Boardroom - Boise, Idaho  
July 10-14, 1989

A regular meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guide Licensing Board was convened on Monday, July 10, 1989 at 0830 hours with all Board members present. Board Executive Director, Dean Sangrey, is absent for the Board meeting due to prior commitment for vacation time. Also, Dallas Burkhalter, new board attorney, will be sitting in off and on during the meeting this week.

**Minutes:** The Board reviewed the minutes of the May 8-12, 1989 meeting. Following review and corrections, MSC (Miller--Baird) THAT THE MINUTES BE APPROVED AS CORRECTED.

**Hunter R. Austin:** The Board reviewed Mr. Austin's file and application for guide license for the 1989-90 license year and his request for review of his experience log relative to said licensing for float boatman on SA6. Following review of the log, MSC (Miller--Baird) THAT MR. AUSTIN'S EXPERIENCE LOG BE ACCEPTED AND, TOGETHER WITH HIS ONE TRIP AS REQUIRED BY BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, THAT HE BE APPROVED WITH LICENSE ISSUED FOR CONDUCT OF FLOAT BOATING ON SA6.

**Dean Paul Buscher:** The Board reviewed Mr. Buscher's application and request to be licensed as a float boatman and further reviewed his log for qualification of said boatman for MF1 and MF2. Following a review of the log MSC (Epley--Miller) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT MR. BUSCHER'S LOG EXPERIENCE AND, IN VIEW OF HIS ONE TRIP AS REQUIRED BY BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS ON MF1 AND MF2, THAT LICENSE BE ISSUED.

**Peter S. Halvorson:** The Board reviewed Mr. Halvorson's guide license application for the 1989-90 season and his request to review his experience log to become licensed as float boatman on MF1 and MF2. Following review of the file and log experience MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT MR. HALVORSON'S EXPERIENCE LOG AND, IN VIEW OF HIS ONE TRIP ON MF1 AND MF2 AS REQUIRED BY BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, THAT LICENSE BE ISSUED.

**Tyler J. Porter:** The Board reviewed Mr. Porter's file and guide license application for the 1989-90 season and his request for acceptance of his experience log to become licensed as float boatman on MF1 and MF2. Following review of file and experience log, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT MR. PORTER'S

EXPERIENCE LOG AND, IN VIEW OF HIS HAVING COMPLETED THE NECESSARY TRIP ON THE RIVER IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, APPROVE AND LICENSE MR. PORTER FOR CONDUCT OF FLOAT BOATING ON MF1 AND MF2.

**Daniel Joshua Lowry:** The Board reviewed Mr. Lowry's file and guide license application to become float boatman for the 1989-90 license season together with his request to accept his experience for boating activities on MF1 and MF2. Following a review of this log MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT MR. LOWRY'S EXPERIENCE LOG AND, IN VIEW OF HIS HAVING COMPLETED THE NECESSARY TRIPS IN ACCORDANCE WITH BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, THAT LICENSE BE ISSUED.

**Jonathon C. Swersey:** The Board reviewed Mr. Swersey's file and guide license application for the 1989-90 season for conduct of float boating on MF1 and MF2 and his further request that the board review his experience log for becoming licensed accordingly. Following review of this log MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT MR. SWERSEY'S EXPERIENCE LOG AND, IN VIEW OF THE FURTHER FACT THAT HE HAS COMPLETED THE NECESSARY TRIP AS REQUIRED BY BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, THAT LICENSE BE ISSUED.

**John E. Harned:** The Board reviewed Mr. Harned's file and guide license application for the 1989-90 license year together with his request for review of his experience log to be licensed as boatman on MF1 and MF2. Following review of the experience log, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT MR. HARNED'S EXPERIENCE LOG AND, IN VIEW OF HIS HAVING TAKEN THE NECESSARY TRIPS AS REQUIRED BY BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, THAT LICENSE BE ISSUED.

**Michael Rock:** The Board reviewed Mr. Rock's file and application for the 1989-90 license year and his request for review of his experience log to become licensed as float boatman on SA6 & MF2. Following review of the file, MSC (Epley--Miller) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT MR. ROCK'S EXPERIENCE LOG AND, IN VIEW OF HIS HAVING COMPLETED THE NECESSARY TRIPS AS REQUIRED BY BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, THAT LICENSE BE ISSUED.

**Shannon Wiere:** The Board reviewed Ms. Wiere's file and application and request for review of her experience log to become licensed as float boatman on SE1, MF1 and MF2. Following review of said experience log, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT MS. WIERE'S EXPERIENCE LOG AND, IN VIEW OF HER HAVING COMPLETED THE

NECESSARY TRIPS AS REQUIRED BY BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, THAT LICENSE BE ISSUED.

**Jeff Carlson:** The Board reviewed Mr. Carlson's file and application to become a licensed guide for the 1989-90 season and further considered the board's denial of his 1988-89 guide's license with the stipulation that, if he had no further violation of Fish and Game law, that they would consider him for licensing in the 1989-90 license year. Following discussion of this matter MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT MR. CARLSON BE APPROVED, WITH LICENSE ISSUED PROBATIONARY, WITH THE CUSTOMARY PROBATIONARY REQUIREMENTS OF NO AMENDMENTS TO HIS LICENSE OR VIOLATION OF LOCAL, STATE OR FEDERAL LAW IN THE ENSUING LICENSE YEAR.

**Ronald Frye:** The Board reviewed Mr. Frye's file and guide license application for the 1989-90 season noting his citation for violation of Fish and Game law. The board further noted that this was a dismissed charge, pending completion of the sentence imposed on Mr. Frye. Therefore, Mr. Frye would appear to have answered honestly in saying "no" on his guide license application Section C. With the foregoing in mind, MSC (Baird--Miller) THAT MR. FRYE'S GUIDE LICENSE FOR THE 1989-90 SEASON BE ISSUED WITH NO RESTRICTIONS.

**John C. Lym:** The Board reviewed Mr. Lym's file and guide license application for the 1989-90 season noting his citation for violation of fish and game law. Following review of this matter MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT MR. LYM BE ISSUED A 1989-90 GUIDE LICENSE, "PROBATIONARY", WITH THE CUSTOMARY PROVISIONS OF THE PROBATION BEING NO VIOLATIONS OF LOCAL, STATE OR FEDERAL LAW, NOR ANY AMENDMENT TO HIS LICENSE DURING THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR.

**Douglas E. McFerrin:** The Board reviewed Mr. McFerrin's file and guide license application for the 1989-90 season noting his citation for violation of fish and game law. Following a review of this matter, MSC (Baird--Miller) THAT MR. McFERRIN BE ISSUED HIS 1989-90 GUIDE LICENSE ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS WITH THE CUSTOMARY TERMS OF PROBATION BEING NO VIOLATION OF LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAW, NOR ANY AMENDMENT TO HIS LICENSE DURING THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR.

**Randy Phillips:** The Board reviewed Mr. Phillips' file and guide license application for the 1989-90 license year noting his citation for violation of fish and game law. Following review of

this matter, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT MR. PHILLIPS BE ISSUED HIS 1989-90 GUIDE LICENSE ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS WITH THE CUSTOMARY TERMS OF PROBATION BEING NO VIOLATION OF LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAW, OR ANY AMENDMENT TO HIS LICENSE DURING THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR.

