IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD

August 31-September 4, 1987
Boardroom - Boise, Idaho

A regular meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Board convened at 0820 hours on Monday, August 31, 1987 with all members present except Hank Miller.

Board Meetings: The Board reviewed past Board meetings for 1987 relative to their timing and scheduling, following which the Board set the following tentative dates for 1988: January 25-29, March 28-April 1; May 9-13; June 20-24; August 29-September 2; November 7-11; and December 8-10, immediately following the IOGA meeting. [The Board will also attend the spring IOGA meeting at Salmon but no formal business will be conducted at that meeting.] The Board directs the Administrative Secretary to formalize these meetings as a projected schedule and submit same to licensees for their information at the time of license renewal.

Financial Statement and Proposed Budgets: Following a review of the financial statement and internal/downtown budgets, MSC (Baird--Vaughn) THAT THE BUDGET REQUEST AS OUTLINED BY CHAIRMAN MEINERS, INCLUDING THE LEGISLATIVE PACKAGE, BE APPROVED.

Minutes: Following a review of the Minutes for the June Board meeting, MSC (Vaughn--Crane) THAT SAID MINUTES BE APPROVED AS CORRECTED.

Distribution of Board Minutes: The Board considered the distribution of Board Minutes to other interested parties and agencies, namely the Idaho Department of Fish and Game, the U.S. Forest Service, and the Bureau of Land Management. Following a discussion of this matter, MSC (Baird--Vaughn) THAT THE HEADQUARTERS OFFICE OF THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME, THE FOREST SUPERVISORS OFFICES, AND BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT DISTRICT OFFICES WITHIN THE STATE BE FURNISHED COPIES OF APPROVED MINUTES.

Contract for Legal Services: The Board reviewed the contract by and between the Idaho Attorney General's Office and the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Board, following which MSC (Vaughn--Crane) THAT THE CHAIRMAN BE DIRECTED TO SIGN THE CONTRACT FOR LEGAL SERVICES FOR FY88.

Vision Quest: The Board reviewed the submitted material outlining Vision Quest's operation in the state of Idaho, following which MSC (Baird--Vaughn) THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO VISION QUEST THANKING THEM FOR SUBMITTING AN OUTLINE OF THEIR

OPERATION AND FURTHER ADVISING THEM THAT, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THEIR CURRENT OPERATIONS IN THE STATE OF IDAHO, THEY FALL OUTSIDE THE SCOPE OF THE IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES ACT, BUT AT THAT POINT IN TIME IF AND WHEN THEY WERE TO CONDUCT THEIR WILDERNESS ACTIVITIES IN THE STATE, THEY WOULD INDEED FALL WITHIN THE PURVIEW OF THE ACT.

Howell Instruments: The Board reviewed a letter from M. M. (Buddy) Pannill addressed to Bill Goosman of the Salmon National Forest regarding alleged illegal outfitting activities in the Camas Creek area out of Challis, following which it is the Board's position that no further action will be taken on this matter.

Policy - Public Records and Photocopy Fees: The Board reviewed the memorandum from its attorney regarding availability of public records to the general public and said request for review of licensees' files, following which the Board establishes the policy that henceforth public requests for review of licensees' files will be accommodated in the following manner: that an individual requesting a review of a licensee's file be required to identify himself/herself, to identify those records which they wish to review in said licensee's file and for what purpose; further, that the staff be instructed to pull individual financial statements and/or sales agreements pertinent to said licensees and establish a separate file for such records as a confidential file. As regards photocopy fees, the Board establish a minimum fee of one dollar (\$1.00) per sheet for said photocopying services.

Don Stratton: The Board met with its Budget Analyst, Don Stratton, to discuss budgeting procedures and to become acquainted with the Board and otherwise discuss legislative matters inclusive of the possibility that revenues generated by the sales tax paid by the industry could be tapped as a means to further fund enforcement activities by the Board.

North Fork Ranger District: The Board reviewed the letter regarding the ten year timber sale action plan, following which it was determined that Leo Crane will take the matter under advisement and provide data for Board response.

Computer Classes: The Board reviewed the staff's request for authorization to attend some specified computer classes offered by Boise State University, following which the Board authorized one (1) office staff member to attend said classes with expenditure of necessary enrollment fees of one hundred seventy-five dollars (\$175.00).

Grievance Procedure: The Board reviewed the memorandum dated August 24, 1987 from the Idaho Personnel Commission regarding uniform grievance procedure (Senate Bill 1060), following which it was the Board's position that it would adopt the model as suggested by the I.P.C. for addressing grievance procedures by the Board.

Postage Meter: The Board reviewed the data provided by the Administrative Secretary, following which it was the Board's position that it would not utilize a postage meter for conduct of its business.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1150 hours and reconvened at 1315 hours.

Lazy J Outfitters, Inc./Larry Jarrett, M.A.: The Board reviewed the letter from John Fowler and Harold Keiholz regarding their bear hunt with Lazy J Outfitters, following which the Board directs that a letter be addressed to Messrs. Fowler and Keiholz thanking them for their interest and further advising them that, in accordance with Idaho law and Rules and Regulations, licensed outfitters must conduct their activities within the boundaries of the area to which they are licensed and may only conduct those activities for which they are licensed.

Wyoming Game and Fish Department: The Board reviewed its letter requesting ideas, recommendation, and cooperation from the Wyoming Game and Fish Department regarding certain illegal outfitting activities across state lines along with the response regarding same, following which it was directed that a further letter be addressed to the Wyoming Game and Fish Department citing specific complaints against specific individuals and asking if it would be possible to file said complaints through their Department as a means to address this mutual problem shared by Idaho and Wyoming.

