

## MINUTES

### STATE OF IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD

Boardroom - Boise, Idaho  
September 11-15, 1989

A regular meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board was convened on Monday, September 11, 1989, at 0830 hours with all Board members present. Also in attendance were Board Executive Director Dean Sangrey, Enforcement Coordinator Al Lewis, and previous Board Attorney Steve Mendive, who was filling in for Board Attorney Dallas Burkhalter, who was previously committed to a Federal Court hearing.

**Executive Director Report:** Mr. Sangrey up-dated the Board as to office activities since the last Board meeting. The procedure currently being used by the office staff to fax copies of outfitters and guides licenses in emergency situations was reviewed, as was the recent need for certain office staff to work overtime in the processing of license applications, thereby creating a minimal amount of compensatory time earned. The Board directed that the fax operation be continued in accommodation of emergency situations, and that the Board's prior compensatory time policy be rescinded and necessary compensatory time be authorized, at the Executive Director's discretion, on an as-needed basis, in accordance with applicable state regulations.

**Board Attorney Report:** Steve Mendive reported for Dallas Burkhalter on various legal matters presently under consideration by the Board. Several of these cases are awaiting resolution of pending litigation.

**Enforcement Coordinator Report:** Mr. Lewis met with the Board to up-date them on his activities relative to ongoing enforcement efforts. He also requested the Board's favorable consideration of efforts to develop a Board logo/insignia that would help in identifying our enforcement personnel in the field. The staff also requested approval to pursue the purchase of appropriate windbreaker jackets and caps on which the new logo/insignia would be displayed. Following a discussion of this suggestion and request by Mr. Lewis, the Board directs that the Executive Director take appropriate steps to purchase an appropriate number and style of windbreakers and caps and work at developing an acceptable logo for use by the Board.

**Bill H. Brewer:** The Board reviewed Mr. Brewer's 1989-90 guide license application for the conduct of big game hunting activities in the employ of Lester "Zeke" West, noting that Mr. Brewer had received a Fish & Game violation and been convicted for same in 1971. Following consideration of this application, MSC (Baird--Miller) THAT MR. BREWER BE ISSUED HIS 1989-90 GUIDE LICENSE WITHOUT RESTRICTION.

**Patrick J. Simpson:** Mr. Simpson met with the Board regarding his 1989-90 guide license application to explain the circumstances surrounding his citations and convictions for various Idaho Fish & Game violations dating from 1982. Following the interview and review of Mr. Simpson's application, MSC (Crane--Baird) THAT MR. SIMPSON BE ISSUED A PROBATIONARY - APPRENTICE HUNTING GUIDE LICENSE FOR THE 1989-90 SEASON. TERMS OF SAID PROBATION SHALL BE THAT NO AMENDMENT TO MR. SIMPSON'S LICENSE WILL BE MADE NOR THAT HE VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE OR FEDERAL LAW DURING THE TERM OF THIS PROBATION ENDING MARCH 31, 1990.

Board recessed for lunch at 1155 hours and reconvened at 1320 hours. Board Attorney Dallas Burkhalter arrived to participate in the Board meeting following completion of his previous court commitment.

**Dave Stucker:** The Board reviewed Mr. Stucker's file and his 1989-90 outfitter application to be renewed for the conduct of bear and cougar hunting in Fish & Game Management Units #19A, 22, 23, 24, 32A and 33. Mr. Stucker has submitted a written statement as to why he is late in submitting his renewal application, namely that he earlier had a pending sale for this portion of his licensed business, but that the sale had fallen through. He would now like to renew said license as the fall hunting season is starting. Following a review of Mr. Stucker's application and file, and in consideration of the factors involved, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT MR. STUCKER BE ADVISED (1) THAT HIS OUTFITTER APPLICATION WAS RECEIVED BY THE BOARD AFTER JULY 1, 1989, THEREFORE RULE 13(a)(iii)(a,b,c) IS APPLICABLE AND MUST BE CONFORMED WITH BEFORE THE BOARD TAKES FURTHER ACTION ON HIS APPLICATION, (2) THE BOARD WOULD EXCUSE REQUIRING HIM HAVING TO MEET WITH THE BOARD IN PERSON TO DISCUSS HIS APPLICATION, (3) MR. STUCKER MUST OBTAIN A VALID FIRST AID CARD AND SUBMIT SAME TO THE BOARD BEFORE EITHER AN OUTFITTER OR GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION CAN BE ISSUED, UNLESS HE HAS SOMEONE IN HIS EMPLOY QUALIFIED TO GUIDE, AND (4) HE MUST SUBMIT AN APPROPRIATE LAND MANAGER SIGNATURE FOR APPROVAL OF SPECIAL USE PERMIT FOR THE CONDUCT OF SAID ACTIVITIES WITHIN PRIOR OPERATING AREA.

**Fiscal Reports:** The Board reviewed the downtown budget for FY 91 as well as proposed internal budget for FY 90, likewise reviewed the expenditure accounting for July, 1989. Following review of these reports, MSC (Crane--Epley) that Board approve same.

**Region 1, U.S. Forest Service/John W. Mumma:** Board reviewed a letter received from Mr. Mumma dated August 25, 1989, regarding the issuance of an Idaho Outfitter and Guide License to Jim McManus for the conduct of deer, elk, moose, bear, cougar, predator and forest grouse hunting, as well as fishing, trailrides and backpacking activities in Fish & Game Management Unit #10 on the Clearwater National Forest, catering to the handicapped. Additionally, the Board reviewed a draft response to Mr. Mumma regarding the McManus

appeal. Following said review MSC (Crane--Baird) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE DRAFT LETTER AS PREPARED BY THE CHAIRMAN IN RESPONSE TO MR. MUMMA'S LETTER OF AUGUST 25, 1989.

