

MINUTES

IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD

May 4-8, 1987

Boardroom - Boise, Idaho

A regular meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Board convened at 0800 hours on Monday, May 4, 1987, with all members present [William Meiners, Hank Miller, Dale Baird, Ron Vaughn (who is fulfilling unexpired term of Scott Farr), and Leo Crane (who is replacing Harry Vaughn whose term has expired)].

Election of Officers: Following discussion, MSC (Vaughn-Baird) THAT BILL MEINERS BE RE-APPOINTED AS CHAIRMAN. MSC (Crane-Vaughn) THAT HANK MILLER BE DESIGNATED AS VICE CHAIRMAN. MSC (Vaughn-Crane) THAT HANK MILLER BE DESIGNATED AS THE ENFORCEMENT COORDINATOR.

Enforcement Calls: It is to be re-emphasized that the calls coming in regarding enforcement matters should go to the Enforcement Coordinator; lacking him, the Chairman; and lacking him, any other Board member.

Minutes: The Board reviewed the February Board Minutes, following which MSC (Baird-Miller) THAT THE MINUTES BE APPROVED AS AMENDED.

Idaho Wilderness Camps, Inc./Garry Merritt, M.A.: Mr. Merritt came before the Board regarding the nonuse hearing for removal of cougar hunting in the joint Lemhi bear/cougar area. Following conclusion of the hearing and a discussion of the matter, MSF (Baird-Meiners - "nay" votes cast by Miller, Vaughn, & Crane) THAT IDAHO WILDERNESS CAMPS, INC.'S COUGAR HUNTING PRIVILEGES IN THE JOINT LEMHI AREA BE ELIMINATED FROM ITS LICENSE BUT THAT IT BE ALLOWED TO RETAIN COUGAR HUNTING IN ITS ASSIGNED AREA OF OPERATION. The motion, having failed, allows Idaho Wilderness Camps, Inc./Garry Merritt, M.A. to continue to be licensed for cougar hunting in the assigned area and in the joint Lemhi bear/cougar area. No further nonuse action will be taken at this time.

Allison Ranch, Inc./Harold E. Thomas, M.A.: The Board reviewed Mr. Thomas' note regarding the proposed revocation of float boating on the Salmon River from the Middle Fork to Spring Bar [SA6] which states: "Since I have been unable to acquire USFS permit, I have been unable to utilize the license. Therefore, I will not contest the nonuse of the license. Thanks. /s/ Harold E. Thomas." Following consideration of this matter, MSC (Vaughn-Miller) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT MR. THOMAS' RELINQUISHMENT OF HIS FLOAT BOATING PRIVILEGES ON THE SALMON RIVER FROM THE MIDDLE FORK TO SPRING BAR [SA6].

Willis B. Benjamin: The Board reviewed Mr. Benjamin's letter relative to the proposed revocation of privileges licensed for fishing and waterfowl hunting, following which MSC (Baird-Crane) THAT THE NONUSE HEARING BE CONTINUED UNTIL A FUTURE BOARD MEETING.

Eastern Washington University/Howard F. Uibel, M.A.: The Board reviewed the file and Dr. Uibel's letter relative to the proposed revocation of float boating on the Moyie River [MO1], following which MSC (Miller-Baird) THAT BASED ON THE TESTIMONY SUBMITTED IN DR. UIBEL'S LETTER AND IN CONSIDERATION OF THE FACT THAT THERE IS NO WAITING LIST ON THE MOYIE RIVER, THE BOARD NOT REVOKE THIS LICENSED PRIVILEGE AT THIS TIME.

Steven D. Schaefers: The Board reviewed Mr. Schaefers' letter concerning the proposed revocation of float boating privileges on the Salmon River from Vinegar Creek to Hammer Creek [SA7A], following which MSC (Miller-Crane) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT MR. SCHAEFERS' RELINQUISHMENT OF FLOAT BOATING ON THE SALMON RIVER FROM VINEGAR CREEK TO HAMMER CREEK [SA7A].

The Board recessed for lunch at 1215 hours and reconvened at 1315 hours.

Upcoming Board Meetings: Following a discussion of this matter, it was decided that meetings for the remainder of 1987 will be held as follows: June 29-July 3 (a change from the originally scheduled time of the first week in June); August 31-September 4; November 9-13; December 10-11 & possibly 12 (following IOGA meeting).

USFS/Region I/Cooperative Agreement: The Board reviewed the proposed Cooperative Agreement for the funding of enforcement activities. Following a discussion of this matter, MSC (Miller-Crane) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT AND SIGN THE BASIC MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH THE FOREST SERVICE FOR THE UTILIZATION OF THESE MONIES.

Hershel Coulter: The Board reviewed the request of Jerry Lockhart, Idaho Department of Fish & Game, for Board cooperation and participation in the prosecutor of Mr. Coulter, following which MSC (Miller-Vaughn) THAT THE BOARD AUTHORIZE PAYMENT OF THE AIRFARE NECESSARY TO RETURN THE WITNESS TO IDAHO FOR CONDUCT OF THE TRIAL.

Middle Fork Rapid Transit #1/Greg Edson, M.A.: Mr. Edson appeared before the Board in response to the Show Cause Hearing Notice relative to the proposed revocation of power boating

activities on the Snake River from Lower Falls to Bliss Dam [SN3-Hagerman Section]. Following the hearing and in consideration of Mr. Edson's testimony of no contest for suspension of this licensed privilege, MSC (Miller-Vaughn) THAT SAID POWER BOATING PRIVILEGES ON THE SNAKE RIVER FROM LOWER FALLS TO BLISS DAM [SN3-HAGERMAN SECTION] BE DELETED FROM MIDDLE FORK RAPID TRANSIT #1'S LICENSE.