John V. Rose dba Bar 44 Outfitters: The Board reviewed the file regarding the proposed revocation/suspension of Mr. Rose's outfitter license, following which MSC (Baird--Vaughn) THAT UPON REQUEST OF COUNSEL FOR MR. ROSE, THE SHOW-CAUSE HEARING FOR REVOCATION OF LICENSE BE CONTINUED UNTIL THE DECEMBER BOARD MEETING AND THE REVOCATION NOTICE BE AMENDED TO INCLUDE THE CHARGE OF IMMORAL, UNETHICAL, OR DISHONORABLE CONDUCT UNDER IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(5) PURSUANT TO ADDITIONAL ALLEGATIONS OF WASTE OF ADDITIONAL AND IMPROPER CARING OF DEER AND GAME MEAT AND VIOLATION OF OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD RULE 8.

Daniel D. Hansen: The Board reviewed Mr. Hansen's guide license application, following which MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT SAID APPLICATION BE APPROVED.

James F. Jensen: The Board reviewed Mr. Jensen's guide license application, following which MSC (Baird--Vaughn) THAT SAID APPLICATION BE DENIED IN ACCORDANCE WITH IDAHO CODE 36-2104(a), 36-2109(c), AND 36-2113(a)(8).

Mike J. Richie: The Board reviewed Mr. Richie's guide license application, following which MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT SAID APPLICATION BE DENIED IN ACCORDANCE WITH IDAHO CODE 36-2109(c) AND 36-2113(a)(9).

Steve Schuster: The Board met with its attorney in discussion and review of various matters pertaining to licensing, legislation, and proposed rules-making.

Steven J. Wieber: The Board reviewed Mr. Wieber's file and his pending application for renewal of his outfitter license for the 1987-1988 license year, following which MSC (Vaughn--Baird) THAT SAID LICENSE RENEWAL APPLICATION BE DENIED FOR CONVICTION OF VIOLATION OF IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME LAW AND ALLEGED ILLEGAL OUTFITTING OPERATIONS OUTSIDE OF HIS ASSIGNED AREA. AUTHORITY FOR THIS ACTION IS FOUND IN IDAHO CODE 36-2109(c) AND 36-2113(a)(6&14). ALSO, FOR VIOLATION OF OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD RULE 5.a. AND RULE 8.a.

The Board recessed at 1650 hours and reconvened on Tuesday, September 1, 1987 at 0815 hours with all members present except Hank Miller.

Donald G. Allen: The Board met with Mr. Allen who has made application to become a Managing Agent of Three Rivers Ranch, following which MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT MR. ALLEN'S APPLICATION BE APPROVED.

Stanley P. Meholchick dba Juniper Mountain Outfitters: Mr. Meholchick and Ron Jullion, the new District Ranger for the USFS-Cascade Ranger District, met with the Board relative to Mr. Meholchick's amendment request to add trailriding activities to his license, following which MSC (Vaughn--Baird) THAT MR. MEHOLCHICK'S LICENSE BE AMENDED TO ADD TRAILRIDING ACTIVITIES TO HIS LICENSE WITHIN AREAS 1, 2, 3 & 4 TO WHICH HE IS CURRENTLY LICENSED FOR OTHER ACTIVITIES WITH THE FURTHER UNDERSTANDING THAT FISHING WOULD CONTINUE TO BE LICENSED AS CURRENTLY LICENSED IN AREAS 1 AND 3 BUT NOT IN AREA 2. THE FOREGOING OCCURS IN FISH AND GAME MANAGEMENT UNITS 25 & 33 FURTHER, THAT MR. MEHOLCHICK'S AMENDMENT REQUEST TO EXTEND/MODIFY HIS HUNTING AREA BOUNDARY IN FISH AND GAME MANAGEMENT UNIT 40 BE APPROVED. [See Addendum #1]

Galena Lodge, Inc./Steven D. Haims, M.A.: Mr. Haims appeared before the Board regarding his outfitter license application to be licensed for conduct of backcountry alpine skiing, cross-country skiing, and mountain bike touring in the Wood River Valley area. Following a review of the file and interview before the Board with Mr. Haims, MSC (Baird--Vaughn) THAT THE APPLICATION BE APPROVED PENDING COMPLETION WITH THE UNDERSTANDING THAT MR. HAIMS IS NOT QUALIFIED TO GUIDE AND THAT ISSUE OF LICENSE IS, THEREFORE, PREDICATED UPON HIS EMPLOYMENT OF A QUALIFIED GUIDE, NAMELY MR. CARDOZO.

Andre K. Molsee dba Shattuck Creek Ranch & Outfitters: The Board reviewed Mr. Molsee's file concerning his request for clarification of his hunting area boundary along the Dworshak Reservoir for that portion of the business he recently purchased from Mike Stockton, following which the Board directs that a letter be addressed to Mr. Molsee advising him that Corps of Engineers Withdrawal area is not a portion of his licensed area; however, it is the Board's understanding that he would have ingress and egress privileges across said property into his hunting area; and further that he be requested to provide a clarification as to the exact location of Alderman Ridge in that from review of the map and the area, it would appear that Alderman Ridge, as identified in the Sales Contract, would abut Dworshak Reservoir in Section 32, Township 39 North, Range 2 East rather than as is presently outlined on Mr. Molsee's license as occurring in Section 8, Township 38 North, Range 2 East, B.M. Furthermore, that from the appearance of the amount of developed campgrounds along the Corps of Engineers Withdrawal area that licensing an outfitter into this area would not be in the public's interest.

