

MINUTES

IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD

June 29-July 3, 1987
Boardroom - Boise, Idaho

A regular meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Board convened at 0830 hours on Monday, June 29, 1987 with all members present.

Steve Schuster: The Board met with its attorney to discuss various matters of interest and to update status of investigations for which the Board has requested his assistance.

David L. Whitworth dba Hammerhead Outfitters: Following a hearing before the Board relative to the Board's denial of relicensing Mr. Whitworth for the 1987-1988 license year, MSC (Baird-Vaughn) BASED ON MR. WHITWORTH'S TESTIMONY THAT HE IS ACTIVELY PURSUING COMPLETION OF HIS APPLICATION FOR A SPECIAL USE PERMIT FROM THE FOREST SERVICE, THAT THE BOARD HOLD IN ABEYANCE ITS DENIAL AND WILL ISSUE AN OUTFITTER LICENSE PROVIDED THAT THE SPECIAL USE PERMIT IS OBTAINED WITH A COPY IN THE BOARD'S OFFICE NOT LATER THAN AUGUST 15, 1987. IF THE SPECIAL USE PERMIT HAS NOT BEEN OBTAINED BY SAID DATE, THE BOARD AFFIRM ITS DENIAL OF MR. WHITWORTH'S APPLICATION. COPIES OF THIS LETTER TO BE SENT TO THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH & GAME AND FOREST SERVICE.

Bob Jacklin and Randy Berry: Mr. Jacklin of Jacklin's Fly Shop, Inc. and Mr. Berry of Teton Valley Lodge met with the Board to discuss various problems of licensing outfitters and guides in eastern Idaho. Following this meeting, the Board stated it would take their concerns under advisement and requested that if they believed it necessary to impose limitations on certain waters [namely, the South Fork of the Snake River], to submit the necessary paperwork for going to rules-making procedure. Additionally, Mr. Jacklin's amendment request to add certain walk and wade fishing on certain waters in the Island Park area together with fishing on Island Park Reservoir and Henry's Lake was discussed and the Board advised it would initiate the necessary research and would get back to him with its response as early as possible.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1230 hours and reconvened at 1330 hours.

George Duncan: The Board met with Mr. Duncan to discuss various aspects of his outfitter license; namely: (1) complaint of illegal outfitting activities within his licensed area; (2) the possible resolution of a stacked situation between himself and Zeke West for bear and cougar hunting; and (3) the licensing of

McManus catering to the handicapped in an area which in part would overlap Mr. Duncan's currently licensed area. Let the record show that Mr. Duncan's testimony has been duly noted and that these matters will be considered in further processing of licenses regarding these matters. For the record: James McManus et al attended this interview before the Board as "interested parties".

Glenn A. Vitucci: The Board interviewed Mr. Vitucci relative to his outfitter license application to be licensed for the conduct of cross-country skiing in the Teton Basin area, following which MSC (Vaughn-Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THIS LICENSE APPLICATION FOR DAY/OVERNIGHT OPERATION ON PRIVATE AND BLM LANDS SUBJECT TO APPROVAL BY THE AFFECTED PRIVATE LANDOWNERS THAT MR. VITUCCI HAS AUTHORITY TO OPERATE ON THEIR LANDS, AND FURTHER THAT MR. VITUCCI WILL BE ISSUED A LICENSE FOR DAY-USE ONLY PENDING COMPLETION BY THE FOREST SERVICE OF AN E.A. IF APPROVED, THIS USE WOULD BE ADDED AT A LATER DATE BY ADMINISTRATIVE AMENDMENT. FURTHER, THAT MR. VITUCCI BE REMINDED THAT HIS FIRST AID CARD WILL EXPIRE IN DECEMBER AND THAT HE SHOULD RENEW SAME BEFORE THAT DATE.

John H. Stover: The Board reviewed Mr. Stover's amendment request to add fishing and trailrides within that area to which he is currently licensed for other activities, following which MSC (Vaughn-Crane) THAT THIS AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED.

Todd Molitor dba Cat Track Outfitters: The Board reviewed Mr. Molitor's amendment request for bear and cougar hunting in Fish and Game Management Unit 44, following which MSC (Baird-Crane) THAT PURSUANT TO INPUT BY THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME, THIS APPLICATION BE DENIED. AUTHORITY FOR THIS IS FOUND IN IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b)(5) AND BOARD RULE 24.c.

Richard R. Reinwald: The Board reviewed Mr. Reinwald's amendment request to be licensed for fishing activities on the Clark Fork River from the Montana Stateline to Lake Pend Oreille [CF1] and on the Pend Oreille River [PO1]. Following a review of this file, MSC (Miller-Crane) THAT MR. REINWALD'S AMENDMENT REQUEST BE DENIED BASED ON AUTHORITY OF IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b)(5) AND BOARD RULE 24.b.

Nolan F. Woods: The Board reviewed Mr. Woods' amendment request to allow the transport of hunters along those river sections on which he is licensed for power boating activities, following which MSC (Miller-Baird) THAT THIS AMENDMENT REQUEST BE DENIED AS BOARD RULE 49 PRECLUDES SUCH ACTIVITY.

The Board recessed at 1730 hours and reconvened at 0830 hours on Tuesday, June 30, 1987 with all members present.

Mark Russell: Mr. Russell met with the Board regarding his amendment request to expand his area of operation and licensed activities. Following a review of these matters, Mr. Russell was advised to revise his requested area of operation to define either trails proposed for use and/or specific boundaries to encompass a reasonable area within which to conduct licensed activities. Mr. Russell was rescheduled as he could be worked in later in the week to enable appropriate Board consideration of his amendment request.

