IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD

June 9-13, 1986  
Boardroom - Boise, Idaho

A regular meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Board convened at 0830 hours on Monday, June 9, 1986, with all members in attendance.

**Russell R. Gore:** Following a nonuse hearing before the Board for the conduct of power and float boating activities on the Salmon River (SA2, SA4, and SA5) and a discussion of the materials presented to the Board during said hearing, MSC (Salter--Miller) THAT AFTER HEARING THE TESTIMONY PRESENTED AT THE SHOW CAUSE HEARING (CASE N-0138) INVOLVING RUSTY GORE AND BASED PRINCIPALLY UPON THE FACT THAT HE HAS BEEN LICENSED ONLY SINCE JANUARY 1985, AND THAT HE PRESENTED TESTIMONY FROM DOCTORS INDICATING THAT HE WAS DISABLED DURING A GOOD PORTION OF THE LICENSE PERIOD SINCE THAT TIME, THAT THE APPARENT NONUSE BE EXCUSED ON THE POWER AND FLOAT BOATING ON THE SALMON RIVER FROM IRON CREEK TO NORTH FORK (SA4) AND POWER AND FLOAT BOATING ACTIVITIES ON THE NORTH FORK TO CORN CREEK SECTION (SA5), AND THE FISHING BOATING ONLY ACTIVITIES ON THE SALMON RIVER FROM THE FIRST HIGHWAY 93 BRIDGE ABOVE CHALLIS TO IRON CREEK (SA2). MR. GORE'S LICENSE IS TO BE ISSUED THE SAME AS LAST YEAR, AND FURTHER THAT THIS DECISION ON THE HEARING HAS NOTHING TO DO WITH THE DECISION WHICH WILL BE MADE LATER ON THE SUCCESSFUL APPLICANTS FOR THE STEELHEAD SEASON ACTIVITIES ON THE SECTION OF RIVER FROM IRON CREEK TO NORTH FORK (SA4B).

**A. W. Angell:** Following a nonuse hearing for conduct of hunting antelope, deer, elk, moose, sheep, bear, cougar, and predators and a discussion of Mr. Angell's situation as noted in his letter submitted to the Board, MSC (Salter--Farr) THAT IN THE MATTER OF THE SHOW CAUSE HEARING (CASE NO. N-0012) AND AFTER REVIEWING AND CONSIDERING THE LETTER SUBMITTED BY A. W. ANGELL, THAT THE BOARD DETERMINE THAT MR. ANGELL IS IN NONUSE FOR HIS LICENSED AREA AND THAT HE BE SO NOTIFIED. THE BOARD, IN REVIEWING HIS REPORT RECORDS, NOTED THAT HE HAD ONLY 1 HUNTER DURING THE PRECEDING 3 YEARS AND FOUND THAT HIS REASONS OF (A) LACK OF INSURANCE IN 1985 AND (B) EXCESSIVE WINTER KILL IN 1983 WERE INSUFFICIENT TO JUSTIFY THE APPARENT NONUSE.

**Hammerhead Outfitters/David L. Whitworth, Managing Agent:** Following a nonuse hearing for the conduct of trailrides, wagon rides, backpacking, fishing, snowmobiling, and deer hunting and a discussion of the material presented to the Board by Mr. Whitworth and a review of the file, MSC (Farr--Miller) THAT PURSUANT TO THE HEARING OF CASE NO. N-0155 IN THE MATTER OF NONUSE OF HAMMERHEAD OUTFITTERS/DAVID L. WHITWORTH, MANAGING AGENT, THAT, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE TESTIMONY RECEIVED FROM MR. WHITWORTH, THE BOARD GIVE MR. WHITWORTH AN ADDITIONAL YEAR TO

OPERATE PENDING COMPLETION OF THE 1986-1987 APPLICATION (CURRENT AMERICAN RED CROSS CARD) WITH WAIVER OF LATE FEE. EXTENUATING CIRCUMSTANCES WERE ALLEGED POOR HEALTH THAT PREVENTED FURTHERING BUSINESS IN MANNER IN ACCORDANCE WITH OPERATION PLAN.

