Boardroom - Boise, Idaho

December 4-8, 1989

A regular meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board was convened on Monday, December 4, 1989 at 0815 hours with all Board members present. Board Executive Director, Dean Sangrey and Board Attorney, Dallas Burkhalter, are also present.

Executive Director's Report: Executive Director, Dean Sangrey, brought the Board up to date on current events and fiscal standing of Board operations as of end of business, November 30, 1989. Further Mr. Sangrey explained the procedures for performance evaluation of non-classified employees on which the Board requests that he draft a memorandum outlining the guidelines he received from the Personnel Commission regarding this matter.

Board Minutes - November Meeting: The Board reviewed the November 13-17, 1989, Board meeting minutes, following which MSC (Miller--Meiners) THAT THE MINUTES BE APPROVED AS CORRECTED.

Enforcement Coordinator: Enforcement Coordinator, Al Lewis, gave a report to the Board relative to on-going enforcement activities to bring the Board up to date as to current status of such matters.

Solitude River Trips, Inc./Al F. Bukowsky, Designated Agent and River Adventure Float Trips, Inc./Mel Norrick, Designated Agent: Messrs Bukowsky and Norrick met with the Board regarding the proposed sale and transfer of River Adventure Float Trips, Inc. float boating privileges on the Middle Fork Salmon River, (MF1 and MF2) to Solitude River Trips, Inc./Al F. Bukowsky, Designated Agent. Following the interview before the Board regarding this proposed sale and transfer of business, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS BETWEEN RIVER ADVENTURE FLOAT TRIPS, INC. TO SOLITUDE RIVER TRIPS, INC. PENDING RECEIPT OF COMPLETED PAPERWORK. NAMELY COMPLETED SALES CONTRACT, REGISTRATION OF THE ARTICLES OF

INCORPORATION IN THE STATE OF IDAHO, RELEASE FROM MR. NORRICK, APPROPRIATE BOND, AND PAYMENT OF NECESSARY FEES; 2) APPROVE MR. BUKOWSKY AS DESIGNATED AGENT QUALIFIED TO GUIDE; AND 3) AUTHORIZE THE CHAIRMAN TO REVIEW SAID PAPERWORK UPON RECEIPT AND IF ACCEPTABLE, TO APPROVE APPROPRIATE LICENSES.

Terry Throckmorton, dba Bar Six Outfitters and David Udy: Messrs Throckmorton and Udy met before the Board regarding the proposed sale and transfer of business from Mr. Udy to Mr. Throckmorton for the conduct of antelope, deer, elk, goat, sheep, bear, and cougar hunting as well as fishing, trail rides and backpacking activities in Fish & Game Management Units 59, 59A, and 61. Following the interview before the Board regarding this matter, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS BETWEEN MESSRS UDY AND THROCKMORTON FOR THE CONDUCT OF THE AFOREMENTIONED LICENSED ACTIVITIES IN FISH & GAME MANAGEMENT UNITS 59, 59A, AND 61 PENDING COMPLETION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK NAMELY 1) VALID FIRST AID CARD; 2) BOND; AND 3) REGISTRATION AND FILING WITH THE BOARD OF ASSUMED BUSINESS NAME CERTIFICATE. FURTHER THAT MR. THROCKMORTON BE APPROVED, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. OPERATING AREA SHALL BE ONE AND THE SAME AS FORMELY LICENSED TO DAVE UDY. (See Addendum #1)

Russell R. Gore, dba Gore's Salmon River Jet and Float Trips/Rusty Gore, Designated Agent and Miller and Moser/Hank Miller, Designated Agent, dba Idaho Adventures: Mr. Gore appeared before the Board relative to the proposed sale and transfer of Moser and Miller's Lower Salmon River float boating, fishing and chukar hunting activities from Hammer Creek to Lewiston (SA8). Following the interview before the Board regarding this matter, MSC (Epley--Baird, Miller abstains) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF MILLER AND MOSER'S FLOAT BOATING BUSINESS ON THE LOWER SALMON RIVER FROM HAMMER CREEK TO LEWISTON (SA8) FOR THE CONDUCT OF FLOAT BOATING, CHUKAR HUNTING, AND FISHING; 2) THAT MR. GORE'S LICENSE BE AMENDED TO INDICATE THIS TRANSFER; AND 3) THAT MR. MILLER WILL SERVE AS GUIDE FOR MR. GORE UNTIL SUCH TIME THAT MR. GORE IS QUALIFIED TO CONDUCT THIS ACTIVITY ON HIS OWN.