Dick McAfee and David L. Peterson: The Board met with Messrs. McAfee and Peterson regarding the purchase and transfer of business by and between RamsHorn Guest Ranch and Mr. Peterson, following which MSC (Crane-Baird) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE SALE OF BUSINESS (RAMSHORN GUEST RANCH) TO MR. DAVE PETERSON IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE FOLLOWING STIPULATIONS: (1) THAT RAMSHORN GUEST RANCH BE LICENSED TO THAT AREA OF OPERATION EXCLUSIVE OF THAT PORTION OF THEIR PREVIOUS AREA OF OPERATION KNOWN AS THE JERRY MEYERS' AREA (THAT BUSINESS ACQUIRED BY DR. PHILIP KRUEGER AS A PORTION OF THE FORMER RAMSHORN OPERATION) [See Addendum #2]; (2) THAT LICENSE WILL BE ISSUED UPON RECEIPT OF AN AMENDMENT OF THE ORIGINAL McAFEE/PICHE SALES CONTRACT AS TO TERMS, ETC. OF SAID CONTRACT; (3) A RELEASE IS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD BY WHICH MR. PICHE INDICATES HE HAS NO FURTHER INTEREST IN THE RAMSHORN GUEST RANCH OPERATION ONCE TERMS OF SALES CONTRACT HAVE BEEN MET; (4) AN ASSUMED NAME CERTIFICATE IS RECEIVED SHOWING THAT A NAME CHANGE FROM RAMSHORN GUEST RANCH TO DOUBLE FORK LODGE IS PROPERLY MADE AND RECORDED; AND (5) IT IS THE BOARD'S FURTHER POSITION THAT THAT AREA ACQUIRED BY DR. PHILIP DRUEGER (JERRY MEYERS' AREA) BE AND IS DEEMED AN UNLICENSABLE AREA UNLESS ACQUIRED BY AND MADE PART OF AN ADJOINING LICENSED AREA OF OPERATION. [See Addendum #1]

Jim Thrash dba Wagon Wheel Corrals: Mr. James West appeared before the Board as the prospective Managing Agent for Wagon Wheel Corrals upon the purchase and transfer of business from Michael Ducharme to Jim Thrash. Following this interview, MSC (Baird-Crane) THAT THE AMENDMENT TO MR. THRASH'S OUTFITTER LICENSE BE APPROVED FOR HIS ACQUIRING OF THE MICHAEL DUCHARME dba WILDHORSE TRAILRIDES AND STABLES BUSINESS UPON COMPLETION OF APPLICATION; FURTHER, THAT MR. JAMES SCOTT WEST BE APPROVED AS MANAGING AGENT UNDER MR. THRASH'S OUTFITTER LICENSE; AND FURTHER, THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO MR. DUCHARME ADVISING HIM OF THE BOARD'S ACTION WITH THE FURTHER UNDERSTANDING THAT HE HAS NO FURTHER INTEREST IN THE WILDHORSE TRAILRIDES AND STABLES BUSINESS AS WAS SET FORTH IN THE AGREEMENT OF SALE DATED MAY 22, 1987 AND SIGNED BY BOTH HIMSELF AND MR. THRASH.

Omnisports dba The Snug Co.: The Board reviewed the amendment request for additional activities/areas, following which MSC (Crane-Vaughn) THAT THE REQUEST FOR MOUNTAIN BIKE TOURING BE APPROVED; THAT THE REQUEST FOR FISHING AS DELINEATED ON THE FOREST SERVICE PERMIT BE APPROVED, BUT THAT FISHING IS NOT APPROVED ON THOSE WATERS ADJACENT TO THE MOUNTAIN BIKE TOURING ROUTES EXCEPT AS DESIGNATED ON THEIR AREA DESCRIPTION.

Sun Valley Wilderness Outfitters: The Board reviewed Managing Agent R. J. Lewy's amendment request to be licensed for dinner rides, hayrides, pack trips, fishing, trailrides, and backpacking activities in the Wilson Creek/Trail Creek drainages of the Ketchum Ranger District, following which MSC (Baird-Miller) THAT THE AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED TO ADD THE WILSON CREEK DRAINAGE TO THE CURRENTLY LICENSED AREA OF OPERATION WHICH IS INCLUSIVE OF THE TRAIL CREEK DRAINAGE.

The Board recessed at 1155 hours for lunch and reconvened at 1315 hours.

Jim McManus: Jim McManus et al [Mary Ann McManus; Linda Pall, the McManus' attorney; & other interested parties, including George Duncan] met with the Board to discuss their outfitter license application relative to the handicapped, following which MSC (Baird-Miller with all members casting "aye" votes) THAT THE BOARD GO INTO EXECUTIVE SESSION IN ACCORDANCE WITH IDAHO CODE 67-2345(f) TO DISCUSS MATTERS OF LITIGATION. The Executive Session began at 1440 hours and ended at 1452 hours with no formal action being taken during the session. Following this Executive Session, the Board advised the McManus' it would reschedule a time for further discussion/questions for 1500 hours.

Frank DeLeo, Jr.: The Board met with Mr. DeLeo relative to his application to become the Managing Agent for Hole-in-the-Wall Lodge, following which MSC (Miller-Vaughn) THAT THIS APPLICATION BE APPROVED.

David Ramsey dba Ramsey's Idaho Trails: The Board considered Mr. Ramsey's amendment request to add trailrides in what he has identified as the City of Rocks area but which, in fact, involves an area considerably more extensive and outside the "Silent City of Rocks" designated area. Following a review of this matter, MSC (Miller-Vaughn) THAT THE AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED [See Addendum #2].

Lazy J Outfitters, Inc./Larry Jarrett, M.A.: The Board reviewed Mr. Jarrett's letter concerning his expressed desire to permit outfitters to take game in another outfitter's area within rifle

shot of ingress or egress trails to his licensed area as well as being able to do the same adjacent to the prescribed boundaries of his licensed area. Following a discussion of this matter, the Board directs that a letter be written to Mr. Jarrett advising him that to do so would be a violation of Idaho Code 36-2109(b) and Board Rule 5.a.