**Mike Sohrakoff:** Board Attorney Dallas Burkhalter briefed the Board relative to the scheduled hearing before the Board relative to the suspension or revocation of Mr. Sohrakoff's license for conduct of alleged illegal boating activity on the Salmon River. Following a review of this matter and as the Board's primary witness was unavailable for testimony at this time, the Board concurs in its' attorney's recommendation that this matter be continued until the November meeting. Further that the Board's attorney be authorized to negotiate a settlement if at all possible.

**Greg DeVan/Mike Szwec/Doug Perry, Bear Valley River Co., Inc.:** This matter pertains to the accident which occurred on the South Fork of the Payette River this summer. Board's attorney reviewed these respective cases, making a recommendation that the Board proceed to a stipulated settlement of this matter if possible, following which MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT BOARD'S ATTORNEY BE AUTHORIZED TO APPROACH BEAR VALLEY RIVER COMPANY IN REGARDS TO A STIPULATED SETTLEMENT OF THE CASE PENDING BEFORE THE BOARD PERTAINING TO VIOLATION OF OUTFITTER AND GUIDE BOARD RULES IN CONDUCT OF FLOAT BOATING ACTIVITIES ON THE SOUTH FORK OF THE PAYETTE RIVER THIS PAST SUMMER. TERMS OF SAID STIPULATION TO BE (1) BEAR VALLEY RIVER COMPANY BE ASSESSED A FINE OF \$500.00 FOR VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(5) AND (14), AND OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS RULE 38; AND (2) THAT GREG DEVAN'S (A) GUIDE LICENSE PRIVILEGES FOR BOATING ACTIVITIES BE REVOKED FOR A PERIOD OF THREE (3) YEARS, AND (B) GUIDE LICENSE PRIVILEGES FOR THE CONDUCT OF HUNTING ACTIVITIES BE REVOKED FOR A PERIOD OF ONE (1) YEAR, FOLLOWING WHICH HE COULD REAPPLY REQUESTING BOARD CONSIDERATION FOR LICENSING OF HUNTING ACTIVITIES. FURTHER, THAT CHARGES PENDING AGAINST MIKE SZWEC BE DISMISSED.

**Idaho Department of Parks and Recreation:** IDPR Director Yvonne Ferrell, Counsel Rinda Just and Boating Program Coordinator Jeff Hoedt met with the Board regarding a mutual problem concerning licensing/regulation of boating activities primarily for the conduct of tour boating on Idaho waters not under Coast Guard jurisdiction. The meeting served to clarify the problem as perceived by both agencies, following which it is the Board's position that several actions would be undertaken, namely (1) Mr. Hoedt will prepare a communication to the Board relative to the Parks Department request for action by the Board regarding the licensing of operators for conduct of tour boating activities on

Idaho waters not under Coast Guard jurisdiction, (2) Board request that its attorney review Idaho Code Title 36, Chapter 21, and Board Rules and Regulations relative to its authority to license this activity or is additional/amended legislation required before this can be done, (3) if, indeed, the Board does have appropriate authority, to draft proposed rules necessary to regulate the activities in question, and (4) that a letter be addressed to Senator Ron Beitelspacher to up-date him as to the meeting held with representatives of the Idaho Department of Parks and Recreation, and to further advise him that the Board now understands the Department of Parks and Recreation is asking that the Board license operators of vessels in question, rather than develop an inspection program for evaluating boat construction, etc. This letter will also advise Senator Beitelspacher that Board's attorney will research our Act to ascertain the steps necessary to achieve this objective.

**Lyn Benjamin:** The Board reviewed Ms. Benjamin's 1989-90 Guide License Application for the conduct of rock climbing and backpacking activities. Following a review of her file and recommendation by the Board's technical committee that her qualifications appear to be more than adequate, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT BOARD APPROVE MS. BENJAMIN'S 1989-90 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION.

**Scott A. Childs:** The Board reviewed Mr. Child's 1989-90 Guide License Application for the conduct of backpacking and technical mountaineering. Following a review of Mr. Child's file and recommendation by Curt Olson regarding Mr. Child's qualifications, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT MR. CHILD'S BE APPROVED FOR BACKPACKING ACTIVITIES, BUT THAT THIS APPROVAL BE RESTRICTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH STIPULATIONS AS SET FORTH FOR MIKE CREVELT/QUAKER HILL CONFERENCE.

**David J. Fitzgerald:** The Board reviewed Mr. Fitzgerald's 1989-90 Guide License Application for the conduct of technical mountaineering in the employ of Mr. Kirk Bachman. Following a review of Mr. Fitzgerald's file and recommendation by the Board's technical committee that Mr. Fitzgerald is qualified to conduct these activities, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT MR. FITZGERALD'S 1989-90 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION BE APPROVED.

**Dean L. Goodner:** The Board reviewed Mr. Goodner's 1989-90 Guide License Application for the conduct of big game hunting and trailriding activities in the employ of Bear Valley Outfitters, Inc., noting a citation and conviction for violation of Idaho Fish & Game law following which MSC (Epley--Baird) MR. GOODNER'S 1989-90 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION BE ISSUED PROBATIONARY WITH THE CUSTOMARY PROVISIONS OF A PROBATIONARY LICENSE IN THAT NO AMENDMENT WILL BE ALLOWED NOR VIOLATION OF ANY LOCAL, STATE OR FEDERAL LAW DURING THE LICENSE YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1990.