**Tim Meserth:** The Board reviewed Mr. Meserth's file and guide license application for the 1989-90 license year noting his answering 'yes' to the conviction of a felony on his guide license application, Section C. Following a review of this matter, the Board finds that the matter was not a felony nor conviction of a fish and game law. Following which, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT MR. MESERTH'S 1989-90 GUIDE LICENSE BE ISSUED WITH NO RESTRICTIONS.

**Maury Jones:** The Board reviewed Mr. Jones' file and guide license application for the 1989-90 license year noting his citation for violation of fish and game law. Following review of this matter, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT MR. JONES BE ISSUED HIS 1989-90 GUIDE LICENSE ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS WITH TERMS OF SAID PROBATION BEING THAT HE VIOLATE NO LOCAL, STATE OR FEDERAL LAW OR NO AMENDMENT TO HIS LICENSE DURING THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR.

**James R. Sattler:** The Board reviewed Mr. Sattler's file and 1989-90 guide license application noting his citation for violation of fish and game law. Following review of this matter, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT MR. SATTLER'S 1989-90 GUIDE LICENSE BE ISSUED WITH NO RESTRICTIONS.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1130 hours and reconvened at 1300 hours with Board's attorney, Steve Mendive present.

**John Eric Hull:** The Board reviewed Mr. Hull's file and 1989-90 guide license application and his further request for review of log for qualifications for conduct of float boating activity on MF2 only. Following which, MSC (Miller--Baird) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT MR. HULL'S EXPERIENCE LOG AND, IN VIEW OF THE TRIP COMPLETED RELATIVE TO BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, THAT LICENSE BE ISSUED AS FLOAT BOATMAN ON MF2.

**Roy I. Hunter:** The Board reviewed Mr. Hunter's 1989-90 guide license application together with his request for review of his experience log to be licensed as float boatman on SA6. Following which, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT MR. HUNTER'S

EXPERIENCE LOG AND, IN VIEW OF THE COMPLETED TRIPS RELATIVE TO BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, THAT MR. HUNTER BE LICENSED AS FLOAT BOATMAN ON SA6.

**Quentin Selby:** The Board's attorney Steve Mendive reviewed the Quentin Selby matter relative to the status of the litigation. Judge McKee has again granted a continuance until July 19, 1989, for Mr. Selby to file his appellant brief.

**Lester (Zeke) West, dba Whitewater Outfitters:** Board attorney Steve Mendive reviewed the stipulated settlement of the employment of an unlicensed guide noting that the settlement has now concluded with payment of appropriate fine to the board in the amount of \$300.

**Cheryl Bransford, dba Meadow Creek Outfitters:** The Board reviewed Ms. Bransford's file and Stipulated Settlement of Case No 89-459-10. The Board now has a signed stipulated settlement as regards this matter and payment of the appropriate \$200 fine.

**G & L York/Gladys York, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed Ms. York's file relative to the Stipulated Agreement of Case No. 89-453-4, to note that the Board now has a signed stipulated agreement with the payment of a fine in the amount of \$300, plus an additional \$130 for attorneys fees.

**Bear Valley River Company/Douglas Perry, Designated Agent:** Board Enforcement Agent Lynn Bowerman reviewed the South Fork Payette River drowning which occurred on June 17, 1989, to relate his information developed to date as regards his investigation of this accident. Following a discussion of the pertinent facts, which up to this point in time have been revealed, MSC (Epley-- Baird) THAT BEAR VALLEY RIVER COMPANY/DOUGLAS PERRY, DESIGNATED AGENT, BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD ON A SHOW CAUSE HEARING AS TO WHY THEIR OUTFITTING LICENSE AND DESIGNATED AGENT LICENSE SHOULD NOT BE REVOKED OR SUSPENDED IN VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE TITLE 36, CHAPTER 21, SECTION 2113(A)(9 AND 14) AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS RULES 37, 38A AND 53. FURTHER, THAT GREG DEVAN AND MICHAEL SWEC LIKEWISE BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD ON A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF THEIR LICENSES IN VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE TITLE 36, CHAPTER 21, SECTION 2113(A)(14) AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES 37, 38A AND 53.

**Enforcement Coordinator:** Enforcement Coordinator Al Lewis met with the Board to update the board on his recent activities and the status of various litigative matters.

**Non-Profit Organizations:** The Board reviewed the various reports concerning non-profit organizations such as the Boy Scouts of America, Seventh Day Adventist Church/Camp IdaHaven, and the activities of the U.S. Air Force in their pursuit of activities which would appear to come under purview of the Outfitters and Guides Act Idaho Code Title 36, Chapter 21. Following a review of this matter, the Board REQUESTS ITS ATTORNEY TO REVIEW THE ACT AND ITS APPLICABILITY TO THE ACTIVITIES OF SUCH ORGANIZATIONS WITH A RECOMMENDATION TO THE BOARD AS TO APPROPRIATE ACTION WHICH IT MAY FOLLOW IN ADDRESSING THIS MATTER.

**Rule 57A:** The Board reviewed its emergency rules procedures by which to correct Rule 57A - Snake River (SS1) where there was an omission in the original rules package for conduct of float boating from Poplar Canyon downstream to the confluence with the Henry's Fork. Emergency Rule was solicited, no adverse comment was received. Following discussion of this matter and upon recommendation by counsel, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE PROPOSED RULE BE ADOPTED WITH APPROPRIATE DISTRIBUTION OF SAID RULE TO VARIOUS LIBRARIES AS PRESCRIBED BY THE STATE ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES ACT.

**Fiscal Report:** The Board reviewed the fiscal report for the month of May. Following which, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT SAID REPORT BE APPROVED.

**South Fork Boise River Appeal:** The Board reviewed the appeal filed by Mssrs. Lentz and Murphy regarding the South Fork Boise River Outfitting and Guiding Environmental Assessment and Decision Notice. Following a discussion of this matter and review of the Forest Service, Department of Agriculture, appeal procedures 36CFR Part 217, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD PROCEED TO INTERVENTION IN THE APPEAL UNDER SECTION 217.14, AND SO NOTIFYING THE BOISE NATIONAL FOREST SUPERVISOR OF THE BOARD'S INTENT IN THIS MATTER. FURTHER, THAT UPON ACCEPTANCE OF THE BOARD'S INTERVENTION BY THE FOREST SUPERVISOR, THE BOARD DIRECTS THAT THE CHAIRMAN AND ITS ATTORNEY DRAFT WRITTEN COMMENTS REGARDING THE BOARD'S POSITION ON THIS APPEAL AND SUBMIT ACCORDINGLY.

The Board recessed for the day at 1700 hours and reconvened on

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Tuesday, July 11, 1989, at 0830 hours with all Board members, as well as Board's attorneys Steve Mendive and Dallas Burkhalter present.

**Larry F. Weeks:** The Board reviewed Mr. Weeks' June 15, 1989, letter in which he requests consideration to serve as an independent hearings officer should the occasion arise. Following discussion of this matter, the Board DIRECTS THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO MR. WEEKS THANKING HIM FOR HIS REQUEST AND INTEREST AND THAT THEY WILL PUT HIS NAME ON FILE FOR FUTURE CONSIDERATION.

**Steve Olsen:** The Board reviewed Mr. Olsen's May 24, 1989 letter in which he requests clarification as to qualifications necessary to become licensed as a power boat trainee. Following a discussion of this matter, the Board DIRECTS THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO MR. OLSEN IN WHICH A COPY OF THE RULE BOOK IS FORWARDED TO HIM WITH HIS ATTENTION DRAWN TO THE NECESSARY REQUIREMENTS TO OBTAIN LICENSES IN THIS REGARD.