The Board recessed for lunch at 11:30 hours and reconvened at 13:10 hours.

Cougar Ranch Outfitters, LTD./Brent Hill, Designated Agent: Mr. Hill met before the Board in a show cause hearing for suspension or revocation of respective licenses regarding the hiring of an unlicensed guide this past season, in violation of both the Idaho

Outfitters and Guides Act and Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations. In the course of the hearing, the findings of fact that surfaced were, in fact, that Mr. Hill did 1) have in his employ and in the field two (2) individuals, a Mr. James Briggs and Mr. Dan Ray Korth guiding clients with Mr. Briggs and Mr. Korth not having licenses in hand at the time they were in the field; 2) that in conversation with Mr. Hill regarding this matter he admits to the fact that this indeed did occur as was reported to the Board by Board Enforcement Officer Stanley Jensen; 3) that applications for said licenses had been received by the Board on September 14, 1989; 4) that Mr. Korth's license was issued on September 21, 1989, however Mr. Briggs' license application was not complete (lacking a valid First Aid card) and therefore was not issued until October 11, 1989, all of which occurred after contact with the individuals in the field; 5) that evidence presented shows that Mr. Briggs had completed the First Aid course on August 26, 1989 and that evidence to this effect is on file; and 6) that Mr. Hill presented unsubstantiated evidence that the applications had been mailed to the Board on or prior to September 1, 1989. Following the review of these findings of fact the conclusions of law are: 1) Mr. Hill did employ unlicensed guides in the field in violation of Idaho Code 36-2113 (a)(9 and 14); 2) that Mr. Hill is therefore in violation of Idaho Outfitter and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rules 2(a) and 3. Following which MSC (Miller--Epley, Baird nay, Meiners abstains) THAT THE BOARD FIND MR. HILL IN VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(9 AND 14) AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULES 2(a) and 3; 2) THAT THE BOARD FINE RATHER THAN SUSPEND OR REVOKE MR. HILL'S LICENSES AND THAT HE BE ASSESSED A TOTAL FINE OF \$100 FOR VIOLATION OF THE IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES ACT AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS. Following which, MSC (Baird--Epley, Crane abstains, Meiners nay) THAT UPON FURTHER CONSIDERATION THAT THE FINE ASSESSED IN THE JUDGEMENT AGAINST MR. HILL FOR HAVING IN HIS EMPLOY TWO GUIDES WHO WERE ACTIVELY GUIDING WITHOUT THEIR GUIDE LICENSES IN POSSESSION, THAT FINE IS HEREBY SUSPENDED.

Executive Session: The Board went into Executive Session at 1510 hours. Crane aye, Epley aye, Baird aye, Miller aye, Meiners aye. Board came out of Executive session at 1525 hours with no formal action taken.

David N. Friedman, dba Lake Charter Service: Mr. Friedman appeared before the Board in an interview regarding violations of Fish & Game laws during this past season. Following the interview and discussion of this matter, MSC (Miller--Crane, Baird nay) THAT IN

VIEW OF THE EXPLANATION OF CIRCUMSTANCES SURROUNDING THE INCIDENT FOR WHICH MR. FRIEDMAN WAS CITED FOR VIOLATION OF FISH AND GAME LAW, THAT THE BOARD TAKE NO ADVERSE ACTION AGAINST MR. FRIEDMAN'S LICENSE.

Board's Attorney: Dallas Burkhalter, Board's Attorney, met with the Board to update the Board on various litigative matters.

Hells Canyon National Recreation Area/Day Use Float Permits Below Hells Canyon, SN7: The Board reviewed Mr. Ed Cole's letter to the Board dated November 21, 1989 regarding the apparent impass that appears to exist regarding this licensing/permitting of day use trips below Hells Canyon. Following consideration of the Board's attorney's recommendation, MSC (Miller--Baird) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE LETTER AS PREPARED BY BOARD'S ATTORNEY, IN RESPONSE TO MR. COLE'S NOVEMBER 21, 1989 LETTER WITH COPIES TO DAVE RITTERSBACHER, CAPITAL CITY SUPERVISOR.