Lolo Creek Outfitters, Inc./Messrs. West, Knight, & Snyder, M.A.: The Board reviewed the file with specific reference to the letter received from W. G. MacGregor, Jr., attorney for Lolo Creek Outfitters, Inc., relative to the area boundaries assigned to Lolo Creek Outfitters' area of operation. Following a review of this letter together with the Board's letter dated August 10, 1987 written in response to Mr. MacGregor concern, it was the Board's position that no further action be taken regarding this matter until such time as response is received from either Lolo Creek Outfitters or its attorney regarding the Board's letter of August 10, 1987.

Charles Ray Weddle, Jr.: The Board reviewed Mr. Weddle's application to become a Managing Agent for Lolo Creek Outfitters, Inc., following which MSC (Crane--Vaughn) THAT SAID APPLICATION BE APPROVED PENDING COMPLETION.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1155 hours and reconvened at 1315 hours.

Diana Swift Haynes dba Wapiti Meadow Ranch: The Board reviewed Ms. Haynes application to be licensed as an outfitter for the conduct of various hunting and summer recreational activities in the Johnson Creek area. Following her interview before the Board, MSC (Vaughn--Baird) THAT MS. HAYNES' APPLICATION BE APPROVED PENDING COMPLETION WITH SAID COMPLETION REQUIREMENTS BEING THAT SHE SUBMIT AN UPDATED AND NOTARIZED FINANCIAL STATEMENT, AN AMENDED AREA DESCRIPTION SPECIFYING THE AREA UPON WHICH SHE WISHES TO CONDUCT HER TRAILRIDES, BACKPACKING, FISHING, AND SNOWMOBILING ACTIVITIES [ESSENTIALLY OUT OF THE COX RANCH ON JOHNSON CREEK], THAT THE BOARD CONCLUDE ITS RESEARCH WITH THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME REGARDING HER FISHING REQUEST AND LIKEWISE CONTACT THE OTHER AFFECTED OUTFITTERS ASKING THEIR INPUT AS TO THE PROPOSAL WITH AN ADJUSTMENT MADE IF SERIOUS CONFLICTS ARE RAISED NECESSARY TO ACCOMMODATE THEIR CONCERN; AND FURTHER THAT REGARDING HER APPLICATION FOR HUNTING ACTIVITIES WHICH WAS SUBMITTED AND OVERLIE THAT AREA CURRENTLY LICENSED TO HIGH COUNTRY OUTFITTERS, INC., THAT HER NAME BE PLACED ON THE CONSIDERATION LIST FOR THAT POINT IN TIME WHEN THIS MATTER AND LITIGATION IS RESOLVED. AND FINALLY THAT MS. HAYNES BE DEEMED QUALIFIED AS GUIDE FOR THE CONDUCT OF TRAILRIDES, FISHING, BACKPACKING, AND SNOWMOBILING (UPON RECEIPT OF A COMPLETE TRAINING FORM) ACTIVITIES. [See Addendum #2]

Policy - Research with Affected Outfitters: The direction of the staff dated January 18, 1984 regarding the Board's policy in the contact of affected outfitters is hereby rescinded and that the Administrative Secretary is instructed, as a matter of course in conjunction with contact with the Idaho Department of Fish and Game, the Forest Service, and others, to contact affected outfitters regarding those activities and/or operations which may overlie their licensed area.

The Board recessed at 1700 hours and reconvened on Wednesday, September 2, 1987 at 0825 hours with all members present except Hank Miller.

Bradley A. Dammerman: The Board reviewed Mr. Dammerman's outfitter license application for the conduct of cougar hunting in Fish and Game Management Units 5, 6, and 8A. Following an interview before the Board and consideration of Mr. Dammerman's application, MSC (Crane--Vaughn) THAT MR. DAMMERMAN'S APPLICATION BE DENIED. Following a discussion of the motion, Leo called for a roll call vote with said vote being: Crane - Yea; Baird - No; Meiners - No; and Vaughn - No. Following a reconsideration of

Mr. Dammerman's application, MSC (Baird--Vaughn) THAT MR. DAMMERMAN'S APPLICATION FOR AN OUTFITTER'S LICENSE BE APPROVED WITH THE LIMITATION THAT HIS HUNTING ACTIVITIES BE RESTRICTED STRICTLY TO COUGAR HUNTING, THAT IT OCCUR ONLY IN THOSE AREAS HE HAS REQUESTED WHICH LIE WITHIN FISH AND GAME MANAGEMENT UNIT 8A, AND THAT THE NUMBER OF COUGAR HARVESTED BE LIMITED AS PER FISH AND GAME'S LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION DATED JULY 24, 1987 TO NOT MORE THAN FOUR (4) COUGARS TO BE HARVESTED PER CALENDAR YEAR. Following a discussion of this motion, Leo requested a roll call vote, said vote being as follows: Crane - No; Baird - Yea; Meiners - Yea; and Vaughn - Yea. [See Addendum #3]

Ralph L. Hatter: The Board reviewed Mr. Hatter's outfitter license application and following an interview before the Board, MSC (Baird--Vaughn) THAT THE APPLICATION BE TABLED PENDING FURTHER INVESTIGATION AND RESEARCH WITH THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME REQUESTING THEIR FORMAL RESPONSE TO OUR INQUIRY AND ALSO CONTACT TO BE MADE WITH AFFECTED OUTFITTERS, NAMELY RON BEITELSPACHER.