**Billy W. Hampton:** The Board reviewed Mr. Hampton's 1989-90 Guide License Application for the conduct of various recreational activities for Ellen Shaw, South Fork Lodge, noting that Mr. Hampton has been convicted of a felony charge at sometime in his youth, and that he apparently has kept his record clean since that point in time. Following which MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT MR. HAMPTON'S 1989-90 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION BE APPROVED WITHOUT RESTRICTION.

**Delbert R. Hendren:** The Board reviewed Mr. Hendren's 1989-90 Guide License Application noting his citation and conviction for violation of Fish and Game law, further noting that the court record shows that Mr. Hendren was given a withheld judgement with probationary period. The terms of the probation were that upon successful completion of his probation, the charges would be dropped, with no record being maintained in his file. The Board further noted that Mr. Hendren had answered "No" in Section C of his guide license application regarding Fish and Game violations. Following additional discussion of this matter and considering the subsequent court action, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. HENDREN'S GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION WITH AN APPRENTICE GUIDE LICENSE ISSUED WITHOUT RESTRICTION.

**Jack Milbrodt:** The Board reviewed Mr. Milbrodt's file noting that he had made application for a 1989-90 guide license for the conduct of big game hunting activities and fishing. The Board further noted that at the time of application, Mr. Milbrodt answered "No" in Section C of said application relative to any Fish and Game violations and that the Idaho Department of Fish & Game records indicated that they had no record of violations at that time. However, since Board action and issue of Mr. Milbrodt's license May 3, 1989, it has come to the Board's attention that Mr. Milbrodt had in fact been cited and convicted for a violation of Fish & Game law. Following review and consideration of this information, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT MR. MILBRODT BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF HIS LICENSE FOR FALSIFICATION OF INFORMATION ON SAID LICENSE APPLICATION. AUTHORITY FOR THIS ACTION IS IN ACCORDANCE WITH IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(1, 6, AND 14).

With no further business to come before that Board at this time, the meeting was recessed at 1640 hours, and reconvened Tuesday, September 12, 1989, at 0830 hours with all Board members, Board Attorney Dallas Burkhalter and Board Executive Director Dean Sangrey present.

**Jeannette Smith:** The Board reviewed Ms. Smith's 1989-90 Guide License Application and log of experience for qualifying her to be licensed as a boatman for floatboating activity on MF1, MF2 and SA6. Following a review of the file and experience log, MSC

(Miller--Baird) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE 1989-90 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION SUBMITTED BY JEANNETTE SMITH IN RECOGNITION OF HER EXPERIENCE LOG AND COMPLETION OF ONE TRIP AS REQUIRED BY BOARD RULE 38(b).

**Steve VanQuill:** The Board reviewed Mr. Vanquill's 1989-90 Guide License Application to be licensed as boatman on SA7A, noting that he had been cited and convicted for violation of Idaho Fish & Game law, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD ISSUE MR. VANQUILL'S 1989-90 GUIDE LICENSE PROBATIONARY WITH THE TERMS OF PROBATION BEING THAT HE SHALL NOT BE GRANTED ANY AMENDMENT TO HIS LICENSE NOR VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE OR FEDERAL LAW DURING THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1990.

**Jeffrey T. Kemp:** The Board reviewed Mr. Kemp's 1989-90 Guide License Application for the conduct of big game hunting, fishing, trailriding and backpacking activities, noting that he had received an Idaho Department of Fish & Game violation in 1982 and had not so noted on his application form in Section C. Following a discussion of this matter, MSC (Crane--Miller, Meiners-No) THAT MR. KEMP'S 1989-90 GUIDE LICENSE BE DENIED. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS IN ACCORDANCE WITH IDAHO CODE 36-2109 (c) AND 36-2113(a)(1).

**Nick Brown:** The Board reviewed Mr. Brown's 1989-90 Guide License Application for the conduct of big game hunting and other recreational activities, noting that he has been cited and convicted for violation of Idaho Fish & Game law. Following a discussion and review of this information, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT MR. BROWN'S 1989-90 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION BE DENIED. THIS DENIAL IS IN ACCORDANCE WITH IDAHO CODE 36-2109(c) AND 36-2113(a)(1 and 6). (SEE PAGE 14, THESE MINUTES).

**Board Minutes:** The minutes of the July 10-14, 1989, regular Board Meeting were reviewed. MSC (Crane--Miller) THAT THE MINUTES BE APPROVED AS CORRECTED.

**Judy Cook:** Judy Cook met with the Board relative to her pending application to be appointed as designated agent for Wild River Outfitters, Inc.. Following a review of her file and related information, it was determined that the Board would require additional documentation for their review and consideration, namely a current copy of the corporate by-laws, and a resolution from the board of directors of the corporation supporting the appointment of Mrs. Cook as designated agent. Mrs. Cook said that she could provide this information and would try to have it back for the Board's review today. However, she did not return, and the matter was held for further consideration at a later date, pending receipt of the necessary documentation.