**Peter H. Grubb dba River Odysseys West:** Following a nonuse hearing before the Board for the conduct of float boating activities on the Salmon River from Vinegar Creek to Hammer Creek (SA7) and a discussion of the matters presented by Mr. Grubb, MSC (Salter--Miller) THAT IN THE HEARING OF CASE NO. N-0145 RELATIVE TO PROPOSED REVOCATION OF LICENSE PRIVILEGES OF PETER H. GRUBB DBA RIVER ODYSSEYS WEST TO CONDUCT FLOAT BOATING ACTIVITIES ON THE SALMON RIVER FROM VINEGAR CREEK TO HAMMER CREEK (SA7), THAT AFTER HEARING MR. GRUBBS' TESTIMONY OUTLINING REASONS WHY THIS SECTION HAD NOT BEEN UTILIZED IN THE PAST 3 YEARS (ALTHOUGH IT HAD BEEN USED PREVIOUS TO THAT TIME) WITH FURTHER EXPLANATION AS TO HOW THE SECTION DOES FIT INTO HIS CURRENT AND PROPOSED ACTIVITIES (NOT ONLY ON THE SALMON RIVER BUT IN OTHER AREAS OF IDAHO AS WELL), THAT THE RIVER SECTION (SA7) NOT BE DELETED FROM HIS LICENSE. HOWEVER, MR. GRUBB IS PLACED ON NOTICE THAT UNLESS HE SHOWS AN ADEQUATE AMOUNT OF USE ON THIS RIVER SECTION DURING THE 1986-1987 LICENSE YEAR HE WILL BE CONSIDERED ELIGIBLE FOR NONUSE NOTIFICATION NEXT YEAR.

**Omer Drury:** Following a nonuse hearing for float boating activities on the Salmon River from Iron Creek to North Fork and North Fork to Corn Creek and in accordance with Mr. Drury's note, MSC (Salter--Vaughn) RELATIVE TO CASE N-0095 INVOLVING OMER DRURY, THAT: (1) THE NOTARIZED STATEMENT FROM MR. DRURY WHEREIN HE STATES "YOU CAN HAVE THE ABOVE. I DO NOT PLAN TO APPEAR OR CONTEST THE ACTION.", AND (2) A LETTER DATED JANUARY 6, 1986, FROM THE BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT, THAT "FLOAT BOATING ON THE SALMON RIVER FROM IRON CREEK TO NORTH FORK (SA4) AND FLOAT BOATING ON THE SALMON RIVER FROM NORTH FORK TO CORN CREEK (SA5) BE DELETED FROM MR. DRURY'S LICENSE DUE TO NONUSE" BE ACCEPTED BY AND BECOME FINAL BOARD ACTION IN THIS MATTER.

**Eakin Ridge Outfitters, Inc.:** Following a nonuse hearing for float boating activities on the Salmon River from North Fork to Corn Creek and a discussion of this matter, MSC (Miller--Salter) THAT REGARDING HEARING ON CASE N-0100 INVOLVING NONUSE FLOAT BOATING ACTIVITIES ON THE SALMON RIVER FROM NORTH FORK TO CORN CREEK (SA5), THAT THE BOARD DELETE FROM EAKIN RIDGE OUTFITTERS, INC. THIS SECTION OF THE RIVER FOR FLOAT BOATING. THIS IS BASED UPON THE LACK OF USE SHOWN ON THE OUTFITTER'S APPLICATIONS FOR THE LAST 3 YEARS AND THE FACT THAT EAKIN RIDGE OUTFITTERS, INC. DOES NOT HAVE A PERMIT FROM THE U.S. FOREST SERVICE TO OPERATE ON

THIS SECTION OF RIVER. It should be noted that no one was present to represent Eakin Ridge Outfitters, Inc. at this hearing nor was there any response to the Board's Notice of Hearing dated May 7, 1986.