Stan Meholchick dba Juniper Mountain Outfitters: Mr. Meholchick notified the Board he would be unable to keep his appointment due to illness and requested his appointment be rescheduled for the September Board meeting.

James McManus: Mr. McManus et al again met with the Board to continue and finalize their presentation and/or respond to questions by the Board regarding their application to provide services to the handicapped. Following these discussions/questions and in consideration of the further material submitted by the McManus', the Board advised the McManus' and their attorney Linda Pall that such discussions/questions, data and further materials would be reviewed and decision made. Linda Pall requested that they be present during Board deliberations/decision proceedings; accordingly, 0900 hours on July 1, 1987 was scheduled for final Board action on this matter. For the record, George Duncan attended this interview before the Board as an "interested party".

Kimberland Meadows/Ralph W. Bass, M.A.: The Board reconsidered the previously tabled amendment request [see May Board Minutes, page 3] regarding Area C. Following a review of the file on this matter and in consideration of an apparent overlap and uncertainty of just what is being requested, MSC (Miller-Baird) THAT THE BOARD RESCIND APPROVAL OF AREA A [SEE MARCH BOARD MINUTES, p. 3]; CONTINUE TO TABLE ACTION ON AREA C; AND REQUEST MR. BASS TO COME BEFORE THE BOARD TO ENABLE DISCUSSION AND CLARIFICATION OF THE KIMBERLAND MEADOWS' AMENDMENT REQUEST AS REGARDS AREAS A AND C.

The Board recessed at 1725 hours and reconvened on Wednesday, July 1, 1987 at 0825 hours with all members present.

John V. Rose dba Bar 44 Outfitters: The Board reviewed the file regarding the Forest Service's request to reconsider the Board's position relative to Mr. Rose's performance rating, following which MSC (Miller-Baird) THAT MR. ROSE BE REQUESTED TO COME BEFORE THE BOARD ON A SHOW CAUSE HEARING AS TO WHY HIS LICENSE SHOULD NOT BE SUSPENDED OR REVOKED BASED ON: (1) ALLEGED SERIOUS FISH AND GAME VIOLATIONS, AND (2) VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2109(c), 36-2113(A)(6&14), AND OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS 8(a) AND 8(b)(ii).

Mark Russell: The Board reviewed Mr. Russell's amendment requests to extend his area of operation in an area adjacent to his currently licensed area on the Payette National Forest and a new area in the Boise National Forest, following which MSC (Baird-Crane) THAT THE CURRENTLY LICENSED AREA ON THE PAYETTE NATIONAL FOREST BE MODIFIED AND EXTENDED TO EMBRACE AN AREA OF OPERATION WITHIN WHICH LICENSED ACTIVITIES MAY OCCUR SUBJECT TO SPECIAL USE PERMIT/IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME LIMITATIONS. FURTHER, THAT THE AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR OPERATION ON THE BOISE NATIONAL FOREST BE APPROVED. [See Addendum #3]

James McManus: As previously scheduled [see McManus on page 4], the Board (with Mr. & Mrs. McManus, et al present during the discussion/decision proceedings) reviewed the McManus' file, following which MSC (Baird-Vaughn) THAT THE JAMES McMANUS' APPLICATION BE APPROVED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE FOLLOWING PROVISIONS: (1) THAT THE ACTIVITIES BE LIMITED TO THOSE PERSONS WHO ARE HANDICAPPED AS DEFINED BY FISH AND GAME STATUTE AND REGULATIONS AND IN THE FOREST SERVICE'S E.A.; (2) THAT UNLIMITED SUMMER ACTIVITIES BE APPROVED TO INCLUDE FISHING, TRAILRIDES, AND BACKPACKING; (3) THAT THE HUNTING ACTIVITIES ARE LIMITED TO NOT MORE THAN 20 CLIENTS DURING THE FIRST YEAR OF OPERATION WITH THE PROVISIO THAT THIS NUMBER BE REVIEWED AND ADJUSTED, IF NECESSARY TO ACCOMMODATE SCOPE OF OPERATION, AND THAT THIS 20-CLIENT LIMITATION BE FROM THE START OF THE ARCHERY SEASON THROUGH THE END OF THE WHITE-TAIL DEER SEASON; (4) THAT HUNTING ACTIVITIES BE APPROVED FOR ELK, DEER, AND MOOSE IN THE ENTIRE AREA REQUESTED; (5) THAT BEAR AND COUGAR HUNTING IS APPROVED AS FOLLOWS: (a) INCIDENTAL ONLY IN THAT PORTION OF THE AREA REQUESTED THAT OVERLAPS AN EXISTING OUTFITTER (FRENCH MOUNTAIN AREA) AND (b) IS LICENSED IN THE REMAINING PORTION OF THE AREA REQUESTED AS SEASON DICTATES ACCORDING TO IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME REGULATIONS; AND (6) THAT IT BE RE-AFFIRMED THAT THE HUNTING ACTIVITIES SHALL BE AVAILABLE ONLY TO THOSE CLIENTS THAT MEET THE CRITERIA OF HANDICAPPED AND THAT ANY PERSONS ASSISTING HANDICAPPED CLIENTS WILL NOT BE PERMITTED TO PARTICIPATE AS ACTIVE HUNTERS AND TAKE GAME ON THEIR LICENSES. [See Addendum #4] For the record: George Duncan attended this Board proceeding as an "interested party".

Cutler Umbach: The Board reviewed Mr. Umbach's outfitter license application to be licensed for llama packing and various other activities on the Payette National Forest. Following a review of the file and in telephone conversation with Clem Pope in which he indicated the Forest Service has not concluded the preparation of an E.A. regarding this and other matters on the Krassel Ranger District, MSC (Baird-Crane; Vaughn abstained) THAT THIS APPLICATION BE TABLED PENDING RECEIPT OF FURTHER INPUT FROM THE FOREST SERVICE.