**Andre Molsee/dba Shattuck Creek Outfitters, Inc.:** The Board

reviewed Mr. Molsee's Outfitter Amendment Request for the addition of trailrides adjacent to his currently licensed operating area. Following a review of this matter and finding that the application does not have BLM concurrence as regards this amendment request, the Board directs that this request be held in abeyance until this matter has been resolved. Further, that a letter be addressed to Mr. Molsee to advise him of the Board's action and to request his attention in clarification/completion of his amendment request.

**Anthony J. Popp, Jr.:** The Board reviewed the request of Mr. Popp to extend his operating area boundary for the conduct of cougar hunting. Review of the file indicates that appropriate research letters were mailed, and that a response has been received from the Idaho Department of Fish & Game advising that their opinion is no additional cougar hunting should be authorized at this time in the affected area. Records also show that Garn Christianson, D.A. for Mackay Bar, phoned in his approval for the extension of the operating area boundary in question. A letter of approval was received from Zeke West, but nothing has been received to date from Dixie Outfitters. Following review of this information, MSC (Baird--Miller) THAT THIS APPLICATION BE DENIED PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b)(5).

**Paul M. Resnick/dba Shepp Ranch:** The Board reviewed the file noting the citation that Shepp Ranch has received from the U.S. Forest Service for the alleged conduct of illegal float boating activity on SA6. Following a discussion of this matter and a review of the citations involved, it is the Board position to take no further action at this time pending federal action on these alleged violations.

Board recessed for lunch at 1200 hours, and reconvened at 1330 hours.

**Daniel M. Wilson/dba Stanley Sports and Adventures:** Mr. Wilson met with the Board relative to his 1989-90 Guide License Application to be licensed for the conduct of mountain bike touring in the Stanley Basin area in and around Stanley, Idaho. Following the interview before the Board and a complete review of the application, it was noted that he was missing documentation for his performance bond and that a further clarification of his operating area is needed as regards the Challis National Forest, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. WILSON'S OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION FOR THE CONDUCT OF MOUNTAIN BIKE TOURING AS REQUESTED, WITH THE OPERATING AREA BOUNDARY BEING AS DEFINED IN HIS APPLICATION PENDING RECEIPT OF THE NECESSARY PAPERWORK AS HAS BEEN IDENTIFIED. **Rod Day:** Mr. Day met with the Board relative to his letter received by the Board on September 11, 1989, asking for guidance

as to whether he, in the conduct of a private hunt, could obtain/maintain horses and a wrangler at his base camp for the conduct of his private hunt. Following a discussion of this matter and the details of this proposed operation, it is the Board's position that Diana Swift Haynes be advised not to provide livestock, etc., under these circumstances as she is not currently licensed to provide this type of transportation into another licensed outfitter's operating area. With this in mind, Mr. Day indicated that he would no longer pursue this option.

**William Russell King:** The Board reviewed Mr. King's 1989-90 Guide License Application for the conduct of big game hunting activity, noting that he has a prior record relative to violation of Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board rules and regulations, namely serving as a guide without having a proper guide license in possession. The most recent incident of this violation occurring during the license year 1988, at which time he pled guilty to said charge. Following a review of this matter in his file, and the repeated violation of law, MSC (Crane--Baird) THAT MR. KING'S 1989-90 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION BE DENIED. AUTHORITY FOR THIS ACTION IS IN ACCORDANCE WITH IDAHO CODE 36-2109(c), AND 36-2113(a)(14). (SEE PAGES 10 AND 14, THESE MINUTES).

**Idaho Public Utilities Commission:** The Board met with Ms. Tonya Clark of the IPUC, and Mr. John Sonnenberg, Senior Inspector for the Port of Entry, Department of Transportation, State of Idaho, regarding a mutual concern relative to vehicle insurance requirements as pertains to outfitters and their transportation of clientele and equipment. Also discussed was the matter of safety inspection of vehicles and other equipment used by outfitters in the conduct of their daily activities. Following discussion of these matters, it was agreed that (1) a committee comprised of Dean Sangrey, Grant Simonds, Ted Epley and Hank Miller meet to formulate an appropriate announcement that would be utilized to alert licensed outfitters that commencing in 1990 a program of courtesy inspections of all outfitter equipment and vehicles will begin; (2) that this announcement will be (a) presented at the IOGA Fall and Spring meeting; (b) mailed out in conjunction with outfitter license renewal applications; (c) will appear in various IOGA newsletters during the spring; and (d) will be inserted when outfitter licenses are renewed and mailed to respective licensees; (3) the Board's attorney be directed to review Idaho Code Title 36, Chapter 21, to ascertain whether our Act is broad enough in scope to permit the Board to prescribe insurance requirements necessary for licensed outfitters to conduct a business in the State of Idaho insofar as insurance limits are concerned; and, (4) as a follow-up to the Board's meeting with the Idaho Department of Parks and Recreation, Board's attorney be requested to further review Title 36, Chapter 21, to determine whether the Act is broad enough in scope to authorize the Board to require operator licenses for those

individuals operating tour boats on Idaho's waters which are outside U.S. Coast Guard jurisdiction. In consideration of the foregoing points, it is understood that both the Idaho Department of Parks and Recreation and the Idaho Public Utilities Commission will be contacted and their assistance solicited to (a) help with development of the criteria to be included in this insert; (b) develop a sticker to be provided the outfitter following inspection of a vehicle so that it is identified as having passed said inspection; and (c) also help with the distribution of these flyers and posting of posters in appropriate places to advertise the program. Finally, Ms. Clark and Mr. Sonnenberg agreed to supply the appointed committee members with current inspection forms to assist them with their development of the foregoing materials.