**Bill Bernt:** Following a nonuse hearing for conduct of float boating on the Salmon River from North Fork to Corn Creek (SA5) and review of Mr. Bernt's letter, previously recorded interview with the Board Chairman, and file, MSC (Miller--Farr) FOLLOWING REVIEW OF THE FILE, LETTERS, AND HEARING TAPED INTERVIEW ON THIS MATTER (HEARING N-0029), THAT: (1) THE BOARD NOT DELETE RIVER SEGMENT SA5 FROM MR. BERN'T LICENSE ON THE BASIS OF TESTIMONY THAT THE FOREST SERVICE WILL ISSUE A TEMPORARY PERMIT FOR OCCASIONAL USE UPON REQUESTE WHERE SUCH USE IS AUTHORIZED BY THE BOARD; (2) MR. BERNT BE PLACED ON THE CONSIDERATION LIST, IN ACCORDANCE WITH RULE 28, SHOULD A VACANCY OCCUR HAVING FOREST SERVICE SPECIAL USE ALLOCATION; AND (3) THE BOARD, IN ACCORDANCE WITH MR. BERNT'S INTERVIEW STATEMENT TO THE BOARD CHAIRMAN, DELETE FLOAT BOATING ON THE SALMON RIVER FROM VINEGAR CREEK TO HAMMER CREEK (SA7) FROM MR. BERNT'S LICENSE PROVIDED HE MAY FLOAT-THROUGH ON THIS RIVER REACH ON AN OCCASIONAL BASIS WITH PRIOR BOARD AND BLM APPROVAL.

**Salmon River Lodge, Inc.:** Following a nonuse hearing for the conduct of power boating on the Salmon River from Iron Creek to North Fork wherein Dave Giles and his partner, Steve Dixon, met with the Board and voluntarily relinquished their interest for said river segment, MSC (Salter--Farr) THAT THE RELINQUISHMENT OF SA4 FOR POWER BOATING OPERATIONS BE ACCEPTED.

**Russell Gore/A. W. Angell/David L. Whitworth/Peter Grubb/Omer Drury/Eakin Ridge Outfitters/Bill Bernt/Salmon River Lodge:** Following the conclusion of these nonuse hearings, MSC (Farr--Vaughn) THAT APPROPRIATE ACTION BE TAKEN TO REFLECT BOARD DECISION WITH SAID ACTION BY ADMINISTRATIVE OR OTHER METHOD FOLLOWING THE CONCLUSION OF THE APPEAL PROCESS PERIOD.

**Robert L. Libertine:** The Board reviewed Mr. Libertine's guide license application to work for the River Company. Following a discussion of the circumstances surrounding the denial of his last year's license, MSC (Vaughn--Farr) THAT ROBERT L. LIBERTINE'S GUIDE LICENSE BE APPROVED AND ISSUED.

**Stanley Potts:** The Board reviewed Mr. Potts' letter dated May 27, 1986, regarding the boundary dispute between himself and Scott Farr in the Trapper Creek/Papoose Creek drainage. Following a discussion of the materials and a review of the file, MSC (Salter--Vaughn; Farr abstains) THAT THE CHAIRMAN BE REQUESTED TO WRITE STANLEY POTTS IN ANSWER TO HIS MAY 27, 1986, LETTER ADVISING HIM THE BOARD HAS SCHEDULED AN INFORMAL HEARING

FOR JULY 30, 1986, AT 3:00 P.M. TO REVIEW AND HEAR TESTIMONY ON THE MATTER. FURTHER, BY COPY OF THE LETTER TO MR. POTTS, THE FOREST SERVICE BE INVITED AND URGED TO BE IN ATTENDANCE AT THE MEETING SO THIS MATTER CAN BE FINALLY RESOLVED; PROVIDED FURTHER THAT MR. POTTS BE REQUESTED TO ADVISE WHETHER THIS PROPOSED DATE WILL MEET HIS SCHEDULE AND, IF NOT, PLEASE SUGGEST AN ALTERNATIVE DATE AND TIME DURING THE AUGUST 20-22 BOARD MEETING FOR REVIEW OF THIS SITUATION.

