE EFFICIENTLY AND EFFECTIVELY UTILIZE.

Larry W. Leavitt: MSC (Salter--Vaughn) THAT MR. LEAVITT'S PROPOSAL TO ACQUIRE THE SECTION OF RIVER FROM THE MOUTH OF THE MIDDLE FORK TO SPRING BAR FROM STEVE CURREY BE APPROVED WHEN HIS APPLICATION IS COMPLETE. IT SHOULD BE PARTICULARLY NOTED THAT HE MUST HAVE A LEAD FLOAT BOATMAN BEFORE HIS LICENSE IS ISSUED.

Steve Currey: MSC (Salter--Meiners) THAT A LETTER OF REPRIMAND BE SENT TO MR. CURREY ADVISING HIM THAT THE BOARD IS VERY DISMAYED WITH HIS HANDLING OF THE PROPOSED SALE OF BUSINESS TO LARRY LEAVITT. THE BOARD'S CONCERNS ARE: (1) THE FACT THAT MR. CURREY IS AN EXPERIENCED OUTFITTER YET HAS NOT PREPARED MR. LEAVITT IN BETTER FORM AS TO THE PROPER PROCEDURE IN ATTEMPTING TO TRANSFER A BUSINESS FROM ONE OUTFITTER TO ANOTHER; (2) THE FACT THAT MR. CURREY DID NOT ADVISE MR. LEAVITT THAT HE COULD NOT DO ANY ADVERTISING OR PREPARATION OF PROMOTIONAL MATERIALS PRIOR TO HIS OBTAINING A LICENSE; (3) THAT BOTH MR. CURREY'S AND MR. LEAVITT'S APPEARANCE BEFORE THE BOARD AND PROPER CLEARANCE WITH THE FOREST SERVICE WOULD HAVE BEEN VERY MUCH IN ORDER PRIOR TO THE TRANSFER OF ANY COLLATERAL; AND (4) THAT GREATER ASSISTANCE FROM MR. CURREY IN HELPING MR. LEAVITT TO OBTAIN PROPERLY QUALIFIED AND EXPERIENCED PERSONNEL TO OPERATE THE BUSINESS IN THE EARLY STAGES WHILE MR. LEAVITT IS OBTAINING TRAINING NECESSARY TO OBTAIN A LICENSE WOULD HAVE BEEN HIGHLY DESIRABLE.

Idaho Outfitters and Guides Association: MSC (Vaughn--Meiners) REGARDING THE SALE OF BUSINESS, THAT THE OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES ASSOCIATION BE CONTACTED AND THAT A NOTICE BE PUBLISHED IN THE IOGA NEWSLETTER ENCOURAGING OUTFITTERS WHO SELL BUSINESSES TO CAREFULLY WALK THE POTENTIAL BUYERS THROUGH THE ADMINISTRATIVE PROCESS INVOLVED IN A CHANGEOVER IN BUSINESS OPERATIONS SO THAT THE PURCHASER UNDERSTANDS THAT HE CANNOT ADVERTISE OR OTHERWISE BOOK OR HOLD HIMSELF OUT FOR HIRE UNTIL APPROPRIATE LICENSES AND PERMITS HAVE BEEN ISSUED BY THE RESPECTIVE AGENCIES, AND FURTHER INDICATING THAT THE SELLER HAS AN OBLIGATION TO APPEAR BEFORE THE BOARD ALONG WITH THE BUYER, AND ALSO TO CONTACT AND APPEAR BEFORE THE RESPECTIVE FEDERAL AGENCY PEOPLE, PRIOR TO CONSUMMATION OF ANY BUSINESS TRANSACTION AND THAT THE BOARD DOES NOT HIGHLY REGARD THE ADAGE "LET THE BUYER BEWARE".

Mike Bishop: MSC (Vaughn--Meiners) THAT MR. BISHOP'S ATTORNEY, MICHAEL B. SWEET, BE NOTIFIED THAT THE COMPLAINT CONCERNS AGAINST MR. BISHOP HAVE BEEN REVIEWED AND INVESTIGATED AND THAT THERE WILL BE NO FURTHER ACTION AGAINST HIS LICENSE. A COPY OF THIS LETTER TO BE SENT TO MR. BISHOP AND STEVE JONES.

Randy Baugh/Jim Pepecorn/Dennis Hill: MSC (Meiners--Vaughn) REGARDING THE BAUGH/PEPCORN/HILL MATTER AND THE SHOW CAUSE HEARING WITH MR. BAUGH, THAT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE AGREEMENTS REACHED AS AN OUTCOME OF THAT HEARING WHEREIN MR. BAUGH HAS RELINQUISHED HIS INTEREST IN THE AREAS TO WHICH HE IS CURRENTLY LICENSED AND MESSRS. PEPCORN AND HILL HAVE INDICATED THEIR INTEREST IN RE-ESTABLISHING LICENSES TO OPERATE IN THOSE PARTICULAR AREAS TO WHICH THEY WERE FORMERLY LICENSED, THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT MR. G & L York: The Board reviewed a complaint against G & L York, following which MSC (Vaughn--Meiners) THAT GLADYS YORK BE REQUESTED TO APPEAR BEFORE THE BOARD IN APRIL TO ANSWER TO THE COMPLAINT AND TO BRING COPIES OF ADVERTISING AND TO DISCUSS HER ABILITY TO HANDLE THE NUMBERS OF HUNTERS SHE CURRENTLY HANDLES. ADDITIONALLY, THE BOARD SHOULD CONTACT THE FOREST SERVICE AND DETERMINE WHAT LEVEL OF USE MS. YORK REPORTS WITH THE RED RIVER RANGER DISTRICT AND TRY TO DETERMINE FROM THE FOREST SERVICE WHETHER THIS LEVEL OF USE IS SATISFACTORY GIVEN THE SIZE OF THE AREA LICENSED TO MS. YORK.

Ray Hamell: The Board reviewed a telephone call from Mr. Hamell of Riggins concerning a donated hunt which would be auctioned at San Francisco for Safari Club International, following which MSC (Meiners--Salter) THAT MR. HAMELL BE TOLD THAT INASMUCH AS HE IS DONATING A HUNT WHICH IS NORMALLY PERCEIVED TO BE CONDUCTED BY AN OUTFITTER OPERATION AND THAT HE IS DOING THIS FOR THE AVOWED PURPOSE OF BUILDING A CLIENTELE LIST WHICH COULD BE CONSTRUED AS COMPENSATION OR GAIN, THAT HE NOT BE PERMITTED TO DONATE SUCH HUNT UNLESS HE MAKES IT CLEAR, IN WRITING, TO SAFARI CLUB INTERNATIONAL AND TO THE PROSPECTIVE PURCHASERS OF THIS HUNT THAT HE IS NOT A BONA FIDE BONDED, INSURED, AND LICENSED OUTFITTER IN THE STATE OF IDAHO.

Oregon State Marine Board: MSC (Salter--Vaughn) THAT THE CHAIRMAN BE REQUESTED TO REPLY TO MR.