Kimberland Meadows: Following a review of the file and the Forest Service's response relative to proposed Area C and fact that the requested area overlaps other existing outfitters, MSC (Vaughn-Crane) THAT THE REQUEST CONTINUED TO BE TABLED TO ALLOW ADDITIONAL RESEARCH TO BE DONE BEFORE MAKING A DECISION ON THIS MATTER; NAMELY, REQUEST FOR INPUT FROM AFFECTED OUTFITTERS DAVE STUCKER, JAMES R. THRASH, AND MARVIN L. TODD.

Norman H. Guth, Inc./Norm Guth, M.A.: The Board reviewed the amendment request to add sheep hunting in his licensed area of operation, following which MSC (Miller-Baird) THAT THE AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED.

Charles D. Neill, Jr. dba Gilmore Ranch Outfitters: The Board reviewed the amendment request to add fishing, trailrides, and cougar hunting to be conducted within the currently licensed area for deer, elk, and bear hunting, following which MSC (Vaughn-Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THIS AMENDMENT REQUEST.

David L. Whitworth dba Hammerhead Outfitters: The Board reviewed Mr. Whitworth's amendment request to add various hunting and summer recreational activities as well as float boating on the Portneuf River. Following a review of the file and the use reports Mr. Whitworth has made to date regarding his currently licensed activities and in view of the fact that Mr. Whitworth has not to-date obtained a Forest Service Special Use Permit and in consideration of his nonuse hearing held in June 1986 at which time he was given a year's grace period to demonstrate his ability to exercise his licensed privileges, MSC (Miller-Vaughn) THAT MR. WHITWORTH'S APPLICATION BE DENIED PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF IDAHO CODE 36-2109(c) AND 36-2113 (b)(13&14).

David Powers: The Board reviewed Mr. Powers' amendment request to add bear hunting within Fish & Game Management Unit 10A and deer and elk hunting in Fish & Game Management Unit 15, following which MSC (Crane-Vaughn) THAT THE REQUEST BE DENIED PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF 36-2109(b)(4&5) AS WELL AS THE RECOMMENDATIONS MADE BY THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH & GAME WITH SPECIFIC REFERENCE TO FISH & GAME MANAGEMENT UNIT 10A AND, FURTHER, THE FACT THAT THE AREA REQUESTED IN FISH & GAME MANAGEMENT UNIT 15 IS LICENSED TO ANOTHER OUTFITTER.

Harold B. Roberts: The Board reviewed Mr. Roberts' amendment request to add wade fishing on the Buffalo, Warm, and Fall Rivers, following which MSC (Baird-Crane) THAT THE AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME; THAT IS, ADD WADE FISHING ON THE FALL RIVER AND DENY WADE FISHING ON THE BUFFALO AND WARM RIVERS PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF 36-2109(b)(4&5).

H. Spence Warner: The Board reviewed Mr. Warner's amendment request to add boating tours and fishing on Palisades Reservoir, following which MSC (Miller-Vaughn) THAT THE AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED PENDING THE OBTAINING OF A SPECIAL USE PERMIT FROM THE LAND MANAGING AGENCY.

Hells Canyon Adventures/Gary Armacost, M.A.: The Board reviewed the amendment request to be licensed for transport of hunters along the Snake River below Hells Canyon Dam, following which MSC (Baird-Crane) THAT THE REQUEST BE DENIED BASED ON THE FACT THAT THE AREA REQUESTED IS CURRENTLY LICENSED TO OTHER OUTFITTERS AND, LIKEWISE, THAT SUCH AUTHORIZATION WOULD BE IN VIOLATION OF OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD RULE NO. 49.

Grand Canyon Dories, Inc./Curtis Chang, M.A.: The Board reviewed Mr. Chang's letter received April 23, 1987, in which he outlines his proposal to develop a recreational rowing program in Lewiston, Idaho, and Clarkston, Washington. Following this review and in consultation with the Board's attorney, MSC (Vaughn-Crane; Miller voted "no") THAT MR. CHANG BE ADVISED THAT THE BOARD FINDS HIS PROPOSAL DOES FALL WITHIN THE PURVIEW OF THE IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES ACT; THEREFORE, IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT HE SUBMIT AN AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE ADDITION OF SAID ACTIVITY TO HIS CURRENT LICENSE. FURTHER, THAT HE BE ENCOURAGED TO ATTEND A TRAINING PROGRAM OFFERED BY THE U.S. ROWING ASSOCIATION OUT OF SEATTLE, WASHINGTON.

Russell R. Gore dba Rusty Gore's Salmon River Jet Boat & Float Trips: The Board reviewed the Trade-A-Trip letter and brochure Mr. Gore has solicited across the state encouraging people to join Trade-A-Trip activities, following which MSC (Miller-Vaughn) THAT THE BOARD DIRECT A LETTER TO MR. GORE INDICATING THAT IT HAS RECEIVED SOME COMMENTS/POSSIBLE COMPLAINTS ABOUT TRADE-A-TRIP ACTIVITIES, THAT THE BOARD HAS LOOKED AT IT FROM THE STANDPOINT THAT AS LONG AS THE OUTFITTER IS TRADING THE TRIP AND THE TRIP HE IS PROVIDING TAKES PLACE IN HIS LICENSED AREA AND REPORTS HIS USE, THE OUTFITTER IS LEGAL. IF THE IDAHO OUTFITTER TRADES OR PROVIDES A TRIP FOR A TRIP OUTSIDE OF HIS LICENSED AREA, HE WOULD THEN BE ILLEGAL. FURTHER, THE INDIVIDUAL TRADING A TRIP HAS TO BE A LICENSED OUTFITTER SO THAT TRADE-A-TRIP CANNOT TRADE A TRIP TO AN INDIVIDUAL WHOSE HOBBY IS RIVER RAFTING, FOR EXAMPLE.

Steven Schuster: The Board met with its attorney to review and update various matters he has been working on regarding Board policy and/or direction.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1215 hours and reconvened at 1330 hours.

Daniel Bolster: The Board reviewed Mr. Bolster's guide license application for the conduct of float boating activities under ECHO/Dick Linford, M.A., following which MSC (Crane-Baird) THAT THIS APPLICATION BE APPROVED AND LICENSE ISSUED UPON COMPLETION OF SAME.