**Salmon River Lodge, Inc./David D. Giles, Managing Agent:** David Giles and his partner Steve Dixon met with the Board relative to their nonuse hearing, following which other matters were discussed with the Board; namely, their license amendment requesting power boat operations on the Salmon River from Spring Bar to Hammer Creek (SA7), Salmon River from Hammer Creek to the confluence with the Snake River (SA8), Snake River from Hells Canyon Dam to Pittsburg Landing (SN7), and Snake River from Pittsburg Landing to Lewiston (SN8). The Board reviewed the license amendment request and in discussion of these matters with Messrs. Giles and Dixon advised them that at the present time these river sections are currently licensed to their maximum and that their request would be placed on the consideration list for that point in time should a vacancy occur and that this verbal communication would be affirmed by a letter to Mr. Giles regarding the matter.

The Board recessed at 1745 hours and reconvened on Tuesday, June 10, 1986, at 0830 hours with all Board members present.

**Salmon River-Vinegar Creek to Hammer Creek (SA7):** The Board reviewed, for clarification, Rule 57 relative to this river segment as to whether that area between Vinegar Creek downstream to Spring Bar was closed to steelhead fishing under the new rule. Following a discussion of this matter, it is the Board's position that those individuals holding a license which includes the Vinegar Creek to Spring Bar reach are legal to utilize the area between Vinegar Creek and Spring Bar on a year-around basis for all licensed activities inclusive of steelhead fishing.

**Tom Mehler:** The Board reviewed a letter from Mr. Mehler regarding charter fishing boat operations on the lakes in northern Idaho. Following a discussion of this letter and Mr. Mehler's interest and concern of illegal operations on these lakes, it is the Board's position that a letter be addressed to Mr. Mehler stating that the Board will pursue its enforcement effort to the extent of identifying and taking action against illegal operations as they become aware of such operations, and that his further concern regarding the number of individuals licensed to fish on the lakes in northern Idaho would need to be considered at a future rules-making.

**Vernon Johnson/Tom Sullivan:** The Board reviewed the proposed sale of the fishing portion of Mr. Johnson's license to Mr. Sullivan and his partners with further reference to Mr. Johnson's nonuse hearing concerning his licensed activities. Following a discussion on this matter, the Board directed that: (1) a letter is to be written Mr. Sullivan and partners informing them that upon receipt of the necessary paperwork to initiate purchase of the float boating business from Mr. Johnson, that the Board will take the matter under advisement with a decision made following a review of the sales contract and other matters; and (2) that the nonuse of Mr. Johnson's hunting area be held in abeyance pending outcome of the nonuse hearing in July.

**Roger Rockwell:** Following a discussion of Mr. Rockwell's first aid training as submitted by Dissendat River Expeditions and a review of the training format, MSC (Farr--Miller) THAT THE TRAINING BE ACCEPTED AS ADEQUATE AND THAT THE LICENSE BE ISSUED.

**Attorney General Contract:** The Board reviewed the renewal contract from the State's Attorney General Office. Following a discussion, MSC (Salter--Vaughn) THAT THE AGREEMENT BE UPDATED AND EXTENDED AS INDICATED IN THE CONTRACT.