Greg DeVan/Bear Valley River Co.: The Board has received the signed stipulation from Mr. DeVan in resolution of the problems pending in this matter, (see Board minutes, November, 1989). Thus, said signature completes necessary execution of said stipulation and the Board considers this matter closed.

G & L York Outfitters, Inc./Gladys York, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the request from Mrs. York's attorney, Mr. Robert Brower, for continuance regarding both scheduled show cause hearings scheduled for the December Board meeting, following which the Board grants said continuance as requested with said hearing rescheduled for the February meeting.

Teton Valley Lodge/Randy Berry, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed Mr. Berry's request for continuance of his show cause hearing before the Board. Said hearing has been rescheduled for the February Board meeting.

Idaho Big Game, Inc./Jon Goodman, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed Idaho Big Game, Inc.'s file noting that by action taken at the November meeting the Board denied renewal of appropriate licenses with instructions to issue a denial letter (by certified mail, return receipt requested) in accordance therewith. The file further shows that no receipt of said denial letter has been acknowledged to date, following which MSC (Crane--Baird) THAT UPON RETURN OF THE DENIAL LETTER FROM THE POST OFFICE THAT SAID LETTER HAS NOT BEEN CLAIMED, THAT APPROPRIATE ACTION BE TAKEN TO AFFECT

PERSONAL SERVICE UPON MR. GOODMAN BY EITHER BOARD ENFORCEMENT AGENTS AND/OR THE COUNTY SHERIFF INVOLVED.

Shepp Ranch/Virginia Hopfenbeck, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the file regarding the pending allegations of illegal boating activities by Shepp Ranch this past summer on SA6 and the citations issued by the Forest Service regarding same. Following consideration of the latest information on processing of these citations, it is the Board's understanding that the U.S. Attorney's office has remanded the case to the Forest Service for further administrative action. Following a discussion of this matter, it is the Board's position that inquiry be made of the Forest Service regarding pending action they contemplate to enable Board action to be taken as deemed appropriate.

Wild River Outfitters/Tony Bradbury, Jr., Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the file concerning the drowning accident which occurred on August 7, 1989 on the Lower Salmon River, SA8, following which, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT WILD RIVER OUTFITTERS, INC./TONY BRADBURY, JR., DESIGNATED AGENT, BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD ON A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF THEIR RESPECTIVE LICENSES FOR VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(14) AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 53. (Administrative Note: Witnesses that should be subpoenaed relative to this matter are Tony Bradbury, Sr.; Lead Boatman, Ted Herring; Guide, Darin Orozca; and Board Enforcement Agent, Walt Browne. Further, that the trip records for this trip be subpoenaed and Mr. Bradbury requested to bring same with him to the hearing.)

The Board recessed for the evening at 1650 hours. Tuesday morning December 5, 1989 the Board reconvened at 0830 hours. All Board members present together with Executive Director, Board's Attorney, and Enforcement Coordinator.

Mike Sohrakoff, Guide License #1300: The Board reviewed, as a matter of carry over from the November Board meeting, the show cause hearing briefs submitted by attorneys in this matter for Board's consideration in taking appropriate action regarding disposition of this case, #89-1300-11. In consideration of the briefs presented to the Board and discussion of same, the findings of fact are as follows: 1) there was a party where alcoholic beverages were consumed; 2) Mike Sohrakoff was a participant in the party and did operate a jet boat on the Salmon River during the hours of darkness, specifically after 12 midnight; 3) although the Salmon River, SA6, is a classified river, the stretch of river,

approximately four (4) miles in length from the Salmon River Resort Club up river to James Ranch consists of "moderately mild water conditions at this time of year, early to mid November, 1988; 4) the activity undertaken by Mr. Sohrakoff was an activity for which he holds a guide license from the State of Idaho; 5) in the course of the hearing before the Board, no evidence was presented that activities undertaken the night of November 8, 1988 posed any danger to the health, safety and welfare of the passengers on board. Thus, in consideration of these Findings of Fact, the Conclusions of Law are as follows: 1) the evidence presented against Mr. Sohrakoff is insufficient to sustain a conviction for violation of Idaho law thus charges are dismissed. Following which MSC (Miller--Baird, Meiners nay) THAT IN VIEW OF THE FOREGOING FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW, THE BOARD DISMISS THE ALLEGED CHARGES AGAINST MIKE SOHRAKOFF, CASE #89-1300-11.

