IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD

January 25-28, 1988  
Boardroom - Boise, Idaho

A regular meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Board convened at 0830 hours on Monday, January 25, 1988 with all Board members present.

**Complaint Files:** The Board reviewed the complaint files and gave instructions to the Chairman as to the disposition of the complaints.

**Dan Chadwick:** The Board met with its attorney in discussion of the following pending litigative matters:

**Steve Wieber - MSC (Vaughn-Miller)** THAT THE STIPULATION OF SETTLEMENT PROPOSED BY JOHN SUTTON, ATTORNEY FOR STEVE WIEBER, BE ADOPTED AND THAT DAN CHADWICK PREPARE THE STIPULATION FOR SIGNATURE.

**Macks Inn -** Following a review of this file, MSC (Miller-Vaughn) THAT THE DENIAL HEARING SCHEDULED FOR TUESDAY, JANUARY 26, 1988 BE VACATED BECAUSE OF THE REPRESENTATION BY JACK HOOPES, ATTORNEY FOR MACKS INN, THAT MACKS INN WILL WITHDRAW ITS REQUEST FOR A LICENSE AND WILL STIPULATE TO THE EFFECT THAT MACKS INN WILL RENT BOATS ONLY WITH NO DELIVERY OR OTHER SERVICES RENDERED. MR. HOOPES WILL SEND A LETTER TO THAT EFFECT.

**David Bream -** Following a review of this matter, MSC (Miller-Crane) THAT THE CASE AGAINST DAVID BREAM BE DISMISSED.

**Quentin Selby/High Country Outfitters -** The Board reviewed the undated request for continuance in Case No. 00170 received from Mr. Selby on January 25, 1988 in which he requested a continuance of his hearing. Following a consideration of this matter, Mr. Selby's request is granted and his hearing continued until March 30, 1988 at 0900 hours.

**Ed Link -** The Board reviewed the proposed revocation hearing and file in this regard, following which MSC (Miller-Crane) THAT MR. LINK'S REVOCATION HEARING BE DISMISSED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE ATTORNEY'S RECOMMENDATION.

**David Odell -** Following a review of Mr. Odell's file, MSC (Miller-Crane) THAT AN ADMINISTRATIVE HEARING BE HELD AND THAT THE BOARD APPOINT JEAN URANGA AS THE INDEPENDENT HEARING OFFICER FOR SAME.

**Earl P. Basso, Jr.:** Mr. Basso and his attorney, Dahlin Phillips, met with the Board on the denial of Mr. Basso's request to be licensed as an outfitter. Following the hearing, MSC (Crane-Vaughn) THAT INASMUCH AS THE HEARING DID NOT PROVIDE ANY NEW INFORMATION REGARDING THE BOARD'S PRIOR DECISION, THE DENIAL BE AFFIRMED.

**Board Minutes:** Following a review of the December 10-11, 1987 Minutes, MSC (Vaughn-Crane) THAT SAID MINUTES BE APPROVED AS CORRECTED.

**MicroComputer Training Course:** The Board reviewed the proposal to send Susan Berner to BSU to participate in the RBase5000 training program, MSC (Baird-Crane) THAT SAID TRAINING BE APPROVED.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1215 hours and reconvened at 1400 hours with all members present.

**Lyle Piram/Ken Berg:** Following a hearing before the Board regarding the suspension/revocation of Mr. Piram's license and the denial of Mr. Berg's guide license application, and in consideration of testimony offered before the Board, Attorney Dan Chadwick recommended the following in settlement of these matters: (1) That no action be taken against Mr. Piram's license at this time; (2) Mr. Berg's guide license be granted; (3) If they have a question about the rules/regulations and the applicable law, rather than rely on verbal comment they will make a request in writing to the Board for its interpretation as to what they are required to do under that particular rule to avoid any misunderstanding as to their obligations; (4) that the Board and its investigators keep close watch on the operations of Messrs. Piram and Berg through March 31, 1989 during which time all books and records of both Messrs. Piram and Berg are to be open for inspection upon demand of the investigator and of the Board, and that their operating procedures will be subjected to review. MSC (Baird-Crane) THAT THE TERMS SET FORTH ABOVE IN SETTLEMENT OF THESE CASES BE ADOPTED AS AGREED TO MESSRS. PIRAM AND BERG. FURTHER, MR. BERG SHALL BE ISSUED A GUIDE LICENSE FOR THE BALANCE OF THE 1987-1988 LICENSE YEAR AND, UPON RECEIPT OF AN APPLICATION FOR A 1988-1989 GUIDE LICENSE, THE LICENSE BE GRANTED.