Jeff Peavey dba Northwest Voyageurs: The Board reviewed the proposed purchase by Mr. Peavey of Bill Bender's float boating business on the Snake River from Hells Canyon downstream to Lewiston, following which MSC (Vaughn-Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE TRANSFER AND SALE OF BUSINESS PENDING COMPLETION OF THE CONTRACT BY SUBMISSION OF EXHIBIT A OUTLINING THE TANGIBLE ASSETS BEING TRANSFERRED IN SAID SALE OF BUSINESS. UPON RECEIPT OF EXHIBIT A, THE CHAIRMAN IS AUTHORIZED TO REVIEW SAME AND IF IT APPEARS REASONABLE AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE SALES CONTRACT, THE LICENSE IS TO BE ISSUED.

Targhee National Forest: Various representatives of the Targhee National Forest and Bureau of Land Management met with the Board in discussion of mutual concerns relative to licensing and permitting of outfitters on the South Fork-Snake River, Palisades Reservoir, and the McGarry Brothers proposal for a working ranch outfitting business. Following discussion and as a consequence of said discussion, the Forest Service will be forwarding to the Board for its information BLM's responsibilities on the South Fork-Snake River; namely, a Memorandum of Understanding by and between the two agencies involved; Forest Service management responsibilities on the Palisades Reservoir; and additional materials they may have on the working ranch concept.

S. C. Buttram: The Board reviewed the Buttram file relative to its status regarding nonuse and the fact that Mr. Buttram is now deceased, and in reference to the letter addressed to the Board's attorney, Steven J. Schuster, from Mrs. Buttram's attorney, Dennis R. Scott, dated April 27, 1987, MSC (Miller-Vaughn) THAT THE BOARD, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE NONUSE STATUS OF THE LICENSED ACTIVITIES AND THE FURTHER FACT THAT MR. BUTTRAM AT NO TIME HAD A FOREST SERVICE PERMIT FOR THE CONDUCT OF SAID BUSINESS, ADDRESS A LETTER TO MRS. BUTTRAM'S ATTORNEY ADVISING HIM THAT: (1) A LICENSE CANNOT AUTOMATICALLY BE TRANSFERRED TO MRS. BUTTRAM

WITHOUT HER MEETING THE QUALIFICATIONS OF AN OUTFITTER AS DEFINED IN IDAHO CODE, TITLE 36, CHAPTER 21, AND BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS PROMULGATED THEREUNDER; (2) INASMUCH AS THE LICENSE APPEARS TO BE IN NONUSE STATUS, THIS MATTER WOULD NEED TO BE RESOLVED TO THE BOARD'S SATISFACTION; AND (3) MRS. BUTTRAM WOULD NEED TO SECURE THE NECESSARY LAND MANAGING AGENCY'S APPROVAL FOR ISSUE OF A SPECIAL USE PERMIT. SHOULD MRS. BUTTRAM NOT WISH TO PURSUE THE ABOVE-REFERENCED ITEMS, THE BOARD WOULD REFUND THE LICENSE FEE SUBMITTED FOR THE 1987-1988 OUTFITTER LICENSE RENEWAL APPLICATION.

Jerry Wilcox: The Board reviewed Mr. Wilcox file and the letter from the Payette National Forest dated April 14, 1987, regarding their position in issue of a Special Use Permit, following which MSC (Baird-Miller; Vaughn abstained) THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO THE PAYETTE NATIONAL FOREST INDICATING THE BOARD'S WILLINGNESS TO LICENSE MR. WILCOX TO THE AREA FORMERLY LICENSED TO THUNDER MOUNTAIN PACKERS, INC./JERRY WILCOX, M.A. FURTHER, THAT THE BOARD THERE ARE SPECIAL CIRCUMSTANCES WHICH WOULD NEGATE THE NECESSITY OF GOING THROUGH THE COMPETITIVE PROCESS FOR PERMITTEE/LICENSEE SELECTION AND THAT WE DO BELIEVE MR. WILCOX IS QUALIFIED TO BE LICENSED AS AN OUTFITTER. FURTHER, THE BOARD DOES BELIEVE MR. WILCOX'S INTEREST AND INVOLVEMENT IN THE PREVIOUS OPERATION WARRANT FAVORABLE CONSIDERATION OF HIS APPLICATION FOR A LICENSE/PERMIT TO OPERATE A COMMERCIAL OUTFITTING BUSINESS IN THIS AREA.

Gillihan & Stoddard, Inc.: The Board reviewed the dissolution of partnership, specifically the letter from Cal Stoddard dated April 24, 1987, and attached agreement, following which MSC (Vaughn-Miller) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT THE DISSOLUTION AS OUTLINED IN SAID AGREEMENT AND THAT LETTERS BE ADDRESSED TO THE CONCERNED PARTIES ADVISING THEM OF THE BOARD'S ACTION IN THIS MATTER; FURTHER, UPON SUBMISSION OF A COMPLETED APPLICATION BY MR. GILLIHAN, THAT A 1987-1988 LICENSE BE ISSUED IN THE NAME OF ROBERT J. GILLIHAN DBA GILLIHAN'S GUIDE SERVICE; AND FURTHER, UPON REVIEW OF THE PROPOSED SALE CONTRACT BY AND BETWEEN ROBERT J. GILLIHAN DBA GILLIHAN'S GUIDE SERVICE AND JERRY JEPSON WHICH WILL IDENTIFY THAT PORTION OF THE BUSINESS BEING SOLD TO MR. JEPSON AND THAT PORTION BEING RETAINED BY MR. GILLIHAN. THAT THE BOARD APPROVE SAID SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS.

The Board recessed at 1700 hours and reconvened on Wednesday, May 6, 1987, at 0830 hours with all members present except Dale Baird.

MOU Amendment 1/Coordinating Guidelines: The Board reviewed the documents submitted by the Board's attorney Steve Schuster addressed to the Forest Service regarding this matter, following which MSC (Miller-Vaughn) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THESE DOCUMENTS AS WRITTEN AND ADDRESSED TO THE PARTIES SO INDICATED ON SAID DOCUMENTS.