Robert J. Gillihan: The Board researched various files, namely Gillihan, Jeppson, Farr, Ron Vaughn, and Big Creek Lodge, to establish those parties authorized and licensed to conduct various activities in the Monumental Creek, Crooked Creek, and Cougar Basin areas as is addressed by Gillihan's letter received by the Board August 31, 1987 in which they request copies of Jerry Jeppson dba Mile Hi Outfitters' area description, clarification as to who is licensed for what in Cougar Basin, and clarification of area description for Gillihan in conduct of their summer recreational activities. Following said review and research of files, the Board directs a letter be sent to Mr. Gillihan advising him of the following findings of fact regarding the above matters: (1) Jerry Jeppson dba Mile Hi Outfitters - research finds that Gillihan in sale of business to Jeppson sold that portion of the Gillihan business for hunting and summer activities in the Crooked Creek area but hunting only in the Monumental Creek area; however, in Mr. Jeppson's purchase of the Scott Farr dba Wilderness Outfitters' business, Mr. Jeppson does in fact have fishing, trailrides, and backpacking licensed for conduct in the Monumental Creek drainage. (2) As regards the licensing of activities in the Cougar Basin area, research finds that both Ron Vaughn and Gillihan are licensed for conduct of summer activities in the Cougar Basin area but that only Gillihan is licensed for the conduct of meatpacking activities in the Cougar Basin area and that both Ron Vaughn and Big Creek Lodge have been excluded from this licensed activity in this area. And, (3) that in sale of business from Gillihan to Jeppson, that Gillihan retained and may conduct summer activities and meatpacking in those areas to which they were previously licensed.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1215 hours and reconvened at 1325 hours with all members present except Hank Miller and Ron Vaughn.

Steven J. Guinn: The Board reviewed the letter drafted by its attorney and dated September 2, 1987 concerning the Board's position regarding the proposed Sheriff's Sale of the Outfitter/Guide license of Steve Guinn, following which MSC (Crane--Baird) THAT SAID LETTER BE APPROVED AND ADOPTED AS THE BOARD'S POSITION IN THIS MATTER.

John C. Caccia: The Board met with Mr. Caccia relative to his outfitter license application for the conduct of float boating activities on the Snake River-Murtaugh Section [SN2], following which MSC (Crane--Baird) THAT SAID APPLICATION BE APPROVED PENDING COMPLETION; THAT IS, AN UPDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENT, SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED TEST, BOND, AND FEE.

William G. Happersett: Mr. Happersett met with the Board for a hearing on the denial of his guide license and the circumstances surrounding same, following which MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT PURSUANT TO A REVIEW OF THE MATTER WITH MR. HAPPERSETT, THE BOARD FINDS THAT THE ORIGINAL FISH AND GAME VIOLATION WAS OF A MINOR NATURE AND THE BOARD IS CONVINCED THAT THE FALSIFICATION OF THE GUIDE'S LICENSE APPLICATION WAS AN OVERSIGHT ON MR. HAPPERSETT'S PART; CONSEQUENTLY THE BOARD REVERSES ITS RULING THAT MR. HAPPERSETT BE DENIED A GUIDE LICENSE AND ORDERS THAT SUCH GUIDE LICENSE BE ISSUED.

Kimberland Meadows/Ralph Bass, M.A.: The Board reviewed the file concerning Kimberland Meadows' amendment request to add certain activities to their licensed activities under their amended areas designated as A and B to note that Kimberland Meadows has now dropped their request for activities in Area C. Following a consideration of these matters, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT KIMBERLAND MEADOWS' AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED FOR AREAS A AND B, WITH AREA A'S DESCRIPTION MODIFIED TO INCLUDE NATIONAL FOREST LANDS AND THOSE PRIVATELY OWNED AND/OR LEASED LANDS UPON WHICH TO CONDUCT THEIR ACTIVITIES. [See Addendum #4]

Region 2 - IDF&G: Jerry Thiessen requested that the Board consider providing the Idaho Department of Fish and Game copies of outfitter licenses with attached area descriptions showing areas in which they operate and the activities for which they are licensed. Following a consideration of this matter, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD PROVIDE REGIONAL OFFICES OF THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME COPIES OF ALL OUTFITTERS' LICENSES AND AREA DESCRIPTIONS, TOGETHER WITH THE LICENSED ACTIVITIES FOR EACH OUTFITTER.

The Board recessed at 1615 hours and reconvened on Thursday, September 3, 1987 at 0820 hours with all members present except Hank Miller and Ron Vaughn.

Ted Epley: The Board reviewed Mr. Epley's file and amendment request to add certain trails to his licensed activities for conduct of trailrides and his letter/petition for adding additional outfitters for the conduct of steelhead fishing on the Salmon River from the boatdock at Riggins downstream to Hammer Creek [SA7B], following which the Board directed that a letter be addressed to Mr. Epley advising him of the trial base status of the fishing activities on SA7B and, therefore, his request at this point in time is not accepted and that there is an additional year yet to run on the trial period following which the Board could then evaluate the use on the river. The Board further directed that a letter and/or contact be made with the Forest Service in response to the Board's letter to the Forest Service as regards Ted's amendment request for trailriding on the McCall Ranger District.