**Outfitter License Bond:** The Board reviewed the January 14, 1988 letter from CNA Insurance Co. in which it proposes changing the format and term of the outfitter performance bond, following which MSC (Crane-Miller) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT THE PROPOSAL FOR A CONTINUOUS AUTHORIZATION ON THE BOND AS PROPOSED BY CNA INSURANCE CO. AS AN ALTERNATE TO ITS ANNUAL BONDING REQUIREMENT AS CURRENTLY IN PLACE.

**U. S. Coast Guard:** The Board reviewed the material as submitted by the U.S.C.G. regarding licensing requirements on those waters in the state of Idaho upon which they have jurisdiction and the material submitted by Lt. C. D. Kakuska. The Board noted that the material did not include the Inland Rules of the Road Nos. 2, 3, 6, 8, 14, 15, 17, 20, 34 & 36 as was noted in the cover letter. Thus, the Board directs that a letter be addressed to Lt. Kakuska asking him for further information in this regard. Also, this letter should state that the Board would be happy to meet with him at his opportunity hopefully in March.

**Hells Canyon National Recreation Area:** The Board reviewed a January 15, 1988 letter from the HCNRA relative to the proposed Western Whitewater Association boat races on the Snake River from Hells Canyon Marina in Lewiston upstream to Pittsburg Landing. Also indicated are various other rivers on which these boat races are to be conducted. Following a discussion of this matter, the Board directs that a letter be addressed to Art Seamans outlining the Board's concerns regarding this activity and its impact that these boat races could have on the float boating activities and safety of individuals involved on this river reach at that particular time with a further spinoff impact that could be associated with either pre or post boat race activity generated by the Whitewater Association races. A further impact would be the delay and/or interruption of float boating activity on the river during the time of race. This concern is likewise applicable to the Payette River from Black Canyon Park to Banks as to the impact said races would have on the float boating activity on this river reach at this particular time.

**Forest Service/BLM:** The Board reviewed a letter from Ron Dickemore of the USFS and Donald L. Watson of the BLM regarding the scoping document concerning boating and other recreational activities along that segment of the Snake River downstream from Palisades Dam to the confluence with the Henry's Fork and the Henry's Fork from St. Anthony to the confluence with the South Fork of the Snake River and mainstream confluence to the Osborn Bridge. Following a discussion on this matter, the Board directs that a letter be addressed to Messrs. Dickemore and Watson bringing their attention to Rule 57 and currently licensed activities on these river reaches and limitations imposed thereon as a measure of the Board's established allocation of commercial use on these river segments. And, that modification/adjustment of this allocated use would require a "rules change" by the Board under the State Administrative Procedures Act [Idaho Code, Title 67, Chapter 52].

**Photocopy Fee:** The Board reviewed the information concerning the current charge the Board is assessing for making photocopies, following which MSC (Vaughn-Crane; Miller voted "no") THAT THE BOARD ESTABLISH A POLICY OF CHARGING FIFTY CENTS A COPY FOR THE FIRST TWENTY-FIVE COPIES AND TWENTY-FIVE CENTS A COPY THEREAFTER. FURTHER, THAT THE INDIVIDUAL REQUESTING COPIES OF MATERIAL OUT OF HIS OWN FILE NOT BE CHARGED A FEE FOR SUCH MATERIALS, BUT IF MATERIALS ARE REQUESTED OTHER THAN HIS OWN PERSONAL FILE, THE FOREGOING FEES SHALL APPLY. THESE FEES ARE APPLICABLE UPON EACH REQUEST MADE BY AN INDIVIDUAL.