Oregon River Experiences, Inc./Bob Doppelt, M.A.: The Board reviewed Mr. Doppelt's file relative to the apparent nonuse status of float boating activities on the Salmon River-Spring Bar to Hammer Creek [SA7A] and his request and submitted materials for an exception/waiver to Board Rule 53, following which MSC (Miller-Vaughn) THAT THE EXCEPTION BE GRANTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH MR. DOPPELT'S PROPOSAL. FURTHER, THAT MR. DOPPELT BE NOTIFIED OF HIS NONUSE STATUS WITH A SHOW CAUSE HEARING SCHEDULED FOR SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF FLOAT BOATING ACTIVITIES ON SA7A.

Laurence Rasmussen dba Wallowa Llamas: The Board met with Mr. Rasmussen relative to his outfitter license application to conduct llama packing in Hells Canyon, following which MSC (Crane-Vaughn) THAT MR. RASMUSSEN'S APPLICATION BE APPROVED.

Garden Valley Outfitters, Inc./Dan Rotthoff, M.A.: The Board reviewed the files regarding the 1987-1988 outfitter license renewal applications in view of Mr. Rotthoff's alleged falsification of Red Cross first aid certification cards, following which MSC (Crane-Miller) THAT THESE 1987-1988 OUTFITTER LICENSES BE DENIED PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF IDAHO CODE 36-2109(c), 36-2113(a)(1&5), AND OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD RULE AND REGULATION NO. 32.a.

Cutler Umbach dba High Llama Wilderness Tours: Mr. Umbach and Earl Dodds appeared before the Board relative to Mr. Umbach's application to be licensed as an outfitter for llama packing, summer sightseeing, fishing, photographic and educational trips in the Payette National Forest. Following the interview, MSC (Crane-Miller; Vaughn abstained) THAT THE BOARD INITIATE THE NECESSARY RESEARCH REGARDING MR. UMBACH'S APPLICATION BY: (1) CONTACTING THE FOREST SERVICE RELATIVE TO THEIR PREPARATION OF AN ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT REGARDING THIS APPLICATION WITH SPECIFIC EMPHASIS AS TO THE ONGOING INVESTIGATIONS THEY ARE MAKING REGARDING HIGH MOUNTAIN LAKES IN AT LEAST A PORTION OF THE AREA REQUESTED BY MR. UMBACH; (2) CONTACTING THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME REGARDING THE FISHING ACTIVITIES; (3) MAKING A DETERMINATION AS TO THE NEED FOR ADDITIONAL OUTFITTER ACTIVITIES IN THE REQUESTED AREA UPON RECEIPT OF RESPONSES FROM THE FOREST SERVICE AND FISH AND GAME DEPARTMENT; AND (4) CONTACTING THE AFFECTED OUTFITTERS OVER WHICH THIS AREA APPEARS TO OVERLAP. FOLLOWING RECEIPT OF THESE RESPONSES THE BOARD WILL ASSESS AND MAKE ITS DETERMINATION AT A SUBSEQUENT MEETING.

Dixie Outfitters, Inc./W. Emmett Smith, M.A.: Following an interview before the Board in which the matter of the new boundary description in the vicinity of Rabbit Point was discussed, MSC (Miller-Crane) THAT THE BOUNDARY BE ADJUSTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE AGREEMENT WITH MR. SMITH BEFORE THE BOARD TO KEEP HIS RABBIT POINT CAMP WITHIN HIS LICENSED AREA OF OPERATION.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1215 hours and reconvened at 1330 hours.

Grizzly Outfitters/David Deeds, Hank Wayman, Mike Duvall, M.A.'s: Following an interview before the Board with Messrs. Wayman and Duvall as to their applications to become Managing Agents, MSC (Crane-Vaughn) THAT THESE APPLICATIONS BE APPROVED. [Note: During the course of the interview with Messrs. Wayman & Duvall, it was stated that they have a proposed business sale for their acquiring Mr. Hoff's portion of this business at some future date at their time and pleasure of exercising this option.]

Michael J. Stockton dba Mike Stockton Outfitting: The Board met with Mr. Stockton relative to his amendment request for a proposed sale of a portion of his business to Andre Molsee, following which MSC (Vaughn-Miller; Crane abstained) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE PROPOSED SALE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE AMENDED AMENDMENT REQUEST AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE ATTACHED AREA DESCRIPTION [See Addendum #1]

B-Bar-C Outfitters, Inc./Mike Stockton, M.A.: The Board met with Mr. Stockton relative to his Managing Agent application and responsibilities, following which MSC (Crane-Vaughn) THAT MR. STOCKTON BE RE-ISSUED A 1987-1988 LICENSE AS MANAGING AGENT FOR B-BAR-C IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE SUBMITTED OPERATION PLAN REQUESTED BY THE BOARD.

Philip M. Krueger dba RamsHorn Guest Ranch: Messrs. Krueger, Dave Peterson, Clarence & Harry Piche, Bill Goosman, and Clint Groll met with the Board regarding the proposed transfer of the RamsHorn Guest Ranch business from Dr. Krueger to Mr. Piche to Mr. Peterson. Following this meeting, it is the Board's position to table this matter until certain legal matters are resolved regarding the licensed area to RamsHorn Guest Ranch; hence, the transfer of area associated with the sale of the business. Hopefully this matter can be resolved to enable final Board action at its June Board meeting.

David L. Peterson: The Board reviewed Mr. Peterson's file, following which MSC (Vaughn-Crane) THAT MR. PETERSON'S 1987-1988 OUTFITTER LICENSE BE APPROVED.

The Board recessed at 1550 hours and reconvened on Thursday, May 7, 1987, at 0830 hours with all members present.

Richard R. Reinwald: The Board reviewed Mr. Reinwald's amendment request to add fishing on the Clark Fork and Pend Oreille Rivers, following which MSC (Baird-Miller) THAT THE REQUEST BE TABLED PENDING RECEIPT OF A COMPLETED APPLICATION AND INPUT FROM THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME REGARDING THIS REQUEST.