Outfitters Plus, Inc., dba Class V Whitewater, Inc./David Fisher, Designated Agent: Mr. Fisher met with the Board and following the interview before the Board relative to his petition for the addition of a power boat permit on the Main Payette River, PA1, it was the Board's direction to Mr. Fisher that it had received a similar request for power boating activity on PA1 approximately three (3) to five (5) years ago at which time said petition was denied. However, the Board is in the process of researching its files in this regard to ascertain reasons for said denial and upon review of said information, will so notify Mr. Fisher of its current position regarding his petition. Further, the Board requested that he submit additional information as regards his proposed operation on the river. (See page 13, these minutes)

Executive Session: MSC (Baird aye, Epley aye, Meiners aye, Miller aye, Leo Crane was excused from the process of this Executive Session.) that the Board go into Executive Session for the purpose of discussion of potential litigative matters. Executive Session began at 9:45 AM. Board came out of Executive Session at 10:40 AM with no decisions made.

Drowning Accident on Clearwater River, 11-15-89: Following a review of the file regarding this drowning accident, the Board directs that the Chairman contact the Idaho State Police asking their investigative branch to conduct an independent investigation of this matter in as timely a manner as possible to enable further Board action to be taken as deemed appropriate.

Quaker Hill Conference, dba Back Country and Beyond/Scott Childs, Designated Agent: Mr. Childs and Messrs Don Koch, Art Barkman, Lynn Koch and Ken Vanderhout met with the Board relative to their request for the Board to again review their operations asking for a declaratory judgement that their activities fall outside the purvue of the Outfitters and Guides Act. Following the interview the Board stated it would 1) request its attorney to review both Quaker Hill Conference's current and 1984 petitions with recommendation to the Board as to whether said operations of Quaker Hill Conference falls under or outside the purvue of Idaho Code Title 36, Chapter 21 and Rules and Regulations promulgated thereunder; 2) review said recommendation at its February meeting and render a decision at that time as regards the Quaker Hill Conference petition; and 3) process Mr. Childs' designated agent license request upon proper application for same.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1205 hours and reconvened at 1325 hours.

Jack Dennis Sports, Inc./Doug Meyer, Designated Agent and South Fork Expeditions, Inc./John Hill, Designated Agent: Messrs Meyer and Hill met with the Board regarding the proposed sale and transfer of business for power boating activities on SS1, currently licensed to South Fork Expeditions, Inc. to Jack Dennis Sports, Inc. This was a follow-up meeting to the November meeting at which time the parties involved were instructed that additional information was required, namely a sales contract, financial statement, and other papers. The requested information was submitted but was found to be inadequate to enable further Board processing of the proposed sale and transfer of business. Mr. Hill was instructed as to the necessary material required, namely: a sales contract inclusive of a Schedule "A" listing tangible assests transferred in the sale of business, release language, and land manager sign off. Further, Mr. Meyer was instructed that he needed to complete his designated agent license application to enable the Board to take final action on his request. The Board directs a letter be addressed to Messrs Meyer and Hill outlining and confirming the Board's position regarding this proposed sale and transfer of business.

Executive Session: The Board went into Executive Session at 1435 hours, (Crane aye, Baird aye, Epley aye, Miller aye, Meiners aye) to discuss potential litigative matters. Board came out of Executive Session at 1450 hours with no decisions made.

Boulder Creek Outfitters, Inc./Tim Craig, Designated Agent: Mr. Craig met with the Board relative to the necessity of obtaining private land owner(s) permission for conduct of outfitted activities on privately owned land(s). Following discussion of this matter, it is the Board's understanding that Mr. Craig will contact private land owners upon whose land he operates to provide the Board subsequent written permission of said land owners/operators for Boulder Creek Outfitters, Inc. to operate on said lands. Of particular concern is the Heckman Ranch properties for conduct of cougar hunting during the current season. This information will be Faxed to the Board for their information and consideration in licensing of this activity. The Board further considered Mr. Craig's amendment request for conduct of outfitted activities on his privately owned property located in Fish and Game Management Unit 11A, a total area of some 1100 acres. Following review of this amendment request, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT SAID AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED FOR CONDUCT OF ELK, DEER, BEAR, COUGAR, PREDATOR, AND FOREST GROUSE HUNTING, AS WELL AS FISHING AND TRAIL RIDE ACTIVITIES. (OPERATING AREA BOUNDRIES SHALL BE ONE AND THE SAME AS DESCRIPTION FOR PRIVATELY OWNED PARCEL, SEE ADDENDUM 2.)