The Board recessed at 1700 hours and reconvened on Tuesday, January 26, 1988 at 0900 hours with all members present.

**Seven Devils Outfitters, Inc.:** The Board reviewed the file and the amendment request submitted by Dave Stucker, Managing Agent, for the inclusion of certain privately owned lands within the Seven Devils licensed area of operation. Following this review and in consideration of the amendment request, MSC (Crane-Vaughn) THAT THIS AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED. [Administrative Note: We will have to describe a peripheral boundary to include the privately owned lands and, in so doing, modify Harvey Whitten's license accordingly to exclude said lands within his licensed area of operation. - See Addendum #1]

**Wild River Outfitters, Inc.:** The Board reviewed the amendment request submitted by Richard Cook, Managing Agent, to add snowmobiling activities to this license. Following this review and in consideration of the fact that Mr. Cook is requesting all of Fish and Game Management Unit 18, MSC (Baird-Crane) THAT THIS MATTER BE TABLED AT THIS POINT IN TIME WITH A LETTER ADDRESSED TO MR. COOK ASKING FOR MORE DETAIL OF HIS PROPOSED OPERATION WITH SPECIFICS AS TO AREAS INVOLVED AND ROUTES SELECTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH FOREST SERVICE CONCERNS OF SAFE AND ACCEPTABLE ROUTES. ALSO, IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME INPUT IS NEEDED AS REGARDS HIS PROPOSED ACTIVITY, WITH PARTICULAR CONCERN AS TO THE IMPACT SUCH ROUTES WOULD HAVE UPON WINTERING BIG GAME POPULATIONS.

**Glenn A. Vitucci:** The Board reviewed Mr. Vitucci's file concerning his obtaining the necessary Special Use Permit from the Forest Service for the conduct of overnight skiing operations on the Targhee National Forest, following which MSC (Baird-Vaughn) THAT THE BOARD MAKE AN ADMINISTRATIVE AMENDMENT TO MR. VITUCCI'S LICENSE FOR OVERNIGHT OPERATIONS ON FOREST SERVICE LANDS. FURTHER, THAT THIS DECISION IS PREDICATED UPON A TELEPHONE CONVERSATION RECEIVED FROM MR. MAC MURDOCK ON JANUARY 21, 1988 STATING THE FOREST SERVICE HAD APPROVED MR. VITUCCI FOR SUCH AN OPERATION FOR THIS CURRENT YEAR.

**Diana Swift Haynes:** The Board reviewed Ms. Haynes amendment request to modify her area description to include a campsite on the south side of Pistol Creek in Section 16, Township 16 North, Range 10 East, B.M. Following a consideration of this matter, MSC (Vaughn-Baird) THAT THIS AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED PENDING CONCURRENCE OF THE SELECTION OF THIS CAMPSITE BY THE FOREST SERVICE. [See Addendum #2]

**Kirk D. Bachman dba Sawtooth Mountain Guides:** The Board reviewed Mr. Bachman's amendment request for the addition of backpacking, technical mountaineering/rock climbing, cross-country skiing and fishing activities to his current license, following which MSC (Baird-Crane) THAT MR. BACHMAN'S AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED EXCLUDING FISHING WHICH IS DENIED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b)(4&5) AND AS FURTHER RECOMMENDED BY THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME IN A LETTER DATED JANUARY 15, 1988. [See Addendum #3]

**William Russell King:** The Board reviewed Mr. King's file relative to the Board's denial of his 1987-1988 guide license, following which MSC (Baird-Crane) THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO MR. KING ADVISING HIM THAT UPON HIS APPLICATION FOR A 1988-1989 GUIDE LICENSE, IF SAID APPLICATION IS TRUTHFULLY COMPLETED IN SECTION C AND SIGNED BY A LICENSED OUTFITTER, THE BOARD WOULD CONSIDER HIS APPLICATION.