The Trout Shop, Inc./Fred Terwilliger, M.A.: The Board reviewed the file on this matter, following which MSC (Baird-Vaughn) THAT: (1) THE LICENSE BE ISSUED TO THE TROUT SHOP, INC./FRED TERWILLIGER, M.A. THE SAME AS LAST YEAR; AND (2) MR. CRINER BE ADVISED THAT HE WOULD NEED TO SUBMIT ADDITIONAL INFORMATION TO COMPLETE THE PROPOSED TRANSFER OF BUSINESS BETWEEN HE AND MR. LILLY, NAMELY EXHIBITS A, B, AND C TO THE BILL OF SALE AND AN OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION AT THE POINT AND TIME HE WISHES TO EXERCISE HIS OPTION TO BECOME THE OUTFITTER.

Holiday River Expeditions/Frogg Stewart, M.A.: The Board reviewed the file regarding Holiday River Expeditions' proposed purchase of the Marty Riddle boating business on the Snake River-Hells Canyon Dam to Lewiston [SN7 & SN8], following which MSC (Miller-Crane) THAT THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS BE APPROVED.

Rod Nash: The Board reviewed Mr. Nash's application to be licensed as a guide, following which MSC (Miller-Vaughn) THAT MR. NASH BE ISSUED A 1987-1988 GUIDE LICENSE ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS DUE TO THE FACT THAT HE HAS AN OUTSTANDING IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH & GAME CITATION DATING FROM 1978 WHICH HAS NOT BEEN RECONCILED AND, FURTHER, THAT A LETTER SHOULD BE ADDRESSED TO MR. NASH INQUIRING AS TO HIS PLANS IN CLEARING UP SAID VIOLATION.

Bret Hincks: Following an interview with Mr. Hincks regarding the transfer of the outfitting business from his father to him as the outfitter of record, MSC (Baird-Vaughn) THAT THE TRANSFER OF BUSINESS BE APPROVED PENDING THE COMPLETION OF THE APPLICATION WITH THE ADDITIONAL INFORMATION AS WAS REQUESTED PLUS THE AMENDMENT TO ELVIN HINCKS' LICENSE TO ADD GOAT AND MOOSE HUNTING.

Roger Knight: Mr. Knight met with the Board relative to being licensed as an outfitter for the conduct of summer recreational activities in the Cassia Division of the Sawtooth National Forest, following which MSC (Baird-Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. KNIGHT'S APPLICATION PENDING COMPLETION OF SAME.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1210 hours and reconvened at 1320 hours.

Michael R. Seal: The Board met with Mr. Seal regarding his becoming the Managing Agent under Ray Seal's license dba High Country Outfitters, following which MSC (Miller-Crane) THAT THE APPLICATION BE APPROVED AND LICENSE ISSUED PENDING COMPLETION OF THE APPLICATION.

Boise State University/Glenn Potter, M.A.: The Board reviewed BSU's amendment request to add llama packing in the Owyhee County Big Jacks Creek area, following which MSC (Vaughn-Crane) THAT THE AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED PENDING COMPLETION AND PAYMENT OF AMENDMENT FEE.

Scott G. Schnebly: The Board met with Mr. Schnebly regarding his application to become the Managing Agent for The Snug Company, following which MSC (Vaughn-Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVED MR. SCHNEBLY'S APPLICATION.

James A. Henson, Jr.: The Board reviewed Mr. Henson's guide license application, following which MSC (Miller-Vaughn) THAT MR. HENSON'S APPLICATION BE APPROVED.

Policy-Fish & Game Citations: MSC (Miller-Vaughn) WHEN THE IOGB STAFF DOES A COMPUTER CHECK THAT RESULTS IN AN OUTFITTER OR GUIDE APPLICANT HAVING RECEIVED A FISH & GAME WARNING TICKET OR A CITATION WHERE THE ACTION HAS EITHER BEEN DISMISSED OR THE DEFENDANT ACQUITTED OF THE ALLEGED VIOLATION OF FISH & GAME LAW, THE STAFF SHOULD PUT A COPY OF THE TICKET IN THE APPLICANT'S FILE BUT PROCEED TO ISSUE THE APPLICABLE LICENSE.

Wayne Hill, Jr.: The Board reviewed Mr. Hill's file relative to his application for a guide license, following which MSC (Crane-Baird) THAT MR. HILL'S LICENSE BE ISSUED.

Matthew W. Bartley: The Board reviewed Mr. Bartley's file regarding the issue of a 1987-1988 guide license, following which MSC (Vaughn-Crane; Miller abstained) THAT THE LICENSE BE APPROVED.

Jimmie Raymond Scott: The Board reviewed Mr. Scott's file and the guide license application, following which MSC (Baird-Vaughn) THAT A PROBATIONARY LICENSE BE ISSUED BASED ON THE MATTER OF FALSIFYING THE ANSWER TO THE QUESTION IN SECTION D OF VIOLATION OF IDAHO OR ANY OTHER STATE OR FEDERAL GAME LAW.

Jeff Curtis Fairman: The Board reviewed the file and Mr. Fairman's guide license application, following which MSC (Vaughn-Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THIS APPLICATION.

Payette River Company/Randy Brink, M.A.: The Board reviewed the file on this matter, following which MSC (Baird-Crane) THAT THE LICENSE BE ISSUED.