**Randall Lemburg:** The Board reviewed input received from the Forest Service relative to their review and recommendation concerning Mr. Lemburg's application. Following a discussion of these matters, MSC (Farr--Vaughn) THAT MR. LEMBURG'S APPLICATION BE APPROVED FOR TRAILRIDING, STREAM FISHING, SNOWMOBILING, AND CHARTER FISHING ON PRIEST LAKE, THE LATTER BEING SUBJECT TO MEETING THE COAST GUARD REQUIREMENTS FOR OPERATION ON PRIEST LAKE. **Harold Thomas/Anthony Popp/Gladys York:** The Board reviewed the proposed sale of business between Messrs. Thomas and Popp, inclusive of the boundary dispute relative to the Rainey Point area between the hunting areas occupied by Mr. Thomas and Mrs. York. Following a discussion of these matters and a review of the file, MSC (Vaughn--Farr) THAT THE BUSINESS SALE BETWEEN MESSRS. THOMAS AND POPP BE APPROVED CONTINGENT UPON RECEIPT OF A SIGNED PURCHASE AGREEMENT AS REFERENCED INTO THE FINAL SALE AGREEMENT DATE-STAMPED INTO THE BOARD OFFICE JUNE 4, 1986. FURTHER, THAT MR. THOMAS' LICENSE BE AMENDED TO DELETE THE HUNTING ACTIVITIES WHICH HAVE NOW BEEN TRANSFERRED TO MR. POPP AND HIS OPERATION OUT OF THE COOK RANCH. FURTHER, IN REVIEW OF THE THOMAS/YORK BOUNDARY AREA DISAGREEMENT WITH REFERENCE TO THE HEARING HELD CONCERNING THIS MATTER IN FEBRUARY 1985, THAT NO ADDITIONAL INFORMATION HAS BEEN PROVIDED TO NECESSITATE OR CHANGE PRIOR BOARD DECISION AND THAT MR. THOMAS AND MRS. YORK BE SO NOTIFIED BY LETTER OF THE BOARD'S FINDING IN THIS MATTER. [See Addenda 2 and 3]

**Sierra Western Guides/Tour West/Grand Canyon Dories:** Following a discussion of their double launch permits on the main Salmon River and a review of the Forest Service's letter and background to the establishment of these double launch permits, it is the Board's position that no further action be taken at this time.

**Ed Bartlett:** Following a review of Mr. Bartlett's guide license application and Fish and Game citation, MSC (Salter--Vaughn) THAT MR. BARTLETT BE ISSUED A PROBATIONARY LICENSE WITH THE SPECIFICS OF THE PROBATION BEING THAT HE NOT VIOLATE APPLICABLE LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS IN THE ENSUING YEAR, WITH COPIES TO THE EMPLOYING OUTFITTERS AND THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME AT SALMON.

**Richard E. Grunch:** Following a review of Mr. Grunch's file and letters received from clients regarding his prior activities, MSC (Vaughn--Salter) THAT MR. GRUNCH'S 1986-1987 LICENSE BE ISSUED.

**Jeffrey M. Bitton:** The Board reviewed Mr. Bitton's letter to the Board dated May 19, 1986, regarding corrections to the language on his license. Following this review, MSC (Farr--Vaughn) IN ACCORDANCE WITH MR. BITTON'S REQUEST TO AMEND HIS LICENSE REGARDING CONDITION UNDER ADDITIONAL AREA FOR ELK AND TROPHY BUCK DEER HUNTING, THAT IT SHOULD BE CHANGED TO READ: "TOTAL NUMBER ON DEER HUNTING GUESTS NOT TO EXCEED 8 PER YEAR IN THE ABOVE AREA OF OPERATION." FURTHER, THAT THERE BE NO LIMIT ON ELK HUNTERS AS LONG AS ELK HUNTING REMAINS ON A DRAW BASIS. ALSO, THAT MR. BITTON'S REQUEST TO DELETE EDNA AND SPANGLER LAKES BE APPROVED AS BOTH LAKES DO FALL WITHIN THE SAWTOOTH WILDERNESS AREA TO WHICH HE IS CURRENTLY LICENSED.

**Dean H. Seely:** Following a review of Mr. Seely's request for a waiver of the late fee, MSC (Vaughn--Farr) THAT THIS REQUEST BE DENIED.