Garden Valley Outfitters, Inc./Dan Rotthoff, M.A.: The Board conducted a hearing relative to the denial of the 1987-1988 outfitter licenses. The hearing proceeded with the witnesses at hand; however, Mr. Patnaude did not respond to his subpoena as witness for the Board; therefore, the hearing was not able to be concluded thus making it necessary for a continuance tentatively scheduled for December.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1200 hours and reconvened at 1240 hours.

Del Davis: The Board reviewed Mr. Davis' files regarding his letter in which he outlined a discrepancy in his area boundary and in which he also requested that he be licensed to an area contiguous with his presently licensed area which appears not to be licensed at the present time. Following a review and research of this matter, the Board directs that a letter be addressed to Mr. Davis advising him that his concern of his area description is valid and that it was a Board error and that such change/correction will be made by an Administrative Amendment to his license; and that he be further advised that he needs to complete the necessary Amendment Request, namely OG-2, with the proper area description and outline of the activities he wishes to be licensed and operating plan as to how this addition to his activities would fit into his current program and that upon receipt of this, the Board will conclude its research and make a final decision following receipt of his amendment request and completion of research.

S. C. Buttram: The Board reviewed the file on this matter and in consideration of the most recent letter received from Mrs. Buttram in her attempt to reconcile and settle the estate upon the death of Mr. Buttram, the Board directs that a letter be addressed to Mrs. Buttram again addressing the nonuse status/special use permit requirement/tangible business asset requirements to include necessary paperwork she requested for transfer and sale of business to her prospective purchaser. Further, that she be instructed that she will need to provide said sales agreement inclusive of tangible assets to be transferred to Grizzly Outfitters of Hayden Lake to enable Board review/action on her request. And that Grizzly Outfitters, by copy of this letter to them, be notified that they would need to submit the necessary application for the proposed purchase of business inclusive of a plan of operation as to how this would fit within their currently licensed activities plus the fact that they would need to secure the necessary land managing agent's approval in issue of special use permit in conduct of proposed business.

Lester West dba Whitewater Outfitters: The Board reviewed the file with specific attention to the letter received from Mr. West dated July 17, 1987 in which he relates his concern regarding his area description boundary and the matter of overlapping activities by himself with other adjacent outfitters licensed in the area, following which the Board directs that a letter be addressed to Mr. West asking him to take his current description(s) and map same on map to ascertain truly whether any omission of areas originally licensed to him has been made, and if so that he then so notify the Board to arrange a meeting to resolve the problem; secondly, that there were no additional overlaps made by the Board, that such overlaps as do exist became apparent in the update of Board maps and mapping of same on appropriate base maps as was done in the remapping of the areas involved.

Nichols River Expeditions, Inc./Chuck Nichols, M.A.: The Board conducted a hearing regarding the alleged nonuse of float boating activities on the Salmon River-Spring Bar to Hammer Creek [SA7A]. Following this hearing and in consideration of the materials presented to the Board asking its reconsideration of its notice of nonuse and proposed suspension/revocation of said license, MSC (Baird--Crane) THE BOARD FINDS THAT WHEREAS: (1) OUTFITTERS' LICENSES PRIOR TO THE YEAR 1986 DID NOT IDENTIFY SPECIFIC RIVER SEGMENTS; (2) REVISED RULES ARE NOT ROUTINELY FURNISHED TO LICENSED OUTFITTERS UNLESS SPECIFICALLY REQUESTED; (3) NICHOLS RIVER EXPEDITIONS, INC. IS A RELATIVELY NEW OUTFITTER OPERATION

ON THE SALMON RIVER; AND (4) NICHOLS RIVER EXPEDITIONS, INC. HAS SHOWN AN INCREASE EACH YEAR IN USE ON RIVER SEGMENT SA8; AND WHEREAS IT IS THE CONCLUSION OF THE BOARD THAT: (1) NICHOLS RIVER EXPEDITIONS, INC. REASONABLY MIGHT NOT HAVE BEEN AWARE OF THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE NONUSE RULE; (2) NICHOLS RIVER EXPEDITIONS, INC. HAS STEADILY INCREASED ITS BUSINESS ACTIVITY ON THE SALMON RIVER; AND (3) NICHOLS RIVER EXPEDITIONS, INC. HAS DEVELOPED PLANS TO MARKET TRIPS ON RIVER SEGMENT SA7A AS PART OF ITS OVERALL OPERATION; NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD FINDS GOOD CAUSE TO WAIVE THE PROVISIONS OF RULE 22.a. FOR A PERIOD OF THREE (3) YEARS COMMENCING WITH THE 1988 LICENSE SEASON AT THE END OF WHICH TIME THE USE BY NICHOLS RIVER EXPEDITIONS, INC. WILL BE RE-EVALUATED TO DETERMINE IF THE PROVISIONS OF RULE 22.a. HAVE BEEN MET.

Seven Devils Outfitters, Inc./Dave Stucker, M.A.: The Board reviewed the amendment request to expand their licensed activities to lands owned and/or controlled by R&S Realty Corporation. Following a review of the file on this matter, MSC (Crane--Baird) THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO MR. STUCKER STATING THAT THE AMENDMENT REQUEST IS INCOMPLETE IN THAT THE LETTER RECEIVED MAY 9, 1987 WHICH THE BOARD WOULD ASSUME IS THE PROPOSED LEASE IS UNSIGNED; FURTHER, THAT THE BOARD WOULD REQUIRE THE LEGAL DESCRIPTION OF ALL PRIVATELY OWNED PROPERTIES INVOLVED AND MADE PART OF SAID LEASE TO ENABLE THE BOARD TO TAKE APPROPRIATE ACTION ON HIS AMENDMENT REQUEST.