Charles Ray Weddle/Darrell Weddle: Messrs. Weddle met with the Board regarding their proposed restructuring of their outfitting business, following which MSC (Baird-Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE: (1) THE AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE ADDITION OF FISHING IN THE COLD SPRINGS PEAK AND ELIZABETH MOUNTAIN AREAS AS REQUESTED BY CHUCK WEDDLE; (2) THE CHANGE OF BUSINESS STRUCTURE TO A CORPORATE OPERATION, NAMELY THE CEE BAR DEE OUTFITTERS, INC.; AND (3) DARRELL AND CHARLES RAY WEDDLE BE THE DESIGNATED MANAGING AGENTS OF THE ABOVE PENDING COMPLETION OF THE APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS. FURTHER, THE AMENDMENT FOR THE ADDITION OF BEAR AND COUGAR HUNTING TO CEE BAR DEE OUTFITTERS, INC. BE APPROVED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE MODIFIED AREA DESCRIPTION AS UNDERSTOOD BY MESSRS. WEDDLE AND THE BOARD TO EXCLUDE THAT AREA LICENSED TO ANOTHER OUTFITTER.

Lolo Creek Outfitters, Inc./Charles Weddle, M.A.: The Board reviewed the file and following the interview with the individuals involved in this proposed application for outfitter licenses, MSC (Baird-Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE REQUEST PENDING SUBMISSION OF AN AMENDED APPLICATION WITH THE FOLLOWING PROVISIONS: (1) THAT THE AREA BOUNDARIES BE ADJUSTED TO CONFORM WITH THE DISCUSSION REGARDING THE EXCLUSION OF BOB SMITH'S LICENSED AREA WHICH IS CURRENTLY INCLUDED; AND (2) THAT THE LICENSE PROVISION ALSO BE LIMITED TO NOT MORE THAN FOUR (4) HUNTERS PER WEEK ON THOSE LANDS THAT ARE ALSO OPEN TO PUBLIC HUNTING, IE: THE STATE, BLM, AND POTLATCH HUNTING AREAS.

Steve J. Wieber dba Happy Hooker Excursions: The Board reviewed the file and the application for renewal for the 1987-1988 license year, following which MSC (Baird-Crane) THAT THE MATTER BE TABLED TO THE JUNE MEETING AND LICENSE HELD FOR BOARD ACTION AT THAT TIME.

The Board recessed at 1735 hours and reconvened on Friday, May 8, 1987, at 0825 hours with all members present.

Michael Scott: The Board reviewed the file on this matter, following which MSC (Miller-Baird) THAT IT BE TABLED AND RECONSIDERED AT A FUTURE TIME.

Sun Valley Helicopter Ski Guides, Inc./Carl Rixen, M.A.: The Board reviewed the file and Forest Service letter regarding the Board's denial of this amendment request, following which MSC (Vaughn-Baird) THAT THE BOARD AFFIRM ITS POSITION TO THE FOREST SERVICE, EXPLAINING TO THEM THAT, IN VIEW OF THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME RECOMMENDATIONS AND THE FURTHER FACT THAT THE AREA IS CURRENTLY LICENSED TO SEVERAL OUTFITTERS OFFERING THE

SAME SERVICES, THE BOARD BELIEVES ITS DECISION JUST BUT THAT IT COULD REVIEW THIS IN A YEAR'S TIME TO RE-ASSESS THE SITUATION IF THERE IS ANY CHANGE. ALSO, IF THE FOREST SERVICE WOULD LIKE TO DISCUSS THIS WITH THE BOARD, PLEASE ADVISE AND WE CAN ARRANGE SUCH A MEETING.

John Knight aka Idaho River Expeditions, Inc.: The Board met with Mr. Knight regarding the proposal to restructure the business operation of Steve Currey Expeditions, Inc. to Idaho River Expeditions, Inc., following which MSC (Miller-Vaughn) THAT THE PROPOSAL BE APPROVED WITH JOHN B. KNIGHT III DESIGNATED AS THE MANAGING AGENT. FURTHER, IN THAT HE, AT THE MOMENT, IS NOT TRAINED TO GUIDE ON THE RIVER SECTIONS, THE BOARD ACCEPT THE EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT WITH LANE GILES AS LEAD BOATMAN ON THE MIDDLE FORK OF THE SALMON RIVER.

John Charles McGregor dba Sun Valley Rivers: The Board reviewed Mr. McGregor's outfitter license amendment request to add chukar hunting along those rivers to which he is licensed for boating, following which MSC (Miller-Vaughn) THAT THE AMENDMENT BE APPROVED.

James E. Champion dba J & J Outfitters: The Board reviewed Mr. Champion's license amendment request to add the Teton River [TE1, TE2, & TE3] for fishing, float and power boating activities, following which MSC (Crane-Miller) THAT THE AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED. [This license slot now fills the available space on the Teton River.]

Ted Epley dba Epley's Idaho Outdoor Adventures: The Board reviewed Mr. Epley's amendment request to add trail use on Forest Service Trails 141, 081, and 084 [namely, the Ruby Creek, Loon Creek, and Secesh River to Loon Creek Trails], following which MSC (Baird-Vaughn) THAT THE BOARD ADVISE MR. EPLEY IT WILL CONDUCT RESEARCH WITH THE FOREST SERVICE REGARDING HIS REQUEST ALONG WITH THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME TO EXPLORE THE OPPORTUNITY TO ADD THIS PERMANENTLY TO HIS LICENSE. MEANWHILE, HIS AMENDMENT REQUEST IS APPROVED FOR THIS YEAR ONLY PENDING COMPLETION (AMENDMENT FEE/FOREST SERVICE SPECIAL USE PERMIT).

Earl R. Keating, Jr.: The Board reviewed the file in this matter regarding the nonuse status of Mr. Keating's cougar hunting in the Lemhi joint-use area noting Mr. Keating's letter of April 7, 1987, addressed to the Board in which he states that his cougar hunting will be conducted as an incidental activity associated with other hunting activities and that he does not hunt cougar in the joint spring use area, following which MSC (Crane-Vaughn) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT MR. KEATING'S EXPLANATION OF HIS HUNTING ACTIVITIES AND DELETE MR. KEATING FROM THE LEMHI BEAR/COUGAR HUNTING AREA.