**Calvin T. Myers:** The Board reviewed Mr. Myers' file regarding his application to become a licensed guide for Dan Rotthoff, following which MSC (Miller-Crane) THAT MR. MYERS' APPLICATION BE APPROVED WITH LICENSE ISSUED ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS FOR THE 1987-1988 SEASON.

**John P. Lawrence:** The Board reviewed Mr. Lawrence's file and guide license application for snowmobiling activities for Three Bear Lodge, following which MSC (Baird-Crane) THAT MR. LAWRENCE'S APPLICATION BE DENIED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF IDAHO CODE 36-2109(c) AND 36-2113(a)(6).

**Gary Lane dba Wapiti River Guides:** The Board reviewed Mr. Lane's January 15, 1988 letter concerning his citation for violation of Idaho Fish and Game law, following which the Board directs that a letter be addressed to Mr. Lane requesting him to appear before the Board in further explanation of this matter.

**Larry Moats:** The Board reviewed the file with reference to Board Minutes of the proceedings of December 11, 1987 and in accordance with the procedures as outlined, the Board has now received the Stipulation and Order for Dismissal and Remand to the Board, following which MSC (Miller-Crane) THAT MR. MOATS' BEAR AND COUGAR HUNTING PRIVILEGES BE REINSTATED BY ADMINISTRATIVE AMENDMENT AND FURTHER THAT MR. MOATS BE ADVISED THAT FOR A PERIOD OF ONE (1) YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1989 HE MUST DEMONSTRATE THAT HE CAN AND WILL UTILIZE THE LICENSED ACTIVITIES AS RESTORED TO HIS LICENSE.

**Bob Jacklin's Fly Shop, Inc.:** The Board reviewed Mr. Jacklin's file concerning his amendment request to add Henry's Lake and Island Park Reservoir to his licensed area of operation with particular attention to his letter of January 21, 1988, following which MSC (Baird-Vaughn) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT MR. JACKLIN'S RELINQUISHMENT OF HIS REQUEST FOR OUTFITTED ACTIVITIES ON ISLAND PARK RESERVOIR AND THAT IT AFFIRM ITS PRIOR DECISION OF DENIAL FOR FISHING ON HENRY'S LAKE IN ACCORDANCE WITH IDAHO CODE 36-2109(B)(4&5), OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD RULE AND REGULATION NO. 19(b&f), AND RECOMMENDATIONS MADE BY THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME IN A LETTER DATED JULY 23, 1987.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1145 hours and reconvened at 1330 hours with all members present.

**Fiscal Report:** The Board reviewed the FY88 Fiscal Report to note that 53% of the budgeted expenditures were expended during the first half of this fiscal year.

**IOGA Concerns:** The Board reviewed the Resolution adopted by the Association regarding the Nonuse Rule and the proposal to use 2 or 3 colored NCR paper for guide licenses. Following a discussion on these matters, the Board directs that a letter be addressed to the Association acknowledging receipt of the December 22, 1987 and advising that: (1) the Board will address the Nonuse Rule at its spring rules-making session; and (2) using colored NCR paper for the issuance of guide licenses is not feasible.

**Linda L. Elwood:** The Board reviewed the Employee Performance Evaluation prepared by Chairman Meiners and concurred with the "excellent" overall rating.

The Board recessed at 1535 hours and reconvened on Wednesday, January 27, 1988 at 0900 hours with all members except Dale Baird present.

**Virginia Crane:** Mrs. Crane visited with the Board regarding mutual concerns between the IOGA and IOGB regarding guide licensing procedures. Hopefully some understanding was reached relative to those instances when a **true emergency does exist** that accommodation of employment of individuals can be arranged and authorized by the Board for a one-time only trip/hunt [dates/locations to be specified] pending submission of the necessary paperwork to complete an application and subsequent issuance of a guide license, provided that: (1) the employing outfitter assures that the individual has met the training requirements necessary to guide those activities requested; (2) the individual has current first aid certification; and (3) the individual's personal data is complete [full name, address, sex, color of hair, height, weight, birthdate & Social Security number]. However, the Board reserves final approval/issue of a guide license where subsequent research finds the applicant does not meet the criteria for licensing as set forth in the Act and/or Board Rules and Regulations.