Board Meetings: The Board discussed the necessity of setting a date for its first meeting in 1990 pending consideration of upcoming rules making procedures. Following a discussion of this matter, MSC (Crane--Epley, Baird nay) THAT THE BOARD'S FIRST MEETING FOR 1990 BE SET FOR THE SECOND WEEK IN FEBRUARY, NAMELY FEBRUARY 12-16, 1990. (See page 13)

The Board recessed for the evening at 1705 hours. Wednesday, December 6, 1989 the Board reconvened at 0820 hours with all Board members present. Also present were the Board's Attorney and Executive Director.

Stephen H. Jones: The Board reviewed Mr. Jones' guide license amendment request to become qualified as a back country ski guide. After consideration of his resume' submitted with said application and recommendation and comments made by the Board's technical advisory committee, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT MR. JONES BE APPROVED FOR CONDUCT OF BACK COUNTRY SKI GUIDE ACTIVITIES IN THE EMPLOYMENT OF SUN VALLEY HELICOPTER SKI GUIDES.

Lawrence Fulford: The Board reviewed a letter dated October 23, 1989 as signed by Douglas F. Manchester, Chairman of Torrey Enterprises, Inc. in which he indicates that he has employed Mr. Fulford this past summer in conduct of various activities which

might fall within the purvue of the Outfitters and Guides Act. A check with Mr. Ken Dickenson, Idaho Department of Employment, December 6, 1989 finds that Mr. Fulford is or was not listed on the employment records of Torrey Enterprises, Inc. in any of the four (4) quarters of 1988 or the first three (3) quarters of 1989. Following consideration of this information, MSC (Epley--Meiners, Baird nay, Miller nay) THAT THE BOARD ADDRESS A LETTER TO MR. MANCHESTER ACKNOWLEDGING RECEIPT OF HIS LETTER INDICATING HIS EMPLOYMENT OF MR. FULFORD BUT THE DEPARTMENT OF EMPLOYMENT RECORDS DO NOT SUSTAIN THIS EMPLOYMENT. THUS, THE BOARD WOULD REQUEST CLARIFICATION OF MR. FULFORD'S EMPLOYMENT STATUS. (Administrative Note: Copies of this letter should go to Bob McKenna and to Mr. Fulford.)

David Wescott, dba Boulder Outdoor Survival School, Inc.: The Board again reviewed Mr. Wescott's file. In consideration of the additional information he was requested to provide the Board, following his meeting with the Board at its November meeting, MSC (Crane--Miller) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. WESCOTT'S OUTFITTER AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR 1) ADDITION OF SNOWMOBILING, DOG SLED RIDES, AND SURVIVAL COURSE ACTIVITIES TO HIS CURRENTLY LICENSED ACTIVITIES; AND 2) APPROVE AN EXTENSION OF HIS CURRENTLY LICENSED OPERATING AREA BOUNDARIES TO INCLUDE CERTAIN LANDS IN FISH AND GAME MANAGEMENT UNITS 61 AND 62A, AS DEFINED ON HIS AMENDMENT REQUEST NAMELY, LANDS INVOLVED IN TOWNSHIPS 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, AND 12 NORTH; AND RANGES 42, 43, AND 44 EAST. (See Addendum #3)

K. Thomas Mehler, dba Mehler Charter Service: The Board reviewed Mr. Mehler's file relative to complaints submitted to the Board regarding his operations. Said review also finds that Mr. Mehler has repeated violations of Idaho Department of Fish & Game laws with convictions of certain of these violations. Following which, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT MR. MEHLER BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD ON A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF HIS LICENSE. AUTHORITY FOR THIS ACTION IS IN ACCORDANCE WITH IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(1, 5, 6, 14) AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 8.

Darl Allred, dba Sawtooth Wilderness Outfitters and Guides: Mr. Allred met with the Board regarding his outfitter's license amendment request for an additional operating area in which to conduct bear and cougar hunting. Board records find that a portion of the operating area requested falls under purvue of Rule 28(c), while another portion of the requested operating area would be considered a new opportunity thereby triggering the MOU. This was explained to Mr. Allred following which the Board stated it would

proceed with the necessary procedures in processing his amendment request, meanwhile would place his name on the waiting list pending outcome of compliance with Rule 28 (c) and the MOU with an answer at the next Board meeting in February if at all possible. The Board directs that a letter be addressed to Mr. Allred outlining the Board's understanding of our mutual discussion regarding this matter. (Administrative Note: Contact with the Idaho Department of Fish and Game should be made as regards Mr. Allred's amendment request.)