Garn Christensen: The Board reviewed Mr. Christensen's application to become Managing Agent for Mackay Bar Corporation, following which MSC (Crane-Vaughn) THAT THIS APPLICATION BE APPROVED.

Jim Davis: The Board reviewed the file concerning the proposed performance rating to note that Mr. Davis has not as yet made application for his 1987-1988 license and further noted that the performance rating in question relates to only one (1) category as being unsatisfactory and that the overall/summary rating is acceptable and, in accordance with the proposed Amendment 1 to the M.O.U., the Board is not involved until such time as the summary rating is something less than satisfactory; thus, the staff is instructed that at such time as Mr. Davis makes appropriate application with late fee, they proceed to license same.

Douglas K. Roberts: The Board reviewed Mr. Roberts' license application to guide for Stanley P. Meholchick dba Juniper Mountain Outfitters, following which MSC (Crane-Vaughn) THAT SAID LICENSE BE ISSUED ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS WITH THE CUSTOMARY PROVISIONS: THAT HE SHALL NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS IN THE ENSUING LICENSE YEAR.

Jerry W. Mitcham: The Board reviewed Mr. Mitcham's license application for trailriding activities to guide for Sun Valley Company, following which MSC (Miller-Baird) THAT MR. MITCHAM BE ISSUED A PROBATIONARY LICENSE WITH THE TERMS BEING THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS IN THE ENSUING LICENSE YEAR.

Grant Simonds: Mr. Simonds appeared before the Board to discuss various matters of concern to the IOGA (enforcement, legislation, and rules-making), following which the Board thanked Mr. Simonds for his interest and cooperation and further advised him that the Board does not anticipate any legislative proposals this year but will be going to rules-making in late fall/early winter. For the record: Grant Simonds did attend Board meetings at various times during the week to observe and become better acquainted with Board business/procedures.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1210 hours and reconvened at 1340 hours.

Wally Beamer dba Rivers Navigation: Relative to the scheduled nonuse hearing for boating privileges on the Salmon River from Vinegar Creek to Hammer Creek [SA7A], Mr. Beamer did not appear before the Board at the appointed hour nor did he submit any

written communication relative to his position in this matter. Following a review of the file, MSC (Baird-Vaughn) THAT THIS LICENSED PRIVILEGE BE REMOVED SINCE THE USE RECORDS INDICATE MR. BEAMER HAS NOT MADE APPLICABLE USE AND NO JUSTIFICATION FOR SUCH NONUSE HAS BEEN SUBMITTED FOR BOARD CONSIDERATION. MR. BEAMER'S LICENSE TO BE AMENDED ACCORDINGLY.

McGarry Brothers: Theron McGarry appeared before the Board relative to an outfitter license application for the conduct of a working ranch concept outfitter program on the Targhee National Forest/Palisades Ranger District, following which MSC (Miller-Crane) THAT THE LICENSE APPLICATION BE APPROVED PENDING COMPLETION OF SAID APPLICATION. FURTHER, THAT LICENSEE BE INSTRUCTED THAT CLIENTELE SHALL NOT CARRY A WEAPON (BOW/GUN) DURING A SCHEDULED HUNTING SEASON.

Lawrence Fulford: The Board reviewed Mr. Fulford's license application to guide trailrides and bird hunting, following which MSC (Miller-Vaughn) THAT MR. FULFORD BE ISSUED A PROBATIONARY LICENSE IN VIEW OF THE FISH AND GAME VIOLATION AND THAT TERMS OF SAID PROBATION BE THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS FOR THE ENSUING LICENSE YEAR.

Benjamin A. Walker, Jr.: The Board reviewed Mr. Walker's guide license application for the conduct of fishing activities, following which MSC (Vaughn-Baird) THAT MR. WALKER BE ISSUED A PROBATIONARY LICENSE CONDITIONED THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS DURING THE ENSUING LICENSE YEAR.

Bradley C. Smith: The Board reviewed Mr. Smith's guide license application, following which MSC (Baird-Crane) THAT MR. SMITH BE ISSUED A PROBATIONARY LICENSE FOR VIOLATION OF FISH AND GAME LAW AND THAT THE TERMS OF SAID PROBATION BE THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS FOR THE ENSUING LICENSE YEAR.

William G. Happersett: The Board reviewed Mr. Happersett's guide license application for fishing activities on the South Fork Snake River for Vern Bressler, following which MSC (Miller-Baird) THAT MR. HAPPERSETT'S APPLICATION BE DENIED IN VIEW OF THE VIOLATION OF IDAHO FISH AND GAME CODE AND, FURTHER, FOR HIS FALSIFICATION OF HIS GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION, SECTION D, IN WHICH HE ANSWERED IN THE NEGATIVE AS TO WHETHER HE HAD ANY VIOLATIONS OF OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES ACT OF THE STATE OF IDAHO OR WHETHER HE HAD EVER BEEN CONVICTED OF ANY VIOLATION OF IDAHO OR ANY OTHER STATE OR FEDERAL FISH AND GAME LAW. AUTHORITY FOR THIS ACTION IS IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(6) AND 36-2114.

Norman A. Klobetanz: The Board reviewed Mr. Klobetanz's guide license application to be licensed for the conduct of fishing, backpacking, and bird hunting under Jeff Peavey's outfitter license, following which MSC (Miller-Crane) THAT MR. KLOBETANZ BE ISSUED A PROBATIONARY GUIDE LICENSE IN VIEW OF THE WILLINGNESS OF THE OUTFITTER TO BACK THE APPLICANT'S CHARACTER AND ASSUMING RESPONSIBILITIES FOR ACTIVITIES. THE TERMS OF SAID PROBATION SHALL BE THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY STATE, LOCAL, OR FEDERAL LAWS IN THE ENSUING LICENSE YEAR.