**Jim Walker:** The Board reviewed Mr. Walker's file relative to alleged illegal hunting activities along the Snake River during the big game hunting season in October 1986. Following the interview with Mr. Walker and review of his file, MSC (Miller-Crane) THE SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR CASE NO. 00422 BE VACATED DUE TO THE FACT THAT NO SUBSTANTIAL EVIDENCE WAS PRESENTED DURING THE INTERVIEW TO WARRANT THE BOARD'S TAKING ANY FURTHER ACTION.

The Board recessed at 1130 hours and reconvened at 1330 hours with all members present except Dale Baird and Ron Vaughn.

**Don Wilson:** The Board reviewed Mr. Wilson's file and the proposed Stipulation for Resolution of this matter, following which MSC (Miller-Crane) THAT THE STIPULATION AS HAVE BEEN PROPOSED, IF CONCURRED WITH BY ALL PARTIES, BE APPROVED BY THE BOARD IN SETTLEMENT OF THE CHARGES AGAINST MR. WILSON.

**James R. Thrash dba Salmon Meadows Lodge:** The Board met with Mr. Thrash regarding his amendment request to conduct whitetail deer hunting in Fish and Game Management Unit 14. Following the interview, review of the file, and telephone conversation with Jerry Thiessen of the Idaho Department of Fish and Game, MSC (Crane-Miller) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE AMENDMENT REQUEST PENDING THE OUTCOME OF RECONSIDERATION BY THE DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME RELATIVE TO THEIR LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION DATED JANUARY 19, 1988 AS REGARDS MR. THRASH'S AMENDMENT REQUEST. FURTHER, THAT SAID LICENSE, IF ISSUED, WOULD BE SUBJECT TO THE LIMITATION OF SIX (6) CLIENTS PER YEAR WITH THE UNDERSTANDING THAT SAID LICENSE WOULD BE SUBJECT TO REVIEW AT THE END OF A TWO-YEAR

PERIOD WITH ANY NECESSARY ADJUSTMENTS MADE IN ACCORDANCE WITH RE-EVALUATION OF THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME'S BIG GAME MANAGEMENT PLAN IN 1990. FURTHER, THAT ISSUE OF LICENSE WOULD BE SUBJECT TO THE FOREST SERVICE'S ISSUE OF A SPECIAL USE PERMIT. NOTE: IF THE FISH AND GAME DEPARTMENT SUSTAINS THEIR PRIOR DECISION, THEN THE BOARD WILL DENY MR. THRASH'S AMENDMENT REQUEST IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b)(4&5) AND THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME LETTER DATED JANUARY 19, 1988. [See Addendum #4]

**Steven L. Flaherty & Gary W. Ade:** Messrs. Flaherty, Ade, and Mike Daly appeared before the Board relative to the proposed sale and transfer of business from Mr. Daly to Messrs. Flaherty & Ade with the business to continue to be known as dba Bugle Point Outfitters, following which MSC (Crane-Miller) THAT (1) THE SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS BE APPROVED WITH LICENSES ISSUED PENDING THE RECEIPT OF A COMPLETED AND SIGNED SALES CONTRACT AND OTHER PAPERWORK WHICH MAY BE NECESSARY; (2) THAT MESSRS. ADE AND FLAHERTY BE APPROVED AS MANAGING AGENTS FOR THE BUSINESS; (3) THAT MESSRS. FLAHERTY AND ADE BE APPROVED AS QUALIFIED TO GUIDE FOR THOSE ACTIVITIES LICENSED TO BUGLE POINT OUTFITTERS; AND (4) THE AMENDMENT REQUEST TO ADJUST AND MODIFY THE AREA BOUNDARY FOR BUGLE POINT OUTFITTERS TO INCLUDE THE LICK POINT AREA BE APPROVED SUBJECT TO THE SUBMISSION OF A COMPLETED AMENDMENT REQUEST WITH THE NECESSARY FEES AND THE APPROVAL BY THE FOREST SERVICE FOR INCLUSION OF THIS AREA WITHIN THE BUGLE POINT OUTFITTERS AREA OF OPERATION. [See Addendum #5]

The Board recessed at 1615 hours and reconvened on Thursday, January 28, 1988 with all members present.