**Michael Johnson:** The Board reviewed a Forest Service letter dated July 20, 1989, regarding the collection of a user fee in connection with a special use permit issued to Mr. Johnson for the conduct of his sleigh rides in the vicinity of McCall, Idaho, inclusive of Bear Basin Corral. Board records do not indicate that Mr. Johnson is a licensed outfitter. Mr. Epley has been requested to investigate this matter and report back to the Board so that a decision can be made as to what action is necessary, if any.

**Hells Canyon National Recreation Area/Day Use Float Trips Below Hells Canyon Dam On SN7:** Board reviewed it's minutes of July 14, 1989, to note that the HCNRA was to report back to the Board regarding the issuance of an appropriate license to selected permittees in conduct of this activity. The Board further noted that no further communication has been received at this time, and directs that a letter be addressed to Art Seamons, HCNRA, to reaffirm the Board's prior position in selection of permittees to be licensed for this activity and requesting documentation as to why these selectees are not valid. This information will then enable the Board to take whatever action is necessary to resolve this situation.

The Board recessed for the day at 1700 hours and reconvened at 0830 hours on Wednesday, September 13, 1989, with all Board members in attendance. Executive Director Dean Sangrey and Board Attorney Dallas Burkhalter were also present.

**Chris J. Nelson:** Mr. Nelson met with the Board relative to his 1989-90 guide license application. During the course of the interview before the Board, Mr. Nelson acknowledged that he had pled guilty to the violation of Fish & Game law and further the Board finds that he has been cited by Board enforcement personnel for guiding without a valid guide license in possession. In consideration of the facts as presented, MSC (Epley--Miller) THAT THE BOARD DENY MR. NELSON'S 1989-90 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION.

AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109(C), 36-2113(a)(1, 6, and 14), AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS RULE 3.

**Gladys York/G&L York Outfitters, Inc.:** The Board reviewed Gladys York's file noting that she apparently had in her employ a guide by the name of William Russell King during the 1988 big game hunting season. It has been established that Mr. King did not have a valid 1988-89 guide license in his possession at the time. Mr. King subsequently pled guilty to the charge of guiding without a license. Inasmuch as it appears that Mrs. York did employ an unlicensed guide, and following consideration of this information, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT MRS. YORK BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD ON A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF HER LICENSE. AUTHORITY FOR THIS ACTION IS IN ACCORDANCE WITH IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(9 and 14), AND IDAHO OUTFITTER AND GUIDE LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS RULE 2(d). [SEE PAGE 8, THESE MINUTES]

**Rule 28(c) Advertisement For Relicensing Of Area Formally Licensed To Richard Grunch:** Applications in response to this advertisement were received from the following individuals: Gary Sylte, dba Coeur d'Alene River Big Game Outfitters; Brian E. Butz; John Wayne Expeditions-Outfitters and Guides, Wayne F. Manis and John N. Marcheso. Following a review of the applications, operating plans, and other related materials submitted with each application, as required by Rule 28(c) and Amendment 1 of the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) by and between the Board and the U.S. Forest Service, it was the Board's decision THAT APPLICATIONS BE RATED IN THE FOLLOWING ORDER OF PREFERENCE; 1) Gary Sylte, dba Coeur d'Alene River Big Game Outfitters; 2) John Wayne Expeditions - Outfitters and Guides; 3) Brian Butz. Given their initial selection of a qualified applicant, the Board will contact the Idaho Panhandle National Forest, Wallace Ranger District, to alert District Ranger R.J. Young as to the Board's initial screening of applicants in accordance with the MOU, Amendment 1, Step 8, to request their/his recommendation as to the final selection of a qualified applicant in accordance with the MOU, Amendment 1, Steps 9 and 10.

**Richard Freil:** The Board reviewed Mr. Freil's 1989-90 Guide License Application to be licensed as a boatman on SN7, SN8, SA7A, SA8 and MF2. Following a review of this application and experience log, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT BOARD ACCEPT MR. FREIL'S LOG TO ALLOW ONE TRIP FOR LICENSING (EXCEPT FOR SA7A, WHERE THERE IS A DUPLICATION OF DATES INDICATED ON SAID LOG), AND MOVE TO APPROVE HIS BEING LICENSED AS BOATMAN ON SN7, SN8, SA8 AND MF2. FURTHER THAT THIS LOG BE CONSIDERED ADEQUATE FOR HIM TO BE LICENSED ON OTHER IDAHO RIVERS UPON COMPLETION OF ONE TRIP IN ACCORDANCE WITH RULE 38(b).

**Review Of Outfitters Exam:** The Board discussed the requirement for completion of the outfitter examination by prospective applicants. Following a discussion as to whether only the sections of the test that specifically relate to the types of licensed activities requested need be completed by the applicant, the Board directs that all portions of the outfitter examination are required to be completed by all applicants. A maximum of four (4) errors are allowed in the general section and one (1) each in each of the remaining "special" areas.