Howard W. Thompson: The Board reviewed the file regarding Mr. Thompson's letter received August 7, 1987 in which he asks various questions pertaining to the qualifications/requirements to conduct a packing and guide school and other matters, following which the Board directed that a letter be addressed to Mr. Thompson advising him of answers to the questions raised in his letter.

Boise State University: The Board reviewed the file regarding Boise State's amendment request to add certain activities but upon which they apparently did not follow through to complete said application. Following a consideration of this matter, the Board's position is that this amendment request is not valid and, therefore, null and void. Further, the Board reviewed Boise State's Outdoor Adventure Program catalog and letter to Dr. Potter regarding activities found and advertised in said catalog and BSU's lack of response to said Board letter of June 25, 1987 and directs that a letter be addressed to Dr. Potter directing him to come and meet with the Board at its next meeting to discuss this situation and hopefully resolve the problem.

Carl Beach: The Board met with Mr. Beach regarding enforcement matters, following which the Board requested the Enforcement Coordinator to follow-up on matters discussed.

The Board recessed at 1645 hours and reconvened on Friday, September 4, 1987 with all members present except Hank Miller and Ron Vaughn.

Sun Valley Wilderness Outfitters, Inc./R. J. Lewy, M.A.: The Board reviewed Mr. Lewy's amendment request for approval of his relocated sleigh riding activities from his currently licensed area to that which the Sawtooth National Recreation Area wishes to assign him in the North Fork of Wood River inclusive of Murdock Canyon. Following a consideration of this matter, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT SAID AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED.

Cutler Umbach dba High Llama Wilderness Tours: The Board reviewed Mr. Umbach's outfitter license application for the conduct of llama packing and other summer recreational activities in the Payette National Forest. Following a review of the file and evaluation of comments received from affected outfitters, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT BECAUSE OF THE FACT THAT THE AREA REQUESTED IS CURRENTLY LICENSED FOR JOINT-USE AMONG SEVERAL OUTFITTERS INCLUSIVE OF A LLAMA OPERATION AND DUE TO THE FACT THAT OUTFITTERS IN THE AREA HAVE HAD THEIR USE DAYS DRASTICALLY REDUCED BY THE FOREST SERVICE, IT IS THE BOARD'S POSITION THAT AN ADDITIONAL OUTFITTER OF ANY TYPE IN THIS PARTICULAR AREA COULD ONLY CAUSE ECONOMIC HARDSHIP ON THOSE EXISTING OUTFITTERS AND, CONSEQUENTLY, THE BOARD DENIES MR. UMBACH'S APPLICATION FOR A LICENSE. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS AS FOUND IN IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b)(4&5) AND OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD RULE 19(b,f,& g).

Scott Fasken dba Idaho Afloat: The Board reviewed Mr. Fasken's file with specific consideration of his request for licensing of float boating activities on the Clearwater River from Kooskia to Orofino [CL2], following which the Board directs that a letter be addressed to Mr. Fasken re-affirming its prior position as outlined to him by Board letter of July 7, 1987 regarding this same matter, that is the Board would need to proceed for the licensing of an applicant for this river reach in accordance with Board Rule 28.a. & c. and further that the Board will proceed to implement provisions of Rule 28.c. to the selection of a licensee to fill the vacant slot on CL2. Copies of this letter should be addressed to the Orofino Chamber of Commerce and to Gregory FitzMaurice (Fasken's attorney) as well.

Jacklin's Fly Shop, Inc./Bob Jacklin, M.A.: The Board reviewed Mr. Jacklin's amendment request to add certain fishing activities as licenseable under his current outfitter license. Following a review of the file in this matter and recommendations made by the Idaho Department of Fish and Game, MSC (Crane--Baird) THAT MR. JACKLIN'S AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED IN PART TO ALLOW WALK-AND-WADE FISHING ON FALL AND BUFFALO RIVERS, BUT THAT HIS REQUEST FOR ADDITIONAL USE ON HENRY'S LAKE-ISLAND PARK RESERVOIR BE DENIED. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS IN ACCORDANCE WITH IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b)(4&5) AND OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD RULE AND REGULATION 19(b&f) ALONG WITH THOSE RECOMMENDATIONS MADE BY THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME IN THEIR LETTER DATED JULY 23, 1987.

Wild River Expeditions, Inc./Richard Cook, M.A.: The Board reviewed the file regarding BLM's concern of certain activities on the lower Salmon River together with Wild River Expeditions, Inc.'s amendment request seeking approval for their purchase of a portion of Dissendat Expeditions, Inc./Charles W. Ferdon, M.A. float boat business on the Salmon River from Vinegar Creek to Hammer Creek [SA7A] and on the Salmon River from Hammer Creek downstream to Heller Bar/Lewiston [SA8], following which MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT SAID AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED PENDING RECEIPT FROM DISSENDAT EXPEDITIONS, INC. RELEASING THEIR INTEREST IN THE FLOAT BOATING ACTIVITY. FURTHER, THAT NO ACTION IS TAKEN ON PN1 AS THIS IS NOT ADDRESSED IN THE SALES AGREEMENT. [Administrative Note: A copy of the letter reflecting Board action in this matter should be addressed to LuVerne Grussing to acquaint him with the Board's action.]