**Enforcement Coordinator:** The Board reviewed the application submitted for filling the Enforcement Coordinator position. Following the interview with Albert Lewis who was the only applicant, MSC (Vaughn-Crane) THAT MR. LEWIS BE SELECTED TO FILL THE ENFORCEMENT COORDINATOR POSITION EFFECTIVE AT THE BEGINNING OF THE FIRST FULL PAY PERIOD IN MARCH 1988 .

**Antelope Valley Outfitters, Inc.:** The Board met with Harold E. Smith, Jr. regarding Antelope Valley Outfitters, Inc.'s application to be licensed for the hunting of elk, deer, antelope, bears, cougar, predators, and birds plus fishing and trailrides in Fish and Game Management Unit 50. Following an interview before the Board and a review of the file, MSC (Baird-Miller) THAT THIS MATTER BE TABLED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE DISCUSSION HELD WITH MR. SMITH TO ALLOW HIM TO RE-SUBMIT A MODIFIED AREA DESCRIPTION, A MORE SPECIFIC PLAN OF OPERATION

DETAILING HOW THEY WOULD PROPOSE TO OPERATE, IF LICENSED AS AN OUTFITTER, TOGETHER WITH LEASE ARRANGEMENTS FROM OTHER PRIVATE LANDOWNERS IN THE AREA UPON WHICH THEY WOULD PROPOSE TO OPERATE, FOLLOWING WHICH THE BOARD WOULD RECONSIDER THEIR APPLICATION AND ATTEMPT MAKING A DECISION ON SAME AT THE MARCH MEETING. FURTHER, THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO MR. SMITH ADVISING HIM OF THE BOARD'S POSITION/UNDERSTANDING OF THIS MATTER.

**S. C. Buttram:** The Board reviewed the S. C. Buttram file, noting that Grizzly Outfitters, Inc./David L. Deeds & R. Dean Hoff, Managing Agents, have submitted an amendment request to purchase the S. C. Buttram business. It is further noted that at this point in time they are purchasing the business but are only applying to be licensed for that portion of the S. C. Buttram area that lies within the Priest Lake State Forest area along the east border to Priest Lake with a further request that at that point in time when they are able to secure the U. S. Forest Service's permission to operate on the other areas previously licensed to S. C. Buttram, they would make a subsequent amendment to have that added at a later date. Following a discussion of this matter, MSC (Miller-Crane; Meiners: "No") THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE SALE TO GRIZZLY OUTFITTERS, INC. AND THAT THEY BE NOTIFIED THAT THERE MAY BE PROBLEMS WITH THE U. S. FOREST SERVICE PORTION OF THE BUTTRAM AREA FOR GETTING A PERMIT, THAT THEY HAVE THE PROPER PAPERWORK FOR THE STATE LANDS THAT ARE INVOLVED BUT THERE MAY NEED TO BE SOME ADJUSTMENT ON THE STATE LANDS BECAUSE A PORTION OF SAID LANDS LIE WITHIN A CRITICAL GRIZZLY BEAR AND WOODLAND CARIBOU HABITAT, AND FURTHER THAT THE BOARD NEEDS A RELEASE FROM ANY FUTURE INTEREST IN THE BUSINESS FROM MRS. BUTTRAM. [Administrative Note: The Buttram license is not current due to ongoing investigation and correspondence by the Board relative to the status of the business.]