**Mike L. Daly/Bugle Point Outfitters:** Following a review of Mr. Daly's file regarding a request for a waiver of the late fee, MSC (Vaughn--Farr) THAT THIS REQUEST BE GRANTED.

**James A. Katz:** Following a review of Mr. Katz' request for a waiver of the late fee, MSC (Farr--Vaughn) THAT THIS REQUEST BE DENIED.

**R & R Outdoors:** Following a review of the file, MSC (Vaughn--Miller) THAT R & R OUTFITTERS REQUEST FOR A REFUND BE APPROVED.

**Gordon Frost:** Following a review of the file, MSC (Vaughn--Farr) THAT MR. FROST'S REQUEST FOR A WAIVER OF THE LATE FEE BE DENIED. [Administrative note: To avoid future problems in response regarding FWL Warm Springs Outfitters, that all correspondence be addressed to Gordon Frost.]

**Trail Guides, Inc./Carolyn Patterson:** Following a review of the file, MSC (Farr--Vaughn) THAT MS. PATTERSON'S REQUEST FOR A WAIVER OF THE LATE FEE BE APPROVED.

**Earl Maggard:** The Board reviewed Mr. Maggard's outfitter license application for hunting and recreational activities in an area which appears to be identical to the area currently licensed to Garden Valley Outfitters/Dan Rotthoff, Managing Agent. Following a review of the file, MSC (Salter--Vaughn) THAT THE APPLICATION OF EARL MAGGARD FOR AN OUTFITTING BUSINESS ON THE SOUTH FORK OF THE PAYETTE RIVER BE DENIED BASED UPON IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b) AND RULE 19.f.

**Earl Maggard:** Regarding to Mr. Maggard's request for review of Board records relative to guides licensed to Dan Rotthoff and the validity of Multimedia Red Cross cards issued to said licensed guides, it is the Board's position that Mr. Maggard be advised that it appreciates his drawing this matter to its attention and that he be further advised that validation of Multimedia Red Cross cards is made by the Board as a normal course in processing and issuing guide licenses and that the Board will again check their records in this regard. If irregularities in this regard are found, appropriate action will be taken.

EPLEY'S REQUEST BE APPROVED FOR A ONE-TIME ONLY USE FOR THIS LICENSE YEAR AND THAT FURTHER RESEARCH BE CONDUCTED ON THIS MATTER BEFORE TAKING ANY FURTHER ACTION REGARDING CONTINUOUS USE AND ADDITION OF THESE TRAILS TO HIS LICENSE. APPROVAL OF THIS AMENDMENT IS SUBJECT TO RECEIPT OF THE \$10.00 AMENDMENT FEE.

**Sun Valley Wilderness Outfitters/R. J. Lewy:** The Board reviewed the request for summer activities of trailrides, backpacking, and incidental fishing on a catch-and-release basis as outlined in Mr. Lewy's letter to the Board dated May 30, 1986, following which MSC (Farr--Miller) THAT THIS REQUEST BE APPROVED. **Kevin Bruce Duncan:** The Board reviewed Mr. Duncan's outfitter application for cougar hunting in Unit 1 and the response and recommendation made by the Idaho Department of Fish and Game, following which MSC (Salter--Vaughn) BASED UPON THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME IN THEIR LETTER DATED JUNE 5, 1986, AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH 36-2109(b)(5), THAT MR. DUNCAN'S APPLICATION FOR COUGAR HUNTING IN UNIT 1 BE DENIED.