**Mackay Bar/Brent Estep, Float Manager:** The Board reviewed Mr. Estep's May 25, 1989 letter received by the Board July 6, 1989 in which he requests credit for a training trip on SA6 for Brent Estep, Jim Grant, Bruce Allen, Bruce McWilliams, Bev Angell, Rick Johnson, Greg Bell, and George Mustard. Following a discussion of this matter and contact with Garn Christensen, Designated Agent for Mackay Bar, the Board DIRECTS THAT THE ABOVE NAMED INDIVIDUALS BE CREDITED WITH ONE TRAINING TRIP TOWARD THEIR REQUIREMENTS TO BECOME LICENSED AS FLOAT BOATMEN ON SA6 WHEN/IF THEY SUBMIT APPLICATIONS FOR LICENSING.

**Peter Grubb, dba River Odysseys West (ROW):** The Board reviewed Mr. Grubb's June 16, 1989 letter requesting clarification as to procedures for opening designated waters for commercial outfitted activity. Following review of this letter, the Board DIRECTS THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO MR. GRUBB IN WHICH HE IS ADVISED THAT PROCEDURES FOR AMENDING THE IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS ARE AS ADDRESSED IN THE STATE ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES ACT (APA) WHERE SPECIFIC STREAMS CAN BE IDENTIFIED WITH PROPOSED USE OUTLINED IN THE REQUIRED PETITION FOR BOARD CONSIDERATION AND APPROPRIATE ACTION AS DEFINED IN THE APA.

**Dworshak Reservoir Jurisdiction:** The Board reviewed the memorandum from the Attorney General's office concerning jurisdiction on these waters. Following a consideration of this matter, the Board

REQUESTS THAT THE CHAIRMAN CONTACT THE NEZ PERCE INDIAN TRIBAL COUNCIL TO EXPLORE OPPORTUNITIES TO RECONCILE ANY PROBLEMS THAT MIGHT EXIST IN THIS REGARD.

**Marvin L. Todd, dba Diamond Ranch Cougars:** The Board reviewed the letter received from the State of Nevada, Department of Wildlife, regarding Mr. Todd's violation of various state and federal fish and game laws. A check of Mr. Todd's files finds that he does not have a current application before the Board. Thus, the Board directs THAT HIS FILE BE FLAGGED AND THAT AT SUCH TIME AS HE MAY MAKE APPLICATION FOR RENEWAL OF SAID LICENSE, THAT IT BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD BEFORE LICENSE IS ISSUED.

**Upland Game and Waterfowl Hunting:** Dale Baird made a report to the Board regarding the task force recommendations on upland game and waterfowl hunting in which they request the board impose a one-year moratorium to allow them to conclude their work. Following a consideration and discussion of this request and review of the May 26, 1989 letter from the Idaho Department of Fish and Game on this subject, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD PLACE A MORATORIUM ON ISSUING OUTFITTER LICENSES FOR CONDUCT OF UPLAND GAME OR WATERFOWL HUNTING ACTIVITIES EXCEPT AS CURRENTLY PROVIDED, NAMELY: INCIDENTAL FOREST GROUSE AND CHUKAR HUNTING, AND LICENSED OUTFITTED ACTIVITY ON SHOOTING PRESERVES. THIS MORATORIUM IS EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY AND MAY EXTEND TO JULY 1, 1990 TO ENABLE THE BOARD TO DEVELOP AND COMPLETE APPROPRIATE RULES FOR CONDUCT/NONCONDUCT OF SAID ACTIVITIES. [Administrative Note: The staff should research the waiting list to ascertain who is on said list with a letter addressed to these individuals advising them of the Board's action in this regard.]

**Dennis F. Raymer:** Mr. Raymer met with the Board relative to his outfitter license application for the conduct of walk and wade fishing on the upper Coeur d'Alene and St. Joe Rivers, as well as float boating activity on CD1. Following the interview and discussion of his proposed activities MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT MR. RAYMER'S APPLICATION FOR FLOAT BOATING ON THE COEUR D'ALENE RIVER (CD1) EXTENDING FROM DEVIL'S ELBOW TO THE SOUTH FORK OF THE COEUR D'ALENE RIVER BE APPROVED AND THAT HIS REQUEST FOR FISHING ON THE UPPER ST. JOE AND THE UPPER COEUR D'ALENE RIVERS, TO INCLUDE TRIBUTARY STREAMS, AS OUTLINED IN HIS APPLICATION BE APPROVED, BUT LIMITED TO WALK AND WADE, CATCH AND RELEASE FISHING. SAID LICENSE TO BE ISSUED WITH MR. RAYMER QUALIFIED TO GUIDE ON CD1 BASED ON HIS LOG SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD, PENDING COMPLETION OF NECESSARY

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PAPERWORK, NAMELY PAYMENT OF FEES AND SUBMISSION OF BOND AND TRAINING LOG FOR CERTIFICATION AS QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. [Administrative Note: The Board needs to contact the Forest Service regarding further procedures of the M.O.U. and consideration of walk and wade fishing on this river reach. However, float boating activities on the Coeur d'Alene and St. Joe Rivers are not involved as these activities are currently licensed and there is room for additional licensees. Further, the board needs to look at Rule 57(a) to clarify the exact definition of what is meant by CD1, with necessary rules change to make this clarification permanent.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1235 hours and reconvened at 1345 hours.

**Martin Sandborgh:** The Board reviewed Mr. Sandborgh's file and guide license application for the 1989-90 season noting that he had received a fish and game violation to which he admitted on his guide license application, Section C. Following review of this matter which appeared to have occurred in Montana in 1982, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT MR. SANDBORGH BE GRANTED HIS 1989-90 GUIDE LICENSE WITH NO RESTRICTIONS.

**Ralph L. Hatter:** Mr. Hatter and Mr. and Mrs. George Duncan met with the Board relative to the proposed sale and transfer of a portion of George Duncan's outfitting business, namely the cougar hunting activities in F&G Units 14 and 15, to Mr. Hatter. Following the interview before the Board and consideration of this proposed sale and transfer of business, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS BE APPROVED WITH THE OPERATING AREA BEING THAT AS DESIGNATED AREA 3 FOR GEORGE DUNCAN FOR THE CONDUCT OF COUGAR HUNTING. LICENSE TO BE ISSUED UPON COMPLETION OF PAPERWORK. (See Addendum #1) [Administrative Note: In checking with Mr. Hatter, it appears that he submitted both a \$75 and a \$10 amendment fee for this amendment to his license. The \$75 is correct and the \$10 should be refunded, if that is what has happened.]

**Michael J. Connelly:** Mr. Connelly met with the Board regarding his guide license application for the 1989-90 license year and the board's request for him to come before the Board in explanation of his violation of law regarding possession of a controlled substance. Following the interview with Mr. Connelly regarding this matter, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT IN VIEW OF THE EXPLANATION THE

BOARD HAS RECEIVED, MR. CONNELLY'S GUIDE LICENSE BE ISSUED AS APPLIED FOR ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS WITH THE TERMS OF THE PROBATION BEING ONLY THAT HE VIOLATE NO STATE, FEDERAL, OR LOCAL LAWS DURING THE LICENSE SEASON. THE USUAL TERM OF RESTRICTION ON AMENDMENTS WILL NOT BE APPLIED TO THIS PROBATION.