A. W. Angell: The Board reviewed Mr. Angell's file relative to nonuse, following which MSC (Vaughn-Baird) THAT MR. ANGELL BE NOTIFIED OF HIS NONUSE STATUS AND THAT HE BE REQUESTED TO APPEAR BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR SUSPENSION/REVOCATION OF LICENSE DUE TO THE NONUSE STATUS OF SAID LICENSE. SAID HEARING TO BE SCHEDULED FOR THE SEPTEMBER BOARD MEETING.

Enforcement Activities: The Board reviewed its enforcement efforts under existing law and ways/means to become more effective under existing statutes. Following said discussion and exploration of options, the Board directs that a policy guideline be established wherein enforcement activity/action shall be screened by the Board (Enforcement Coordinator) with the view of prosecuting appropriate cases under the Board's civil penalty provisions, Idaho Code 36-2117(a).

Thomas O. Webb: The Board reviewed Mr. Webb's outfitter amendment request to add float boating rentals on Big Springs from the public boat ramp downstream to Macks Inn, following which MSC (Baird-Crane) THAT THIS AMENDMENT REQUEST BE DENIED PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF 36-2109(b)(5), THE LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION FROM THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME DATED AUGUST 8, 1986, AND OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD RULES AND REGULATION NO. 57.

S. C. Buttram: The Board reviewed the communication received from Mrs. Buttram regarding the status of the S. C. Buttram license and the letter of response drafted by the Board's attorney. The Board determined that said letter of response be forwarded to Mrs. Buttram for her consideration and disposition of this matter.

David Powers: The Board reviewed the recent material which has evolved regarding Mr. Powers' alleged outfitting activities, following which MSC (Crane-Vaughn) THAT MR. POWERS BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD ON A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR SUSPENSION/REVOCATION OF HIS OUTFITTER LICENSE DUE TO THE ALLEGED

ILLEGAL OUTFITTED ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED BY HIM OUTSIDE HIS ASSIGNED AREA. AUTHORITY FOR THIS ACTION IS FOUND IN IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(14). [Copies of this hearing notice to be sent to Mike Merkle/USFS, Clearwater County Sheriff, and Idaho Department of Fish and Game.]

USFS-Enforcement Activities: The Board reviewed this matter and directs that the letter drafted by its attorney concerning implementation of the MOU by and between the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Board and Region 1 Forest Service be sent.

Oregon River Experiences, Inc.: The Board reviewed the letter of June 14, 1987 signed by Robert Cooley in response to the Board's notice of hearing for nonuse indicating minimal use of 2 clients along with the use reports submitted for the 1982-1985 years showing -0- use had been reported on SA7A, following which MSC (Miller-Baird) THAT THE FLOAT BOATING ACTIVITIES AS LICENSED TO OREGON RIVER EXPERIENCES, INC. BE DELETED FOR NONUSE.

Nichols River Expeditions, Inc.: The Board reviewed the file in the matter of nonuse and directs that Mr. Ferraday, attorney for Nichols River Expeditions, Inc. be advised that the hearing would be continued until the September Board meeting.

Scott D. Fasken dba Idaho Afloat: The Board reviewed Mr. Fasken's amendment request for the addition of float boating activities on the Clearwater River [CL1 & CL2] and for an exception to Rule 53 for sportyak activities on the main Salmon River [SA6], following which MSC (Miller-Baird) THAT MR. FASKEN'S AMENDMENT REQUEST TO ADD FLOAT BOATING ON CL1 BE APPROVED, THAT HE BE ADVISED THAT CL2 HAS NOT SPACE AVAILABLE BUT THAT HIS NAME WILL BE PLACED ON THE CONSIDERATION LIST FOR ANY OPENEINGS THAT MAY ARISE, AND THAT HIS SPORTYAK EXCEPTION TO RULE 53 BE APPROVED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CONDUCT OF SAID TRIP AS OUTLINED IN MR. FASKEN'S LETTER RECEIVED BY THE BOARD ON JUNE 25, 1987.

Barker-Ewing Idaho, Inc.: The Board reviewed the request for an exception to Board Rule 53 for the conduct of a trip as is outlined in Mr. Johnson's letter to the Board dated June 22, 1987 following which MSC (Miller-Baird) THAT SAID REQUEST BE APPROVED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE LETTER DATED JUNE 22, 1987.

Stanley Potts: The Board reviewed Mr. Potts' request for approval of bighorn sheep hunts in Fish and Game Management Units 527-1 and 537, following which MSC (Baird-Crane) THAT THIS REQUEST BE APPROVED WITH A LETTER ADDRESSED TO MR. POTTS ADVISING HIM OF THE BOARD'S ACTION WITH COPIES TO THE APPROPRIATE LAND MANAGING AGENCY AND AFFECTED OUTFITTERS.

The Board recessed at 1700 hours and reconvened on Thursday, July 2, 1987 at 0815 hours with all members present.

Don Wilson: The Board reviewed Mr. Wilson's file regarding his alleged third party agreement, hunting outside his assigned area, and the employment of unlicensed guides, following which MSC (Miller-Crane) THAT DON WILSON'S 1987-1988 OUTFITTER LICENSE RENEWAL APPLICATION BE DENIED PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109(a), 36-2110(a)(1), 36-2113(A)(8,9,&14) AND OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD RULE NO. 21. FURTHER, DAVID WILSON'S LICENSE AS DESIGNATED MANAGING AGENT BE DENIED PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109(c). [Administrative note: A letter needs to be addressed to Mr. Wilson clarifying the Board's position regarding its prior decision in the issue of a probationary license upon receipt of Forest Service special use permit as expressed in the Board's letter dated March 30, 1987. Since this time, additional information has come to the attention of the Board regarding the alleged illegal activities of Mr. Wilson thereby necessitating his being requested to come before the Board.]