The Board recessed for lunch at 1150 hours and reconvened at 1315 hours.

Boulder Creek Outfitters, Inc./Tim Craig, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed Boulder Creek Outfitters, Inc. file noting the outfitter amendment request for the conduct of cougar hunting within Fish and Game management unit 13 on those properties owned by Don Heckman, otherwise known as Heckman Ranches, Inc. The Board is also in receipt of a communication dated December 5, 1989 in which Mr. Heckman has given exclusive hunting rights to Boulder Creek Outfitters, Inc. through March, 1990. Following which, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE BOULDER CREEK OUTFITTERS, INC. OUTFITTER AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE CONDUCT OF COUGAR HUNTING ON THE HECKMAN RANCHES, INC. AS SPECIFIED AND CONFINED TO SAID PROPERTIES WITH EXCLUSIVE RIGHTS GRANTED BY MR. HECKMAN'S LETTER OF DECEMBER 5, 1989. (Administrative Note: Notify Mr. Andre Molsee, dba Shattuck Creek Ranch and Outfitters, that Mr. Craig has obtained exclusive hunting rights on Heckman Ranches, Inc. for the conduct of cougar hunting through March, 1990 and the Board has approved said request.)

Review of the file, finds that all response and necessary paperwork is not complete, following which MSC (Miller--Epley, Crane nay) THAT 1) CONTACT BE MADE WITH THE U.S. FOREST SERVICE RELATIVE TO THE MOU AMENDMENT 1 AND NECESSARY CLEARANCE THEREFORE FOR THIS "NEW OPPORTUNITY"; 2) CONTACT BE MADE WITH AFFECTED OUTFITTERS TO ASCERTAIN THEIR RESPONSE TO THIS OPERATION WITHIN THEIR OPERATING BOUNDARIES; AND 3) UNLESS SIGNIFICANT ADVERSE COMMENT IS TENDERED TO REQUIRE FURTHER BOARD ACTION REGARDING THIS APPLICATION, THE CHAIRMAN BE AUTHORIZED TO APPROVE SAID APPLICATION AND ISSUE LICENSE.

Don Childs, Progressive Insurance Co.: Mr. Child's met with the Board in review of suggested insurance coverage for conduct of outfitting and guiding activities in Idaho. During the course of the meeting, Mr. Childs offered to set down his recommendations and forward same to the Board for their consideration in promulgation of applicable rules regarding this matter.

Rick Hussey, dba Quarter Circle A Outfitters: Mr. Hussey met with the Board regarding Idaho Big Game, Inc./Jon Goodman, Designated Agent and the on-going situation by and between the Board and Idaho Big Game, Inc./Jon Goodman. Mr. Hussey's concern was how this might affect him and his interest(s) in Idaho Big Game, Inc. It was the Board's position that his "interest" was between he and Mr. Goodman and did not involve the issue/non-issue of an outfitter license.

Hells Canyon Adventures/Gary Armacost, Designated Agent: Mr. Armacost met with the Board in discussion of the proposed day use float trips below Hells Canyon on SN7.

St. Joe Hunting and Fishing Camp, Inc./Willard J. Judge, Designated Agent: Mr. and Mrs. Judge and Mr. Tom Poage met with the Board as regards the sale and transfer of business by and between the current owners of St. Joe Hunting and Fishing Camp, Inc. to Mr. Judge, and his becoming the new designated agent for said company. Following the interview before the Board, MSC (Miller--Baird) THAT 1) THE BOARD APPROVE THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS WITH ALL ACTIVITIES CURRENTLY LICENSED TO ST. JOE HUNTING AND FISHING CAMP, INC. BEING TRANSFERRED AS IS AND FOR THE OPERATING AREA TO BE ONE AND THE SAME AS CURRENTLY LICENSED; 2) MR. JUDGE BE APPROVED AS DESIGNATED AGENT QUALIFIED TO GUIDE; AND 3) LICENSE BE ISSUED UPON SATISFACTORY COMPLETION OF PAPERWORK, NAMELY THE BONDING REQUIREMENT WITH THE NEW DESIGNATED AGENT SHOWN THEREON. (See Addendum #4)

The Board recessed for the day at 1700 hours. Thursday, December 7, 1989 the Board reconvened at 0830 hours with all Board members present as well as Executive Director and Board's Attorney.