**Ron Gillett/dba Triangle C Ranches:** Mr. Gillett met with the Board relative to clarification of his currently licensed activities, and to discuss his current outfitter amendment request for the conduct of a bighorn sheep hunt in Fish & Game Management Unit 520A-2. In consideration of Mr. Gillett's bighorn sheep hunt request and noting he has obtained the necessary approval from the affected outfitter and land managing agency involved, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. GILLETT'S REQUEST FOR AMENDMENT TO HIS OUTFITTER LICENSE IN CONDUCT OF A BIGHORN SHEEP HUNT FOR A MR. RON FOSTER, IDAHO HUNTING LICENSE #01-057378, PERMIT #80000030, OCTOBER 20-29, 1989, IN FISH & GAME MANAGEMENT UNIT 520A-2. As regards Mr. Gillett's other concerns, he questioned his being licensed for float boating activity on SA1. He acknowledged that he will follow up on this question with the SNRA relative to the change made in the put-in and take-out points on SA1, and that the Board has clarified their position relative to his being licensed for bighorn sheep hunting in Fish & Game Management Unit 36B.

**Grizzly Outfitters, Inc./Rich Lindsay, D.A.:** The Board reviewed the Grizzly Outfitter, Inc., file, noting their outfitter amendment request to expand their operating area boundaries to include that area formally licensed to S.C. Buttram, east to the Washington state line and north to the Canadian Border for the conduct of elk, deer, moose, bear, cougar, predator and bird hunting. Following review and consideration of this matter, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE AMENDMENT REQUEST OF GRIZZLY OUTFITTERS FOR THE OPERATING AREA AS DESIGNATED IN SAID AMENDMENT REQUEST. FURTHER, THAT THIS MODIFICATION OF OPERATING AREA BOUNDARY BE ACCOMPLISHED BY ADMINISTRATIVE AMENDMENT AS WAS SPECIFIED BY BOARD ACTION IN THE MINUTES DATED APRIL 1, 1988. [SEE ADDENDUM #2] (ADMINISTRATIVE NOTE - FOREST SERVICE, ATTN; DEBBIE BUTLER, SHOULD BE NOTIFIED OF BOARD ACTION IN THIS REGARD.)

**Bradley J. Hess:** Mr. Hess appeared before the Board in a denial hearing regarding the Board's denial of his outfitter application for the conduct of elk and deer hunting in Fish & Game Management Unit 73. During the course of the hearing before the Board, the following Findings of Fact were established: (1) the area requested for the conduct of the aforementioned activities, namely Management

Unit 73, is currently licensed to another Idaho outfitter, specifically Larry W. Cross, for the conduct of identical activities, namely big game hunting, (2) Larry Cross has, as identified in use records submitted to the Board during the course of relicensing, shown use in the area in question, (3) that in accordance with Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations Rule 19(f), an area currently licensed to one individual is not available to be licensed to another individual. Following consideration of these Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law are as follows: (1) The area is currently licensed to an outfitter, namely Larry W. Cross, and is not, therefore, available to another applicant for licensing for big game hunting activity. Following consideration of these Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, MSC (Miller--Baird) THAT THE BOARD AFFIRM ITS PRIOR DENIAL OF MR. HESS'S OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION FOR THE CONDUCT OF BIG GAME HUNTING IN FISH & GAME MANAGMENT UNIT 73.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1230 hours, and reconvened at 1330 hours with Ted Epley absent for the remainder of the week due to prior commitments.

**Phil Crabtree/dba Middle Fork River Tours:** The Board reviewed Mr. Crabtree's outfitter license amendment request for the addition of forest grouse hunting as a licensable activity under his current outfitter license. Following a review of this request, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT MR. CRABTREE'S AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE ADDITION OF FOREST GROUSE HUNTING BE APPROVED.

**Clearwater National Forest:** The Board reviewed the August 29, 1989, memoranda from Fred L. Turvey, Forest Supervisor, Clearwater National Forest, as regards a collection agreement proposed between the Clearwater National Forest, Idaho Department of Fish & Game, Region II, and the State of Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board. Review of this proposed collection agreement finds that it does not follow the understanding the Board had initially with the Forest Service and its' representative Thomas C. Blun, District Ranger for the Pierce Ranger District. There appears to be some discrepancy as to the nature and scope and conditions under which this collection agreement was to proceed. Therefore, the Board directs its attorney to contact the Forest Service relative to the concerns identified by the Board and asking/requesting that certain changes be made in the document prior to acceptance/signing by the Board.

**Update Of The Idaho Outfitters And Guides Act, Title 36, Chapter 21:** The Board reviewed the need to update the Act by an insert to reflect the recent legislative change effective July 1, 1989, as regards the employment of an executive director. Following review of this matter and upon advise of counsel it is the Board's position that an insert to the Act is not necessary at this time,

that this change in legislative authority and whatever else may evolve from the 1990 legislative session, be held until such time as this is known and revision developed at that time to update the Act.

**Brent Estep:** The Board interviewed Mr. Estep relative to his application to become designated agent for Mackay Bar Corp. and Mountain Air Float Trips, for the conduct of their floatboating activities. Following the interview before the Board, MSC (Miller--Baird) THAT MR. ESTEP BE APPROVED AS DESIGNATED AGENT AS REQUESTED.

Board member Dale Baird left the meeting at 1500 hours due to a prior commitment.

**Brad Cox:** The Board met with Mr. Cox relative to his 1989-90 designated agent application for Magnum Outfitters, Inc. Following his interview before the Board regarding this application, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. COX AS DESIGNATED AGENT, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE, FOR MAGNUM OUTFITTERS, INC., FOR ALL ACTIVITIES THEY ARE CURRENTLY LICENSED TO CONDUCT.