Archie George/Mike Daly: Mr. & Mrs. George and Mr. & Mrs. Daly met with the Board concerning an adjustment of area boundaries to eliminate an overlap between these parties, following which MSC (Baird-Crane) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT THE BOUNDARIES AS AGREED TO BY THE AFFECTED PARTIES AND THAT APPROPRIATE MODIFICATIONS OF SUCH BOUNDARIES BE MADE WITH AMENDMENTS ISSUED TO THEIR RESPECTIVE LICENSES. [See Addenda #5 & #6]

Don Habel/Eakin Ridge Outfitters: The Board met with Mr. Habel and Lamont Anderson, M.A. for Eakin Ridge Outfitters, to discuss an adjustment of area boundaries during which a resolution to the boundary overlap was made, MSC (Baird-Crane) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT THE BOUNDARIES AS AGREED TO BY THE AFFECTED PARTIES (OLD DON HABEL BOUNDARY) AND THAT APPROPRIATE MODIFICATIONS OF SUCH BOUNDARIES BE MADE WITH AMENDMENTS ISSUED TO THEIR RESPECTIVE LICENSES. [See Addenda #7 & #8]

The Board recessed for lunch at 1145 hours and reconvened at 1310 hours.

L. P. Enright dba Busterback Ranch: The Board reviewed the amendment request to add horse-drawn hayrack rides to their licensed activities, following which MSC (Crane-Baird) THAT THE AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED FOR: (1) CONDUCT OF WAGON RIDES (HORSE-DRAWN HAYRACK RIDES) ON BUSTERBACK RANCH'S PRIVATELY OWNED LANDS; (2) THAT APPROVAL FOR CONDUCT OF SAID ACTIVITY ON SAWTOOTH NATIONAL RECREATION AREA (SNRA) LANDS IS MADE PENDING RECEIPT/APPROVAL OF THE SNRA FOR AN APPROPRIATE SPECIAL USE

PERMIT; AND (3) RECEIPT BY THE BOARD OF THE NECESSARY PAPERWORK IN CLARIFICATION OF STATUS/DESIGNATION OF ONE OR MORE MANAGING AGENTS. [See Addendum #9]

Diamond D Ranch: Thomas Demorest, Managing Agent, met with the Board in response to the Notice of Hearing regarding the nonuse status of licensed cougar hunting activities, following which MSC (Crane-Vaughn) THAT IN VIEW OF MR. DEMOREST'S STATED POSITION THAT HE HAS NO INTEREST IN CONTINUING TO BE LICENSED FOR COUGAR HUNTING IN THE CUSTER JOINT-USE AREA BUT DID WISH TO CONTINUE BEING LICENSED FOR COUGAR HUNTING WITHIN HIS LICENSED AREA, THE BOARD ACCEPT MR. DEMOREST'S RELINQUISHMENT OF COUGAR HUNTING IN THE CUSTER COUNTY AREA BUT THAT HE CONTINUE TO BE LICENSED FOR COUGAR HUNTING IN HIS LICENSED AREA.

Jerry Wilcox: Following a review of the file regarding Mr. Wilcox's application to become the successor outfitter of interest to Thunder Mountain Packers, Inc., MSC (Vaughn-Miller) THAT MR. WILCOX'S APPLICATION BE APPROVED AND LICENSE ISSUED FOR THAT AREA FORMERLY LICENSED TO THUNDER MOUNTAIN PACKERS, INC.

Enforcement Coordinator: The Board reviewed Hank Miller's letter of resignation as Enforcement Coordinator and discussed appointing another one, following which MSC (Miller-Crane) THAT DALE BAIRD BE APPOINTED AS THE ENFORCEMENT COORDINATOR.

Enforcement Meetings: A discussion was held regarding tentative meetings: (1) a meeting of all Enforcements Officers being brought to Boise with a suggested date of September 8, 1987 at which time Steve Schuster would present materials regarding the Board's moving to implement its civil authorities under the Act for enforcement activities and likewise to give the Enforcement Officers the opportunity to become better acquainted and exchange lies; and (2) a meeting in southeast Idaho in cooperation with the Forest Service and Fish & Game with Ron Dickemore of the Palisades Ranger District being interested in hosting such a meeting and that this should be explored with arrangements made to consummate such a meeting if it can be worked out.

Complaints: The Board reviewed the complaint file and instructed the Chairman to take the necessary steps to answer said complaints.

Areas/Activities Removed for Nonuse: Following a review of this matter, the Board directs that the staff be advised that in response to questions coming to the Board relative to relicensing of areas/activities relinquished through nonuse action, that the

Board is not as yet in a position to relicense said areas/activities pending determination by the Board as to whether same are relicensable in accordance with the criteria as outlined in Rule 28.

Fiscal Reports: The Board reviewed the year-end report and likewise the suggested FY88 internal budget, following which approval was given to proceed with the suggested FY88 internal budget and proposed downtown budget.

Enforcement Officers: The pay raise for Enforcement Officers was approved for a 5% increase effective August 1, 1987, with the further stipulation in regard to the accumulated annual leave that this be paid off as a lump sum. [Payment for accrual of leave is made in compliance with recently enacted state law which became effective 6/28/87.]

The Board recessed at 1735 hours and reconvened on Friday, July 3, 1987 at 0820 hours with all members present.

Charter Boat Fishing Operations on Lakes & Reservoirs: The Board reviewed the material received from Ned J. Horner of the Idaho Department of Fish and Game and letter received from Joe Benninger of Garfield Bay on Lake Pend Oreille concerning the impact of charter boat fishing operations on Lake Pend Oreille as well as other northern Idaho lakes. Following a discussion on this matter, the Board directs that a letter be addressed to Messrs. Horner and Benninger advising them that the Board is, indeed, aware of problems involved and expresses its appreciation for their concern and that the Board proposes to go to rules-making on this matter late this fall or early winter and would ask their assistance in drafting rule criteria as to limits and other matters that they feel necessary to be placed into an appropriate rule which would perhaps control the situation.