**Stanley Potts:** Mr. Potts and his attorney, Jerry Meyers, met before the Board in an informal discussion of the complaint filed against Mr. Potts by Eakin Ridge Outfitters. Following a review and discussion of this complaint, it is the Board's position and direction to its attorney THAT A LETTER OF REPRIMAND BE ADDRESSED TO MR. POTTS REGARDING THE PACK-OUT OF ELK MEAT WITHIN EAKIN RIDGE'S OPERATING AREA AS ASSOCIATED WITH THE 1988 BIGHORN SHEEP HUNT. FURTHER, THAT IN SETTLEMENT OF THIS MATTER, ALL PARTIES WILL ASSUME FULL PAYMENT OF RESPECTIVE ATTORNEY'S FEES.

The Board recessed for the day at 1700 hours and reconvened on Wednesday, July 12, 1989, at 0830 hours with all Board members and Board's attorneys Steve Mendive and Dallas Burkhalter present.

**Hole-in-the-Wall Lodge/Billy Stockton, Designated Agent:** Mr. Stockton and Mrs. Stockton met with the Board relative to his application and request to become designated agent for Hole-in-the-Wall Lodge. Following the interview before the board concerning this request, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. STOCKTON AS DESIGNATED AGENT - QUALIFIED TO GUIDE WITH GUIDE LICENSE ISSUED SUBJECT TO RECEIPT BY THE BOARD OF NECESSARY TRAINING FORM, ATTESTING HIS ACQUAINTANCE WITH THE AREA. [Administrative Note: The Board needs to obtain Articles of Incorporation of Hole-in-the-Wall Lodge.]

**Stanley Potts:** The Board reviewed Mr. Potts' various amendment requests for the conduct of bighorn sheep hunting, namely (1) conduct of the individual who purchased the Foundation for North American Wild Sheep/Idaho Department of Fish and Game auction tag; (2) a request to take a booked hunter into Area 537 which is a non-outfitted area; and (3) amendment request to take booked hunters into Area 526-2, 527-1, and 527-9, all of which fall within areas currently licensed to other outfitters. A review of the file on these last three requests finds that Mr. Potts has obtained permission from the affected outfitters for him to conduct these hunts within their respective operating areas. Following which, MSC (Baird--Epley, Meiners - No on Motion Parts 4 and 5) THAT STANLEY POTTS' OUTFITTERS LICENSE BE AMENDED TO ALLOW MR. POTTS TO

(1) HUNT CLIENT DAN PAELLIA, THE HOLDER OF THE STATE AUCTION PERMIT, IN ANY BIGHORN SHEEP HUNTING UNIT IN THE STATE OF IDAHO THAT IS OPEN DURING THE 1989-1990 SHEEP SEASON; (2) INCLUDE SHEEP HUNTING UNIT AREA NO. 537, A NON-ASSIGNED AREA; (3) HUNT ONE SHEEP HUNTER, A DAN DONALDSON, IN AREA 526-2 ONLY IN THAT PORTION WHICH IS CURRENTLY ASSIGNED TO OUTFITTER CON HOURIHAN; (4) HUNT ONE HUNTER, ARCHIE SMITH, IN UNIT 527-9 ONLY IN THAT AREA OF 527-9 WHICH IS ASSIGNED TO OUTFITTER SHANE MACAFEE, DBA CASTLE CREEK OUTFITTERS; AND (5) HUNT ONE HUNTER, A DAVE JOHNSON, IN AREA 527-1 ONLY IN THAT AREA ASSIGNED TO FLYING B RANCHES. THIS AMENDMENT IS CONTINGENT UPON LETTERS OF PERMISSION FROM THE AFFECTED OUTFITTER ON FILE IN THE BOARD'S OFFICE AND APPROVAL FROM THE U.S.F.S. FOR SPECIAL USE PERMITS. THIS AMENDMENT IS VALID ONLY FOR THE 1989 BIGHORN SHEEP HUNTING SEASON.

**Gary Sylte, dba Coeur d'Alene River Big Game Outfitters:** Mr. and Mrs. Sylte met with the Board relative to the denial of their outfitter license application for conduct of big game hunting activities in F&G Unit 4. Following the conclusion of the hearing, the following Findings of Fact were established: (1) That the Board erred in its determination that there was an overlap by and between Mr. Sylte's application and Richard VanderMeyden's operating area; (2) that the Board's position relative to the accessibility of the area to general public for the conduct of general hunting may not be as was perceived, that the area is one in which locked gates reduces the access to the general public and therefore, the Board may wish to reconsider its position; and (3) that the Board, based on the information and testimony offered, would re-evaluate their position relative to not licensing that area formerly licensed to Richard Grunch, dba The Grunch Bunch and go to Rule 28(c) for criteria/procedures re-licensing of the area. With these Findings of Fact in mind, Conclusions of Law are: (1) Idaho Code 36-2109(b)(4 and 5) and Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations Rule 19(f) does not apply; (2) Rule 28(c) does apply; and (3) based on Rule 28(c) the denial of Syltes application will stay in place, however, the Board will reconsider its decision not to advertise the area for outfitting activity and, in fact, will advertise the area for outfitted activity with the Syltes application, as submitted, considered along with any other applications received in selecting an appropriate licensee. Final decision will be made at the September board meeting. Following consideration of this matter, MSC (Miller--Baird) THAT (1) THE BOARD ACCEPT THE FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW AND MOVE TO THE FURTHER PROCESSING OF THE SYLTES

APPLICATION; AND (2) THE BOARD APPROVE MR. SYLTE'S APPLICATION FOR AN OPERATING AREA ON THE WEST SIDE OF THE COEUR D'ALENE RIVER AS SUBMITTED (SYLTES WILL PROVIDE A NEW WORDED BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION) FOR DEER AND ELK HUNTING LIMITED TO 7 CLIENTS DURING ARCHERY SEASON AND 7 CLIENTS DURING RIFLE SEASON. (See Addendum #2)

**Kerry Brennan:** Mr. Brennan met with the Board relative to his request for rehearing on the denial of his 1989-90 guide license application for violation of fish and game law and falsification of his guide license application. Following a review of the file and meeting with the Board and in view of the testimony offered by Mr. Brennan, the Findings of Fact are: (1) that Mr. Brennan did, in fact, violate fish and game law by not appropriately tagging steelhead that he had taken; (2) that Mr. Brennan did, in fact, falsify his guide license application; and (3) Mr. Brennan admits to these facts and provided an explanation of circumstances surrounding the incident. With these findings of fact in mind, the Conclusions of Law are (1) Mr. Brennan did violate Idaho Code 2109(c) and 36-2113(a)(1 and 6); and (2) such violations are grounds for denial of Mr. Brennan's license. Following which, MSC (Miller--Crane; Baird, No) THAT (1) THE BOARD ACCEPT THE FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW; (2) THE BOARD RESCIND ITS PREVIOUS DENIAL OF MR. BRENNAN'S LICENSE (3) MR. BRENNAN'S 1989-90 GUIDE LICENSE BE ISSUED ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS, THE TERMS OF SAID PROBATION BEING THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE OR FEDERAL LAW OR THAT NO AMENDMENT WILL BE ALLOWED TO HIS LICENSE DURING THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR; AND (4) THAT NECESSARY FEES SHALL HAVE TO BE RECEIVED BEFORE SAID LICENSE WILL BE ISSUED.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1330 hours and reconvened at 1345 hours.