**Wally York and Sons, Inc./Travis York, D.A.:** The Board reviewed Mr. York's outfitter license amendment request for the addition of moose hunting as a licensable activity under their current license within their current operating area boundary. Following a review of this request and noting that moose are on a draw hunt basis in the requested area, MSC (Crane--Miller) THAT WALLY YORK AND SONS, INC.'S, AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE CONDUCT OF MOOSE HUNTING BE APPROVED WITHIN HIS CURRENTLY LICENSED OPERATING AREA.

**Complaints:** The Board reviewed the complaints on file and instructed the Chairman to take necessary action/steps to resolve/answer same.

There being no further business for the day, the Board recessed at 1715 hours. The Board reconvened at 0830 hours on Thursday, September 14th, with all Board members except Ted Epley present. Board Attorney Dallas Burkhalter and Executive Director Dean Sangrey also present.

**Tim Jantz:** The Board reviewed Mr. Jantz's file noting that he had requested a hearing before the Board regarding the denial of his 1989-90 Guide License Application. The time for hearing came and past and Mr. Jantz did not appear with this being the second opportunity for him appear before the Board relative to this matter. Following a discussion of this situation, and noting that he was applying to become a river guide, and that the floatboating season is essentially over, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT (1) THE BOARD DISMISS HIS PETITION FOR HEARING ON THIS MATTER, AND (2) THAT MR.

JANTZ BE ADVISED THAT PRIOR TO ANY ACTION ON SUBSEQUENT LICENSE APPLICATIONS HE MAY SUBMIT FOR CONSIDERATION THAT HE WILL NEED TO APPEAR BEFORE THE BOARD TO DISCUSS THE MATTER OF THE DENIAL OF HIS 1989-90 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION. (ADMINISTRATIVE NOTE - MR. JANTZ'S FILE IS TO BE APPROPRIATELY FLAGGED TO NOTE BOARD ACTION.)

**Review Of Waiting Lists:** The Board spent the balance of the morning session reviewing the waiting lists which have been filed with the Board for consideration in licensing of applicants for certain boating and hunting activities. This review was in preparation for the Board to take appropriate action at the November Board meeting.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1150 hours, and reconvened at 1300 hours. Board's Attorney Dallas Burkhalter has been excused for the balance of the meeting and will be available by phone if necessary.

**Nick Brown:** Andre Molsee, employing outfitter for Mr. Brown, phoned the Board regarding the disposition of Mr. Brown's guide license application for the 1989-90 season. When advised that the Board had taken action to deny this application, Mr. Molsee requested the reasons for such action, following which Mr. Brown then called the Board to plead his case. He explained the circumstances surrounding the Fish & Game violations that he had received and the manner in which he had turned himself in voluntarily regarding these violations and asked the Board's reconsideration of its' denial of his 1989-90 guide license application. Following a review of Mr. Brown's explanation of the circumstances, and in reconsideration of the Board's action, MSC (Crane--Miller) THAT THE BOARD RECONSIDER IT'S DECISION AS REGARDS THE DENIAL OF NICK BROWN'S 1989-90 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION, AS PREDICATED UPON THE TESTIMONY OFFERED BEFORE THE BOARD BY SPEAKER PHONE CONFERENCE ON THIS MATTER, TO RESCIND IT'S DENIAL OF HIS APPLICATION AND ISSUE SAME ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS, WITH THE PROVISIONS OF PROBATION BEING THAT NO AMENDMENT TO HIS LICENSE WILL BE ALLOWED, NOR WILL THERE BE ANY VIOLATION OF ANY LOCAL, STATE OR FEDERAL LAW DURING THE COURSE OF THIS LICENSE YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1990. (SEE PAGE 6, THESE MINUTES).

**William Russell King:** Mr. King contacted the Board by phone at approximately 1400 hours, September 14, 1989, regarding the Board's denial of his 1989-90 Guide License Application. By speaker-phone conversation with the Board members Mr. King pleaded his case for reconsideration of it's denial of his application. The Board advised Mr. King that they would take this information under consideration and call him back relative to a decision in this matter. Following a review of Mr. King's file and in consideration of his testimony offered by phone, MSC (Crane--Miller) THAT THE

BOARD NOT RECONSIDER IT'S POSITION IN THIS REGARD AND SUSTAIN IT'S PRIOR DECISION IN DENIAL OF THIS 1989-90 GUIDE LICENSE. FURTHER, THAT MR. KING BE SO NOTIFIED OF THE BOARD'S DECISION IN THIS REGARD, WHICH WAS DONE BY PHONE THIS DATE. (SEE PAGES 8 AND 10, THESE MINUTES).

Board member Dale Baird left the meeting at 1500 hours due to a prior commitment.

**John W. Smith:** The Board reviewed Mr. Smith's file, noting his 1989-90 Guide License Application and his citation and conviction for violation of Idaho Fish & Game law, and explanation thereof. In consideration of Mr. Smith's having owned up to said violation and letters of recommendation from other parties involved, MSC (Crane--Miller) THAT MR. SMITH'S 1989-90 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION BE ISSUED WITH NO RESTRICTION.

**Douglas McSpadden:** Mr. McSpadden, representing Backcountry Bicycle Tours, Inc., met with the Board regarding his application to become designated agent for Backcountry Bicycle Tours. Following the interview before the Board concerning this application, MSC (Crane--Miller) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. MCSPADDEN AS DESIGNATED AGENT FOR BACKCOUNTRY TOURS, INC., QUALIFIED TO GUIDE.

There being no further business to come before the Board, meeting was recessed at 1635 hours.