Fish and Game Unit 71 Petitions: The Board reviewed the various petitions received concerning the desire of individuals signing said petitions to exclude any outfitted hunting activities in Fish and Game Management Unit 71, following which the Board establishes the position that they may go to rules-making regarding this matter at the next rules hearings to ascertain public sentiment relative to the proposed petitions before making final decision regarding exclusion of hunted outfitter activities in Fish and Game Management Unit 71.

Board/USFS MOU/Amendment 1: The Board reviewed letters received from the Forest Service regarding this matter, following which MSC (Miller-Baird) THAT A LETTER OF RESPONSE BE ADDRESSED TO THE

FOREST SERVICE INDICATING THE BOARD'S WILLINGNESS TO MEET WITH STAN TIXIER AND/OR OTHER INDIVIDUALS AUTHORIZED TO MAKE A DECISION IN BEHALF OF THE FOREST SERVICE IN AN ATTEMPT TO FINALIZE SIGNATURE TO AMENDMENT 1 OF THE MOU.

USFS Communications: All other communications from the Forest Service were reviewed with appropriate responses to be made regarding the Fly Hill Connection Road on the North Fork Ranger District authorized.

BLM/Salmon District: The Board reviewed the letter from Robert H. Hale, Challis Area Manager, regarding boating activities on the Salmon River from Slate Creek to the First Highway 93 Bridge above Challis [SA2], following which the Board directs that a letter be addressed to Mr. Hale thanking him for his interest and cooperation in this matter and advising him that the Board would need to go to rules-making to change the limits of this river segment and this could be done at the next rules-making in late fall or early winter 1987-1988.

Linda E. Whitted: The Board reviewed Mrs. Whitted's performance evaluation and merit increase suggested by its Administrative Secretary, following which MSC (Miller-Crane) THAT THE EVALUATION BE APPROVED AND THAT MRS. WHITTED BE GIVEN PERMANENT STATUS ALONG WITH A 5% MERIT INCREASE EFFECTIVE 7-12-87.

Clarification of Rules: The Board reviewed the file regarding the apparent confusion which exists by and between outfitters and guides and the Board [and perhaps the general public] concerning said rules, the Board thanks the staff for bringing these matters to its attention with the further position that efforts shall be made to emphasize awareness of the application of Rule 3 through contact with Association members as well as other parties, that the matter of third party agreements should be sent to all outfitters as well as Association members, and that Hank's comments as well as the letter to Mr. Heinrich could be reworked, printed, and mailed at the earliest opportunity. In this regard, the staff is instructed to contact the Post Office Department to see what is involved in obtaining a bulk rate mailing permit and at the same time also explore the costs involved in obtaining a postage meter. Also, the matter of what constitutes a self-governing agency could be included in such mailings.

Lolo Creek Outfitters: The Board reviewed the file regarding Lolo Creek Outfitters' licensed area description noting that the Board erred in not considering all applicants in describing the area of operation licensed to Lolo Creek Outfitters, following

which MSC (Baird-Crane) THAT THE LOLO CREEK OUTFITTERS AREA BOUNDARY BE ADJUSTED TO READ: COMMENCING WITH THE DESCRIPTION ENDING "EAST ON HIGHWAY 11 TO WEIPPE;" THENCE EASTERLY ON HIGHWAY 11 TO WEIPPE (SEC. 15, T35N, R4E, BM); THENCE DUE EAST ALONG 'PRIMARY ACCESS ROUTE' TO INTERSECT THE '1ST AUXILIARY MERIDIAN EAST' AT THE RANGELINE COMMON TO SECTIONS 13/18, T34N, R4E/5E, BM); THENCE SOUTHEASTELRY UPSTREAM ON LOLO CREEK TO CROCKER CREEK AND CONTINUING SOUTHEASTERLY UPSTREAM ON CROCKER CREEK TO THE GLENWOOD ROAD (FOREST SERVICE ROAD 100); THENCE WESTERLY ALONG SAID ROAD TO KAMIAH, IDAHO, THE POINT OF BEGINNING.

Idaho Wilderness Camps, Inc.: The following are additional comments to the Board's Minutes of May 4-8, 1987 that were inadvertently omitted. During the discussion regarding the nonuse hearing for removal of cougar hunting privileges, information was presented that indicated sufficient cougar hunting activities in years prior to 1983 warrant not removing this activity from the license of Idaho Wilderness Camps, Inc.