**Ronald W. Bloxham and Michael Scott, dba White Cloud Outfitters:** Mssrs. Bloxham and Scott met with the Board relative to the matter of walk and wade fishing on SA2. The thrust of their testimony and meeting with the Board and submission of a letter from the five affected outfitters currently licensed for float boating and fishing on SA2 is in opposition to licensing of walk and wade fishing on SA2 beyond that associated with their respective activities as licensed outfitters and Robert Cole who should be grandfathered for walk and wade fishing along SA2.

**James R. Thrash, dba Salmon Meadows Lodge, SML Outfitters, Wagon Wheel Corrals:** Mr. Thrash met with the Board concerning his

amendment requests, namely (1) to clarify his trailrides and fishing activities in F&G Unit 24 in the vicinity of Payette Lake; and (2) his amendment request to amend his license for the conduct of sheep hunting activity in sheep hunt units 520-5 and 520-6. Following the interview before the Board and discussion of this matter, MSC (Miller-Baird) THAT LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO MR. THRASH TO ADVISE HIM THAT THE BOARD WILL (1) TAKE HIS AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR MODIFICATION OF HIS FISHING AND TRAILRIDING ACTIVITIES UNDER ADVISEMENT AND THAT HE IS AUTHORIZED TO CONTINUE AS CURRENTLY LICENSED UNTIL SUCH TIME AS WE HAVE FURTHER INPUT FROM THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME AND THE U.S. FOREST SERVICE; AND (2) APPROVE HIS REQUEST FOR CONDUCT OF BIGHORN SHEEP HUNTING IN SHEEP HUNT UNITS 520-5 AND 520-6 AS REQUESTED FOR CLIENT NAMED MARK WITT OF ST. LOUIS, MISSOURI, AND GAIL WINNEY OF WAUSAU, WISCONSIN. FURTHER, THE BOARD HAS ON RECORD APPROVAL OF THE LAND MANAGING AGENCY AND AFFECTED OUTFITTERS EXCEPT ZEKE WEST, DBA WHITEWATER RANCH, WHICH WOULD BE EXCLUDED FROM THIS AMENDMENT REQUEST UNLESS SUCH APPROVAL IS RECEIVED IN WRITING PRIOR TO THE SCHEDULED HUNT. [Administrative Note: It should be noted that Mr. Thrash shares F&G Units 520-5 and 520-6 with other licensed outfitters whose permission has been obtained as noted. Further, that the affected outfitters involved in the trailriding, fishing amendment request should be notified and asked for response to this proposed amendment.]

**Village Stables, Inc./Daniel R. Mulick, Designated Agent:** Mr. Mulick, together with Mr. Tim Gardiner of Timothy N. Gardiner, Inc./Tim Gardiner, Designated Agent, met with the Board relative to the proposed sale and transfer of Mr. Gardiner's outfitting business for the conduct of trailrides, fishing and backpacking in F&G Mgmt. Unit 52 to Village Stables, Inc./Daniel R. Mulick, Designated Agent. Following a review of the file and discussion of this matter and working out the necessary details relative to the proposed sale and transfer of business, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS BE APPROVED AND THAT OUTFITTER LICENSE BE ISSUED TO VILLAGE STABLES, INC. WITH DANIEL MULICK APPROVED AS DESIGNATED AGENT - QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. FURTHER, THAT THIS LICENSE WILL BE ISSUED UPON RECEIPT AND APPROVAL OF A WRITTEN OPERATING PLAN. THE OPERATING AREA ASSOCIATED WITH THIS LICENSE SHALL BE ONE AND THE SAME AS THAT FORMERLY LICENSED TO MR. GARDINER AND FOR THE SAME ACTIVITIES. (See Addendum #3)

**Bureau of Land Management:** The Board reviewed the Bureau of Land Management letter dated June 15, 1989, and proposal regarding an

increase in the allocation of commercial use on the upper Owyhee River System, Nevada, Idaho and Oregon, while at the same time encouraging a shift in commercial use from the early spring to the late spring and summer months. Following discussion of this proposal, the Board DIRECTS THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO THE BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT TO COMMEND THEM FOR THEIR PROPOSED ACTION AND TO ENCOURAGE THEM TO CARRY IT FORWARD TO FRUITION.

**U.S. Forest Service:** The Board reviewed various Forest Service letters, namely:

1. Letter from Palisades Ranger District regarding the Anschutz Corporation Grand Valley Prospect Exploration Oil Well Environmental Assessment of August 1989. The Board directs THAT NO COMMENT IS NECESSARY AS REGARDS THIS LETTER.

2. Letter from Palisades Ranger District regarding the prospectus for the proposed fishing and sightseeing special use permit to be issued on the Palisades Reservoir. Following a review of this memorandum and in consideration of previous correspondence and action both by the Forest Service and the Board dated June 4, 1988 and July 12, 1988, the Board directs THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO MR. DICKEMORE ASKING FOR CLARIFICATION OF HIS PROPOSED PROSPECTUS AS IT RELATES TO THE PREVIOUS ACTIONS THAT HAVE BEEN TAKEN IN THIS REGARD.

3. Letter received from Sawtooth National Recreation Area dated May 17, 1989, regarding cougar hunting activities on the SNRA. Following review of this matter, the Board directs THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO MR. PENCE ADVISING HIM THAT AT THE PRESENT TIME THERE ARE AT LEAST FIVE OUTFITTERS LICENSED FOR COUGAR HUNTING WITHIN THE SNRA WHICH WOULD APPEAR TO COVER A BULK, IF NOT ALL OF THE SNRA AND ASK FOR CLARIFICATION OF HIS LETTER/REQUEST.

4. Letter from the Payette National Forest Krassel Ranger District regarding the midsummer Frank Church River of No Return Wilderness management field discussion dated June 15, 1989. Following review of this memorandum and request for Licensing Board participation in the deliberations, the Board DIRECTS THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO MR. KIMBALL, DISTRICT RANGER, KRASSEL RANGER DISTRICT, THANKING HIM FOR THE INVITATION AND STATING THAT DALE BAIRD WILL BE ATTENDING THE CONFERENCE.

The Board recessed for the day at 1715 hours and reconvened on Thursday, July 13, 1989, at 0830 hours with all Board members and Board's attorneys Steve Mendive and Dallas Burkhalter present.

**Proposed FY90-91 Budget:** Following a review of the proposed FY90/FY91 budgets, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE PROPOSED BUDGETS. [Administrative Note: Mr. Miller requests that as time and opportunity affords the ability to do so, that additional monies be funnelled into an increased enforcement effort.]