The Board reconvened at 0930 hours on Friday, September 15, 1989, with Board members Leo Crane, Hank Miller and Bill Meiners present. Board members Dale Baird and Ted Epley absent. Board attorney excused from the days proceedings. Executive Director Dean Sangrey present.

**Dworshak Reservoir:** Board made reference to it's July Board minutes, page 7, in which they had directed the Chairman to contact the tribal council chairman of the Nez Perce Tribe, namely one Alan S. Pinkham. He was to be contacted regarding the jurisdiction on Dworshak Reservoir for the conduct of activities on said reservoir. Chairman Meiners did meet with Mr. Pinkham on August 7, 1989, to discuss the matter of outfitting and guiding activities on Dworshak Reservoir. Following this meeting, the Chairman reported to the Board that continued outfitted and guided activities on the reservoir in question is acceptable to the Nez Perce Tribe until such time as the tribal council has had an opportunity to review the matter. Further, that the Board would continue it's current licensing procedures in accordance with Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations Rule 57(b), wherein a maximum of seven (7) operators with no more than two boats each is authorized in conduct of boating and fishing activities on Dworshak Reservoir. This understanding of continued outfitting and guiding

activities on Dworshak Reservoir was conveyed to Alan J. Pinkham, Chairman, Nez Perce Tribal Council, by Board letter dated August 15, 1989, and is herein made a record for future reference for Board action and direction. [SEE ADDENDUM #3]

**Maverick Ranch Lite Beef, Inc./Roy R. Moore, Jr., Designated Agent:**  
Mr. Moore met with the Board in an interview regarding his Outfitter License Application for the conduct of deer, elk, incidental bear and cougar, predators, bird hunting, specifically chukar, and forest grouse, power boat operation on Brownlee Reservoir, fishing for species found in Brownlee Reservoir, trailrides, snowmobiling, wagonrides and sleighrides. These activities would be conducted in conjunction with his privately owned ranch in Fish & Game Management Unit #31 off Brownlee Reservoir. Following the interview before the Board, MSC (Miller-Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE (1) MAVERICK RANCH LITE BEEF INC., DBA MOUNTAIN MAN LODGE AND MARINA, OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION FOR THE CONDUCT OF (A) CHUKAR, FOREST GROUSE HUNTING, POWER BOAT OPERATION ON BROWNLEE RESERVOIR, FISHING, TRAILRIDES, SNOWMOBILING, WAGONRIDES AND SLEIGHRIDES, AND (B) UPON INPUT FROM THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME RELATIVE TO DEER, ELK, INCIDENTAL BEAR AND COUGAR HUNTING, THAT SAID ACTIVITIES BE ADDED BY ADMINISTRATIVE AMENDMENT IN ACCORDANCE WITH WHATEVER RECOMMENDATIONS/LIMITATIONS MAY BE RECOMMENDED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF FISH & GAME, (2) THAT THIS BOARD APPROVAL OF THE OUTFITTER LICENSE IS WITH THE UNDERSTANDING AND CONCURRENCE BY MR. MOORE THAT HE WOULD AMEND HIS MANAGEMENT AGREEMENT WITH HIS RANCH MANAGERS TO DELETE GUIDING ACTIVITIES FROM THE SPLIT SHARE AGREEMENT THAT HE CURRENTLY HAS WITH THEM IN OPERATION ON THE RANCH. THAT IS, GUIDING ACTIVITIES WOULD BE ON A STRAIGHT SALARY BASIS, (3) THAT MR. MOORE BE APPROVED AS DESIGNATED AGENT, NOT QUALIFIED TO GUIDE, BUT UPON SUBMISSION OF A VALID RED CROSS CARD, THAT HE WOULD BE SO QUALIFIED WITH THE PAYMENT OF A NECESSARY FEE, (4) THAT PERRY PAUL ADKINS BE APPROVED AS A QUALIFIED GUIDE FOR THE CONDUCT OF ACTIVITIES LICENSED TO MAVERICK RANCH LITE BEEF, INC., DBA MOUNTAIN MAN LODGE AND MARINA, OUTFITTER, (5) THAT JAMES R. BRAUBERGER, BE LIKEWISE APPROVED FOR GUIDED ACTIVITIES FOR THE RANCH, AND (6) THAT LICENSE BE ISSUED PENDING COMPLETION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK. FURTHER, THAT THE LOGS SUBMITTED FOR JIM BRAUBERGER AND PERRY ADKINS FOR CONDUCT OF POWER BOATING ACTIVITIES ON BROWNLEE RESERVOIR BE ACCEPTED AS QUALIFYING THEM TO CONDUCT THESE ACTIVITIES. [SEE ADDENDUM #4]

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 1200 hours, September 15, 1989.



This is a letter to thank you for taking the time to meet with me Monday, August 7, 1989, to discuss the matter of outfitting and guiding activities on Dworshak Reservoir. Following our discussion, it is my understanding that continued outfitted and guided activities on Dworshak Reservoir is acceptable to you until such time as the tribal council has had opportunity to review the matter. Thus, the Board will continue its current licensing procedure in accordance with Idaho Outfitters and Guides Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 57(b), wherein a maximum of 7 operators with no more than 2 boats each is authorized in conduct of boating and fishing activities on Dworshak Reservoir.

Again, I thank you for the opportunity to meet and discuss this matter with you. Enclosed, as promised, are copies of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Act and Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations that address regulation and licensing of outfitted and guiding activities in Idaho.