**Memorandum of Understanding:** At 1100 hours the Board met with Earl Kimball and Clem Pope of the Forest Service to review and discuss Amendment No. 1 to the Memorandum of Understanding between the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Board and the Northern, Intermountain, and Pacific Northwest Regions of the U. S. Forest Service. Following a review of the points of concern, namely Step 1 of the proposed coordinating guidelines with reference to the Forest Service Manual 2721.53f(3)(a) and more specifically sub-paragraphs 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6, it was the Board's position that sub-paragraphs 1, 2, 3, and 4 do not represent "new" opportunities for outfitting, while sub-paragraphs 5 and 6 may be instances of new outfitting opportunities. Following a discussion of these matters, Earl Kimball indicated he would undertake to re-draft or change the wording of these points to a context more acceptable to the Board, yet meet Forest Service requirements. The Board directs that a letter be addressed to the Region IV Forester regarding this matter and stating that following receipt, evaluation, and acceptance of these re-drafted procedures, the Board would then be in a better position to sign Amendment No. 1 to the Memorandum of Understanding.

**Steve Galles/Andre Molsee:** The Board interviewed Messrs. Galles and Molsee regarding the proposed sale of business in Units 11 and 13. MSC (Salter--Farr) THAT THE PROPOSED SALE OF THE COUGAR/PREDATOR HUNTING BUSINESS IN UNITS 11 AND 13 FROM STEVE GALLES TO ANDRE MOLSEE BE APPROVED.

**Thunder Mountain Packers, Inc./Don Waller, Managing Agent:** Following a meeting with Earl Kimball and Clem Pope from the Krassel Ranger District of the Payette National Forest, regarding Amendment No. 1 to the Memorandum of Understanding by and between the Board and the U.S. Forest Service, and more specifically the relicensing of Don Waller to that area previously licensed to him before sale of the outfitting business to Kim Horrocks, the Board reviewed the file as requested by the Forest Service to evaluate their analysis of outfitting opportunities as applicable to the area. The Board takes exception to: (1) The detailed breakdown of service day use, the "when" and "where" such use is to be made, and the evident restrictions such limits place upon the ability of an outfitter to manage his business. (2) With reference to "specific use" as is stated in the analysis, it is the Board's interpretation that this means hunting and boating licensed/permitted uses as identified on the license/permit but not necessarily the recreational activities such as trailriding, etc. (3) With reference to the reallocation of unutilized outfitter service days to another outfitter, the Board takes exception to the Forest Service proposal to reallocate major activities such as hunting and boating as this would be a violation of hunting area boundaries and boating privileges which are licensed by the State on an exclusive use basis. However, non-exclusive recreational activities, such as trailrides and fishing, may be considered in this vein. (4) The Board requests, as a further area of coordination, that the Forest Service provide the Board the proposed permit inclusive of those "other provisions" as may be drafted by the Forest Service and placed on the outfitter's permit to enable Board review and concurrence where said provisions involve license requirements, such as advertising, as mandated by Outfitters and Guides Act/Rules and Regulations. (5) The Board concurs in the recommended boundary adjustments to the current Waller area, namely the extensions to the current boundary to enable a more viable operation with the exception of that recommended extension on the extreme eastern end of the area that embraces the Little Cottonwood Creek drainage. Said area is currently licensed to another outfitter, namely Cougar Ranch Outfitters; thus the Board recommends the

**Salmon River-SA4B and SA7B:** At 1815 hours the Board gave its attention to the initial selection process for successful applicants for river operations on SA4B and SA7B. The initial selection was confined to SA7B and terminated at 2200 hours at which time the Board recessed.

The Board reconvened on Thursday, June 12, 1986, at 0830 hours with all Board members present except Bob Salter.

**Pat Marek/Gerald Kooyers:** The Board interviewed Mr. Kooyers and Mr. & Mrs. Marek relative to the sale of business from Kooyers to Marek's. Following this interview and a review of the file relating to this proposed purchase, MSC (Farr--Vaughn) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE PROPOSED PURCHASE OF THE DENNIS HILL BUSINESS PENDING MR. PROCTOR'S SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF THE TEST AND OTHER PAPERWORK AS MAY BE NECESSARY.

THESE DENIALS ARE BASED ON THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME AS NOTED IN THEIR LETTER RECEIVED JUNE 12, 1986, IN ACCORDANCE WITH IDAHO CODE 36-2109 (b)(4) AND (b)(5), AND DUE TO THE FACT THAT THE SELBY AREA IS NOT AVAILABLE FOR LICENSING TO ANOTHER PARTY PENDING THE APPEAL/LITIGATION PROCESS.