**Martin Capps, dba Happy Hollow Camps:** The Board reviewed Mr. Capps July 3, 1989 memo to the Board in which he concurs in the Board's response to his amendment request to take another look at his operating area boundaries by moving same north to join the Larry Moats' operating area boundary. Following review of this matter, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT MR. CAPPS' OPERATING AREA BOUNDARIES BE AMENDED TO REFLECT PROPOSED CHANGE IN SAID BOUNDARY NORTH TO COINCIDE AND JOIN THE LARRY MOATS OPERATING AREA BOUNDARY. (See Addendum #4)

**George J. Meholchick:** Mssrs. George Meholchick and Stan Meholchick appeared before the Board in a denial hearing relative to the Board's denial of George Meholchick's 1989-90 guide license application. In the course of the testimony presented to the Board the following Findings of Fact were established: (1) Mr. Meholchick did receive a citation for violation of fish and game law, namely the placement of bear bait on public land without permit; and (2) Mr. Meholchick pled guilty to said charge and paid the appropriate fine. Following consideration of these Findings of Fact, the Conclusions of Law are as follows: (1) Mr. Meholchick was, in fact, in violation of Idaho Code 36-2109(c) and 36-2113(a)(6). Following consideration of these Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD RESCIND ITS PRIOR DENIAL OF MR. MEHOLCHICK'S 1989-90 GUIDE LICENSE AND ISSUE SAID LICENSE ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS FOR THE 1989 SEASON WITH THE CUSTOMARY PROBATIONARY LIMITATIONS OF NO VIOLATION OF LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAW OR AMENDMENT TO HIS GUIDE LICENSE DURING THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR.

**Board Policy:** The Board reviewed its procedure for investigating and taking appropriate action regarding citations for violation of state and federal law. Following a discussion of this matter, the Board DIRECTS THAT THE ENFORCEMENT COORDINATOR BE REQUESTED TO

CONTACT AND REQUEST A WRITTEN REPORT FROM THE INDIVIDUAL WHO ISSUED SAID CITATION FOR VIOLATION OF SAID STATE AND FEDERAL LAW TO ASSIST THE BOARD IN REVIEW AND DISPOSAL OF SUCH MATTERS.

**Lazy J Outfitters, Inc./Larry Jarrett, Designated Agent; Delbert Allmon, dba Fall Creek Outfitters; and Ronald L. Shearer, dba Steel Mountain Outfitters:** Mssrs. Shearer and Allmon met with the Board (Mr. Jarrett was not present, but was represented by his attorney, Mr. Sutton) as regards the proposed clarification of operating boundaries between the parties involved. Following the interview before the Board regarding this matter, MSC (Miller--Baird) THAT (1) AS REGARDS MR. JARRETT'S AMENDMENT REQUEST IN PART TO MODIFY HIS CURRENT OPERATING BOUNDARY BETWEEN HIMSELF AND RON SHEARER, THAT INASMUCH AS BOTH PARTIES ARE AGREEABLE TO THIS CHANGE IN OPERATING AREA BOUNDARIES, THAT SAID REQUEST BE APPROVED, PENDING RECEIPT OF A WORDED AREA DESCRIPTION TO BE SUBMITTED BY MR. SHEARER (See Addendum #5); (2) AS REGARDS MR. SHEARER'S AMENDMENT REQUEST TO BE RESTORED TO HIS OPERATING AREA BOUNDARIES PRIOR TO HIS FORMATION OF PARTNERSHIP WITH MR. ALLMAN, THAT THE BOARD APPROVE A MODIFIED REQUEST TO RESTORE MR. SHEARER TO BEAR AND COUGAR HUNTING IN THAT AREA TO WHICH HE WAS FORMERLY LICENSED FOR SUCH ACTIVITIES NORTH AND WEST OF THE MIDDLE FORK OF THE BOISE RIVER (See Addendum #6); (3) THAT THE DISPUTED OPERATING AREA BOUNDARIES BY AND BETWEEN MR. ALLMAN AND MR. JARRETT BE CONTINUED UNTIL THE NOVEMBER BOARD MEETING FOR DISCUSSION AND FURTHER ACTION AND (4) THAT THE BOARD ADVISE MR. SHEARER THAT THE BOARD WILL NOT MOVE TO UN-STACK BEAR HUNTING ACTIVITIES BY AND BETWEEN HIMSELF AND MR. ALLMAN AT THIS TIME.

**Lazy J Outfitters, Inc./Larry Jarrett, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed Mr. Jarrett's request for a license amendment for the conduct of bighorn sheep hunting in bighorn sheep hunting unit 528-2, said unit being an area in which no current outfitter is licensed for the conduct of bighorn sheep hunting. Following consideration of this matter, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT MR. JARRETT'S AMENDMENT FOR THE CONDUCT OF BIGHORN SHEEP HUNTING IN 528-2 BE APPROVED PENDING RECEIPT AND COMPLETION OF A NECESSARY AMENDMENT REQUEST, PAPERWORK, AND PAYMENT OF FEES FOR THE 1989-90 SEASON IN GUIDING DR. HILLEBRAND, PERMIT #80-000146. FURTHER, THAT UPON RECEIPT OF SAID PAPERWORK, THAT THE CHAIRMAN AND/OR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR BE AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE AMENDED LICENSE.

**Mike Mulligan:** The Board reviewed Mr. Mulligan's outfitter license amendment request for the addition of jeep tours as a licenseable activity under his outfitters license within the Sawtooth National

Recreation Area. Following a review of the file and noting that the Forest Service has concluded their environmental assessment and approval of said amendment request with issue of special use permit MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. MULLIGAN'S AMENDMENT REQUEST PENDING RECEIPT OF PAYMENT OF NECESSARY FEES.

**Payette National Forest:** The Board reviewed the July 9, 1989, memorandum to Ted Epley regarding commercial air service on forest land. The Board reviewed this memorandum and DIRECTS THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO THE FOREST SERVICE URGING THEM TO FOLLOW THROUGH ON THIS MATTER AND, AS IT PROGRESSES, TO KEEP THE BOARD INFORMED -- THAT WE WOULD LIKE TO PARTICIPATE IN ANY MEETINGS THAT ARE TO BE HELD IN THIS REGARD. FURTHER, THAT AS REGARDS THE PROPOSED LUMP RECREATIONAL USE ON THE McCALL RANGER DISTRICT, THAT THE BOARD WOULD LIKE TO BE INVOLVED IN ANY MEETINGS CONCERNING THIS MATTER AND HAS ASKED TED EPLEY TO REPRESENT THE BOARD IN THIS REGARD.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1145 hours and reconvened at 1315 hours.

**Class V Whitewater:** The Board reviewed Class V Whitewater's July 12, 1989, letter in which they outline their proposal to participate in a donated float trip on the North Fork Payette River (PN2) from Cabarton Bridge to Smiths Ferry. Following which, it is the Board's position THAT THIS DOES NOT FALL WITHIN THE PURVIEW OF THE ACT AND THAT CLASS V WHITEWATER BE SO ADVISED.

**H. Spence Warner:** The Board reviewed Mr. Warner's request for their consideration of utilization of the letters "SFL" as a decal on his boats. The Board's position is THAT IF THIS IS NOT UTILIZED BY SOMEONE ELSE IN THE SAME WATERS, THIS IS SATISFACTORY TO THE BOARD. The Board further considered his request for reevaluation of the Board's limitation of boats on the South Fork Snake River. Following which, the Board DIRECTS THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO MR. WARNER ADVISING HIM THAT THE BOARD'S RULE LIMITATION IS PLACED THERE FOR A CONTROL AND PROTECTION OF THE RIVER AND TO CHANGE THE CURRENT RULE WOULD REQUIRE GOING TO RULES MAKING PROCEDURES IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE STATE ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES ACT.

**Quenton Cook:** The Board reviewed Mr. Cook's file, noting that he has withdrawn his outfitter license application. Thus, this matter is closed.