**Grizzly Outfitters, Inc.:** Following the approval of sale between Mrs. S. C. Buttram and Grizzly Outfitters, Inc. and in consideration of their amendment request to add certain lands to their licensed area of operation, MSC (Baird-Vaughn; Meiners: "No") THAT GRIZZLY OUTFITTERS, INC.'S REQUEST FOR AN AMENDMENT TO THEIR LICENSE TO INCLUDE STATE LANDS LYING WITHIN THE PRIEST LAKE STATE FOREST AS PREVIOUSLY LICENSED TO S. **Jim Renshaw:** Following an interview before the Board by Mr. & Mrs. Renshaw and Cecil Weddle concerning the sale and transfer of business from Mr. Weddle to Mr. Renshaw, MSC (Crane-Baird) THAT THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS BE APPROVED AND LICENSE ISSUED WITH MR. RENSHAW QUALIFIED TO GUIDE FOR ALL ACTIVITIES FOR WHICH THE OUTFITTER LICENSE IS ISSUED. [See Addendum #6]

**Scott C. Schnebly:** Mr. Schnebly met with the Board regarding his outfitter license application, following which MSC (Baird-Miller) THAT MR. SCHNEBLY'S APPLICATION BE APPROVED FOR ALL WATERS AND AREAS REQUESTED EXCEPT THAT THE BIG LOST RIVER DRAINAGE REQUEST BE MODIFIED TO INCLUDE ONLY THE EAST FORK OF THE BIG LOST RIVER PROPER FROM WEST FORK OF THE BIG LOST RIVER DOWNSTREAM AND THE REMAINDER OF THE BIG LOST RIVER DRAINAGE FROM EAST FORK OF THE BIG LOST RIVER DOWNSTREAM. THIS EFFECTIVELY EXCLUDES THE WEST FORK OF THE BIG LOST RIVER AND THE COPPER BASIN DRAINAGE AREA, WILDHORSE CREEK DRAINAGE, AND THE NORTH FORK OF THE BIG LOST RIVER. [Note to Linda: Please send a copy of the letter you addressed to Carl Nellis to Herb Pollard at Region 6 for his review and confirmation of his telephone conversation. - See Addendum #7]

**Glenda Lewy:** Following an interview before the Board by Mrs. Lewy concerning her becoming licensed as a Managing Agent for Sun Valley Wilderness Company, Inc., MSC (Miller-Crane) THAT THIS APPLICATION BE APPROVED.

**Sun Valley Wilderness Co./R. J. Lewy:** The Board met with Mr. Lewy relative to the complaint filed by Mr. R. C. Nye of Lancaster, Pennsylvania, MSC (Miller-Crane) UPON REVIEW OF THE FILE AND IN CONSIDERATION OF THE TESTIMONY OFFERED BEFORE THE BOARD RELATIVE TO THIS COMPLAINT, THAT THE BOARD TAKE NO FURTHER ACTION, THE PARTIES INVOLVED BE SO NOTIFIED, AND THE BOARD CONSIDER THE MATTER CLOSED.

**IOGA Concerns:** Grant Simonds, Virginia Crane, and Sandy Podsaid met with the Board to discuss areas of concern regarding the pending legislative amendment and the proposed administrative fine along with proposed rules-making. An understanding was reached with the IOGA indicating they could support the administrative fine proposal with the agreement that the Chairman and Grant Simonds would attend a meeting in Coeur d'Alene (tentative date: February 24 or 25, 1988) for purposes of developing criteria for licensing of charter boat fishing rules and regulations.

**Charter Boat Fishing:** The Board discussed the impact/interest of affected parties inclusive of the Idaho Department of Fish and Game of charter boat fishing activities on Idaho's lakes and reservoirs, following which MSC (Miller-Vaughn) THAT THE BOARD DECLARE A MORATORIUM ON LICENSING OF ADDITIONAL CHARTER BOAT FISHING ON IDAHO'S LAKES AND RESERVOIRS PENDING THE OUTCOME OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION UNTIL THIS MATTER IS ADDRESSED THROUGH THE RULES-MAKING PROCEDURES IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE STATE ADMINISTRATIVE PROCECURES ACT.

All Board business having been concluded for this meeting, the Board adjourned at 1700 hours.