Larry Moats: The Board reviewed Mr. Moats' file regarding his request for consideration to be licensed for boating activities on the Salmon River-North Fork to Corn Creek [SA5]. Following a review and research of the river lists in this matter, the Board directs that a letter be addressed to Mr. Moats stating that due to nonuse criteria, certain licensed privileges have been taken from licensed outfitters and, therefore, in accordance with Rule 28 the Board would place his name on the consideration list for consideration to be licensed on SA5 at such time as the Board moves to fill these vacant slots.

Mack's Inn Resort: The Board reviewed Mack's Inn Resort's outfitter license application request to be licensed for snowmobiling, cross-country skiing, and float boating activities in the vicinity of Mack's Inn, following which MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THAT PORTION OF THE APPLICATION REQUESTING FLOAT BOATING ACTIVITIES ON BIG SPRINGS BE DENIED IN ACCORDANCE WITH FISH AND GAME RECOMMENDATIONS AND IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b)(5) AND OUTFITTERS

AND GUIDES BOARD RULE 19.g. FURTHER, THAT SAID LETTER SHOULD ADVISE MR. SPELLMON THAT UPON RECEIPT OF A COMPLETED APPLICATION AND PLAN OF OPERATION TO ADDRESS HIS PROPOSED CROSS-COUNTRY SKIING AND SNOWMOBILING ACTIVITIES, THE BOARD WOULD BE WILLING TO SCHEDULE AN INTERVIEW IN CONSIDERATION OF HIS APPLICATION FOR LICENSING OF THESE OUTFITTED ACTIVITIES.

Jeff Peavey dba Northwest Voyageurs: The Board reviewed the file relative to Mr. Peavey's letter concerning the applicability of Rule 53 and/or Rule 54 as they may apply to his float boating activity utilizing either inflatable kayaks and/or canoes, following which the Board directs that a letter be addressed to Mr. Peavey advising him that it would appear his proposed use of inflatable canoes would, indeed, come under the criteria as outlined in Rule 54.

Lawrence Fulford: The Board reviewed Mr. Fulford's license file, following which the Board directs that a letter be addressed to Mr. Fulford advising him that Board policy does not permit the amendment or modification of a guide license while said licensee is in probationary status. A copy of this letter should go to both Sam and Harvey Whitten, his employing outfitters.

Let the record show that Ron Vaughn entered the Board meeting at 1100 hours.

Grant Simonds: The Board met with Mr. Simonds on various matters of mutual interest to the IOGA and the Board (legislation, rules, and information/coordination on news releases of interest to IOGA and the industry in general).

Mitchell P. McFarland: The Board reviewed the file in this matter relative to Mr. McFarland's guide license application, following which MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT SAID APPLICATION BE APPROVED ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS WITH THE USUAL PROHIBITIONS OF PROBATION BEING MADE KNOWN TO MR. MCFARLAND.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1235 hours and reconvened at 1340 hours.

Amendment #1 to M.O.U.: The Board received a letter from the U.S. Forest Service stating that in accordance with counsel's advice, they were not able to keep their appointment before the Board to discuss this matter. The Board directed that a letter be addressed to the U.S. Forest Service in which the Board would express its disappointment in the delay of the meeting.

Carl G. Mueller: The Board reviewed Mr. Mueller's file and guide license application, following which MSC (Vaughn--Baird; Crane abstained) THAT MR. MUELLER'S APPLICATION BE APPROVED PROBATIONARY WITH THE FURTHER STIPULATION THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS IN THE ENSUING LICENSE YEAR AND FURTHER THAT HE NOT ACTIVELY GUIDE CLIENTELE IN THE FIELD.

Gilbert Ray Judkins: The Board reviewed Mr. Judkins' file and guide license application, following which MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE GUIDE LICENSE BE APPROVED PROBATIONARY PENDING COMPLETION AND THAT A LETTER OF REPRIMAND REGARDING THE NEGLIGENCE OF ANSWERING TRUTHFULLY THOSE QUESTIONS ASKED ON THE APPLICATION.

Tim Courchaine: The Board reviewed the file and Mr. Courchaine's guide license application, following which MSC (Baird--Vaughn) THAT THIS APPLICATION BE APPROVED PENDING COMPLETION AND RECEIPT OF A VALID RED CROSS CARD.

Clint Hogan: The Board reviewed the file and Mr. Hogan's guide license application, following which MSC (Vaughn--Crane) THAT MR. HOGAN'S GUIDE APPLICATION BE DENIED UNDER AUTHORITY OF IDAHO CODE 36-2109(c) AND 36-2113(a)(1&6).

Philip S. Lansing: The Board reviewed Mr. Lansing's file and guide license application, following which MSC (Baird--Vaughn) THAT MR. LANSING'S APPLICATION BE APPROVED PENDING COMPLETION AND SUBMISSION OF RED CROSS CARD AND PAYMENT OF FEES.

Mike A. Carr: The Board reviewed the file and Mr. Carr's guide license application, following which MSC (Crane--Vaughn) THAT MR. CARR'S GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION BE APPROVED.

Ken Berg: The Board reviewed the file and Mr. Berg's guide license application, following which MSC (Baird--Vaughn) THAT MR. BERG'S GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION BE DENIED. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS AS FOUND IN IDAHO CODE 36-2104.