Lazy J Outfitters, Inc./Larry Jarrett, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed Lazy J Outfitters, Inc. file in the matter of an alleged violation of Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations in that he allegedly operated outside of his licensed operating area in an unprofessional and unethical manner. Following the review of the investigative reports and discussion

of these matters, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT LAZY J OUTFITTERS, INC./LARRY A. JARRETT, DESIGNATED AGENT, BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD ON A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF THE RESPECTIVE LICENSES. AUTHORITY FOR THIS ACTION IS IN ACCORDANCE WITH IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(5, 8, 14) AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULES 5 AND 8.

The River Company, Inc., dba Middle Fork River Co./Steve Lentz, Designated Agent and Two-M River Outfitters, Inc./Michael Murphy, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the petition for amendment of Rule 57 of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations as pertains to the South Fork of the Boise River (B01). The petitioners petition the Board to amend the current Board rule (Rule 57a) to increase the maximum number of float boats per operator on B01, from one (1) to two (2) boats for the accomodation of public safety, health and welfare. Following a discussion of this petition, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT PETITION AND GO TO RULE MAKING ON THIS MATTER.

Proposed Rules: Following a review of the draft proposed rules and consideration of the major changes that are being proposed, MSC (Miller--Baird) THAT THE BOARD UNDERTAKE TO HAVE THE FINAL PROPOSED DRAFT OF RULES READY FOR BOARD ACTION AT THE FEBRUARY, 1990 MEETING.

Board recessed for lunch at 1150 hours and reconvened at 1325 hours.

Executive Session: Board went into Executive Session at 1326 hours for the purpose of discussion of potential litigative matters. Crane aye, Epley aye, Baird aye, Meiners aye, Miller absent. The Board came out of Executive Session at 1410 hours with no decisions made.

Shannon Lindsey, LT&L Properties, Grangeville, Idaho: Mr. Lindsey met with the Board regarding the lease agreement he has with Boulder Creek Outfitters/Tim Craig, Designated Agent, in the conduct of outfitted activities on the L T & L Ranch, asking certain questions for clarification for further processing of this lease arrangement.

Quaker Hill Conference, Inc., dba Back Country and Beyond/Scott Childs, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the designated agent application submitted by Scott Childs and finds that Mr. Childs did not pass the outfitters exam. Thus, the Board directs that a

letter be addressed to Mr. Childs advising him of this matter and that he may retake the test after a 15 day waiting period. Further, the Board urges him to take time on the test as, if he fails it again, he will have to wait until the end of the current license year before being able to retake the exam. Also, that Mr. Childs' resume be sent to the Board's technical advisory committee for review and recommendation. Following which, if the exam is successfully completed and the committee recommends Mr. Childs qualified as cross country ski guide, MSC (Miller--Crane, Baird abstains) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. CHILDS AS DESIGNATED AGENT FOR QUAKER HILL CONFERENCE, INC., DBA BACK COUNTRY AND BEYOND, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE FOR CROSS COUNTRY SKIING AND BACKPACKING; TECHNICAL MOUNTAINEERING AND ROCK CLIMBING IS APPROVED AS PREVIOUSLY LICENSED. AUTHORITY FOR THIS ACTION IS PURSUANT TO APPLICANT NOT MEETING THE CRITERIA AS SET FORTH TO BECOME QUALIFIED FOR TECHNICAL MOUNTAINEERING AND ROCK CLIMBING IN IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 44.

Board member, Meiners, was excused from the meeting at 1615 hours.

Board Meetings: As regard proposed Rules making, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT BOARD MEETINGS BE HELD ON THE FOURTH MONDAY OF FEBRUARY, APRIL, JUNE AND AUGUST. SPECIAL MEETINGS CAN/WILL BE HELD IN ADDITION TO THESE AS NEEDED. THESE MEETINGS ARE REGULAR BOARD MEETINGS. (See page 8, these minutes)

The Board recessed for the evening at 1645 hours. The Board reconvened on Friday, December 8, 1989 at 0825 hours. All Board members, except Hank Miller, present. Board Executive Director also present. Board's Attorney, excused.