Richard D. Armiger dba Paradise Outfitters: The Board reviewed Mr. Armiger's outfitter amendment request to expand his area of operation into Fish and Game Management Unit 10A, following which MSC (Crane-Vaughn) THAT MR. ARMIGER'S AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED FOR: (1) DEER HUNTING AND INCIDENTAL BEAR AND COUGAR HUNTING TO BE DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS: BEGINNING AT THE JUNCTION OF STATE HIGHWAY 11 AND FOREST ROAD 100 AND FISH & GAME MANAGEMENT UNIT 10/10A BOUNDARY (SEC. 11, T36N, R5E, BM); THENCE SOUTHERLY ON ROAD 100 TO THE BLM/CLEARWATER NATIONAL FOREST BOUNDARY NEAR MUSSELSHELL MEADOWS (SEC. 25, T35N, R5E, BM); THENCE DUE SOUTH ALONG SAID BOUNDARY TO ROAD 100; THENCE SOUTHWESTERLY ALONG ROAD 100 (GLENWOOD ROAD) TO CROCKER CREEK; THENCE NORTHWESTERLY DOWNSTREAM ALONG CROCKER CREEK TO LOLO CREEK AND CONTINUING NORHTWESTERLY DOWNSTREAM ALONG LOLO CREEK TO THE '1ST AUXILIARY MERIDIAN EAST' AND RANGELINE COMMON TO T34N, R4E/5E, BM (SECTIONS 13/18); THENCE DUE NORTH ON SAID AUXILIARY MERIDIAN AND RANGELINE TO INTERSECT 'PRIMARY ACCESS ROUTE' (SECTIONS 13/18, T35N, R4E/5E, BM); THENCE DUE WEST ON SAID ROUTE TO WEIPPE AND STATE HIGHWAY 11; THENCE NORTHEASTERLY ON STATE HIGHWAY 11 TO ITS JUNCTURE WITH FOREST ROAD 100, THE POINT OF BEGINNING. [CLEARWATER NATIONAL FOREST MAP DATED 1980]; (2) THAT LICENSEE BE LIMITED TO NOT MORE THAN FOUR (4) HUNTERS PER WEEK ON THOSE LANDS THAT ARE ALSO OPEN TO PUBLIC HUNTING; AND (3) THAT OTHER REQUESTED ACTIVITIES (ELK, PREDATORS, BIRDS, FISHING, TRAILRIDES) ARE DENIED IN ACCORDANCE WITH IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b)(4&5) AND RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME OUTLINED IN THEIR LETTER DATED FEBRUARY 6, 1987.

Cee Bar Dee: The Board reviewed the area description licensed to Cee Bar Dee Outfitters noting an error in said description, following which MSC (Vaughn-Crane) THAT THE CEE BAR DEE AREA DESCRIPTION BE CORRECTED TO DELETE REFERENCE TO "PIERCE" AS, IN FACT, THE DESCRIPTION SHOULD READ: "...THENCE EASTERLY ON STATE HIGHWAY 11 TO FISH AND GAME MANAGEMENT UNIT 10/10A BOUNDARY AND JUNCTURE WITH FOREST ROAD 100 (SEC. 11, T36N, R5E, BM); THENCE.."

South Fork Expeditions, Ltd.: The Board reviewed the amendment request to add goat and cougar hunting in that area to which they are currently licensed and to add fishing on Palisades Reservoir. The Board reviewed the file in this matter and noted the Idaho Department of Fish and Game letter dated May 11, 1987 in response to Board's request for their recommendations regarding this request in which they state that there is no open cougar hunt or controlled goat hunt in Mr. Hill's requested area of operation and further that they have no problem with licensing him on Palisades Reservoir. In like manner the Board noted Forest Service input regarding said amendment request and a telephone call by and between the Chairman and Ron Dickemore, Palisades District Ranger, in which he stated the Forest Service would have no problem in licensing Mr. Hill for fishing on Palisades Reservoir in accordance with the tentative agreement by and between the Board and the Forest Service as to imposing a limit of not more than 8-12 such licensees on Palisades Reservoir at some future rules-making date. MSC (Baird-Miller) THAT THE AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR FISHING ON PALISADES RESERVOIR BE APPROVED AND THAT MR. HILL BE ADVISED OF THE STATUS OF COUGAR AND GOAT HUNTING REQUESTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE MAY 11, 1987 FISH AND GAME LETTER AND, THEREFORE, SAID REQUEST IS DENIED.

Randall Lemburg: The Board reviewed Mr. Lemburg's file relative to the matter of his Coast Guard licensing to operate on Priest Lake noting that there seems to be a certain amount of confusion by the Board as to those waters in Idaho which the Coast Guard deems as navigable and, therefore, assume jurisdiction in requiring a Coast Guard license and, in fact, by the Coast Guard itself relative to the matter of someone from the Coast Guard telling Mr. Lemburg that he did not require a Coast Guard license on Priest Lake. The latter was checked out by the Chairman in contact with the Coast Guard by telephone conversation with Commander Felton the consequence of which is that Commander Felton has forwarded to the Board a list of navigable waters in Idaho upon which the Coast Guard has jurisdiction and, indeed, Priest Lake is among those waters. Thereby, Mr. Lemburg is required to have said Coast Guard license, following which MSC

(Baird-Vaughn) IN VIEW OF THE EVIDENCE THAT MR. LEMBURG MADE EVERY EFFORT TO OBTAIN A COAST GUARD LICENSE IN GOOD FAITH, THAT THE BOARD NOT TAKE ANY ACTION AGAINST HIS 1987-1988 OUTFITTER LICENSE FOR OPERATIONS ON PRIEST LAKE BUT THAT HE BE ADVISED THAT SUCH A LICENSE MUST BE OBTAINED WITH EVIDENCE PROVIDED OF SUCH LICENSING MADE TO THE BOARD BEFORE THE BOARD WILL ISSUE A 1988-1989 OUTFITTER LICENSE FOR AN OPERATION ON PRIEST LAKE.

High Country Outfitters/Quentin Selby, M.A.: The Board was updated by its attorney Steve Schuster on the status of Mr. Selby's litigation, etc. to find the matter is still in litigation with, hopefully, a resolution in the not-too-distant future.

Selection of Licensees on SA2 & SA4B: Following a review of the files of applicants who had submitted an interest and operating plans for consideration to be selected to fill the slots on these river reaches, the selectees are: on SA2 - Ron Bloxham, S Bar S Outfitters, Michael Scott, Larry Moats, and Rusty Gore; on SA4B - Martin Capps and Jerry Myers. The Board affirms the selection of these individuals to fill the vacancies on these river reaches and directs that individuals not selected be advised their names will be placed on the consideration list for future consideration in accordance with the provisions of Rule 28.

There being no further business, the Board adjourned at 1200 hours.

Trailrides may be conducted on national forest lands within the Cassia, Albion, and Sublett Divisions of the Sawtooth National Forest.