**Cheryl Bransford, dba Meadow Creek Outfitters:** The Board reviewed

Ms. Bransford's file, noting her outfitter license amendment for the addition of trailrides. This was a matter pending before the Board awaiting Forest Service input regarding this request. This input has now been received with the Forest Service having no objection to the licensing of this activity on adjacent national forest lands. Following which, MSC (Crane-- Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE CHERYL BRANSFORD'S AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR CONDUCT OF TRAILRIDES AS OUTLINED ON HER AMENDMENT REQUEST WITH THE OPERATING AREA BEING AS SO DEFINED IN THAT REQUEST. (See Addendum #7)

**Salmon River Challenge, Inc./Pat Marek, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed Salmon River Challenge, Inc.'s, amendment request for chukar hunting along those water for which they have been licensed for float boating activity, namely SA6, SA7A, SA7B, and SA7C. Following which, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE SALMON RIVER CHALLENGE, INC.'S OUTFITTER AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR CONDUCT OF CHUKAR HUNTING ALONG THOSE WATERS UPON WHICH THEY ARE LICENSED FOR FLOAT BOATING ACTIVITY.

**David E. Williams:** Dave Williams met with the Board regarding David 'Les' Udy's citation for violation of fish and game law. Following the interview before the Board in which Mr. Williams acknowledged his full responsibility for the conduct of his guides' actions in this matter, the Board DIRECTS THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO MR. WILLIAMS TO (A) EXPRESS THE BOARD'S APPRECIATION FOR HIS COMING BEFORE THE BOARD TO EXPLAIN THE CIRCUMSTANCES SURROUNDING THE INCIDENT; (B) ACCEPT MR. WILLIAMS STATEMENT BEFORE THE BOARD THAT A SIMILAR SITUATION WOULD NOT HAPPEN AGAIN AND THAT HE NO LONGER WAS ASSOCIATED WITH MR. UDY; AND (C) THAT A COPY OF THIS LETTER SHALL BECOME A PART OF HIS PERMANENT RECORD.

**David E. Williams:** Dave Williams met with the Board regarding the Lemhi County Joint-Use Bear/Cougar hunting area. Following the interview before the Board and in consideration of the requested response from the Governor's office regarding this matter, the Board DIRECTS (1) THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO MR. WILLIAMS EXPRESSING THEIR ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF HIS APPEARING BEFORE THE BOARD TO EXPRESS HIS CONCERNS REGARDING THIS MATTER AND THAT HIS TESTIMONY WILL BE DULY CONSIDERED IN MAKING A FINAL DETERMINATION AS REGARDS THE LEMHI COUNTY JOINT-USE AREA; AND (2) THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO THE GOVERNOR IN RESPONSE TO HIS INQUIRY TO (A) OUTLINE THE BACKGROUND TO THE ORIGIN OF THE LEMHI COUNTY JOINT-USE AREA, (B) SUBSEQUENT BOARD ACTIONS TO OVERCOME THE PROBLEM, AND (C) THE BOARD'S CURRENT ON-GOING ACTION TO RESOLVE THE PROBLEM AND PUT

IT AT REST.

**Glacier Raft Company - Idaho/Kris Kok, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed Mr. Kok's outfitter license amendment request for the addition of float boating activity on CL1 and SE2. Following a review of this request and research of Board files, the Board finds that (1) Board letter dated March 24, 1986, to Darwin R. Stoneman, Glacier Raft Company, notified Glacier Raft Company that it was selected as a qualified candidate for float boating operations on CL1 and SE2; (2) Board records fail to show that Glacier Raft Company followed through to become licensed on these river reaches, namely CL1 and SE2; (3) Board records find that CL1 is currently licensed to capacity in accordance with Rule 57(A) with one individual on the waiting list; and (4) Board records find that SE2 has three individuals currently licensed for conduct of float boating activity out of the total authorized use of five with two on the waiting list for consideration in licensing this river reach. Following discussion of this background to this amendment request MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT (1) GLACIER RAFT COMPANY - IDAHO'S AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR FLOAT BOATING ON CL1 BE DENIED. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CAPACITIES ESTABLISHED BY RULE 57(A). FURTHER THAT GLACIER RAFT COMPANY - IDAHO BE NOTIFIED THAT THEIR NAME WILL BE PLACED ON THE WAITING LIST FOR FUTURE CONSIDERATION ON CL1; AND (2) GLACIER RAFT COMPANY - IDAHO BE NOTIFIED THAT OF THE TOTAL AUTHORIZATION FOR FIVE FLOAT BOAT LICENSES ON SE2, THREE ARE CURRENTLY LICENSED WITH TWO SLOTS REMAINING TO BE LICENSED; (3) THESE TWO SLOTS BECAME AVAILABLE DUE NONUSE DECISIONS BY THE BOARD, TO NECESSITATE THAT RE-LICENSING OF SE2 BE DONE IN ACCORDANCE WITH RULE 28(C) AND (4) GLACIER RAFT COMPANY - IDAHO BE NOTIFIED THAT THERE CURRENTLY ARE TWO INDIVIDUALS ON THE WAITING LIST AND THAT THEIR NAME WILL BE PLACED THERE AS WELL FOR CONSIDERATION IN RE-LICENSING FLOAT BOAT ACTIVITY ON SE2.

**Tim Jantz:** The Board reviewed Mr. Jantz's file noting the scheduled time for the denial hearing was at hand. However, notice of hearing may not have gotten out in time for Mr. Jantz to appear at the appointed time and date. Mr. Jantz did not appear. This matter will be continued to the September Board meeting and Mr. Jantz be notified.

**Riders, Inc./Linda Bonser Rider, Designated Agent:** Ms. Rider appeared before the Board relative to their outfitter license application to become licensed for the conduct of trailrides on the

Panhandle Forest, and F&G Mgmt. Unit 3. Following the interview before the Board regarding this application, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT RIDERS, INC.'S, APPLICATION FOR AN OUTFITTER LICENSE BE APPROVED AS PRESENTED WITH THE PORTION THAT ENCOMPASSES NATIONAL FOREST LAND BE INCLUDED PENDING AN AFFIRMATIVE NOTICE FROM THE PANHANDLE NATIONAL FOREST, FERNAN DISTRICT RANGER, AND THAT LINDA RIDER BE APPROVED AS DESIGNATED AGENT - QUALIFIED TO GUIDE, WITH LICENSE TO BE ISSUED ACCORDING TO THE PRECEEDING INSTRUCTIONS AND PAYMENT OF FEES. THE LICENSED ACTIVITIES (NAMELY, TRAILRIDES, HAYRIDES AND SLEIGHRIDES) AND OPERATING AREA BOUNDARY SHALL BE AS APPLIED FOR. (See Addendum #8)

**Richard L. Norris, dba Moose Creek Outfitters:** The Board reviewed Mr. Norris's outfitter amendment request for the conduct of cougar hunting within his own licensed operating area plus that operating area licensed to Mr. Ken Smith, dba 62 Ridge Outfitters and Guides, and additionally to Idaho Big Game, Inc./Mr. Jon Goodman, Designated Agent. The Board further noted that the Idaho Department of Fish and Game indicates they have no objection to adding cougar hunting to Mr. Norris's licensed activities within his currently licensed operating area boundary. Following which, MSC (Miller--Baird) THAT (1) MR. NORRIS'S OUTFITTER AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE CONDUCT OF COUGAR HUNTING WITHIN HIS CURRENTLY LICENSED OPERATING AREA BOUNDARIES BE APPROVED; AND (2) MR. NORRIS'S REQUEST FOR CONDUCT OF COUGAR HUNTING IN THOSE OPERATING AREAS CURRENTLY LICENSED TO MR. SMITH AND MR. GOODMAN BE DENIED. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS IN ACCORDANCE WITH IDAHO CODE 36-2109(B)(5) AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS RULE 19(F).