Stanley P. Meholchick dba Juniper Mountain Outfitters: The Board reviewed the file in this matter, following which MSC (Baird-Miller) THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO THE FOREST SERVICE IN RESPONSE TO THEIR LETTER DATED MARCH 27, 1987, AS SIGNED BY CHUCK JONES, DISTRICT RANGER OF THE CASCADE RANGER DISTRICT, REGARDING THIS MATTER TO EXPLAIN THE BOARD'S POSITION THAT INASMUCH AS MR. MEHOLCHICK HAS APPEALED THE FOREST SERVICE'S DECISION, IT WILL TAKE NO ACTION ON THE MATTER UNTIL THE APPEAL PROCESS HAS BEEN EXHAUSTED.

Andre K. Molsee dba Shattuck Creek Ranch and Outfitters: Mr. Molsee met with the Board to discuss his plans for operation of the ranch inclusive of his purchase of a portion of Mike Stockton's business, following which MSC (Crane-Baird) THAT: (1) THE BOARD APPROVE THE PURCHASE OF A PORTION OF THE MIKE STOCKTON BUSINESS AS IS OUTLINED IN THE SALES AGREEMENT; (2) MIKE STOCKTON'S LICENSED ACTIVITIES AND AREA OF OPERATION BE ADJUSTED ACCORDINGLY; AND (3) ANDRE MOLSEE'S AREA DESCRIPTION BE REVISED TO REFLECT THE NEW AREA OF OPERATION [see Addendum 2]. [The Board reviewed with Mr. Molsee the proposed sale of his cougar hunting activities in Fish & Game Management Units 11 & 13 and indicated to him that upon receipt of a sales agreement to a qualified applicant, the Board would consider same. And in like manner, the proposed acquisition by Mr. Molsee of a portion of Zeke West's business, namely float boating activities on the Clearwater River-Orofino to Lewiston [CL3] and the purchase of bear hunting activities in Fish & Game Management Unit 10. Further, in regard to Mr. Molsee's question as to his ability to, on a one-time basis only, provide transport of rented canoes from his lodge to the St. Joe River in the vicinity of Avery, that upon a letter received outlining the criteria and circumstances surrounding this proposed one-time only activity, that the Board would grant said permission for the conduct of this activity. And lastly, concerning the possible litigation against Willard Woodby on the civil matter, the Board's advice was that it would need to receive the details of said proposed litigation for review by its attorney and his recommendation following said review.]

Idaho Guide Service, Inc./Olin Gardner, M.A./Dave Fisher: The Board met with Messrs. Gardner and Fisher regarding the proposed sale of the Payette River from Banks to Black Canyon Dam [PA1] portion of Mr. Gardner's business to Mr. Fisher, following which MSC (Miller-Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE PROPOSED SALE PENDING COMPLETION OF SUBMITTED MATERIALS; NAMELY, A SIGNED RELEASE FROM JIM POWELL AND A LIST OF TANGIBLE ASSETS BEING TRANSFERRED IN THE SALE.

Wally Beamer dba Rivers Navigation: The Board reviewed the file on this matter and the apparent nonuse of power boating on the Salmon River-Vinegar Creek to Hammer Creek [SA7A], following which MSC (Baird-Crane) THAT MR. BEAMER BE NOTIFIED OF HIS NONUSE STATUS AND ASKED TO COME BEFORE THE BOARD AT ITS JUNE BOARD MEETING.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1200 hours and reconvened at 1330 hours.

J. Hulme Dunford: The Board met with Mr. Dunford to discuss his understanding of the boundary area description between himself and Marriner Jensen in Fish & Game Management Unit 78. Hopefully this was explained to Mr. Dunford's satisfaction.

Weldon Reynolds: The Board reviewed the file on this matter and concurs in the issuance of Mr. Reynolds' license for the 1987-1988 license year.

Nichols River Expeditions, Inc./Chuck Nichols, M.A.: The Board reviewed the file to note the apparent nonuse of float boating activities on the Salmon River-Spring Bar to Hammer Creek [SA7A], following which MSC (Baird-Crane) THAT THE BOARD NOTIFY MR. NICHOLS OF THE NONUSE STATUS OF THIS PORTION OF HIS LICENSE AND SCHEDULE A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR THE SUSPENSION/REVOCATION OF THIS LICENSED PRIVILEGE.

Big Creek Lodge & Outfitters, Inc./Bret Manly, M.A.: The Board reviewed the file relative to the apparent nonuse of cougar hunting, fishing, and snowmobiling, following which MSC (Baird-Vaughn) THAT THESE ACTIVITIES APPEAR TO BE INCIDENTAL IN CONNECTION WITH HIS MAJOR THRUST OF BIG GAME HUNTING AND, THEREFORE, NOT CONSIDERED IN NONUSE STATUS AT THIS POINT.

Steven W. Shepard dba Salmon River Outfitters: The Board reviewed the file relative to the apparent nonuse on the Salmon River-Spring Bar to Hammer Creek [SA7A], following which MSC (Miller-Baird) THAT DUE TO THE DEFINITE USE MADE ON THIS RIVER REACH DURING THE 1986-1987 SEASON, THAT THIS NOT BE DECLARED IN NONUSE STATUS AT THIS POINT IN TIME AND MR. SHEPARD BE GIVEN ANOTHER YEAR TO SEE WHAT HAPPENS.

MOU-Salmon National Forest/BLM: The Board reviewed the MOU regarding the river reach from Iron Creek to North Fork, following which the Board directs that a letter be addressed to both the Salmon National Forest and the BLM expressing its appreciation for their action in this matter.

Challis Ranger District: The Board reviewed a letter dated March 30, 1987, relative to their apparent intent of excluding outfitting and guiding activities in certain areas within Fish & Game Management Units 17, 19, and 21, following which the Board directs that a letter be addressed to the Challis Ranger District thanking them for making the Board aware of their proposed actions and asking that they do, in fact, provide the Board a complete update on decisions made at that time when the Challis Forest Plan is approved, but prior to that time the Board would appreciate receiving the rationale and/or basis for the exclusion of outfitting and guiding use as is proposed for Board review and comment.