Lyle Piram: The Board notes that Mr. Piram is the employing outfitter of an unlicensed guide, following which MSC (Baird--Vaughn) THAT MR. PIRAM BE REQUESTED TO APPEAR BEFORE THE BOARD FOR A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR SUSPENSION/REVOCATION OF HIS LICENSE FOR EMPLOYING AN UNLICENSED GUIDE. FURTHER, THAT MR. PIRAM BE SUBPOENAED TO APPEAR AT SAID SHOW CAUSE HEARING AND IN SO DOING BRING WITH HIM HIS RECORDS AND BOOKS FOR THE CURRENT 1987-1988 LICENSE YEAR. AUTHORITY FOR THIS ACTION IS AS FOUND IN IDAHO CODE 36-2107(f) AND 36-2113(a)(9).

Raymond (Corky) Torrey: The Board reviewed the file and Mr. Torrey's guide license application, following which MSC (Crane--Vaughn) THAT MR. TORREY'S APPLICATION BE DENIED. AUTHORITY FOR THIS ACTION IS AS FOUND IN IDAHO CODE 36-2109(c) AND 36-2113(a)(1&6).

Robert R. Anderson: The Board reviewed the file and Mr. Anderson's request for authority to conduct a one-time draw deer hunt in Idaho Fish and Game Management Unit 69 as is outlined in Mr. Anderson's letter to the Board received August 31, 1987 in which he has been contacted by a Mr. Dan Werbe holding deer tag #31992 for conduct of said hunt. Following a review of this matter, MSC (Baird--Vaughn) THAT MR. ANDERSON'S REQUEST BE APPROVED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE STIPULATIONS OUTLINED IN HIS LETTER TO THE BOARD RECEIVED AUGUST 31, 1987. FURTHER, THAT MR. ANDERSON BE ADVISED THAT HIS AMENDMENT REQUEST TO MODIFY HIS AREA BOUNDARY WAS RECEIVED BY THE BOARD AND HAS NOT BEEN RESEARCHED, BUT THE BOARD WILL DO SAME AND TAKE APPROPRIATE ACTION ON SAID REQUEST AT ITS NOVEMBER BOARD MEETING.

Boulder Creek Outfitters, Inc./Tim Craig, M.A.: The Board reviewed the file and Mr. Craig's letter requesting permission / authority for ingress and egress to his hunting area along access routes crossing adjoining outfitters' licensed areas, following which the Board directs that a letter be addressed to Mr. Craig with copies to Richard Norris and to the USFS Moose Creek Ranger District that normal ingress and egress is considered a part of any outfitter's license so long as there is no hunting or other outfitted activities conducted in the process of said ingress or egress. Further, that Mr. Craig should be thanked for letting the Board know of his intention to employ Mr. Mark Kennedy as a guide.

Sawtooth Expeditions, Inc./Robert Marsh, M.A.: The Board reviewed the file and Mr. Marsh's amendment request to add chukar hunting to his licensed activities along the Middle Fork of the Salmon River, following which MSC (Baird--Vaughn) THAT SAID AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED.

Legislation/Rules-Making: The Board, by earlier action (see page 1) approved the proposed legislative package as was submitted with the budget request. Said legislative proposal addresses certain housecleaning/clarification language relative to the licensing of outfitters and guides in Idaho, addresses the clarification and definition of a Managing Agent and appropriate fee, as well as addressing the need to further define the role of individuals providing services to the public in the conduct of

outfitting activities, and seeks enforcement authority for the Board as a law enforcement agency. Rules as have been proposed have been drafted to reflect proposed legislative changes and to clarify the scope and intent of the Outfitters and Guides Act. Said rules are to be again reviewed by the Board at a later date to enable submission and review by the public, the industry, and the IOGA at its April 1988 meeting with the intent that rules-making procedure, inclusive of public hearings, would be initiated and held in the late spring (May-June).

Complaints: The Board reviewed the complaint files and instructed the Chairman to take the necessary steps to answer said complaints.

All business having been concluded, the Board adjourned at 1625 hours.

AREAS FOR TRAILRIDES, WAGON RIDES, CROSS-COUNTRY SKIING,
BACKPACKING, AND SNOWMOBILING

AREA 1: Trailrides, wagon rides, cross-country skiing, and snowmobiling may take place on the Kimberland Meadows property located in Section 35, T20N, R1E and in Sections 1, 2, 3, 10, 11, and 12 in T19N, R1E, BM, north of New Meadows.

AREA 2: Trailrides, wagon rides, cross-country skiing, and snowmobiling may also take place beginning on the south boundary of Area 1/U.S. Highway 95 juncture (Sec. 12, T19N, R1E, BM); thence west and south along Highway 95 via Rubicon, Tamarack, Pine Ridge to near Woodland and the township line common to Townships 18/19N, R1E, BM; thence due west approximately eight miles on said township line to the Payette/Weiser River watershed divide (Sec. 35, T19N, R2W, BM); thence northerly along said watershed divide to and along the Little Salmon/Weiser watershed divide to "Lick Creek" on the township line common to Townships 20/21N, R1W, BM; thence due east on said township line to the Round Valley Creek drainage and section corner common to Sections 5&6, T20N/Sections 31&32, T21N, R1E, BM; thence due north along the section line to Indian Creek (Sec. 5, T22N, R1E, BM); thence northeasterly downstream along Indian Creek to the Little Salmon River and Highway 95; thence southerly on Highway 95 to the point of beginning. RESTRICTION: Licensee is restricted to 2 boats with no more than 4 anglers per boat and has agreed to provide catch records to the Idaho Department of Fish and Game.