**Bogus Basin Ski Resort:** The Board reviewed the Bogus Basin Ski Resort request for a ruling by the Board as to whether their proposed activities as outlined in a letter dated March 7, 1986, fall within the purview of the Outfitters and Guides Act. This matter was referred to the Ski Committee for their recommendation. Following receipt and review of the Ski Committee's recommendation, it was the Board's decision that the

Grammer, Managing Agent:** The Board reviewed Mr. Grammer's amendment request for a boundary adjustment and the responses from the Forest Service and the Idaho Department of Fish and Game, following which MSC (Vaughn--Farr) THAT THE REQUESTED AMENDMENT BE APPROVED. **Steve Wieber dba Happy Hooker Excursions:** At 1100 hours the Board conducted a hearing on the denial of an amendment request by Mr. Weiber. Present were all Board members, its Administrative Secretary Linda Elwood, its counsel Steve Addington, Steve Wieber, his attorney/agent Howard Delaney, and his client Jay Cauley. SHANAFELT SHOWED USE ABOVE THAT WHICH WAS RECORDED IN HIS USE REPORTS DUE PARTIALLY TO A MISUNDERSTANDING AS TO WHOM HE SHOULD REPORT THE USE; IN OTHER WORDS, HE HAD NOT REPORTED USE TO THE BLM ON THE IRON CREEK TO NORTH FORK SECTION AND HAD REPORTED ONLY TO THE FOREST SERVICE. ACTUALLY, HIS USE REPORTS TO THE BOARD WERE INCOMPLETE BECAUSE HE HAD MERELY CHECKED THE APPROPRIATE PLACES RATHER THAN INSERTING THE NUMBERS OF PEOPLE THAT HE HAD ACCOMMODATED.

ALSO, THAT MR. LINDSEY BE URGED TO GET IN CONTACT WITH THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME, IF HE SO WISHES, AND SEE IF SOME OF THE RESTRICTIONS COULD BE MODIFIED.

**Thomas Webb:** The Board reviewed Mr. Webb's telephone call to the Board requesting guidance relative to his proposal to provide a boat rental service, then he would take these clients and transport them by his own equipment and means to a point of ingress on the river turning said boats and clients loose without guides, and then pick them up at some specified time and place later by his own equipment and returning said clients and equipment to the point of rental. Following a consideration of this matter, it was the Board's direction that Mr. Webb be advised that this would be considered as outfitting and, therefore, urged that he make other arrangements. [Note: This was done by phone contact with Mr. Webb stating he would submit a written request for appropriate Board action.]

**Rick Hussey:** The Board reviewed the letter from Mr. Hussey regarding his concern for the necessity of licensing both as a Managing Agent and an Outfitter; also, his concern about the effect of the Board's position relative to sale of businesses licensed to the Lemhi County bear/cougar hunting area. Following a discussion on this matter, the Board directed that a letter be addressed to Mr. Hussey to direct his attention to: (a) Idaho Code 36-2109(c) and Rule 17 concerning the licensing of Managing Agents and/or Outfitters; (b) Idaho Code 36-2109(b)(5) and Rules 24.b. and 24.c. concerning the Board's authority to adjust a licensed area for reasons of wildlife management and/or territorial conflict; and (c) Idaho Code 36-2109(c) and Rule 26 concerning the sale of a license.

**Roy Woltz:** The Board reviewed a letter received from Mr. Woltz outlining his plans in putting together his plan of operation and making timely submission of an application to the Board after securing the necessary Forest Service permits. The Board directs that Mr. Woltz be advised that this is acceptable to the Board; however, he needs to make timely application in order to maintain his status in the award of boating on the Selway and Clearwater Rivers; that is, he must make application for a 1986-1987 license.