Solitude River Trips, Inc./Al F. Bukowsky, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the Solitude River Trips, Inc. file noting that they have now submitted the additional paperwork requested, namely a sales contract. However, we do not as yet have the corporate papers on file. The Board directs that until such time as these are received and registered in Idaho that a license not be issued. However, upon receipt of such papers, that license be issued as the application has been approved and the file is otherwise complete.

Outfitters Plus, Inc., dba Class V Whitewater, Inc./David Fisher, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the petition received from Mr. Fisher in which he petitions the Board to go to rules making for the addition of power boat operation on the Main Payette River,

PA1. Following completion of a review of Mr. Fisher's petition and Board records and files, as related on page 6 of these minutes, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT IN AS MUCH AS THE SUBJECT COVERED IN THE PETITION FOR RULES MAKING HAS BEEN REVIEWED IN PUBLIC HEARINGS IN THE RECENT PAST AND THE REVIEW OF THOSE HEARINGS SHOW THAT THERE IS A CONSIDERABLE SENTIMENT THAT THIS ACTIVITY WOULD INTERFERE WITH THE PUBLIC'S USE OF THAT RIVER, THE PRIVATE LAND OWNERS USE ADJACENT TO THE RIVER AND WITH THE NESTING AND REARING AREAS FOR WATERFOWL ALONG THE RIVER, IT IS THE BOARD'S DECISION THAT THE PETITION WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. (See page 6, these minutes)

H. Spence Warner: The Board reviewed H. Spence Warner's file and investigative officer Arlo Larsen's report regarding the outfitter's employment of unlicensed guides. Following this review, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT H. SPENCE WARNER BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD FOR A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF HIS RESPECTIVE LICENSES FOR THE EMPLOYMENT OF UNLICENSED GUIDES. AUTHORITY FOR THIS ACTION IS IN ACCORDANCE WITH IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a) (9), AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 2(a).



Beginning at the Red Ives Ranger Station (Sec. 20, T43N, R9E, BM); thence easterly on Road 320 along the St. Joe River to Bluebells Creek and juncture with Road 715 (Sec. 26, T45N, R10E, BM); thence southerly on Road 715 to the Clearwater/Panhandle National Forest boundary, Clearwater/St. Joe River watershed divide, and Idaho Department of Fish and Game Management (F&G Mgmt) Unit 7/10 boundary; thence southwesterly on Road 715 and said boundaries to juncture of F&G Mgmt Units 7/9A/10 and continuing southwesterly downstream on Meadow Creek to Trail 59 (Sec. 31, T42N, R10E, BM); thence westerly around the head of Copper Creek to and down the Copper/Roaring Creek watershed divide; thence southwesterly down said watershed divide to the mouth of Frost Creek (Sec. 8, T41N, R9E, BM); thence upstream on Frost Creek to Lost Trail Ridge and Trail 283 and continuing northerly on Trail 283 to the Clearwater/Panhandle National Forest boundary at the head of Spud Creek near Benchmark 6105 and F&G Mgmt Unit 7/9A boundary (NW corner Sec. 36, T42N, R8E, BM); thence on a line southwest across Perry and Collins Creeks to juncture of Trails 97 and 685 on Avalanche Ridge (Sec. 24, T41N, R7E, BM); thence northerly on Trail 97 to the Clearwater/Panhandle National Forest boundary via Mallard Peak to Trail 110 and F&G Mgmt Unit 9/9A boundary (SW 1/4 Sec. 36, T32N, R7E, BM); thence northerly on Trail 110 to the approximate quarter corner between Sections 24 and 25, T42N, R7E, BM (near Fawn lake); thence due north to Trail 109 on Sawtooth Creek; thence east on Trail 109 to the Clearwater/Panhandle National Forest boundary at the head of Sawtooth Creek, F&G Mgmt Unit 9/9A boundary, and Clearwater/St. Joe watershed divide; thence northerly on said boundaries via Surveyors Peak to the juncture of F&G Mgmt Units 7/9/9A boundaries; thence northerly on F&G Mgmt Unit 7/9 boundary via Granite Peak to Copper Ridge and Trail 263; thence northeasterly on Trail 263 to Red Ives Ranger Station, the point of beginning.