**Wild River Outfitters:** The Board reviewed Wild River Outfitters' Designated Agent license application request for Richard J. Cook to become designated agent. Review of the file finds that an agreed to settlement as regards a citation issued Mr. Cook in 1988, that said settlement was to the effect that Mr. Cook relinquished his Wild River Outfitters 1988 Designated Agent's license effective November 4, 1988, and that he relinquished said position for a period of one year from date of said agreement/relinquishment. Following which, MSC (Miller--Crane; Epley, abstained) THAT RICHARD J. COOK'S DESIGNATED AGENT APPLICATION BE DENIED IN ACCORDANCE TO THE AGREEMENT AS SET FORTH IN THE NOVEMBER 4, 1988, LETTER RECEIVED BY THE BOARD NOVEMBER 7, 1988, FROM MR. COOK'S ATTORNEY DENNIS J. SALLAZ. FURTHER, THAT UPON RE-APPLICATION BY MR. COOK FOR A DESIGNATED AGENT LICENSE, THAT HE ATTACH TO SAID APPLICATION A COPY

OF THE AGREED TO SETTLEMENT AS REFERENCED IN THE NOVEMBER 4, 1988, LETTER.

**Richard A. Bradbury:** The Board reviewed Mr. Bradbury's guide license application for the 1989-90 season noting his violation of fish and game law. Following review of the file and the letter he submitted to the Board and also Mr. Bradbury's coming before the Board in explanation of the circumstances surrounding this violation, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT MR. **David P. Bobbitt, dba Coeur d'Alene Outfitter:** The Board reviewed Mr. Bobbitt's file and outfitter license amendment request for the conduct of fishing and trailriding within his current operating area with fishing to take place in the Steep Lakes and Goose Lake. Research in this matter finds that the Forest Service has approved said amendment to his license and by telephone conversation by and between Board Chairman and Jerry Thiessen of the Idaho Department of Fish and Game, the Department has no objection, with the stipulation that Mr. Bobbitt be advised that the Department may utilize the Steep Lakes as a brood stock source for golden trout in the future, thereby necessitating this being removed from his license at some future date. **Devils Bedstead/Milton Butler, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed the Devils Bedstead file and Bill Shields' Designated Agent request to add Milt Butler as a Designated Agent for Devils Bedstead (said request is in conformance to request by Mr. Shields by telephone call July 12, 1989, taken by Office Secretary, Jani DeMond). Following consideration of this request, MSC (Crane--Baird) THAT (1) MILT BUTLER BE APPROVED AS DESIGNATED AGENT - QUALIFIED TO GUIDE FOR DEVILS BEDSTEAD RANCH; AND (2) THAT LICENSE BE ISSUED UPON RECEIPT OF CORRECTED BOND TO REFLECT THE ADDITION OF MILT BUTLER AS A DESIGNATED AGENT FOR DEVILS BEDSTEAD. [Administrative Note: The Board requests the Executive Director to research Devils Bedstead Ranch's file as well as Timothy

Gardiner, Inc.'s file to determine how Timothy Gardiner, Inc. is licensed for fishing and trailriding activities within that operating area licensed to Devils Bedstead.

The Board recessed for the day at 1700 hours and reconvened on Friday, July 14, 1989, at 0830 hours with all Board members and attorney Dallas Burkhalter present.

**Brett Hincks, dba Hincks' Palisades Creek Ranch:** The Board reviewed Mr. Hincks' outfitter license amendment request for conduct of fishing and sightseeing trips on Palisades Reservoir. Review of the file with specific reference to the Forest Service letter dated May 2, 1988, finds that Mr. Hincks is among those who are listed as qualified to be licensed/permitted on Palisades Reservoir. Following which, MSC (Miller--Baird) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. HINCKS' OUTFITTER LICENSE AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR CONDUCT OF FISHING AND SIGHTSEEING TRIPS ON PALISADES RESERVOIR, PENDING RECEIPT OF AN OPERATING PLAN OUTLINING HOW THESE TRIPS ARE TO BE CONDUCTED AND THE TYPE OF CRAFT WHICH SHALL BE UTILIZED IN THE CONDUCT OF SUCH ACTIVITY. Following review of his file and the Board rules and regulations, Rule 57(a), the Board finds that ten individuals may be licensed for the conduct of power boating activity on CL3. **Cornelius J. Hourihan, dba Taylor Ranch Outfitters:** The Board reviewed Mr. Hourihan's outfitter amendment request for the conduct of bighorn sheep hunting activity for the 1989 bighorn sheep season in sheep hunt units 527-1, 536B-1, and 536B-2. Following a review of Mr. Hourihan's request wherein the Board finds that (1) Mr. Hourihan indicates he has obtained the permission of affected outfitters in sheep unit 527-1 and 536B-1; (2) that 536B-2 is not licensed to any licensed outfitter; and (3) Mr. Hourihan has land manager approval for the conduct of said hunts, exclusive of the Morgan Creek drainage, MSC (Epley-- Baird; Meiners, No on permission to hunt in Sheep Unit 536B-1) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. **Hells Canyon National Recreation Area/Art Seamons and Ed Cole, Managers:** The Board met with Mssrs. Ed Cole and Art Seamons, Area Managers, regarding the proposed one-day float trips below Hells Canyon on SN7. Following the meeting, the Board CONCURS IN THE LICENSING/PERMITTING OF ADVENTURE AFLOAT AS A SELECTED OUTFITTER FOR THE CONDUCT OF DAY-USE FLOAT TRIPS ON SN7 UPON COMPLETION OF PROPER PAPERWORK AND PAYMENT OF FEES AND WILL DELAY MAKING THE FINAL DECISION AS TO THE SECOND OUTFITTER TO BE SELECTED FOR THIS ACTIVITY PENDING RECEIPT OF ADDITIONAL INFORMATION FROM THE HELLS CANYON NATIONAL RECREATION AREA. The Board noted that Mr. Markham had called stating that he would drop his request for fishing activities at this point in time. However, all research has not been completed regarding input from affected outfitters. Thus, no further action will be taken on this application until such time as this material has been received.


**Steelhead Fishing on SA2:** The Board reviewed the various requests for walk and wade fishing on SA2. Following review of this matter and in consideration of the testimony which has been submitted to the Board regarding the impact of said walk and wade fishing upon the social interaction and the activities of currently licensed outfitters along this river reach, the Board DIRECTS THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO THOSE INDIVIDUALS WHO HAVE INQUIRED AS TO THE POSSIBILITY OF BEING LICENSED FOR THIS ACTIVITY, THAT AN ADEQUATE NUMBER OF OUTFITTERS ARE CURRENTLY LICENSED TO ACCOMMODATE PUBLIC NEED. THUS, NO FURTHER LICENSES SHALL BE GRANTED.

**COMPLAINTS:** The Board reviewed the complaints on file and instructed the Chairman to take necessary action/steps to resolve/answer same.