Idaho Panhandle National Forest: The Board reviewed the letter dated April 17, 1987, regarding their proposed evaluation of potential outfitter and guide service within the Salmo-Priest Wilderness area and within portions of the grizzly bear and caribou habitat identified on the Priest Lake, Bonners Ferry, and Sullivan Lake Ranger District, following which the Board directs that a letter be addressed to the Forest Service thanking them for their letter and stating that the Board, at this point in time, has no input to make but would appreciate working with them in drafting a final decision in this matter in accordance with the MOU guidelines.

Northern Idaho Lakes: The Board reviewed the communication from the Idaho Department of Fish & Game dated April 27, 1987, regarding their concerns and the accompanying biological data that they have provided relative to this matter. Further, and in consideration of the concern as has been expressed by certain of the northern Idaho charter fishing boat operators, MSC (Baird-Crane) THAT THIS MATTER BE TAKEN UNDER CONSIDERATION FOR THE NEXT RULES-MAKING SESSION AND THAT THE BOARD CONTACT THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH & GAME, THE CHARTER FISHING BOAT OPERATORS, AND OTHER INTERESTED PARTIES IN ATTEMPTING TO DRAFT SOME ROUGH RULES APPLICABLE TO ADDRESS THIS SITUATION, NOT ONLY FOR THE NORTHERN IDAHO LAKES BUT FOR OTHER LAKES AND RESERVOIRS FOR WHICH THE BOARD IS EXERCISING ITS AUTHORITY WITH THE INTENT THAT SAID DRAFT RULES BE IN PLACE FOR CONSIDERATION FOR THE NEXT RULES-MAKING PROCEDURE IN LATE FALL 1987 OR EARLY 1988. FURTHER, THAT JOE BLACKBURN SHOULD BE CONTACTED AND HARRY VAUGHN, IF HE IS AVAILABLE, AND BOTH ASKED TO SERVE AS CONTACT INDIVIDUALS TO INITIATE AND FORMALIZE THE FOREGOING ACTIVITIES WITH DRAFT RULES AS A PRODUCT OF THEIR EFFORTS.

IOPA: The Board reviewed the IOPA communication dated April 7, 1987, following which: (1) The Board directs that approved Board Minutes be copied and sent to the IOPA for their information and

use. (2) The Board will pursue the attempting of getting a better definition and classification of hunting guides to update and improve the professional expertise of said guides. (3) After a review of the proposal and resolution regarding licensing procedures for hunting guides, the Board declines to implement this recommendation and will follow the guidelines and rule as currently enacted.

Implementation of Amendment to Rule 57: The Board discussed the selection of five (5) float boat operators on the Salmon River-Slate Creek to the First Highway 93 Bridge above Challis [new SA2] and for the selection of two (2) float boating steelhead fishing slots on the Salmon River-Iron Creek to North Fork [SA4B], following which the Board instructs the Administrative Secretary to send notices of inquiry and interest to those individuals on the consideration list plus others who have indicated or may indicate an interest in this matter with all such inquiries and plans of operation to be postmarked by June 22, 1987, for Board consideration and selection at its June Board meeting. Further, that the currently designated SA2 [Salmon River-First Highway 93 Bridge above Challis to Iron Creek] be redesignated as SA3.

Ed Peterson: The Board reviewed Mr. Peterson's file on his amendment request to add fishing and trailrides to his licensed activities to be conducted within the area to which he is currently licensed, following which MSC (Crane-Vaughn) THAT MR. PETERSON'S AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED.

Fred S. Ehlert dba Alpenhaus Motel & Fly Shop: The Board reviewed Mr. Ehlert's amendment request to add float tubing and fly fishing on Henry's Lake, following which MSC (Vaughn-Miller) THAT THE BOARD DENY MR. EHLERT'S AMENDMENT REQUEST PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b)(4&5) AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE RECOMMENDATIONS MADE BY THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH & GAME IN THEIR LETTER DATED APRIL 22, 1987.

Henry's Fork Anglers, Inc./Mike Lawson, M.A.: The Board reviewed Mr. Lawson's amendment request to add fishing, float boating, and forest grouse hunting to his licensed activities, following which MSC (Vaughn-Baird) THAT MR. LAWSON'S REQUEST FOR WADE FISHING ON FALL RIVER BE APPROVED, THAT FLOAT BOATING/FISHING ON THE HENRY'S FORK OF THE SNAKE RIVER FROM ST. ANTHONY TO THE CONFLUENCE [SH3] BE APPROVED, BUT THAT HIS REQUEST FOR BIRD HUNTING BE DENIED. IT SHOULD ALSO BE POINTED OUT THAT ACCORDING TO BOARD RECORDS, MR. LAWSON IS NOT LICENSED FOR CHUKAR HUNTING.

Sandy Liman: The Board reviewed Mr. Liman's letter of inquiry regarding his proposed activities for the conduct of mountain bike tours on the Sawtooth and Challis National Forests wherein he asks whether it would come under the purview of the Outfitters and Guides Act, following which the Board directs that a letter be addressed to Mr. Liman advising him that it would appear these activities do come under the purview of the Act, but to ask whether he has contacted the Forest Service regarding his proposed activities and what their response may be in requiring a Special Use Permit and granting of same. Following receipt of this additional information, the Board will make a final determination as to the conduct of these activities.

Nancy Bukus: The Board reviewed Ms. Bukus' letter received May 5, 1987, regarding her proposal to accommodate retired men and women in the Ashton/Henry's Fork area with specific reference to whether or not her fishing activities fall under the purview of the Outfitters and Guides Act. Following consideration of Ms. Bukus' letter and proposal, the Board directs that a letter be addressed to her asking for clarification of intent regarding the proposed fishing activity. If said fishing was not advertised and was merely an incidental, infrequent, and unplanned activity, such activity would be considered outside the scope of the Outfitters and Guides Act. If, however, the proposed fishing was an advertised, planned service to clientele, said activity would fall within the purview of the Act requiring the necessity of her being licensed as an outfitter.


Complaints: The Board reviewed the complaints on file, following which it directs the Chairman to take appropriate action.
